

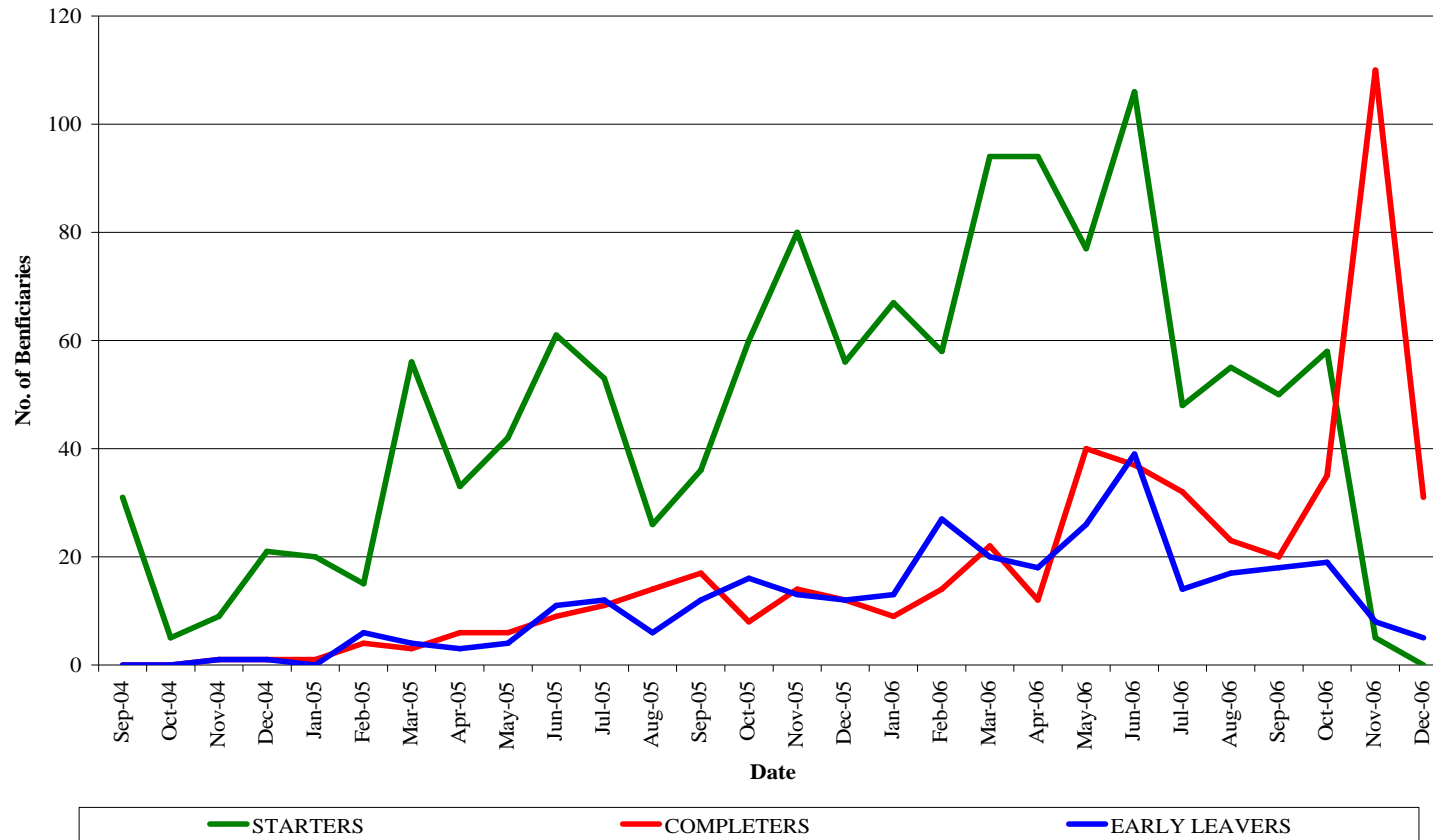

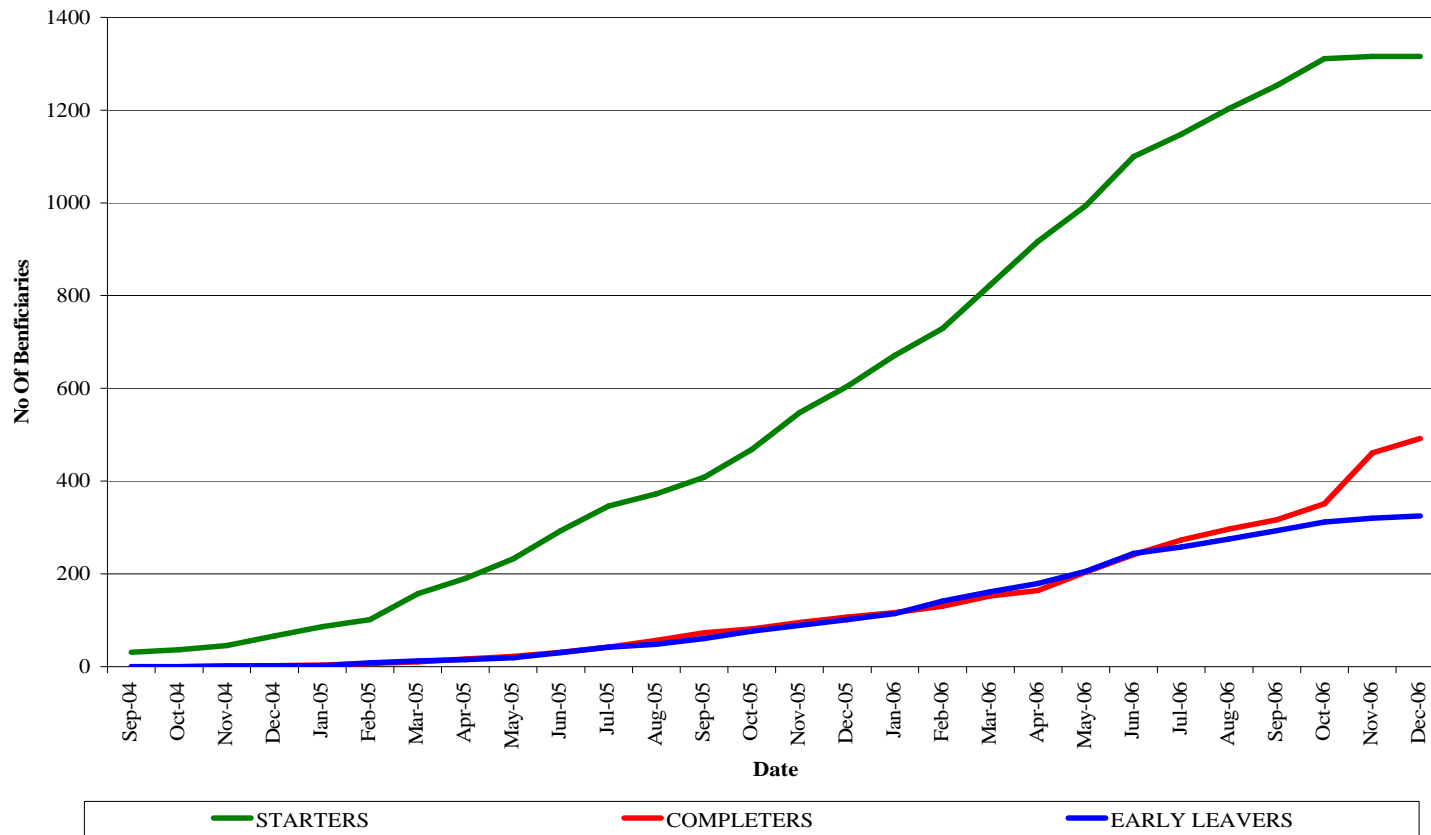

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



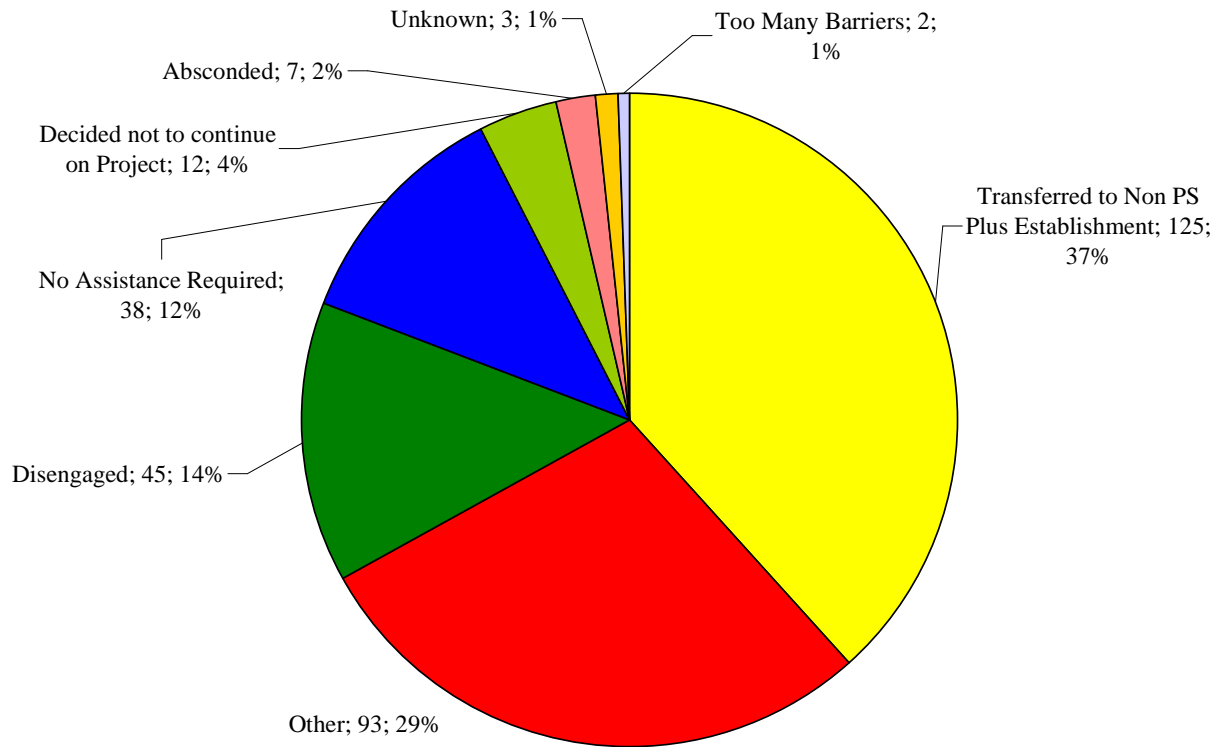
- Most months, Preston started between 50 and 100 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- During project closure in November 2006, 110 beneficiaries completed the project.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Over 1300 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Preston.
- Approximately 800 beneficiaries finished in Preston – 492 completed the project and 325 left the project early.

### Reasons for Early Leavers

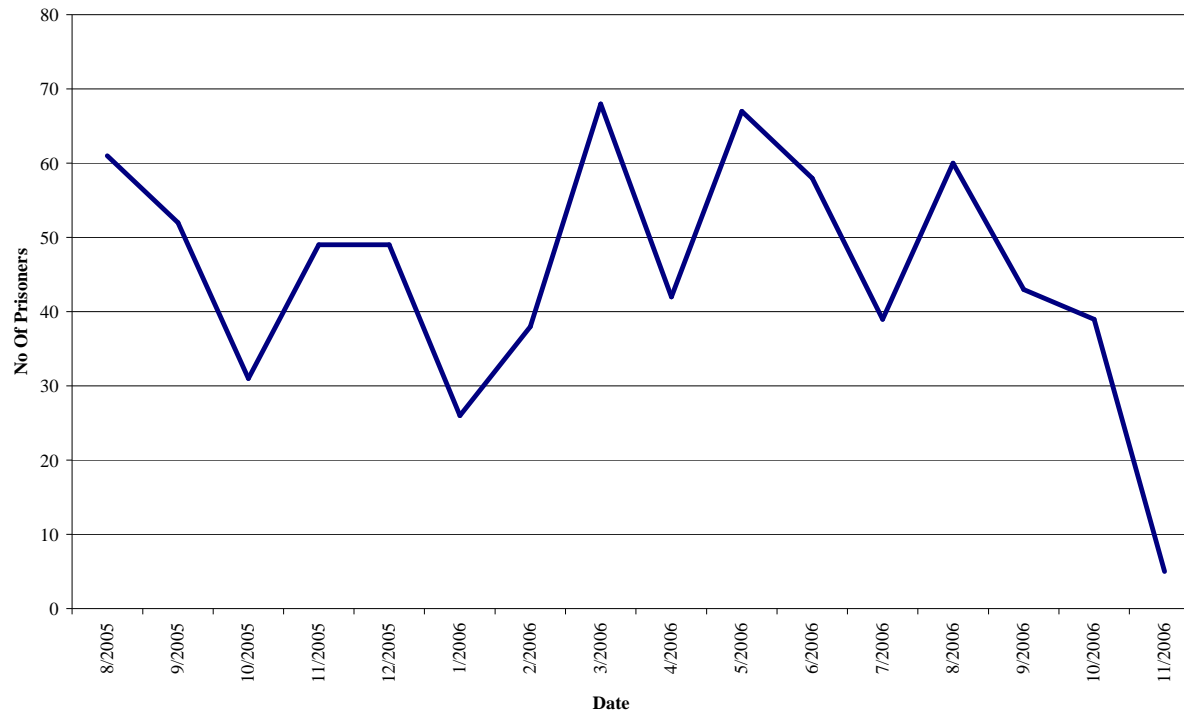

