

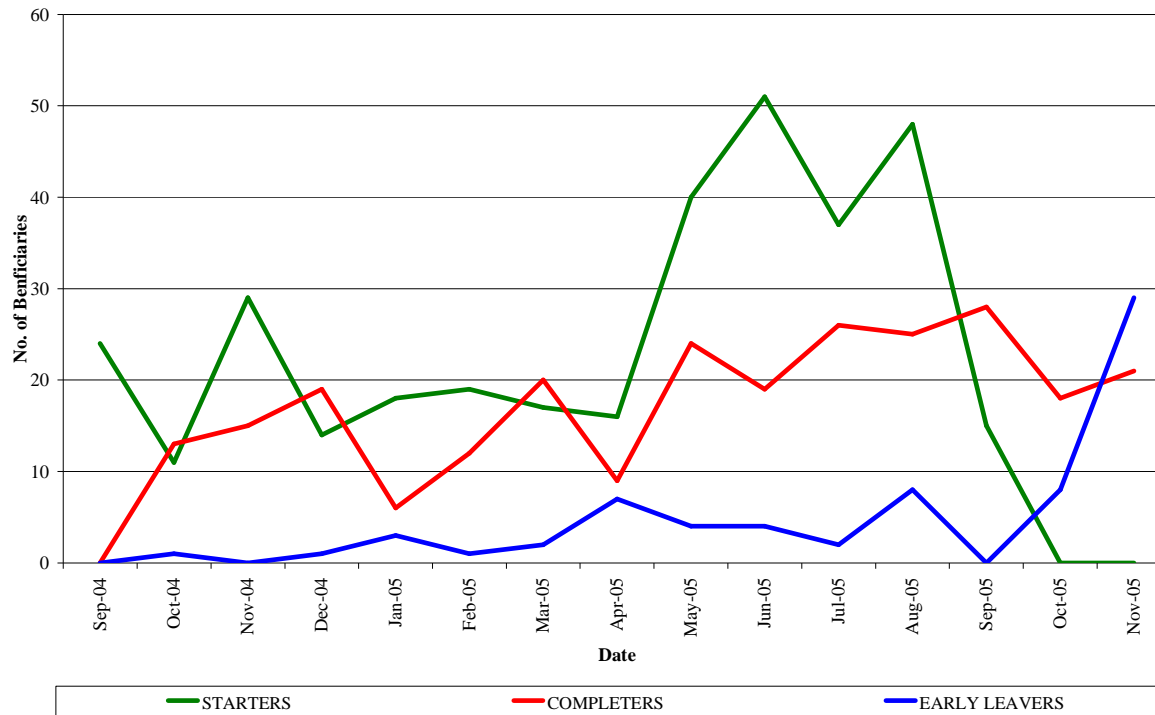

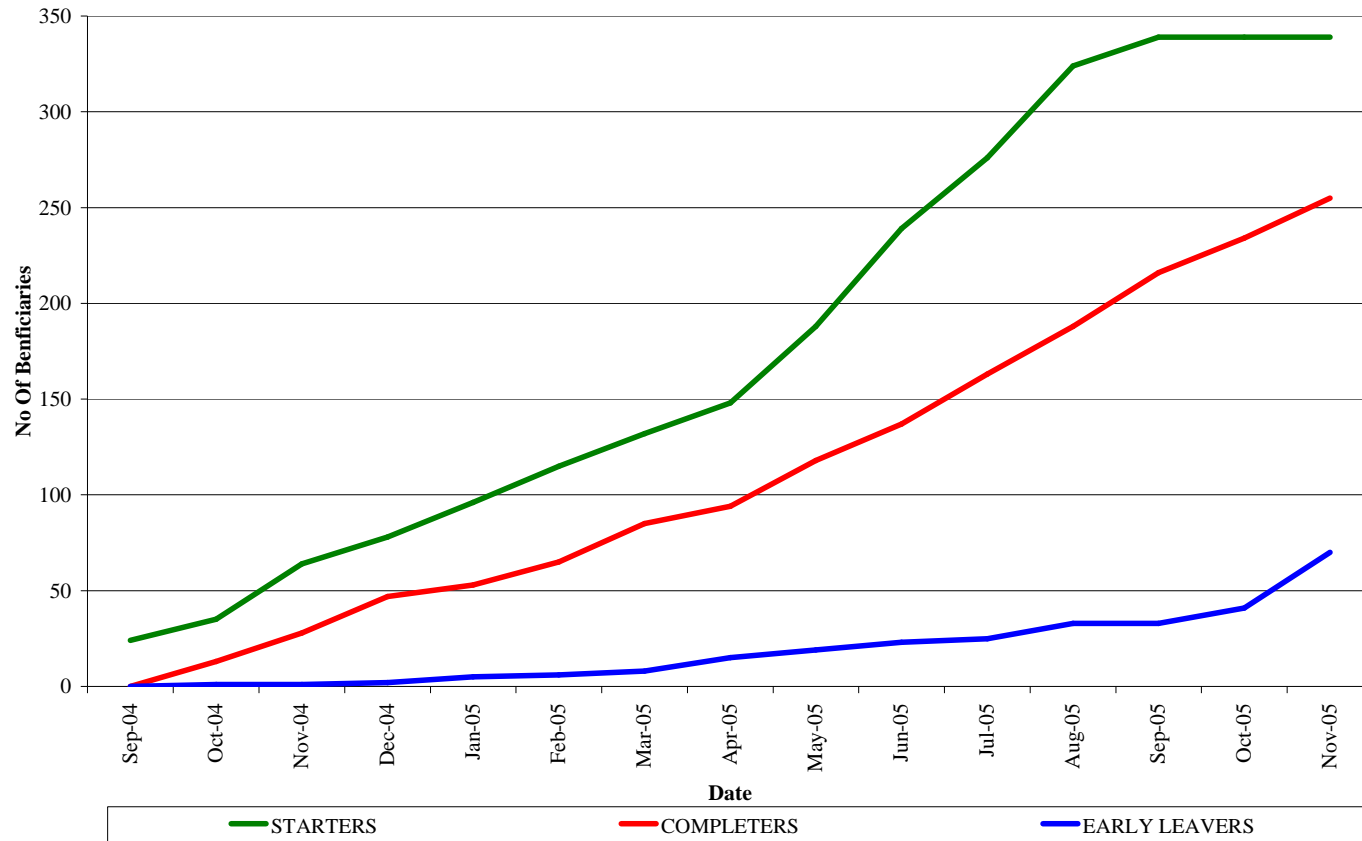

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



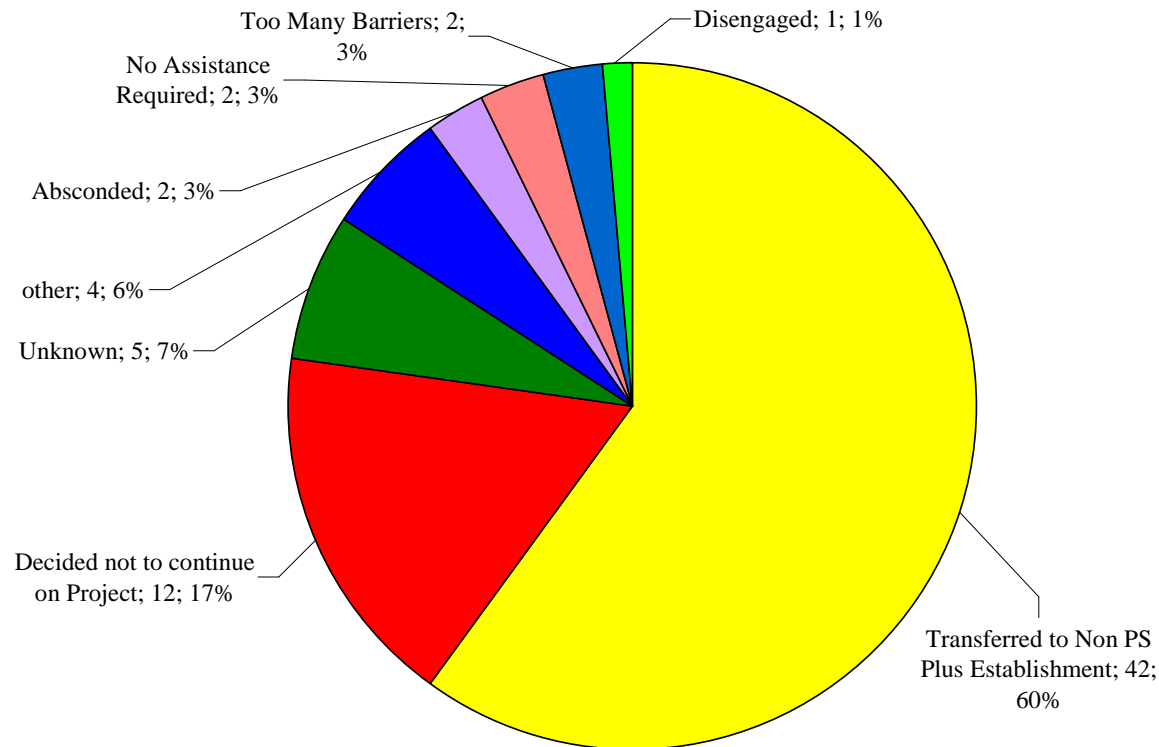
- For the first few months, Buckley Hall (F) started less than 30 beneficiaries per month, but from May 2005, up to 51 beneficiaries were started per month, until HMP Buckley Hall became a male establishment in December 2005.
- Up until the last month of the project, the number of Early Leaver remaining below 10. As the changeover