

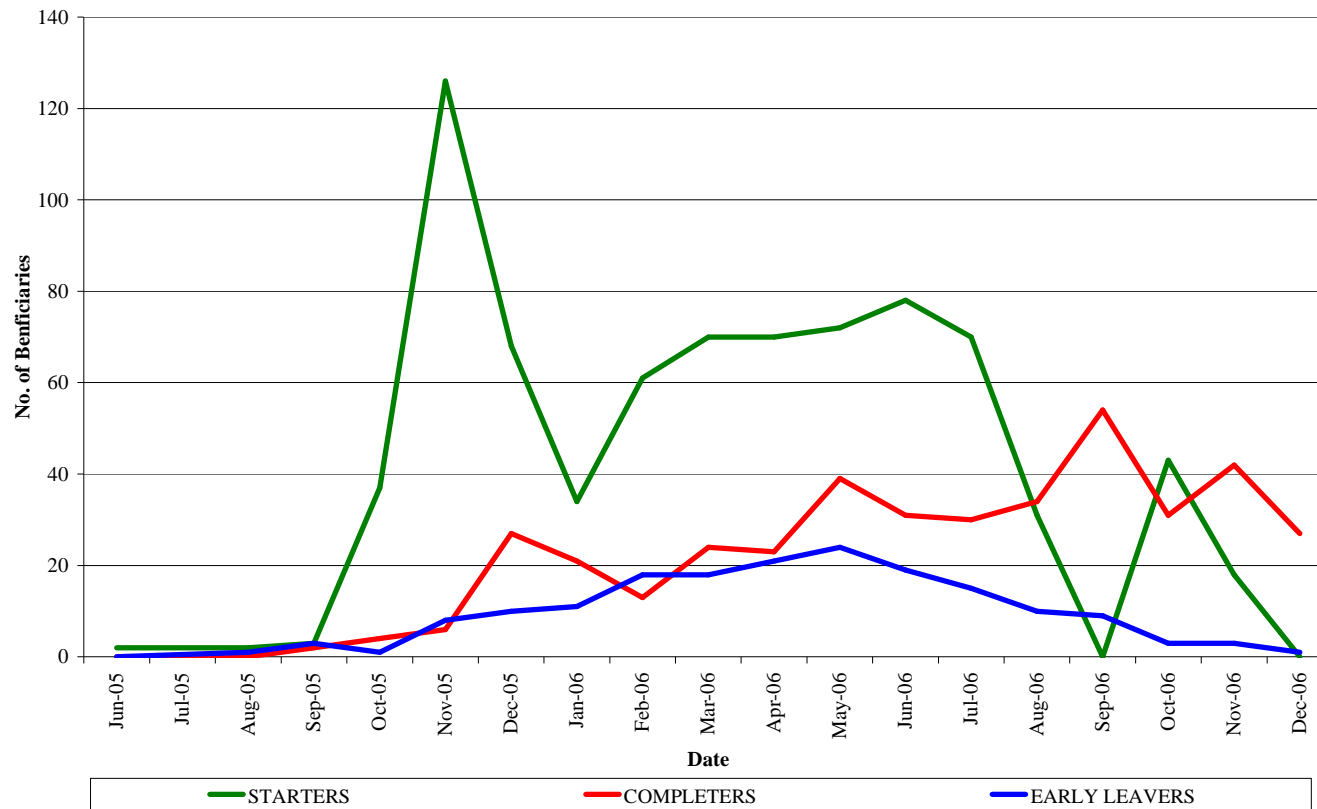

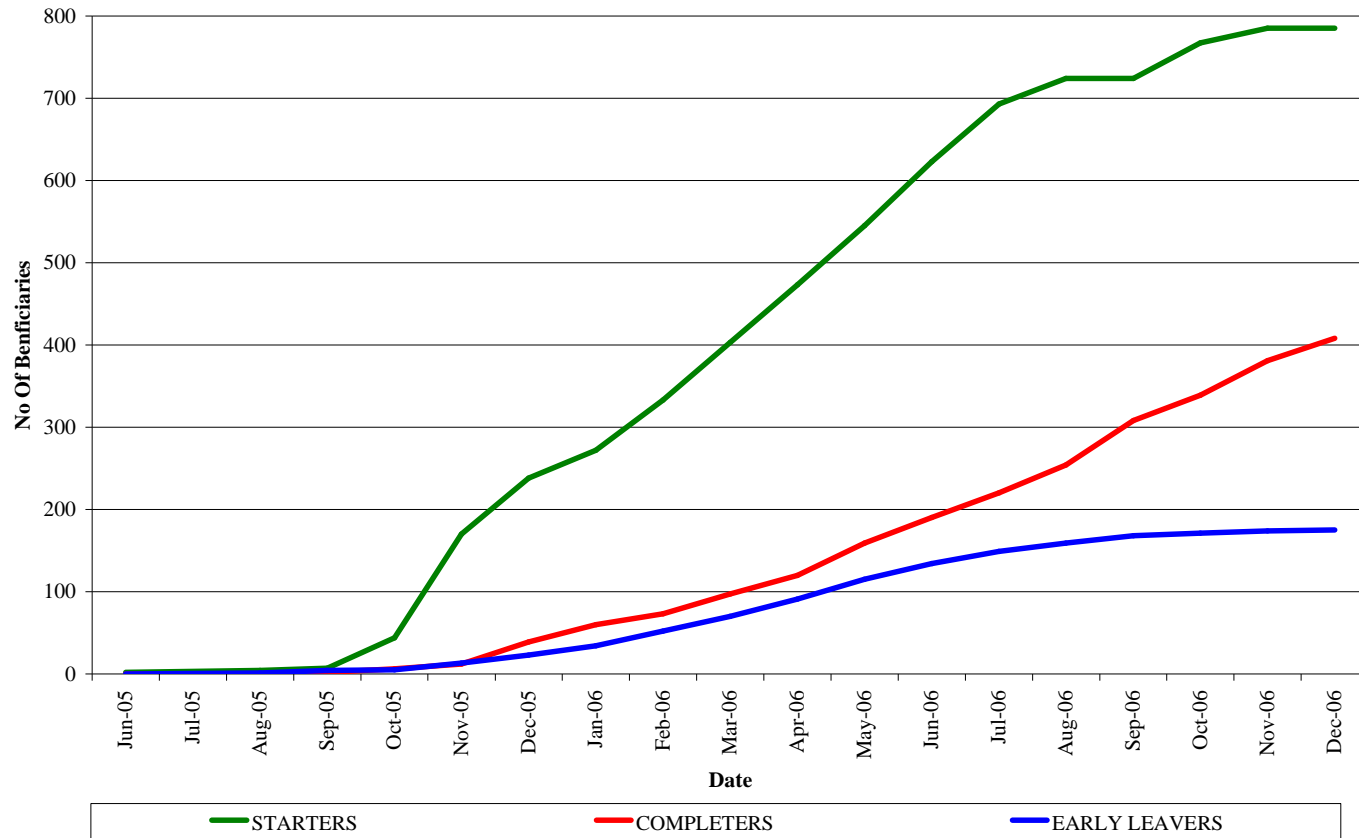

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



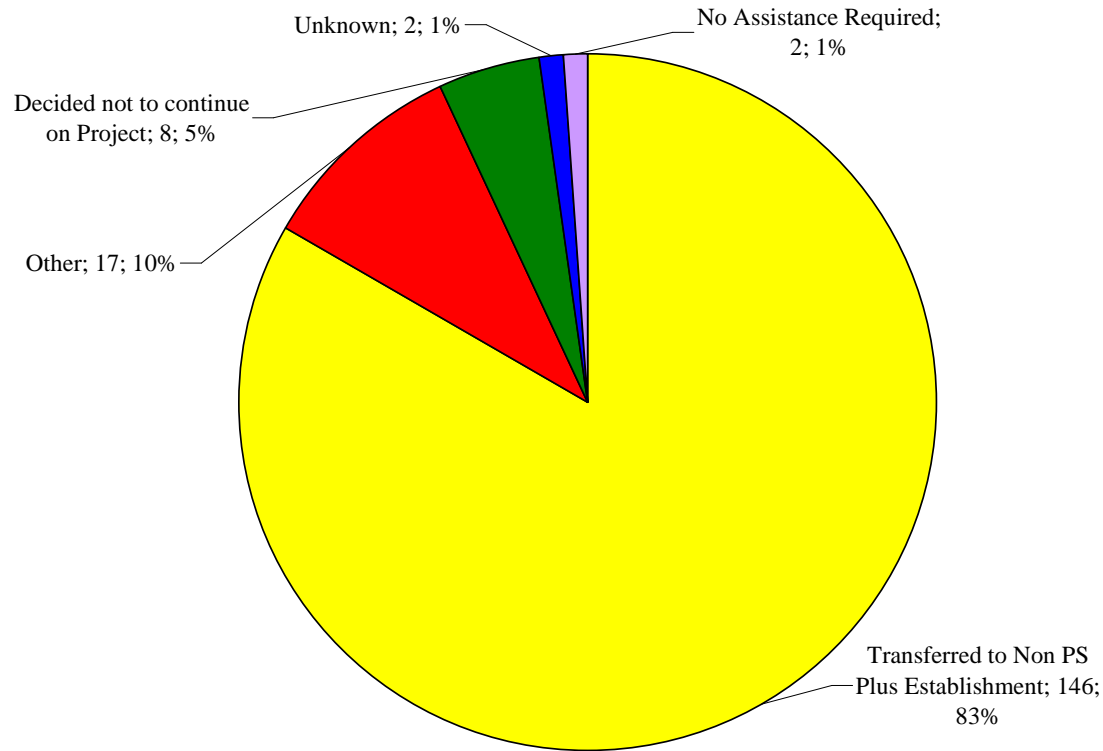
- Most months, Bristol started between 35 and 80 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- Up until the last 4 months of the project (project closure), no more than 40 beneficiaries were completing the PS plus 2 project per month.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Nearly 800 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Bristol.
- Approximately 600 beneficiaries finished in Bristol – 408 completed the project and 175 left the project early.

Reasons for Early Leavers