- Of the 325 beneficiaries who left the project early, 37% (125) transferred to a non-PS Plus establishment.
- 45 of the beneficiaries who left the project early were disengaged and 38 did not require any assistance from PS Plus.

Non-Starters Per Month

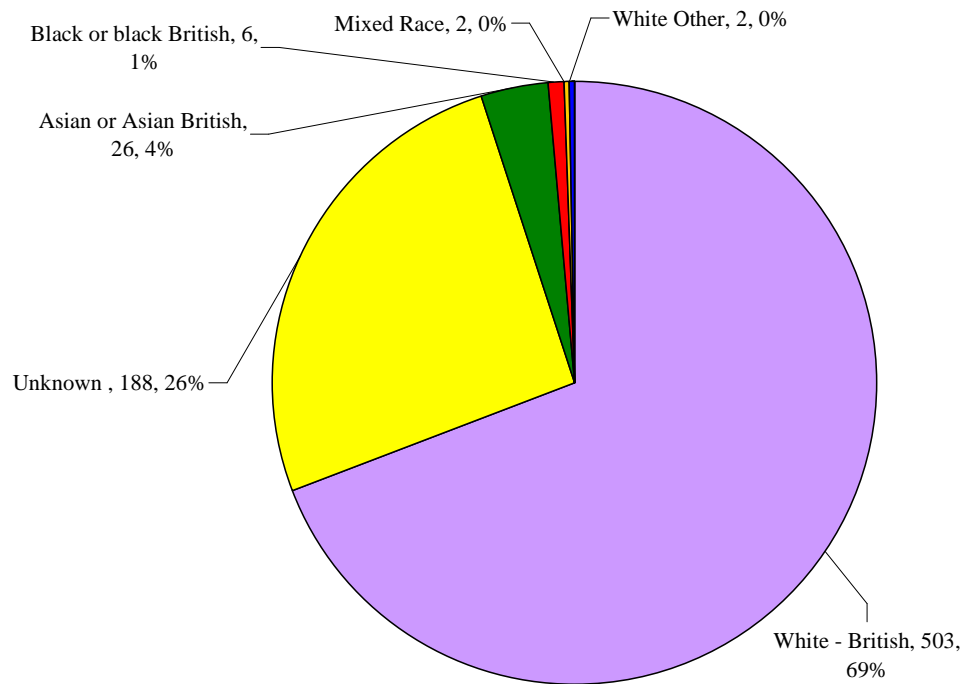

- Most months, over 30 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- In total, 727 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Preston.
- 268 of the prisoners not started in Preston did not require PS Plus Services and 160 prisoners transferred before being started on the project (98 to a PS Plus establishment and 62 transferred before the assessment was entered).