to a male establishment occurred, more beneficiaries transferred to other PS Plus establishments, increasing the number of early leavers.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Nearly 350 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Buckley Hall (F).
- 325 beneficiaries finished in Buckley Hall (F) – 255 completed the project and 70 left the project early.

Reasons for Early Leavers



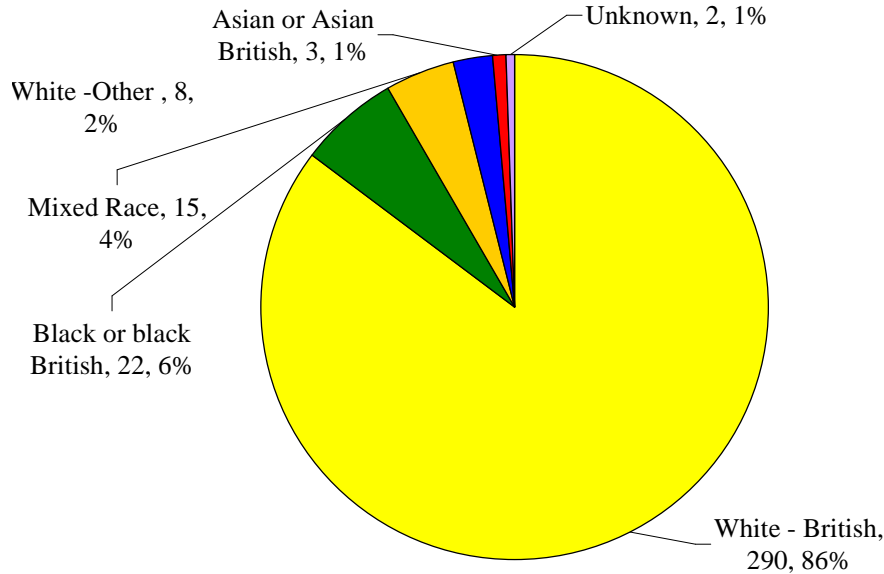
Other reasons given for beneficiaries leaving the project early:

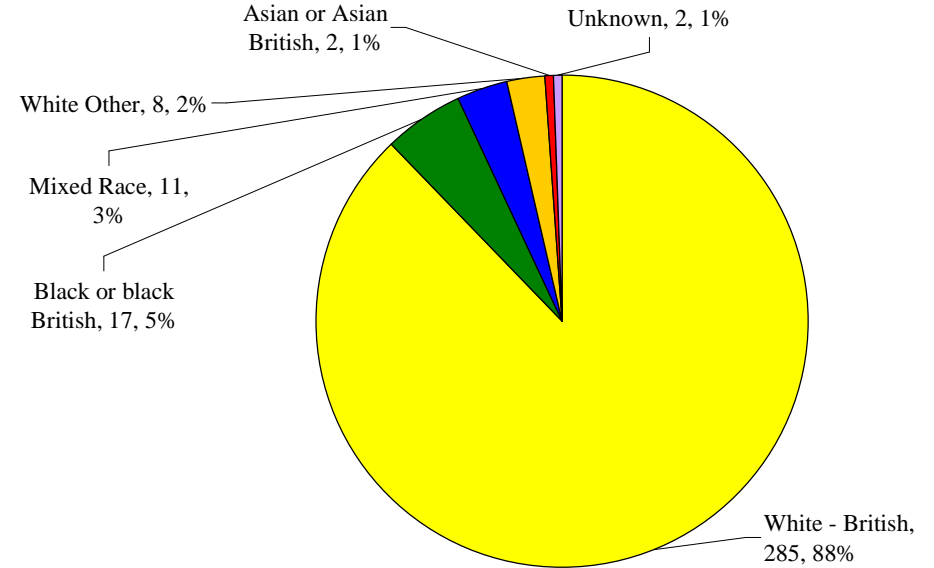
- Of the 70 early leavers, 60% (42) transferred to a Non-PS Plus establishment.
- 17% (12) of early leavers decided not to continue on the project.
- 2 of the early leavers did not require any assistance from PS Plus.

- 86% (290) of the beneficiaries started and 88% (285) who finished in Buckley Hall (F) were White-British.
- 13% (48) of the beneficiaries started and 11% (38) who finished in Buckley Hall (F) were from ethnic minorities.
- The ethnic origin of 2 beneficiaries who started and 2 beneficiaries who finished in Buckley Hall (F) is unknown.