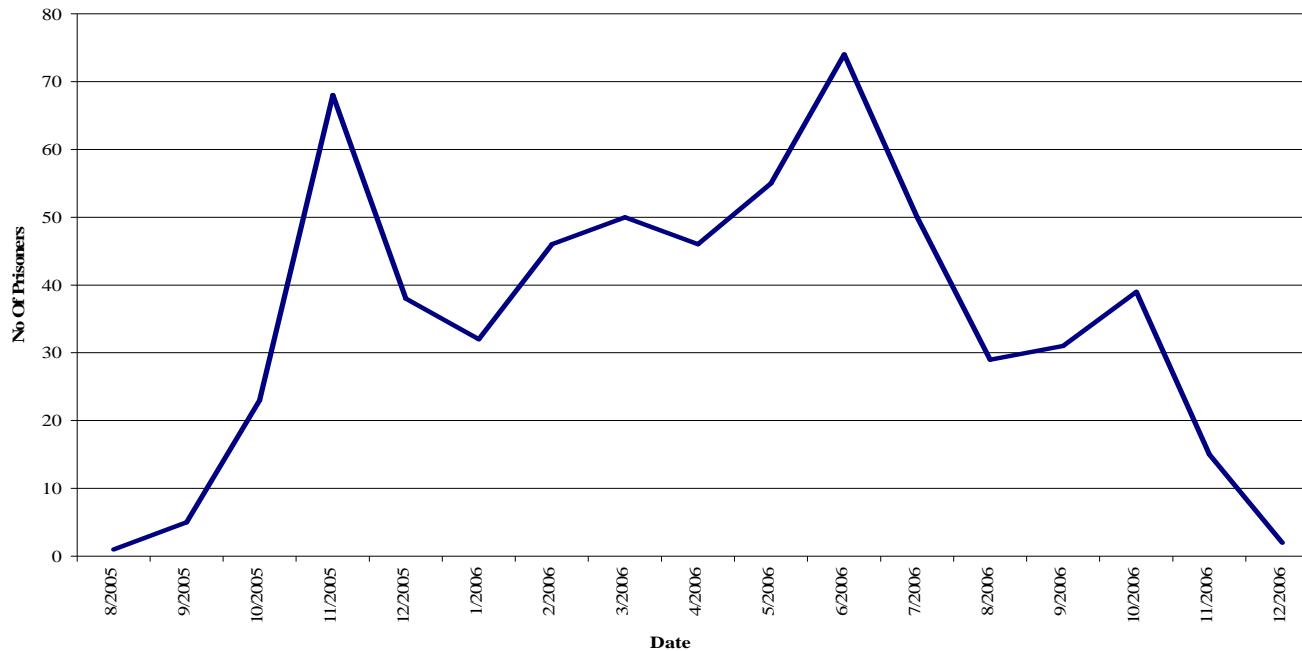


Other reasons given for beneficiaries leaving the project early:

- Of the 175 early leavers, 83% (146) transferred to a Non-PS Plus establishment.
- 5% (8) of the early leavers decided not to continue on the project.

Non-Starters Per Month

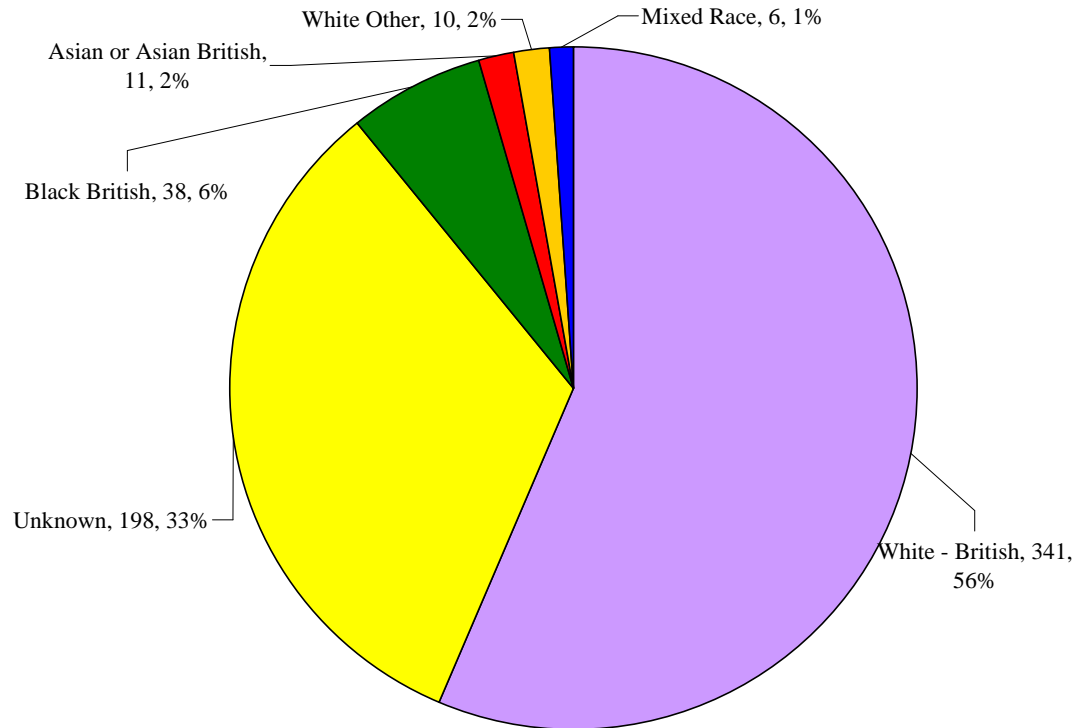

- Most months, over 30 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- In total, over 600 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Bristol.
- 148 of the prisoners not started in Bristol did not require PS Plus Services and 191 prisoners transferred before being started on the project (108 to a PS Plus establishment and 83 to a non-PS Plus establishment).