Ethnic Breakdown of prisoners not started



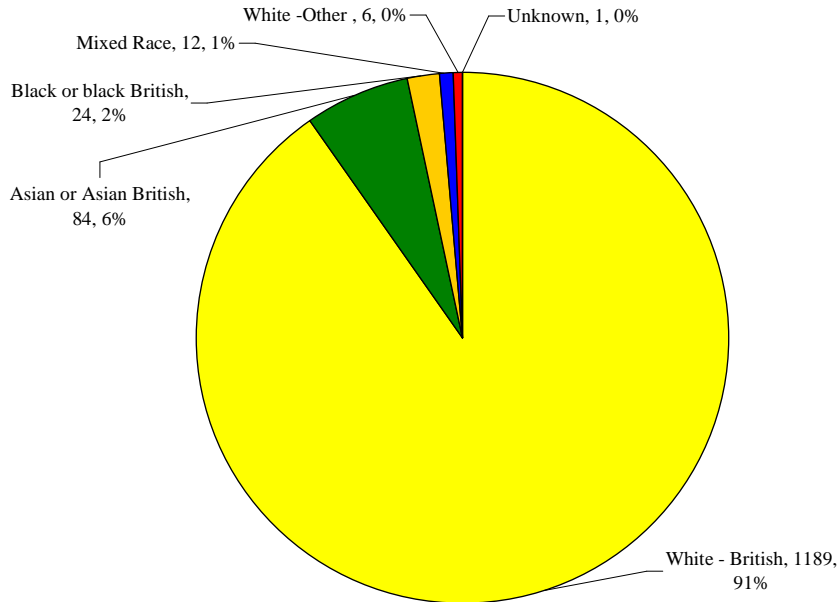

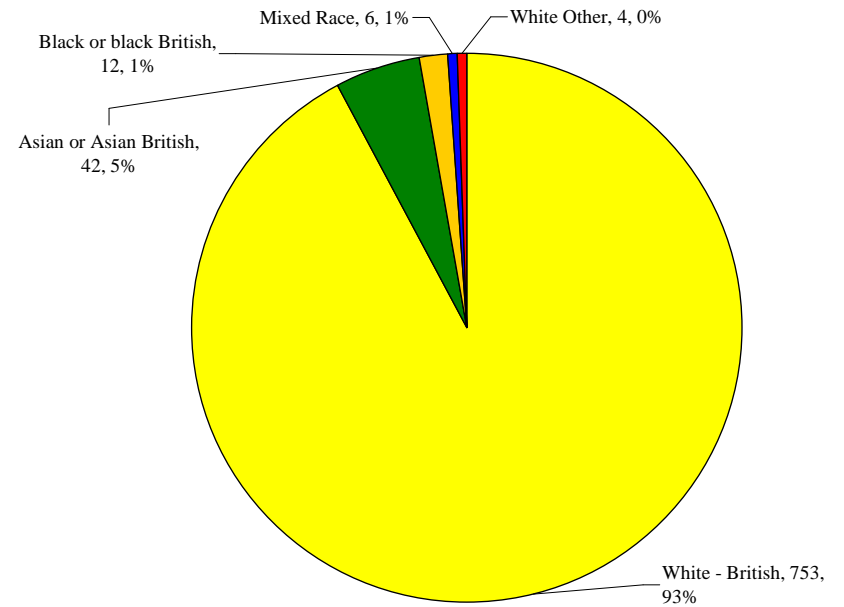
- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (69%) and from United Kingdom (78%).
- The ethnic origin for 26% and the nationality of 20% of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- Ethnic minorities account for 5% (36 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.

- 91% (1189) of the beneficiaries who started and 93% (753) of the beneficiaries who finished in Preston were White-British.
- 9% (126) of the beneficiaries who started and 7% (64) of the beneficiaries who finished in Preston were from ethnic minorities.
- The ethnic origin of one beneficiary who started in Preston is unknown.