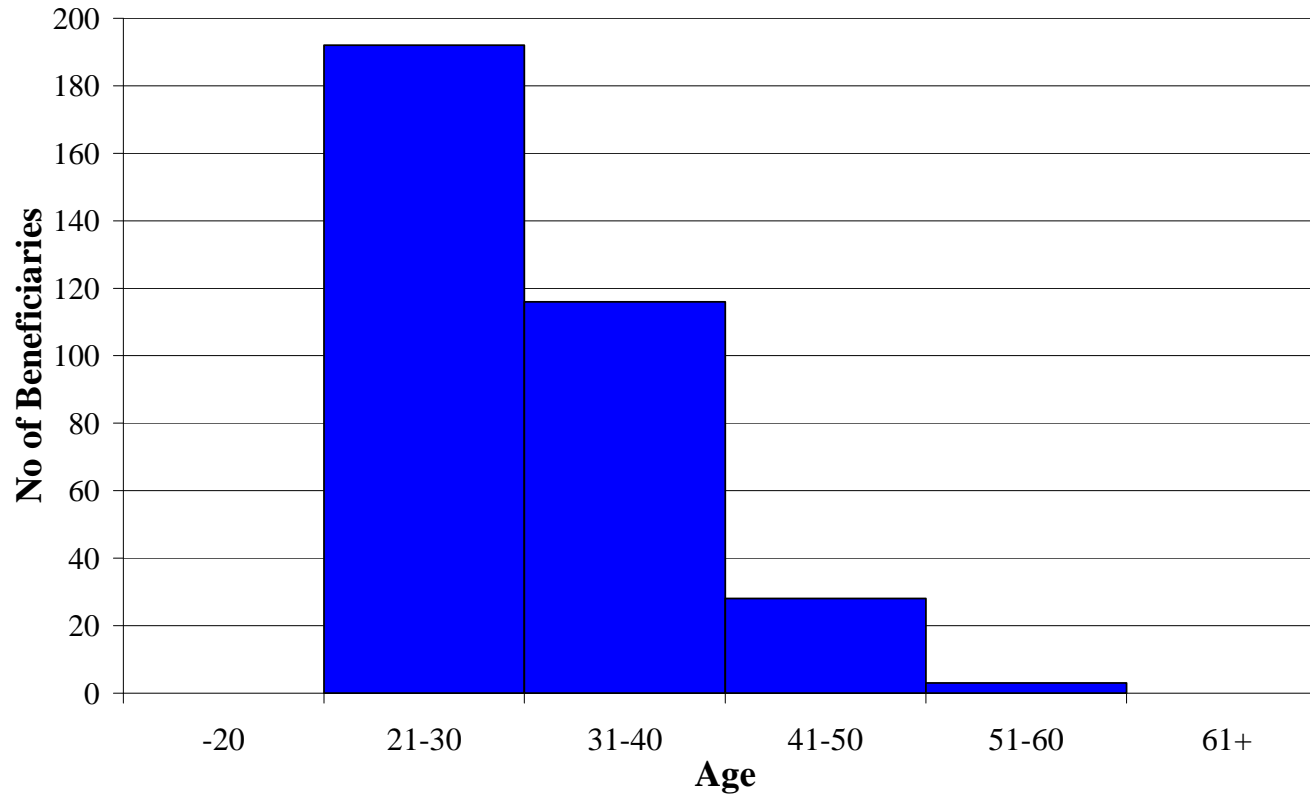

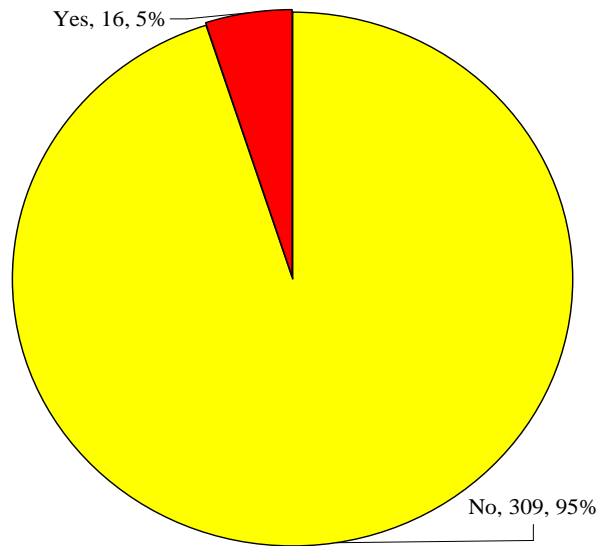
- 54% (184) of the beneficiaries started in Buckley Hall (F) stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- 35% (114) of the beneficiaries who finished in Buckley Hall (F) stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- The nationalities of 154 (45%) of the beneficiaries started in Buckley Hall (F) and 211 (65%) of the beneficiaries that finished in Buckley Hall (F) is unknown.

Age of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2

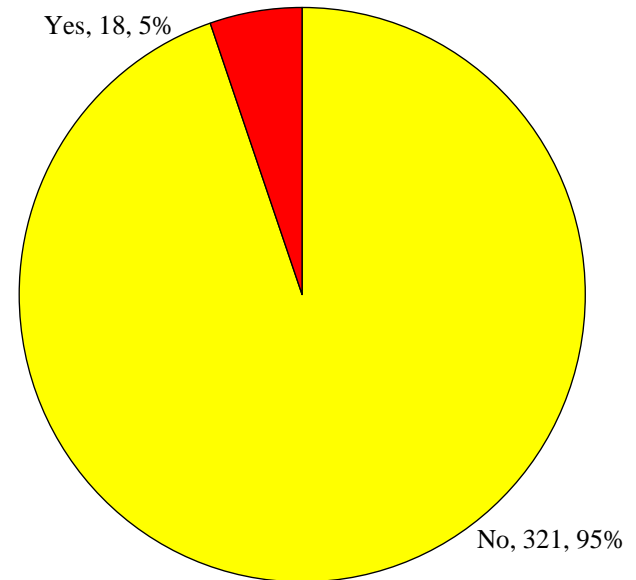


- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Buckley Hall (F) is 30 years and 7 months. The average (mode) age group is 21 – 30 years old.
- There are no beneficiaries in Buckley Hall (F) under the age of 20 or over the age of 61.

Disabled Beneficiaries



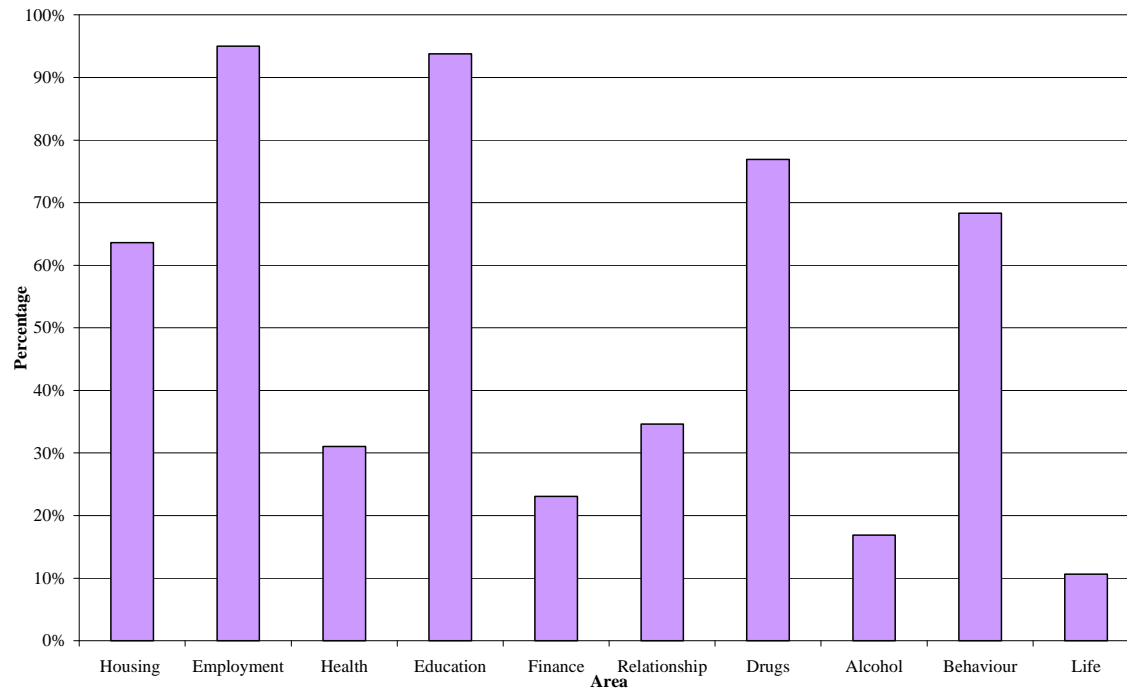
Beneficiaries Starting in Buckley Hall (F)