Ethnic Breakdown of prisoners not started



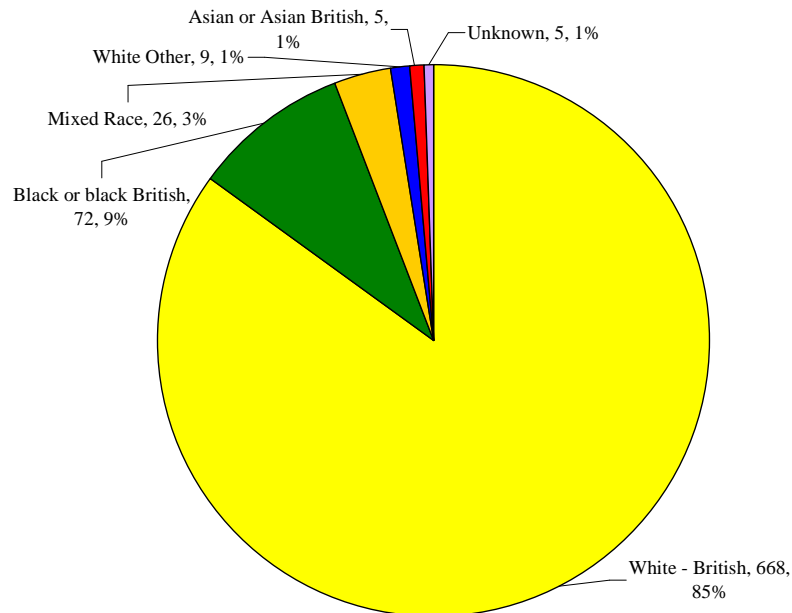

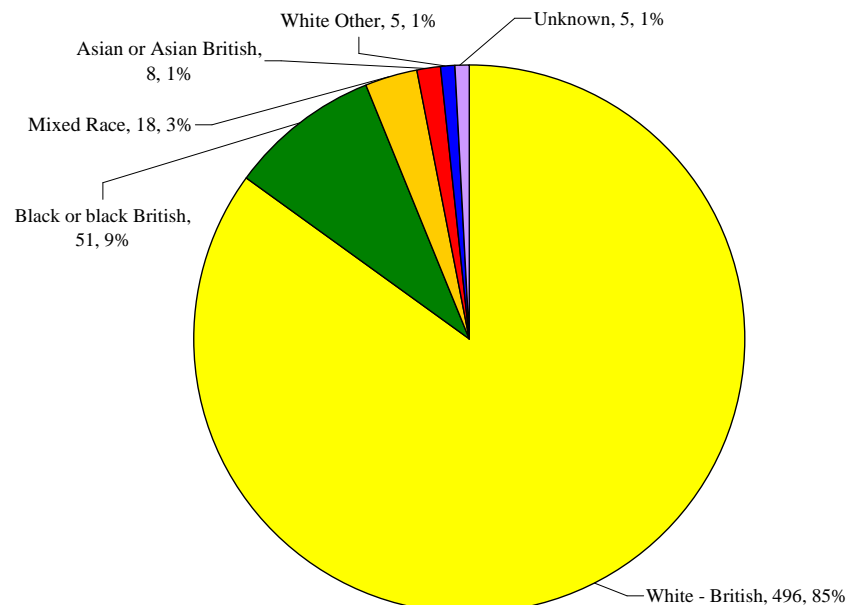
- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (56%) and from United Kingdom (84%).
- The ethnic origin for 1 in 3 and the nationality of 1 in 9 of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- Ethnic minorities account for 11% (65 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.

Finished in Bristol

- 85% (668) of the beneficiaries started and 85% (496) of the beneficiaries who finished in Bristol where White-British.
- 14% (112) of the beneficiaries who started and 14% (82) of the beneficiaries who finished in Bristol where from ethnic minorities.
- The ethnic origin of 5 beneficiaries who started (1%) and 5 beneficiaries who finished (1%) in Bristol is unknown.

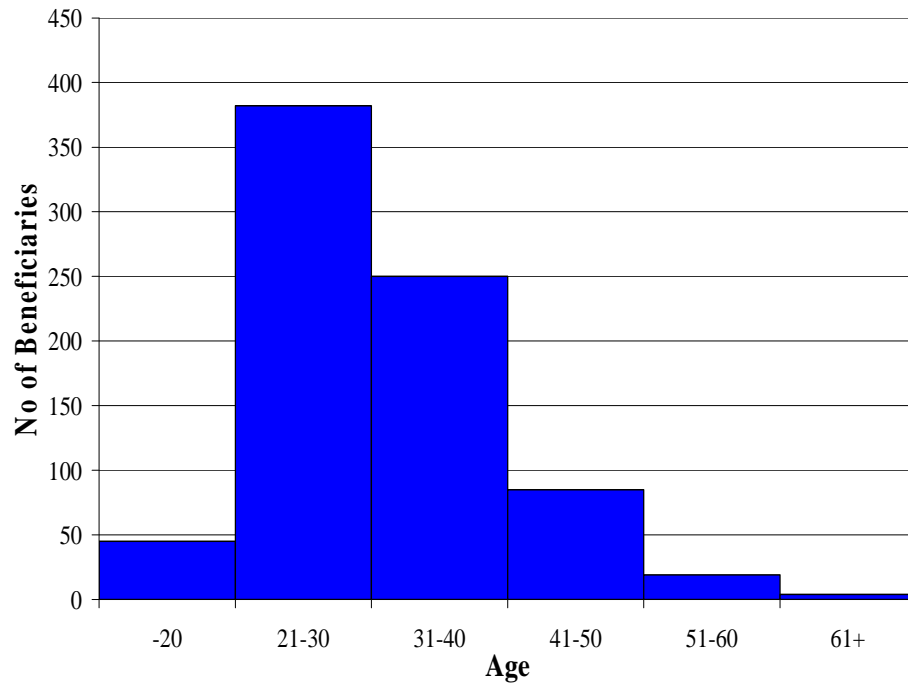

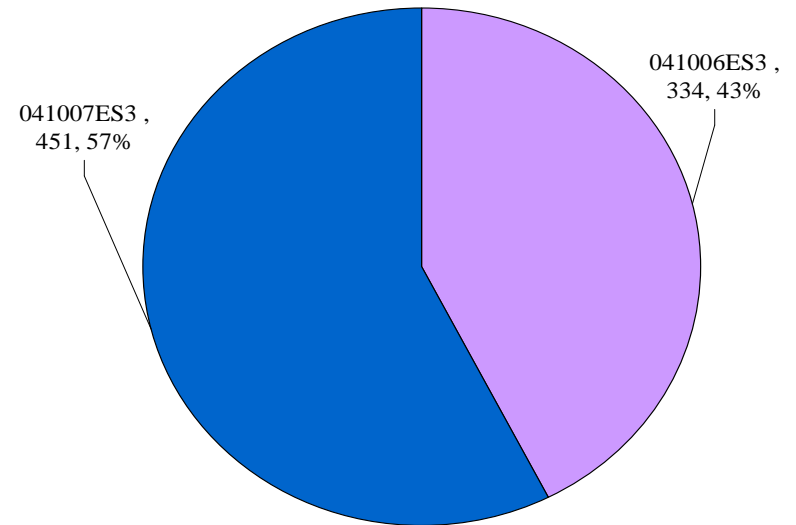

- 98% (772) of the beneficiaries started in Bristol stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- 98% (572) of the beneficiaries who finished in Bristol stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- The nationalities of 2 of the beneficiaries started in Bristol and 1 of the beneficiaries that finished in Bristol is unknown.

Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2



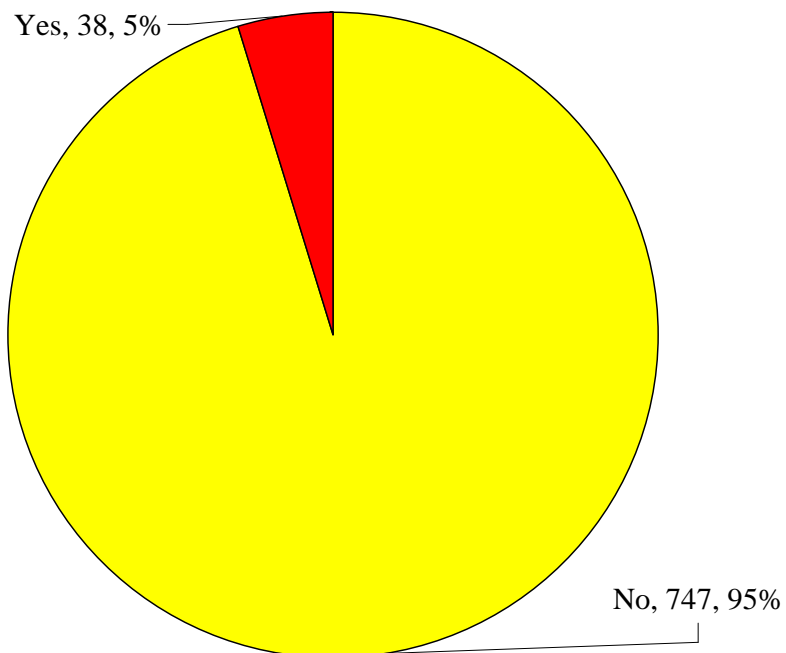
Age Breakdown



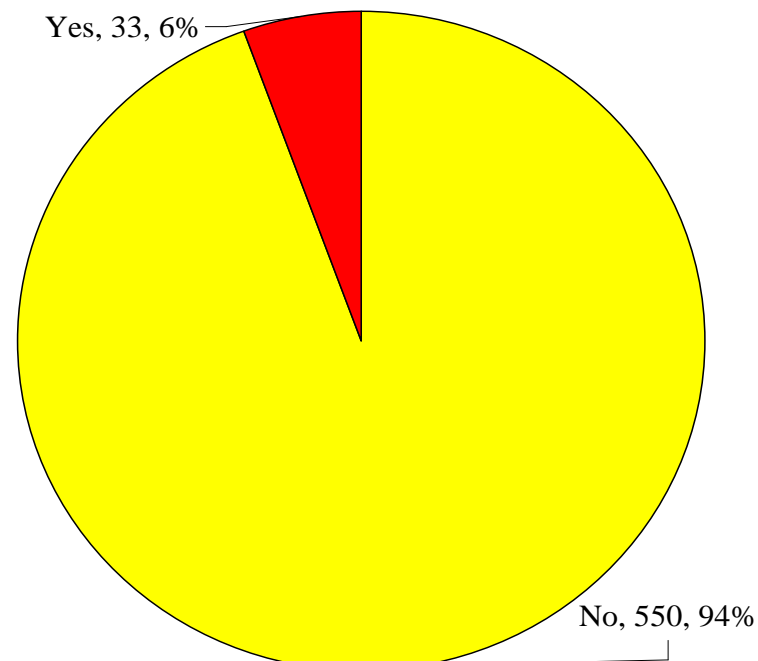
Dossier Number Breakdown

- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Bristol is 31 years and 2 months. The average (mode) age group is 21 – 30 years old.
- 57% (451) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041007ES3 (male beneficiaries aged 28 and over).