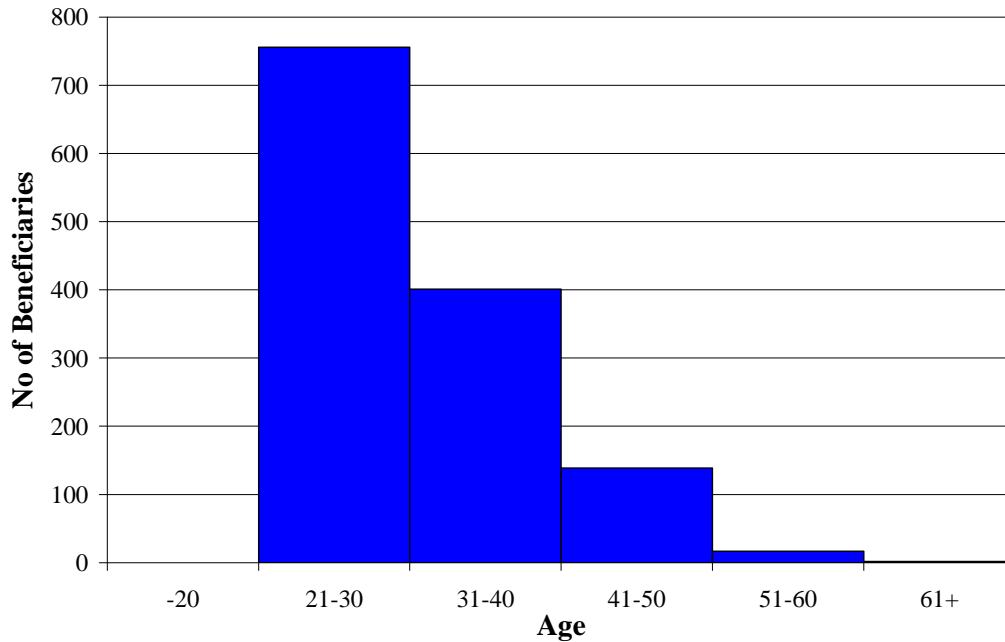

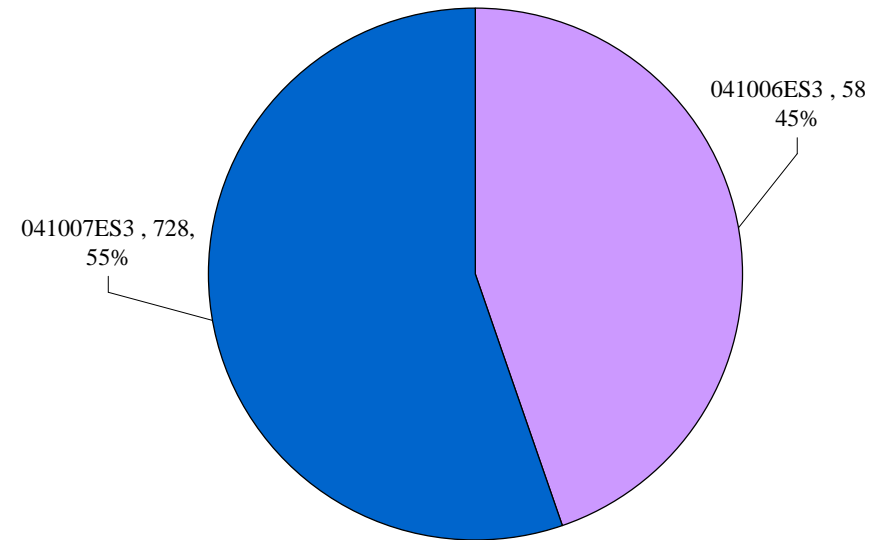
- 86% (1129) of the beneficiaries who started in Preston stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- 86% (700) of the beneficiaries who finished in Preston stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- The nationality of 161 of the beneficiaries who started in Preston and 97 of the beneficiaries who finished in Preston was unknown.



Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2



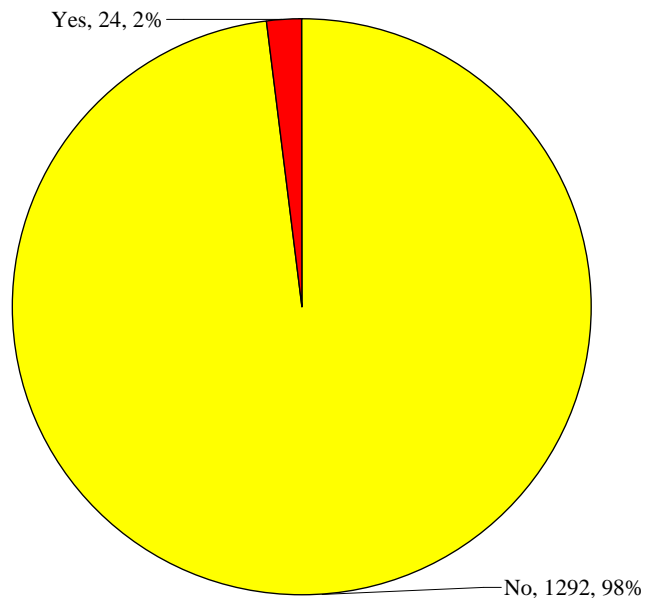
Age Breakdown



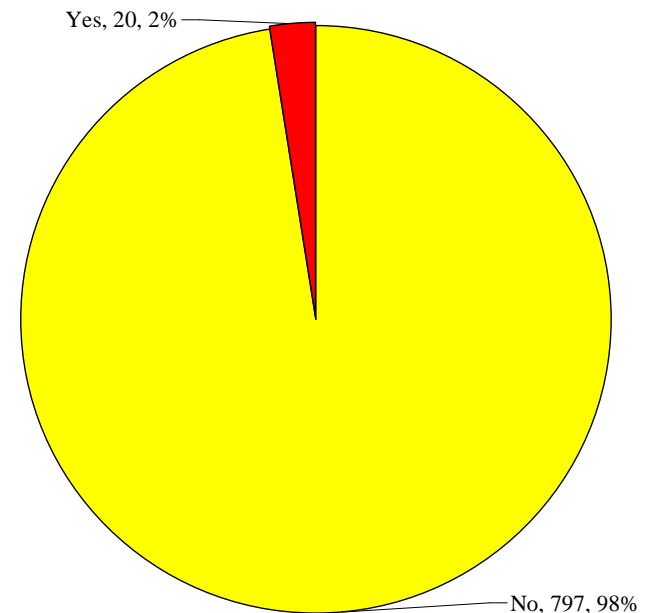
Dossier Number Breakdown

- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Preston is 30 years and 8 months. The average (mode) age group is 21-30 years old.
- There are no beneficiaries in Preston below the age of 21.
- 55% (728) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041007ES3 (male beneficiaries aged 28 and over).