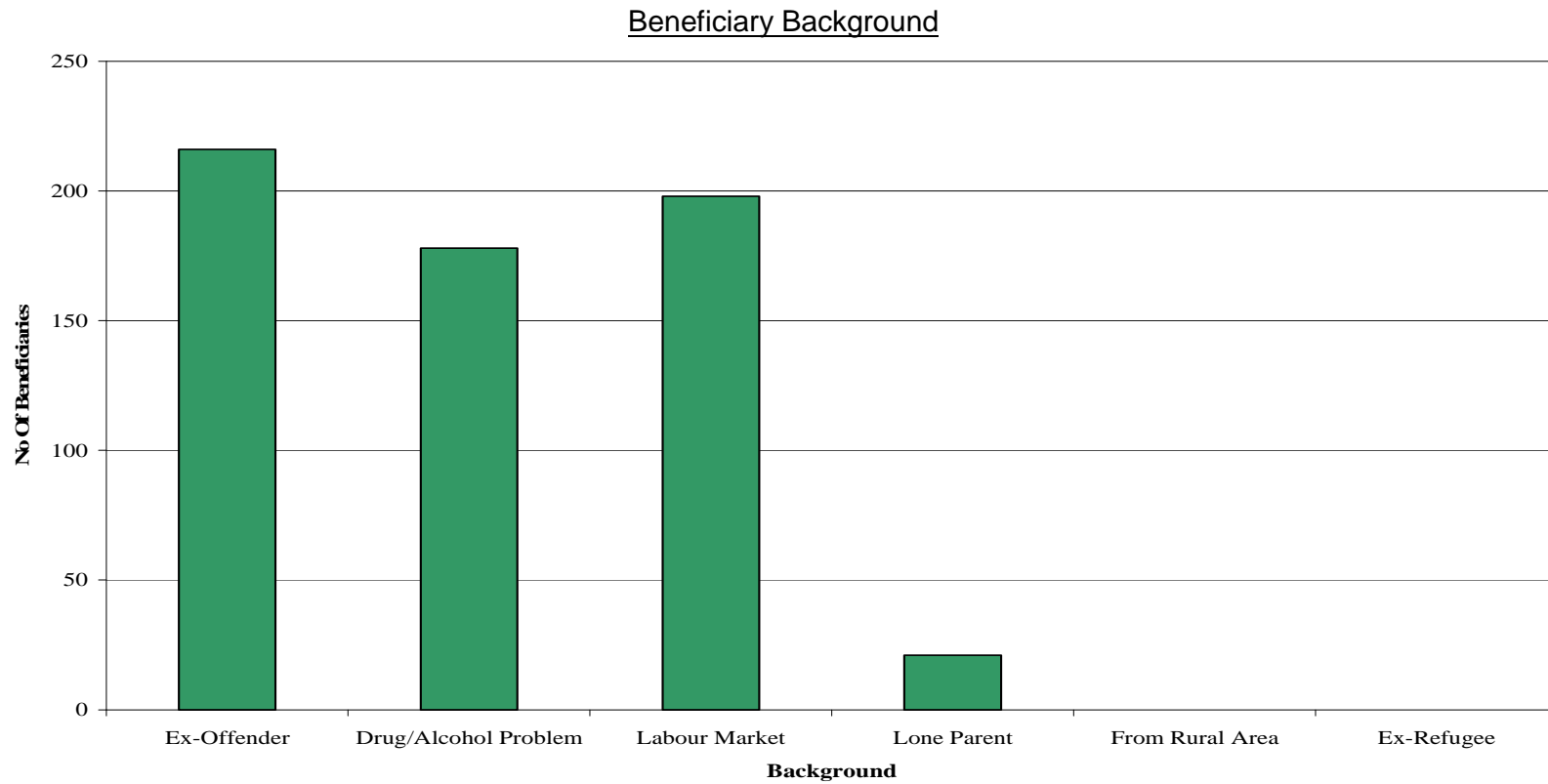
Beneficiaries Finishing in Buckley Hall (F)

- 5% (16) of the beneficiaries who started in Buckley Hall (F) were classified as being disabled.
- 5% (18) of the beneficiaries who finished in Buckley Hall (F) were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Buckley Hall (F)

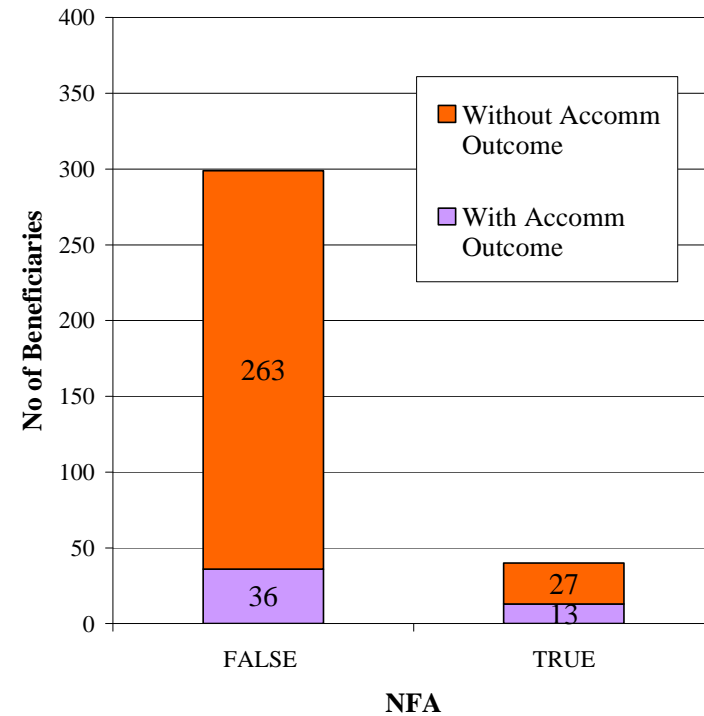
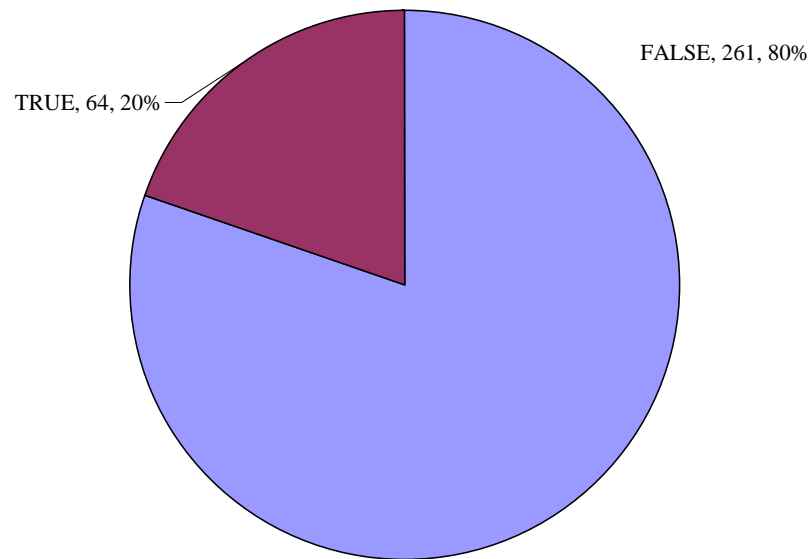