Disabled Beneficiaries



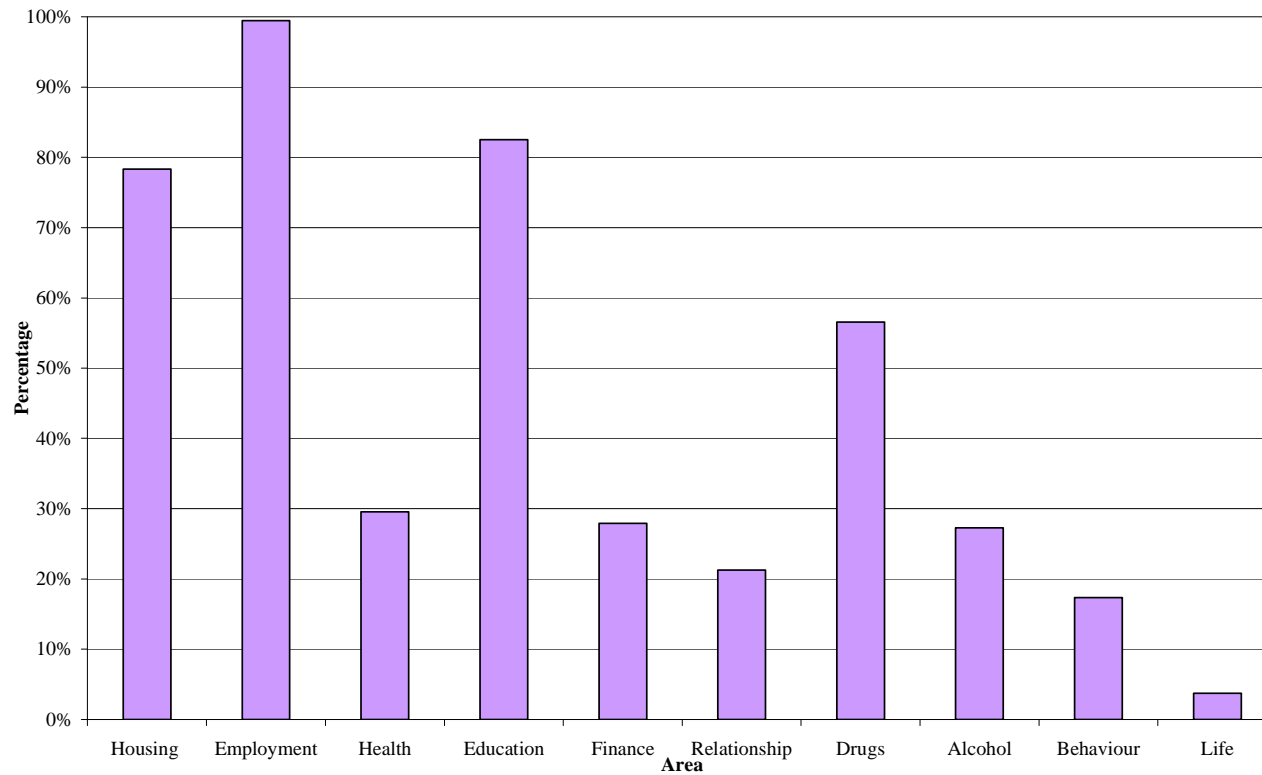

Beneficiaries Finishing in Bristol

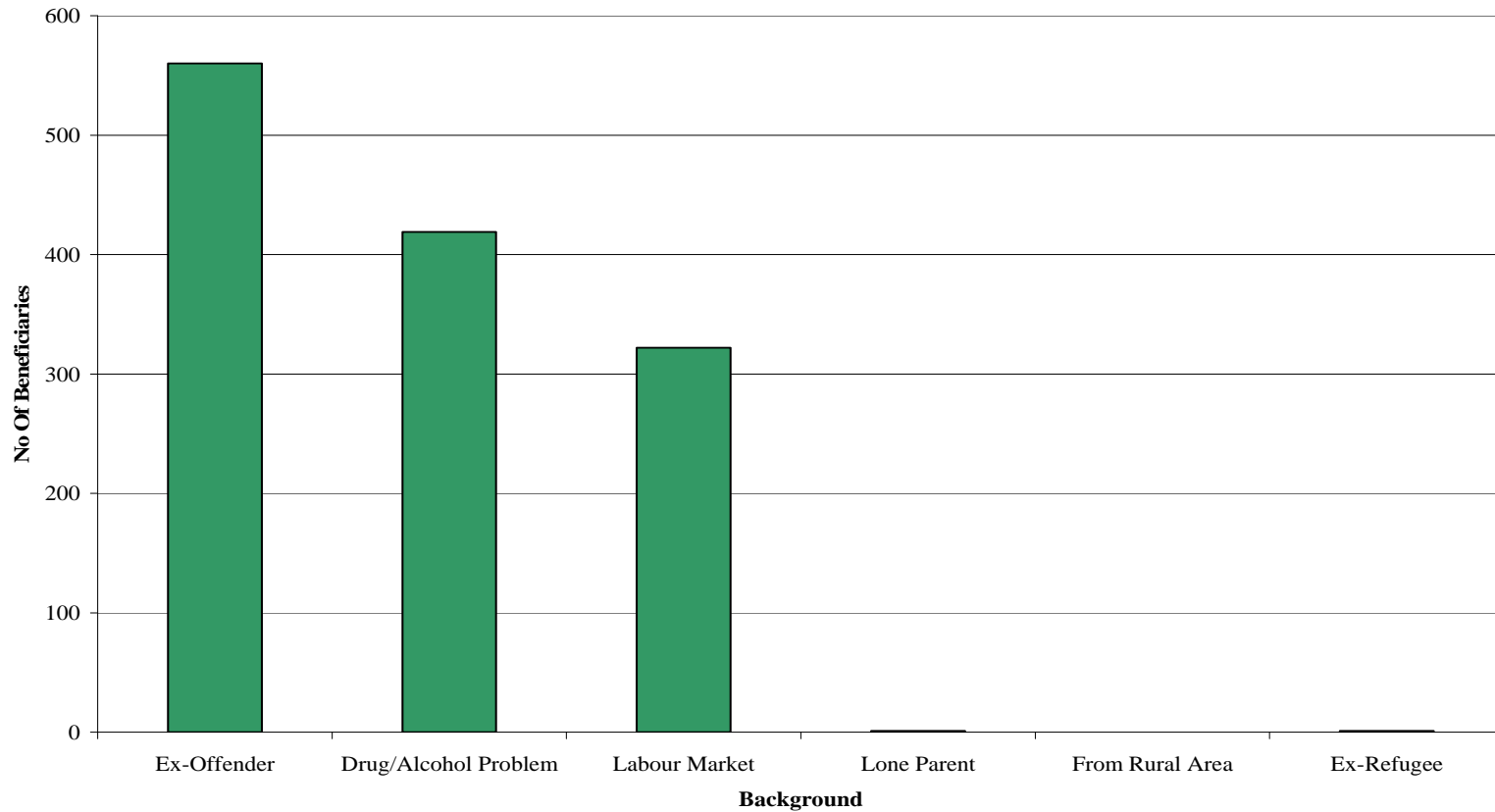
- 5% (38) of the beneficiaries who started in Bristol were classified as being disabled.
- 6% (33) of the beneficiaries who finished in Bristol were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Bristol



- Nearly 10% of the beneficiaries who started in Bristol needed help with employment.
- Over 80% of the beneficiaries who started in Bristol needed help with education.
- Over 50% of the beneficiaries who started in Bristol needed help with drug issues.

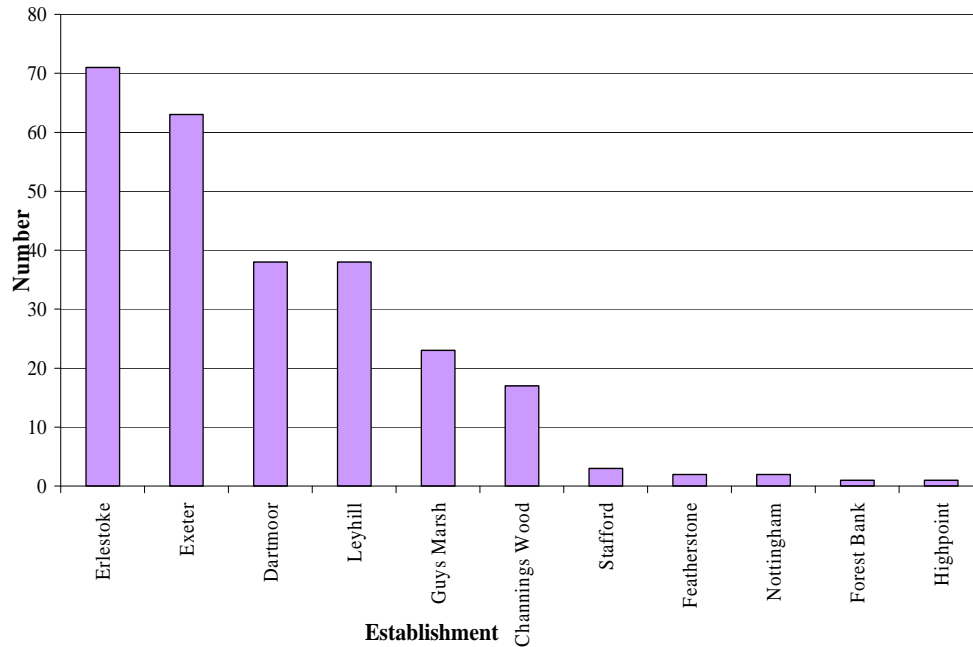
Beneficiary Background



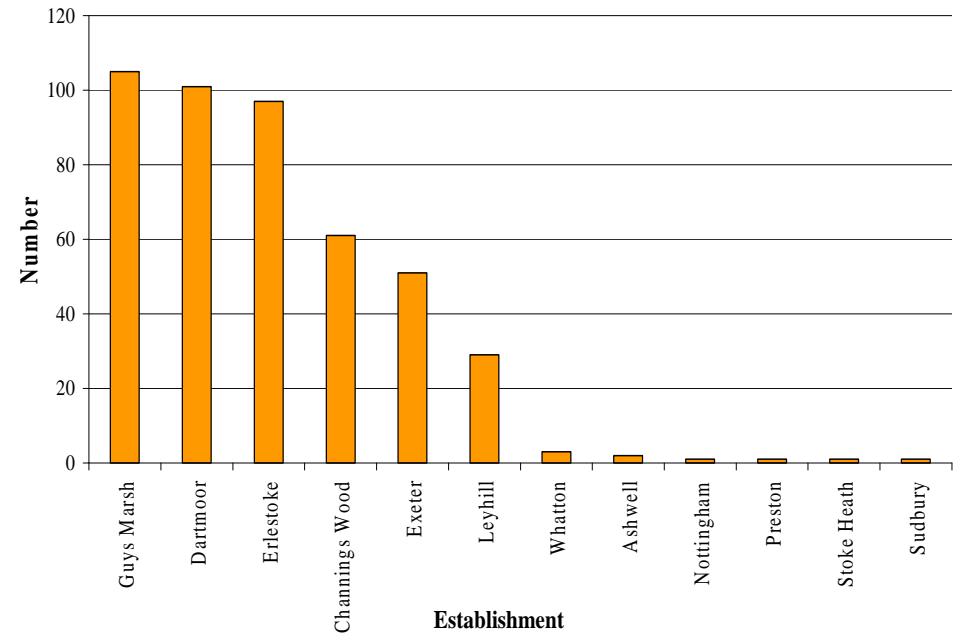
- Over 550 of the beneficiaries who started in Bristol were ex-offenders.
- Over 400 of the beneficiaries who started in Bristol had a drug or alcohol problem.