### Disabled Beneficiaries



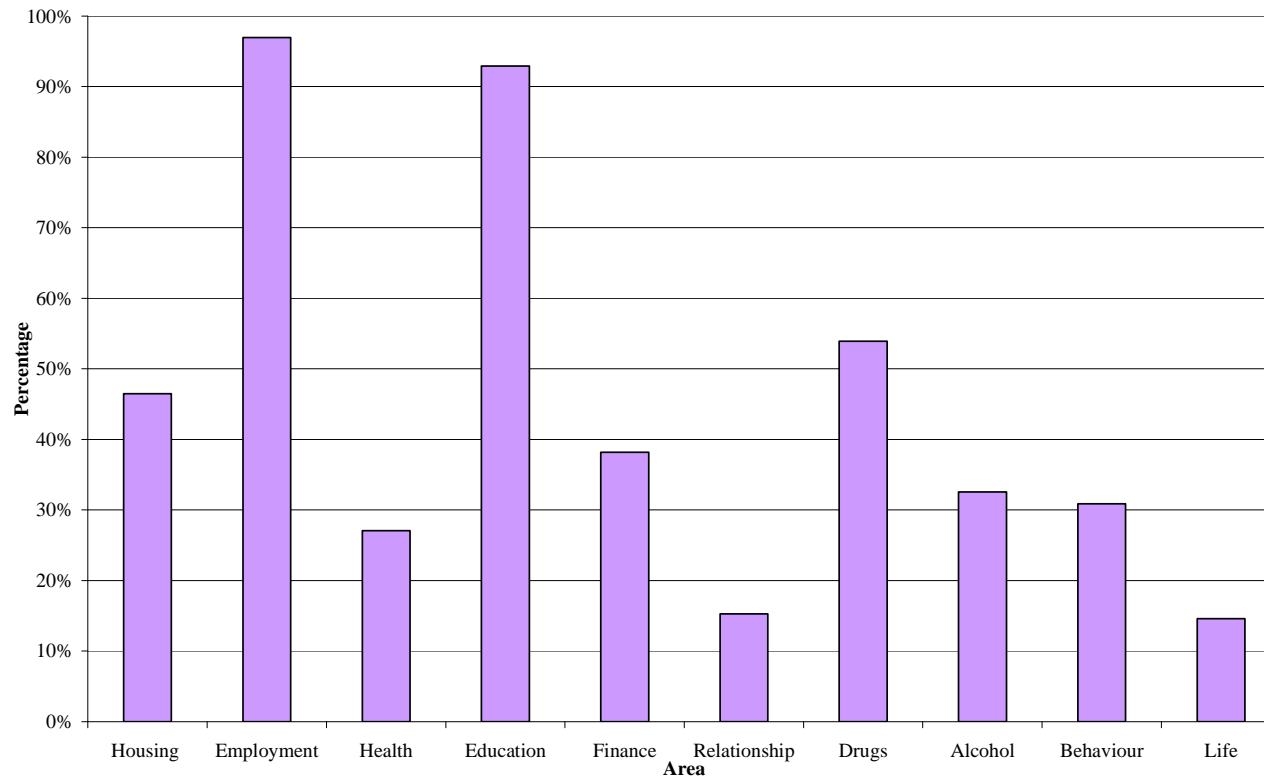

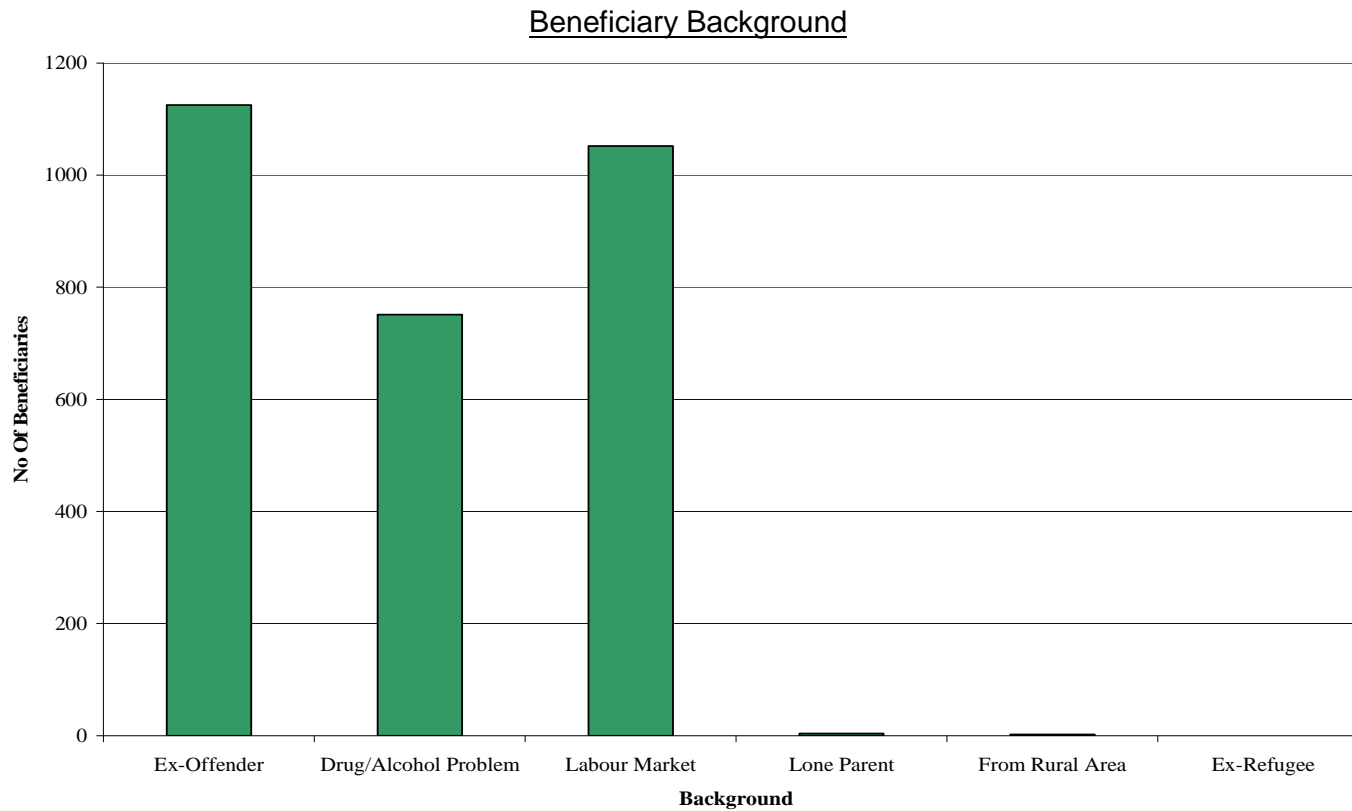
Beneficiaries Finishing in Preston

- 2% (24) of the beneficiaries who started in Preston were classified as being disabled.
- 2% (20) of the beneficiaries who finished in Preston were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Preston



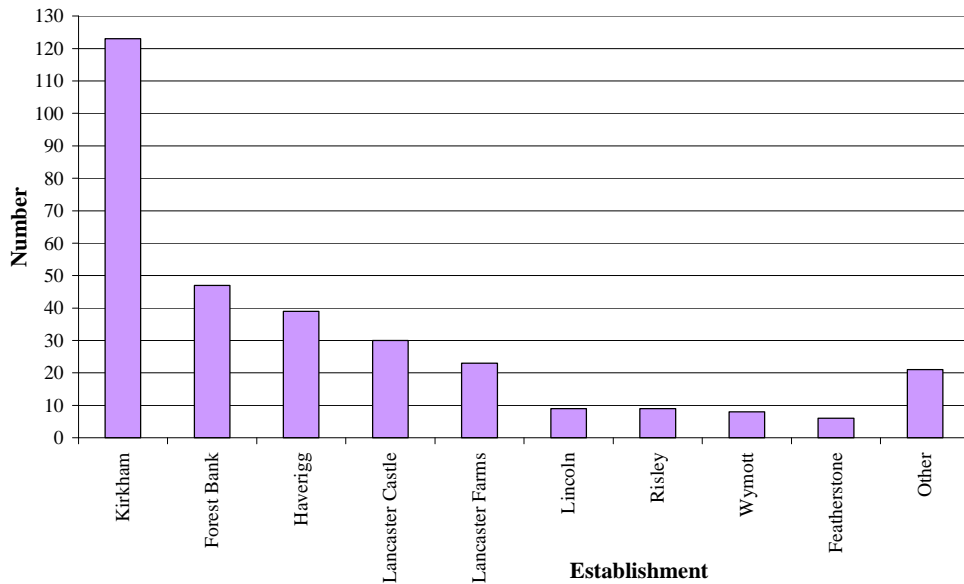
- Over 95% of the beneficiaries who started in Preston needed help with employment.
- Over 50% of the beneficiaries who started in Preston needed help with drug issues.
- Over 35% of the beneficiaries who started in Preston needed help with housing issues.



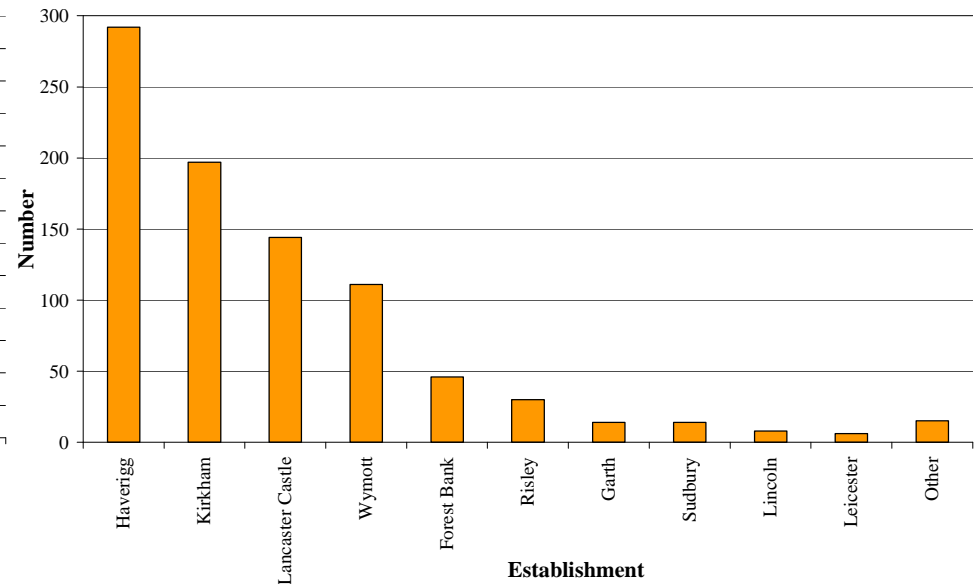
- Over 1000 of the beneficiaries who started in Preston were ex-offenders and over 1000 were on the labour market.
- Over 700 of the beneficiaries who started in Preston had a drug or alcohol problem.
- There were 4 lone parents and 2 beneficiaries from rural areas who started in Preston.