- Over 90% of the beneficiaries who started in Buckley Hall (F) needed help with employment and over 90% needed help with education.
- Over 70% of the beneficiaries who started in Buckley Hall (F) needed help with drug issues.
- Over 60% of the beneficiaries who started in Buckley Hall (F) need help with housing issues.



- Nearly 200 of the beneficiaries who started in Buckley Hall (F) were on the labour market.
- 178 of the beneficiaries who started in Buckley Hall (F) had a drug or alcohol problem.
- 21 of the beneficiaries who started in Buckley Hall (F) were lone parents.

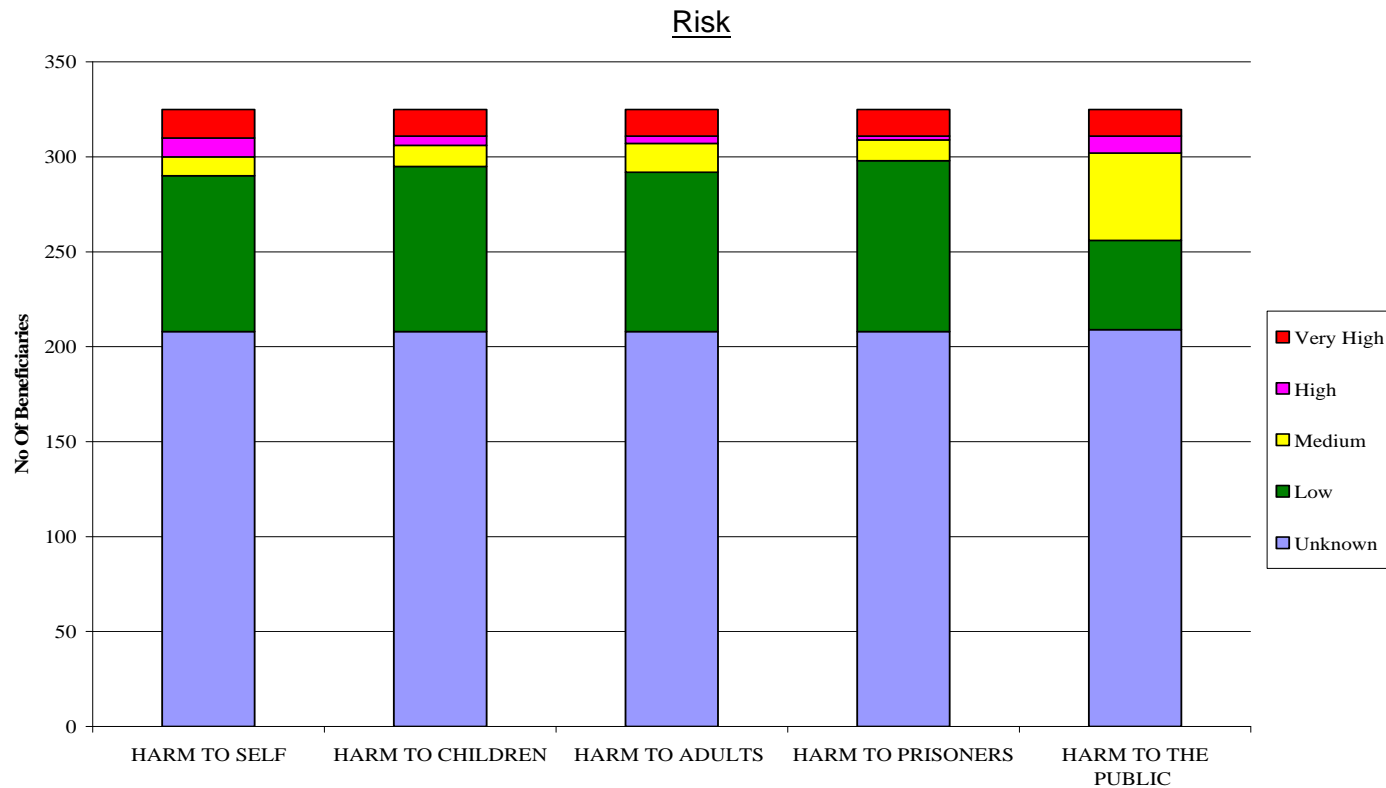
Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode



Beneficiaries Starting in Buckley Hall (F)

- 20% (64) of the beneficiaries started in Buckley Hall (F) were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 40 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode, of which 13 had an accommodation outcome secured.