Transfers into Bristol

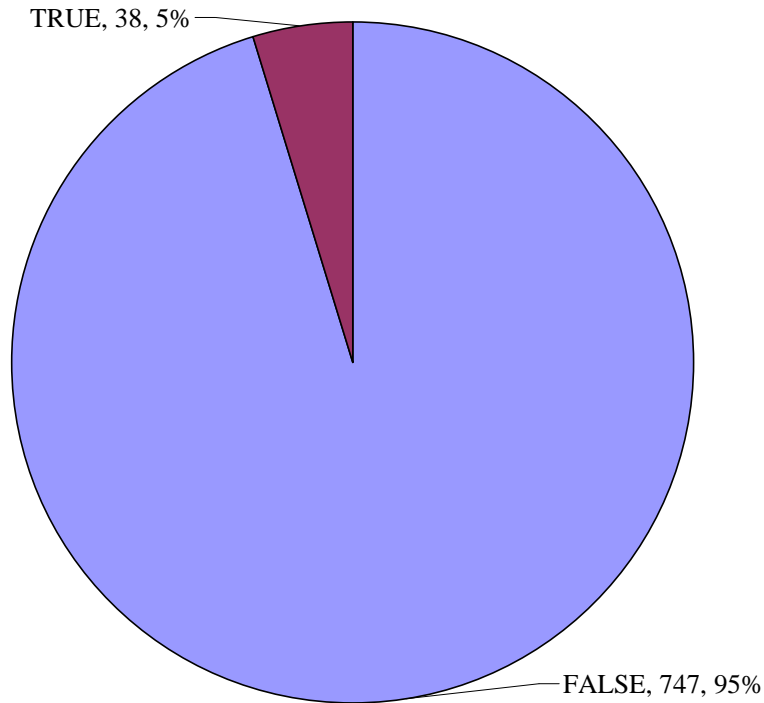


Transfers from Bristol

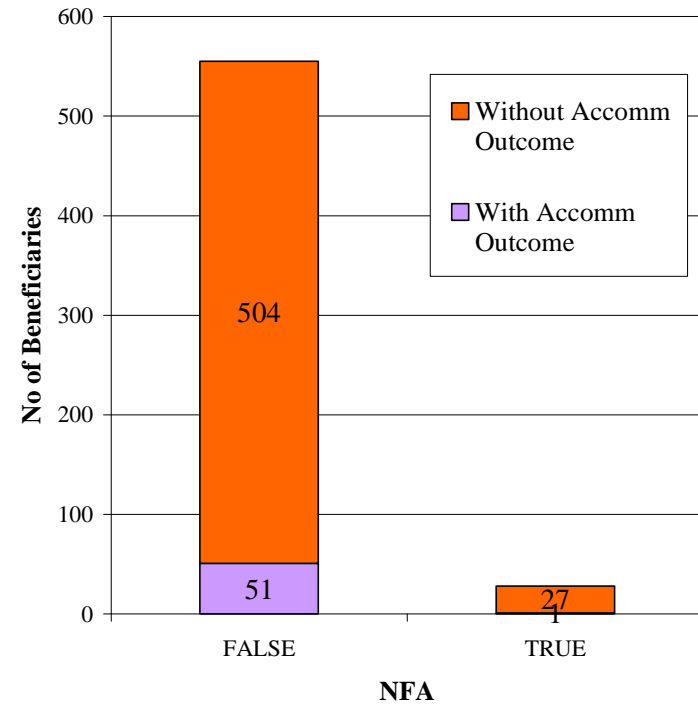


- 264 beneficiaries have transferred into Bristol – 80% transferred to Bristol from Erlestoke, Exeter, Dartmoor, or Leyhill.
- 453 beneficiaries have transferred from Bristol – 80% transferred from Bristol to Guys Marsh, Dartmoor, Erlestoke or Channings Wood.

Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode

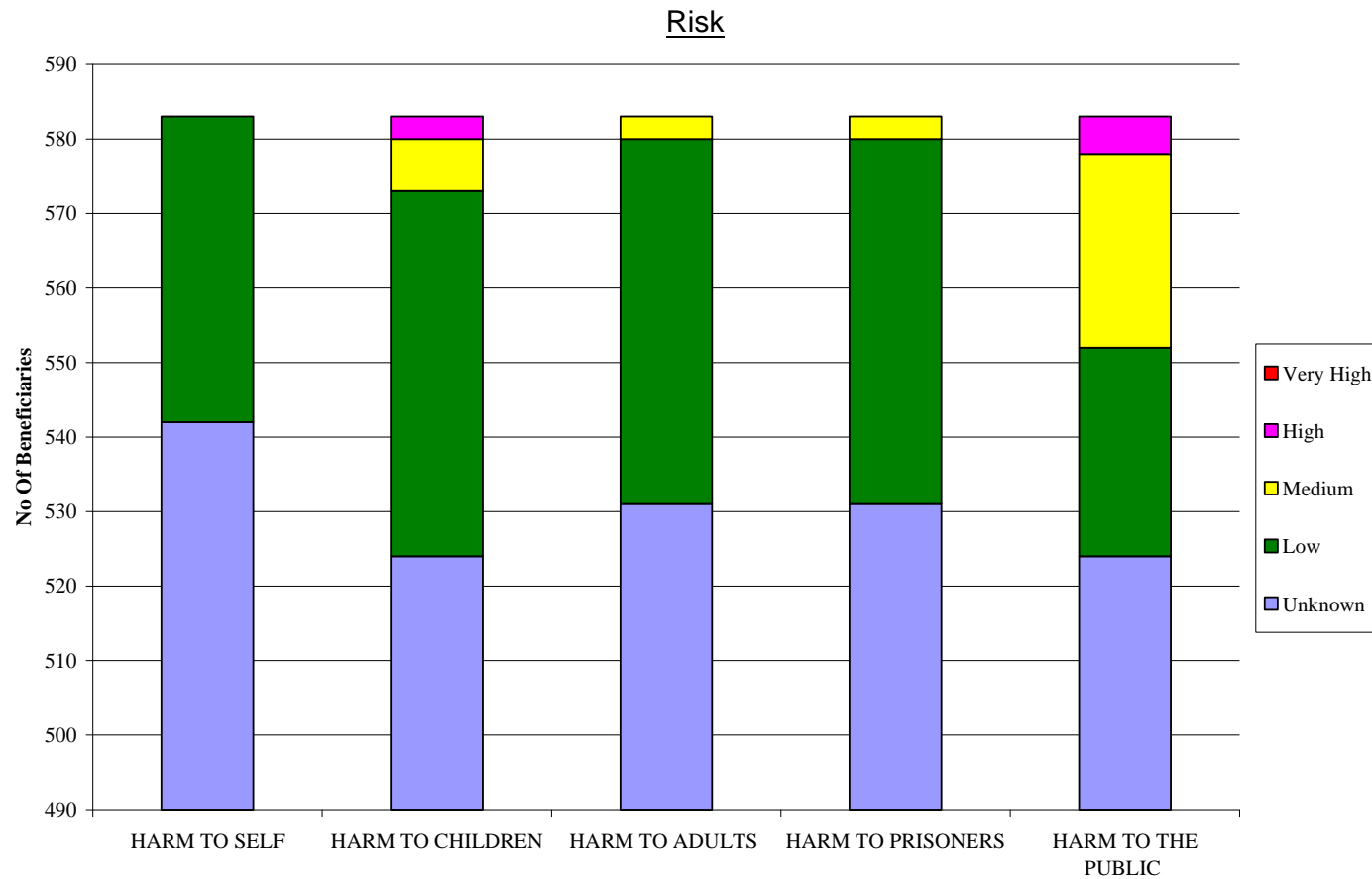


Beneficiaries Starting in Bristol



Beneficiaries Finishing in Bristol

- 5% (38) of the beneficiaries started in Bristol were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 28 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project, of which one had an accommodation outcome secured.



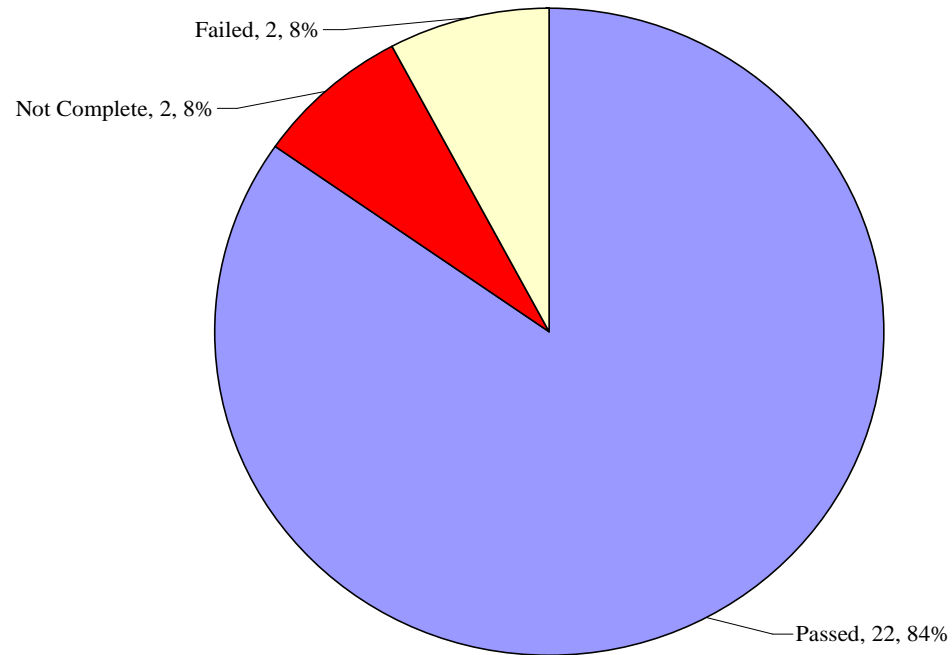
- For over 520 beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners.

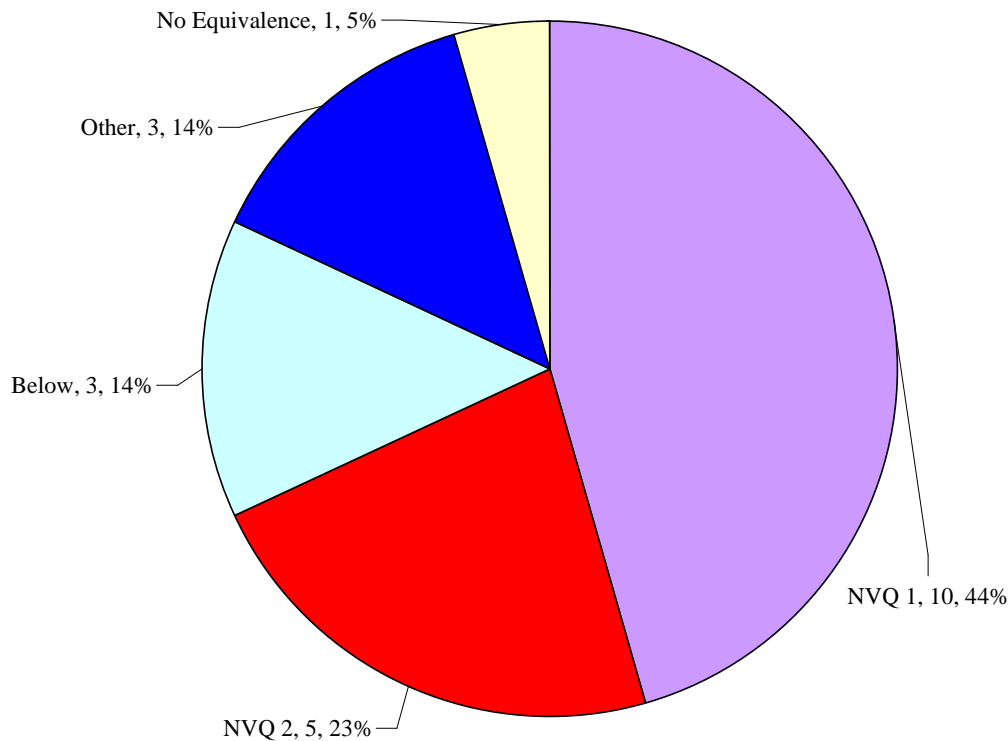
- 484 soft outcomes were gained by Bristol beneficiaries.
- 124 beneficiaries had IAG assistance.
- 81 beneficiaries attended ECDL.
- Beneficiaries in Bristol attended 29 interviews – Further Education, Homeless and Job interviews.
- 9 beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiary Access Fund.