Transfers into Preston

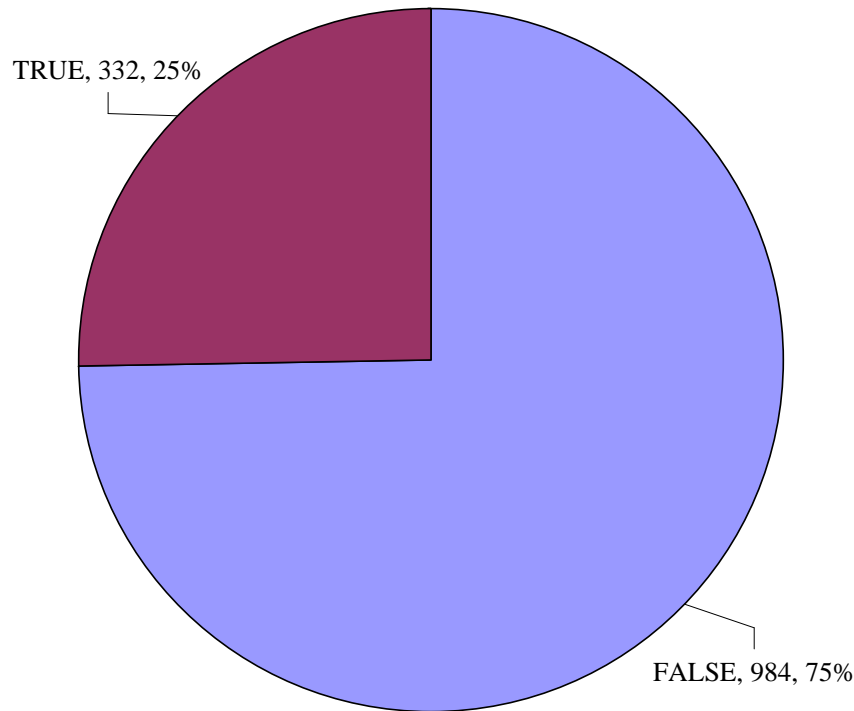


Transfers from Preston

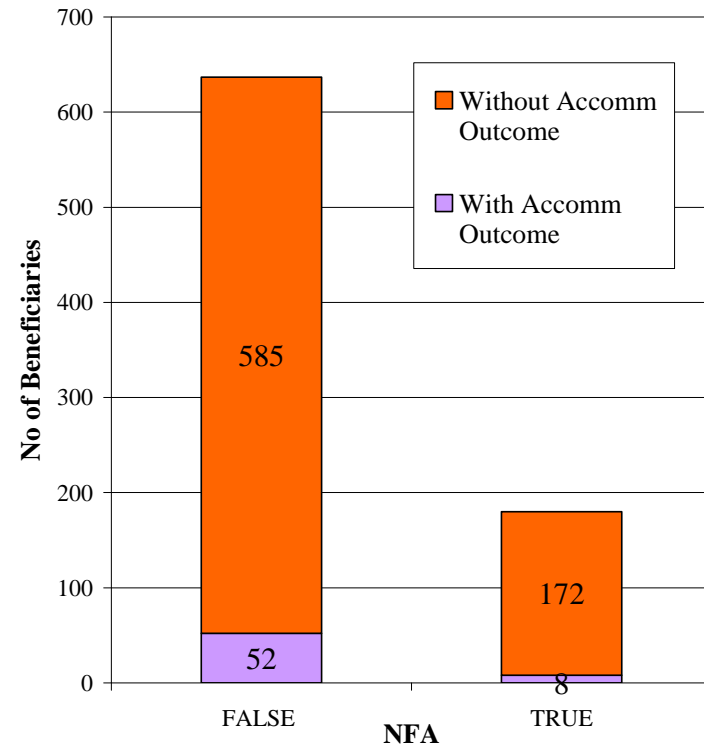


- 315 beneficiaries have transferred into Preston – 76% transferred to Preston from Kirkham, Forest Bank, Haverigg or Lancaster Castle.
- 877 beneficiaries have transferred from Preston – 85% transferred from Preston to Haverigg, Kirkham, Lancaster Castle or Wymott.

Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode

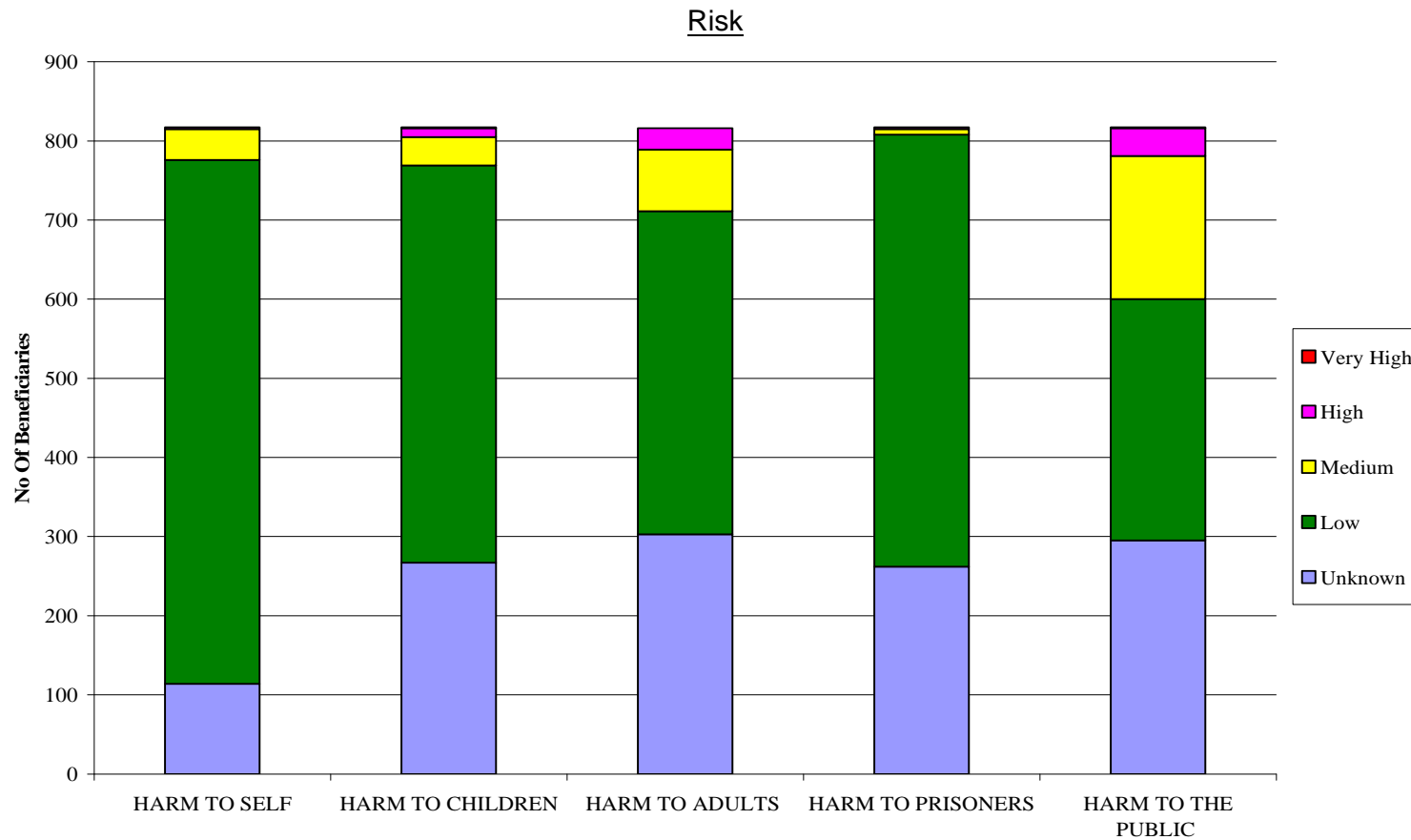


Beneficiaries Starting in Preston



Beneficiaries Finishing in Preston

- 25% (332) of the beneficiaries started in Preston were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 180 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 8 had an accommodation outcome secured.