Beneficiaries Finishing in Buckley Hall (F)

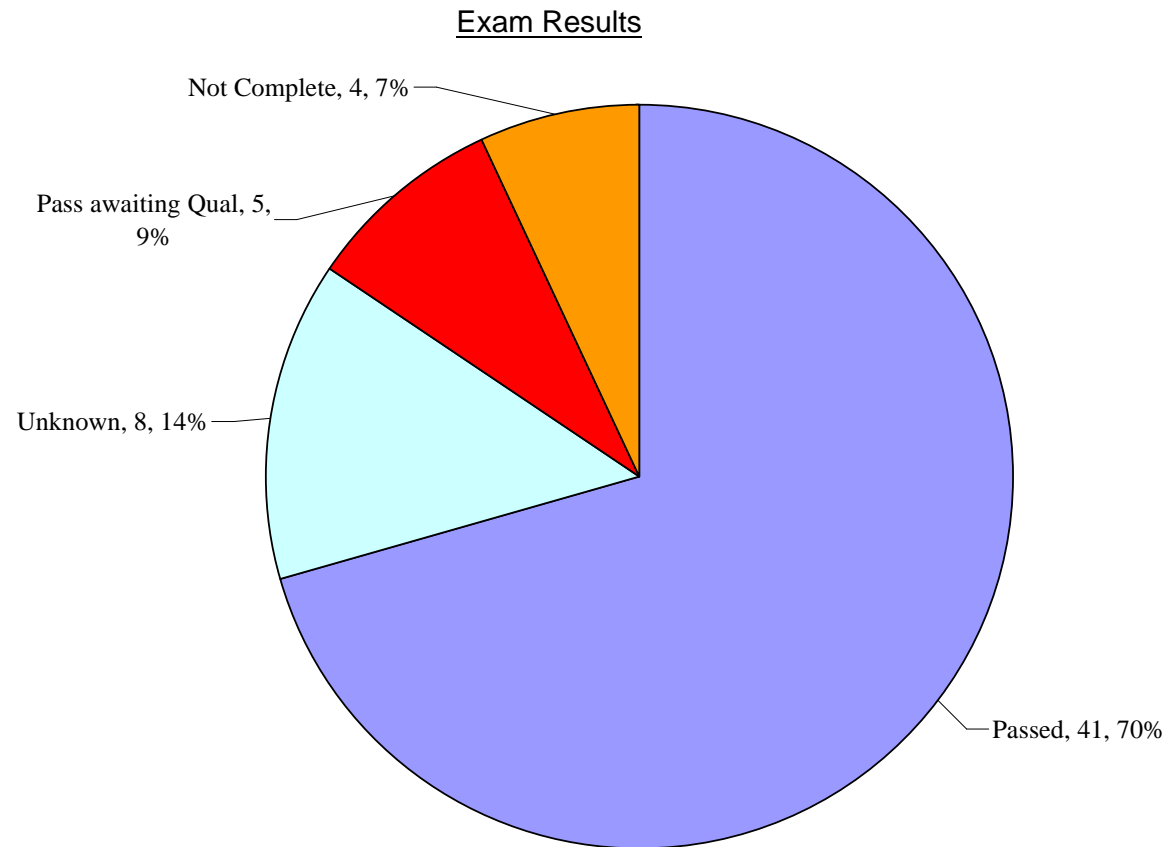


- For over 200 beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners.
- There are 14 beneficiaries whose risk is classed as “very high” to harm children, adults, prisoners and public, and 15 beneficiaries with “very high” risk of harm to themselves.