Exam Results



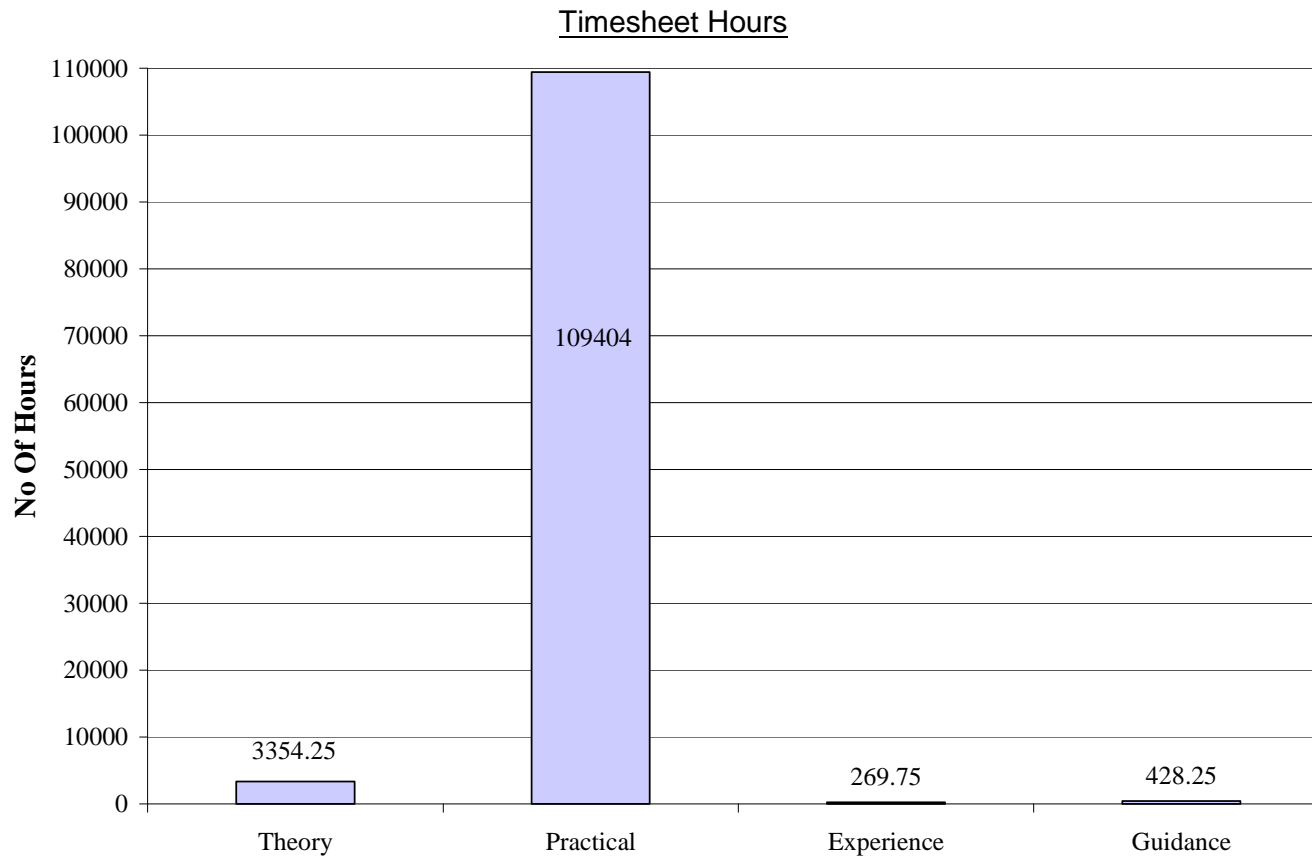
- 84% (22) of the exams taken were passed.

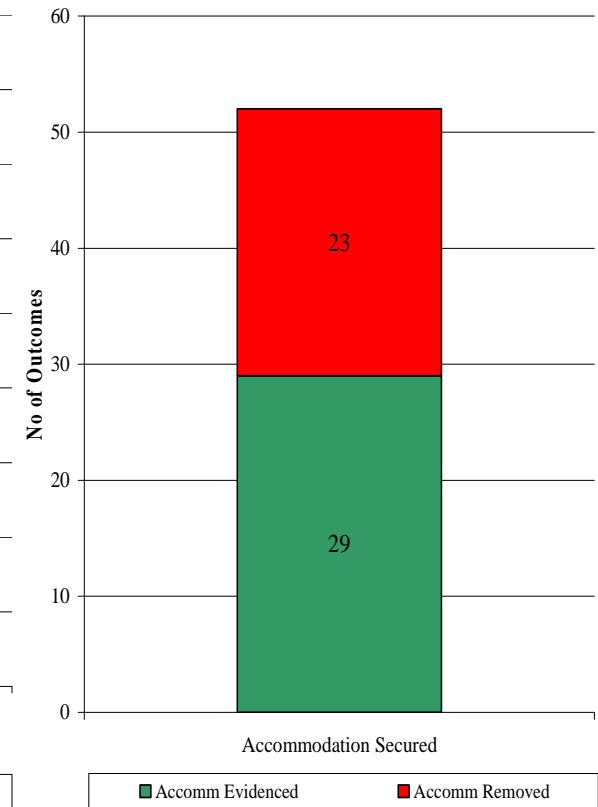
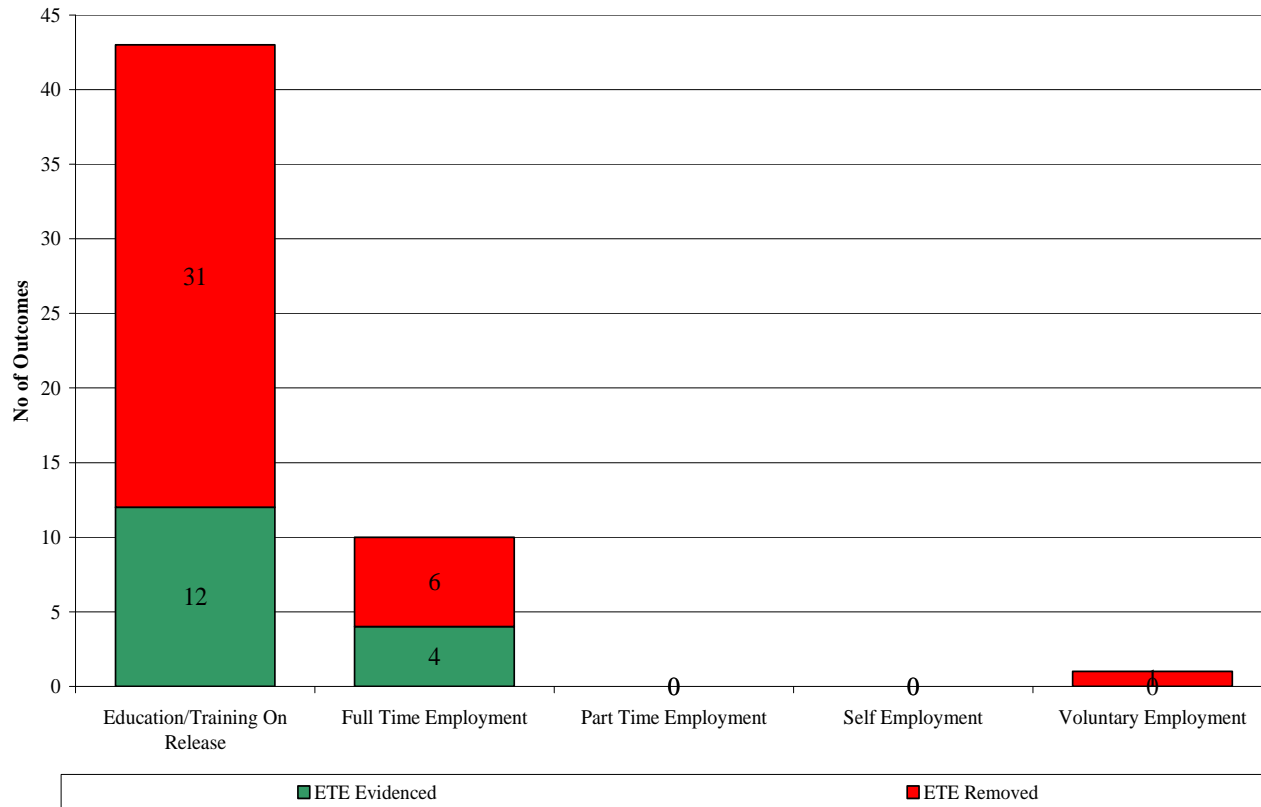

- o 15 NVQ levels 1 and 2 have been gained by beneficiaries in Bristol.
- o 7 adult Literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Bristol.



- 113,456 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 109,404 (96%) hours collected were for practical activities.

Hard Outcomes



- 54 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Bristol with evidence for 16 of these outcomes (30% evidence for outcome rate).
- 52 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 29 outcomes (56% evidence for outcome rate).