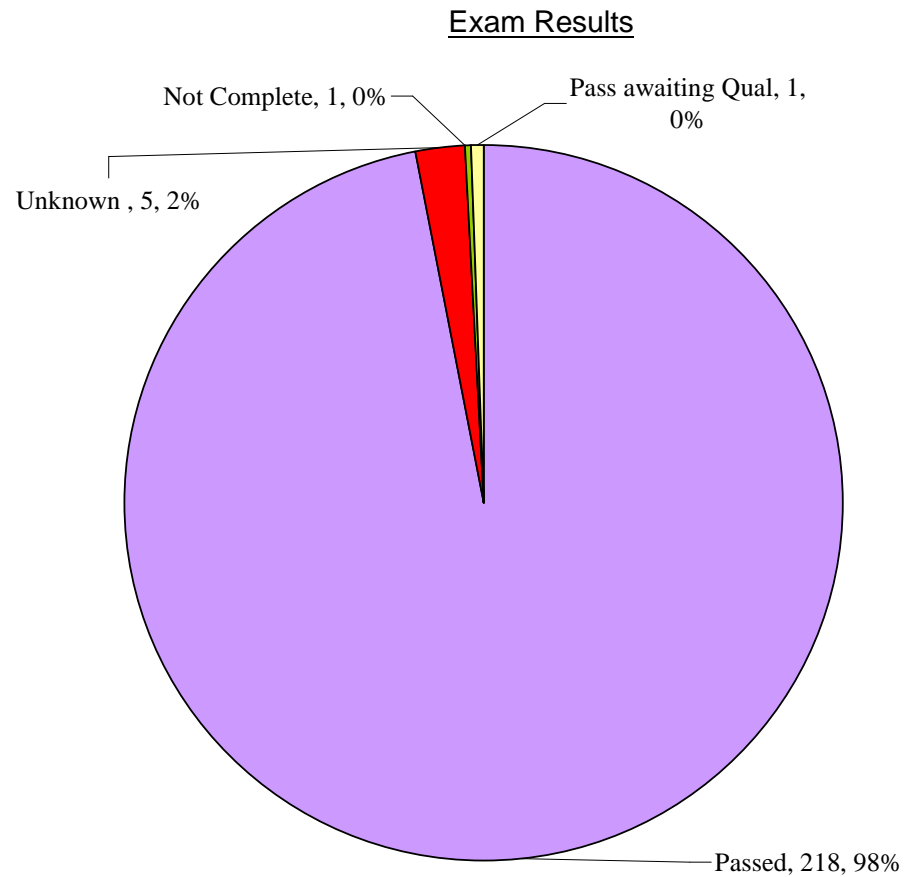
- For the majority of the beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners.

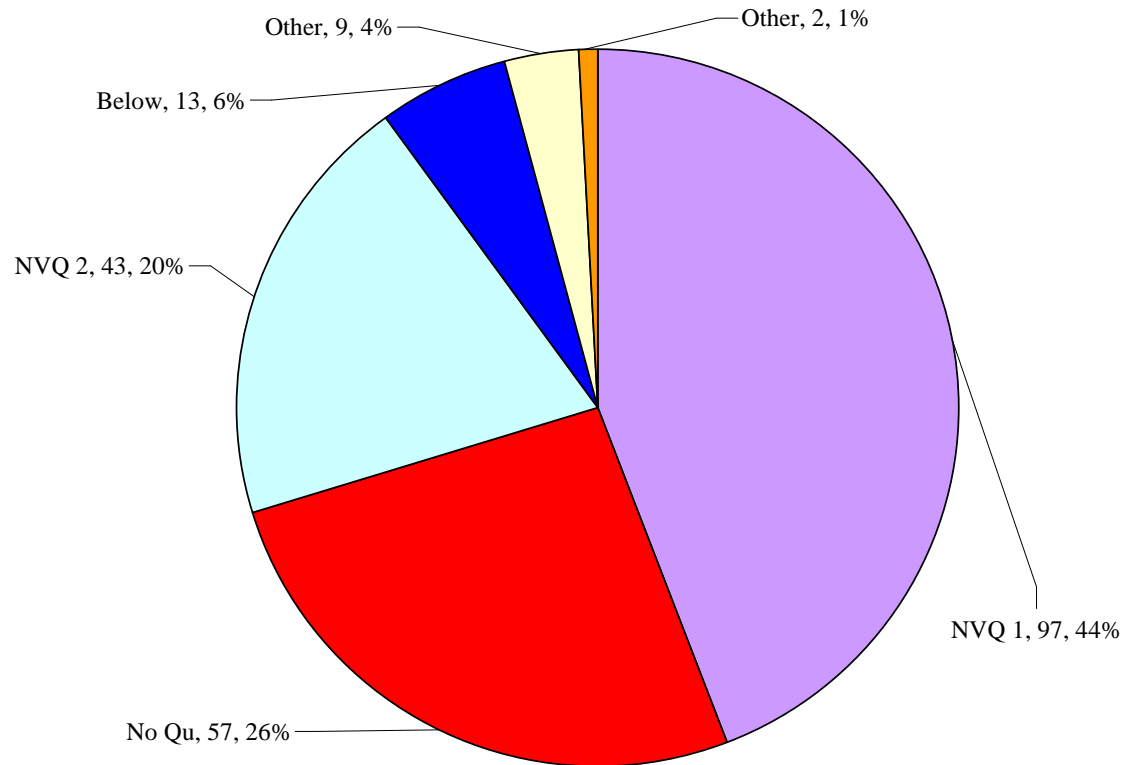
- 588 soft outcomes were gained by Preston beneficiaries.
- 130 beneficiaries received IAG assistance.
- 87 beneficiaries attended ECDL.
- Beneficiaries in Preston attended 38 interviews – Further Education, Fresh Start, Homeless, New Deal and Progress to Work interviews.
- 42 beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiary Access Fund.