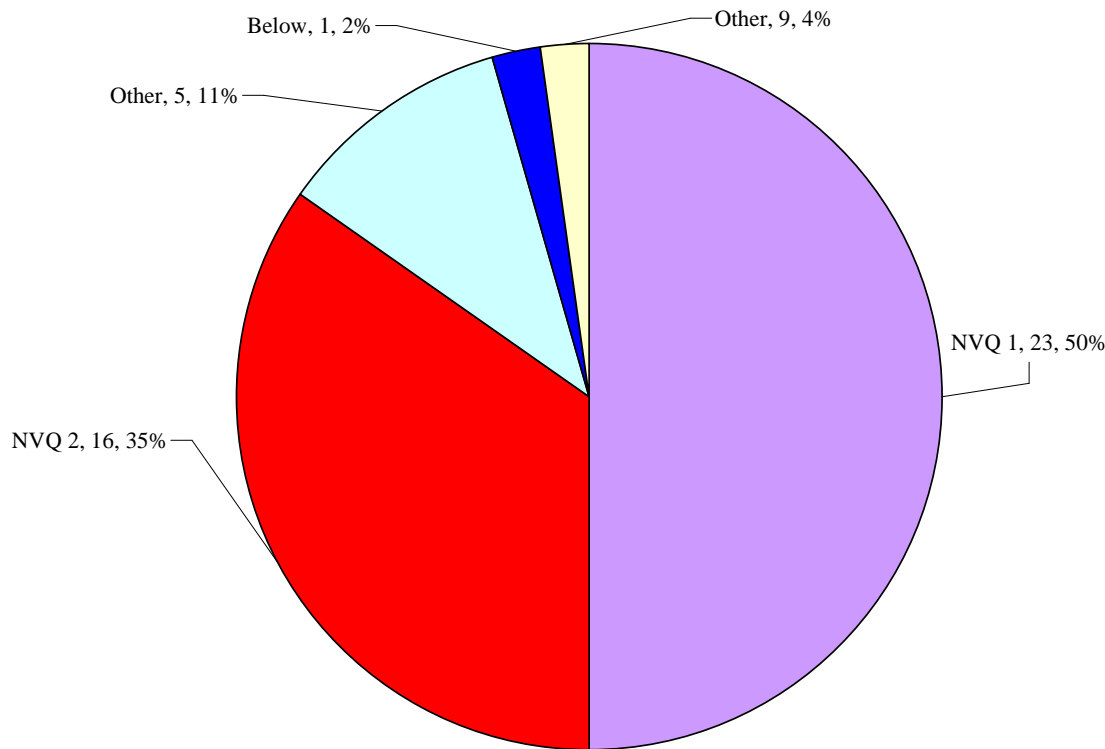

- 538 Soft outcomes were gained by Buckley Hall (F) beneficiaries.
- 109 beneficiaries received IAG assistance.
- 41 beneficiaries had their rent arrears addressed.
- Beneficiaries in Buckley Hall (F) attended 159 interviews – Further Education, Fresh Start, Job, New Deal and Progress to Work interviews.
- 23 beneficiaries attended the ECDL course.



- 79% (46) of the exams taken were passed.
- No exams were failed.

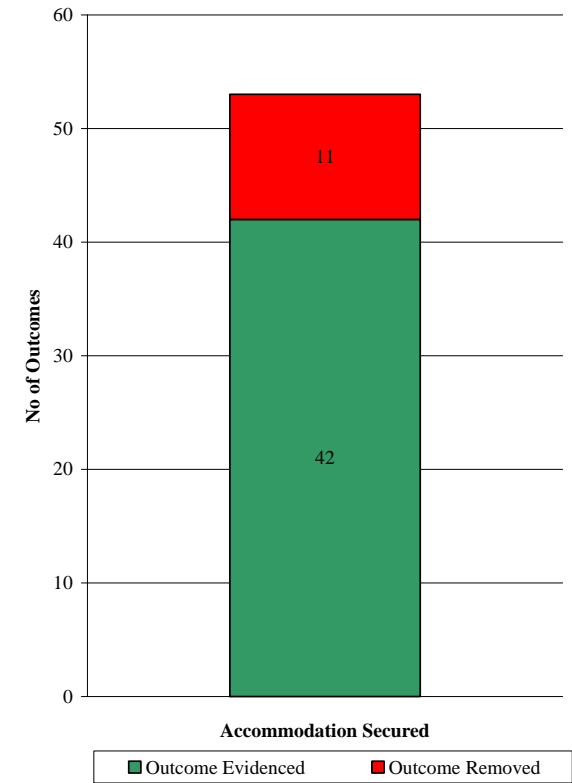
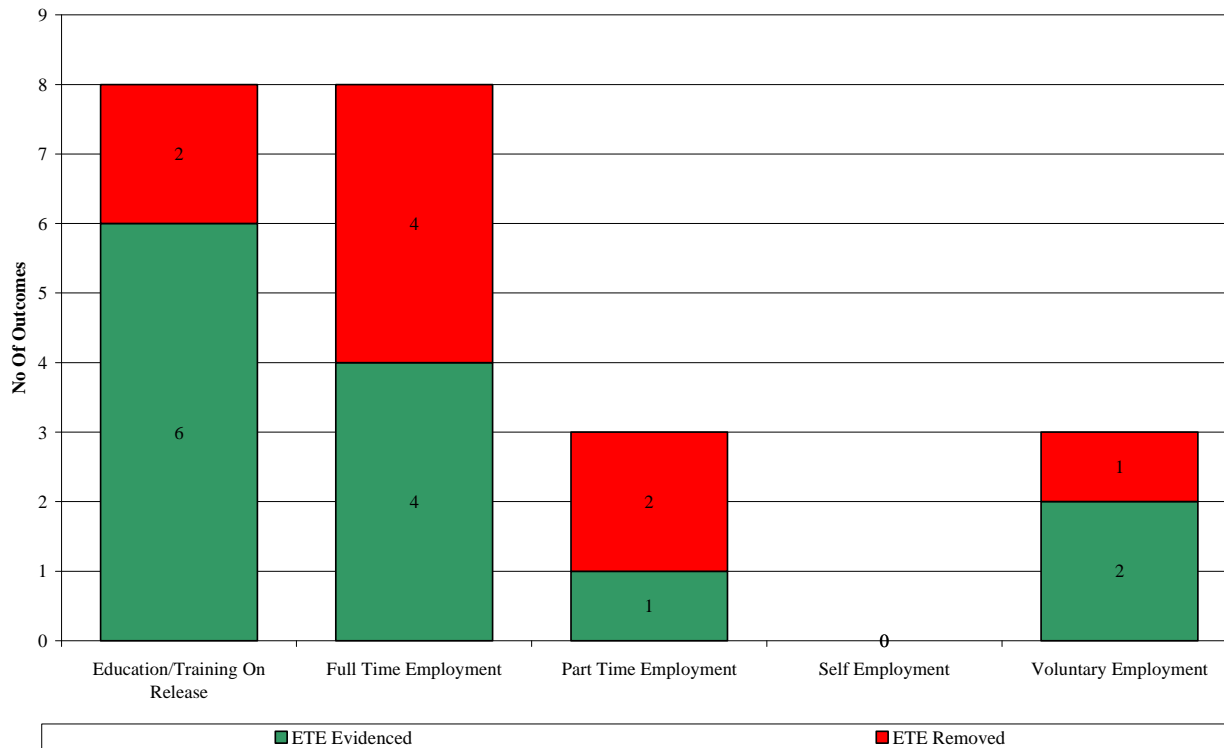

- 39 NVQ levels 1 and 2 have been gained by beneficiaries in Buckley Hall (F).
- 5 adult Literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Buckley Hall (F).

Hard Outcomes



- 22 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Buckley Hall (F) with evidence for 13 of these outcomes (59% evidence for outcome rate).
- 53 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 42 outcomes (79% evidence for outcome rate).