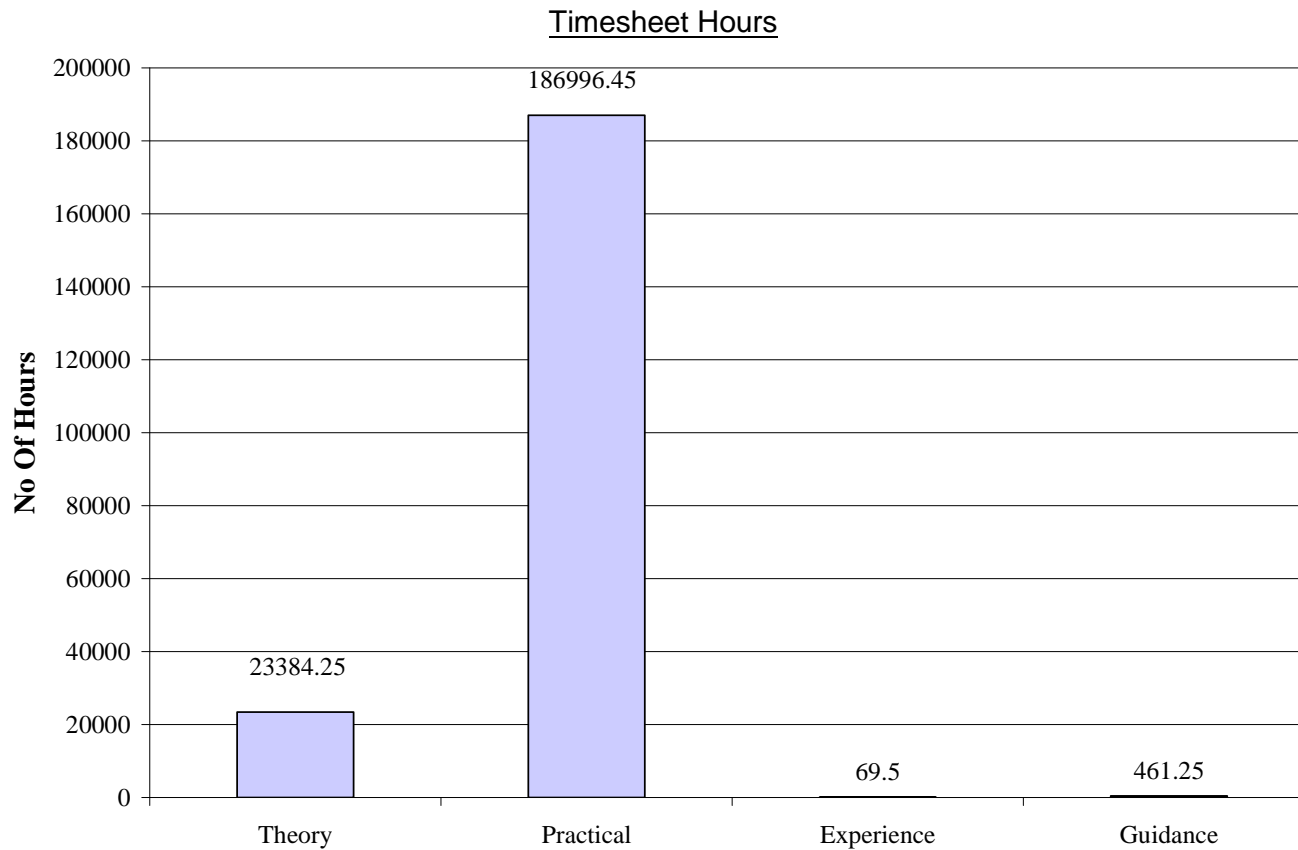
- 98% (219) of the exams taken were passed.
- The outcome of 5 exams (2%) was unknown.

NVQ Equivalence for Passed Subjects



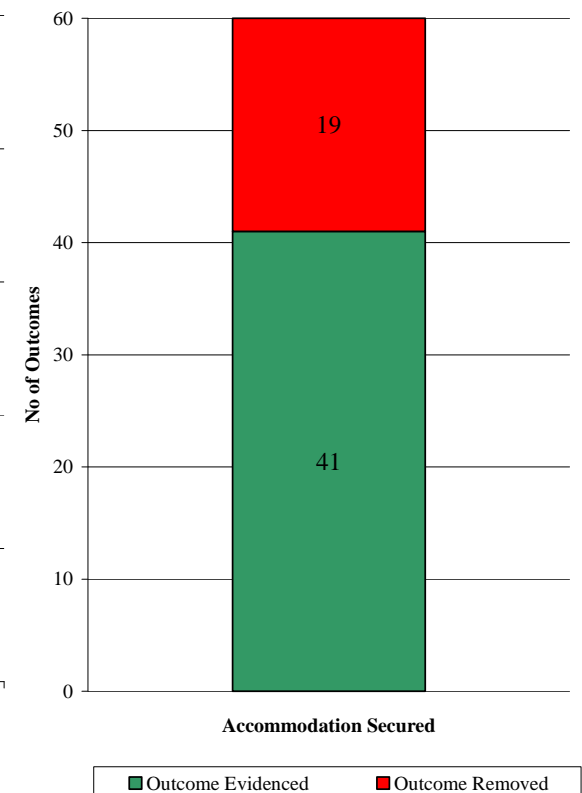
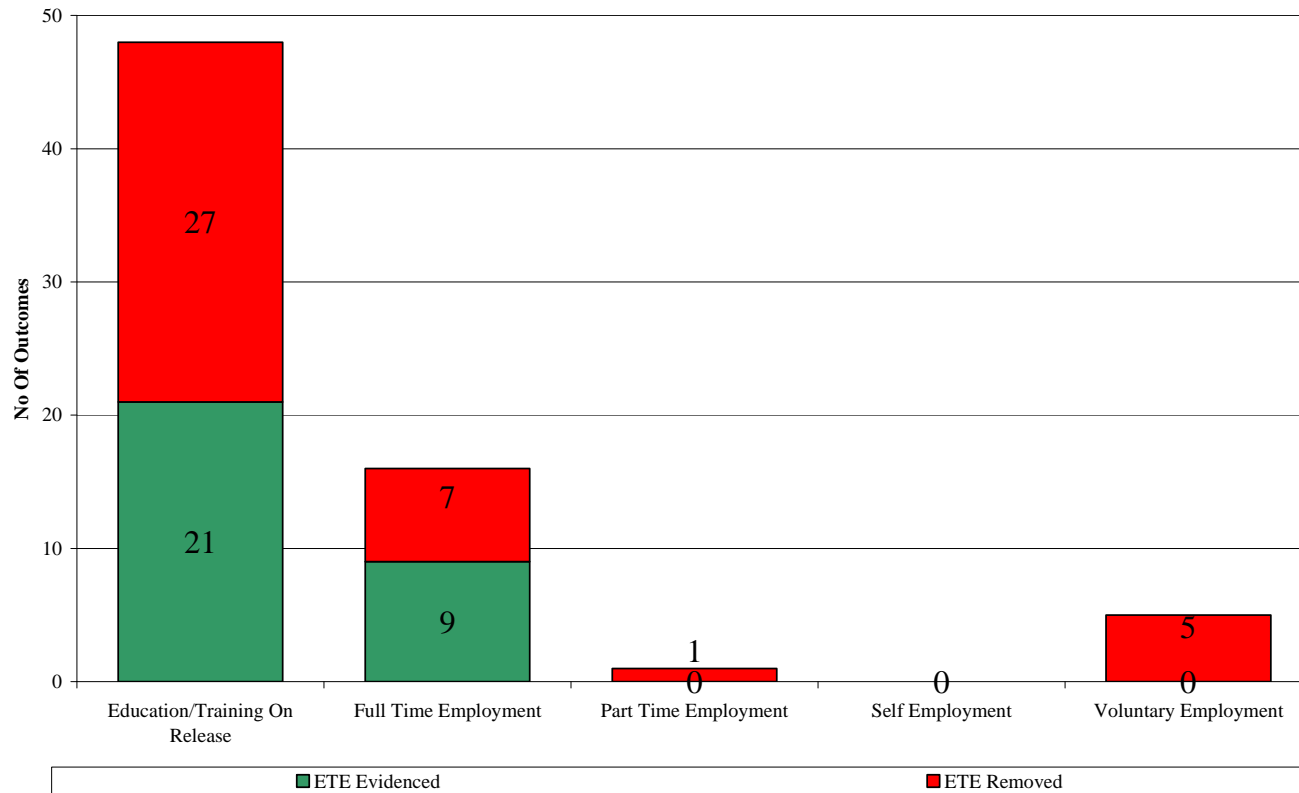

- 140 NVQ levels 1 and 2 have been gained by beneficiaries in Preston.
- 118 adult literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Preston.



- 210,911 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 186,996 (89%) of the hours collected were for practical activities.

### Hard Outcomes



- 70 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Preston with evidence for 30 of these outcomes (43% evidence for outcome rate).
- 60 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 41 outcomes (68% evidence for outcome rate).
