

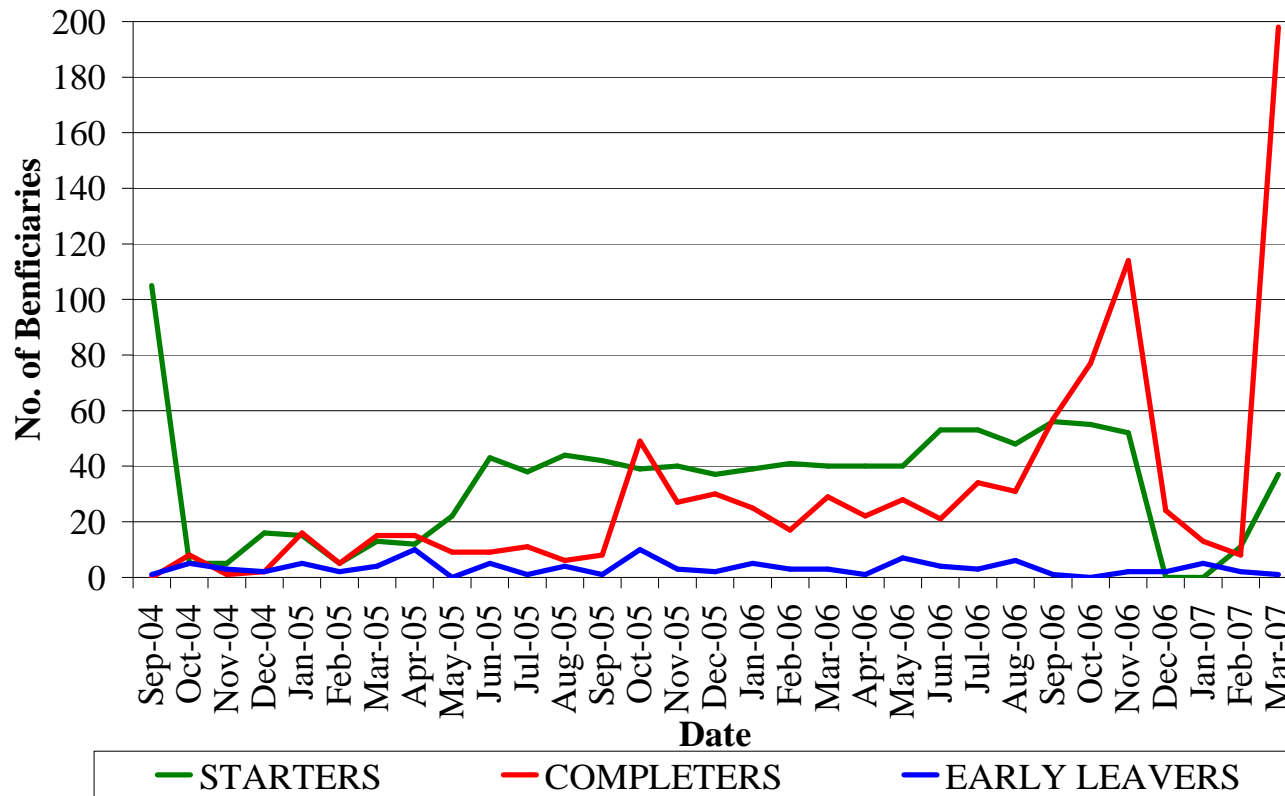

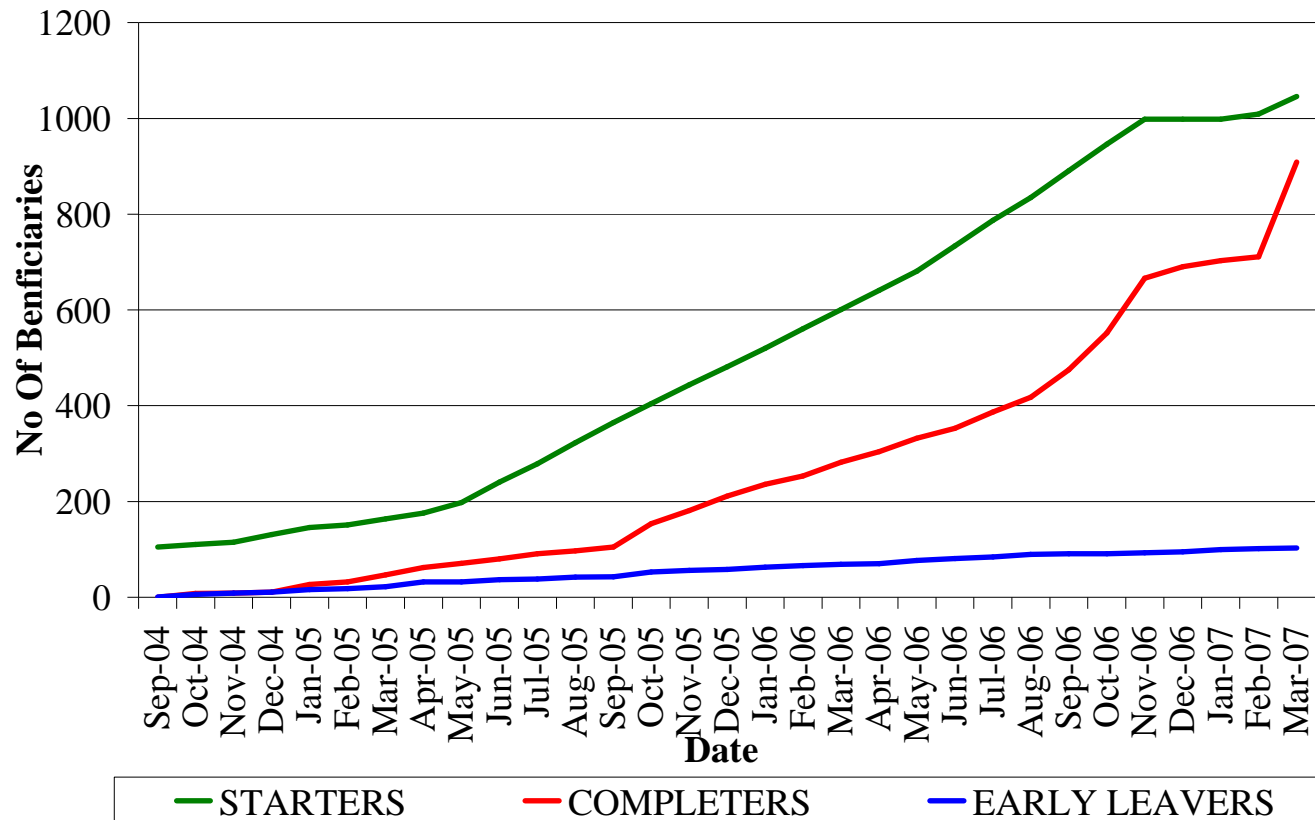

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



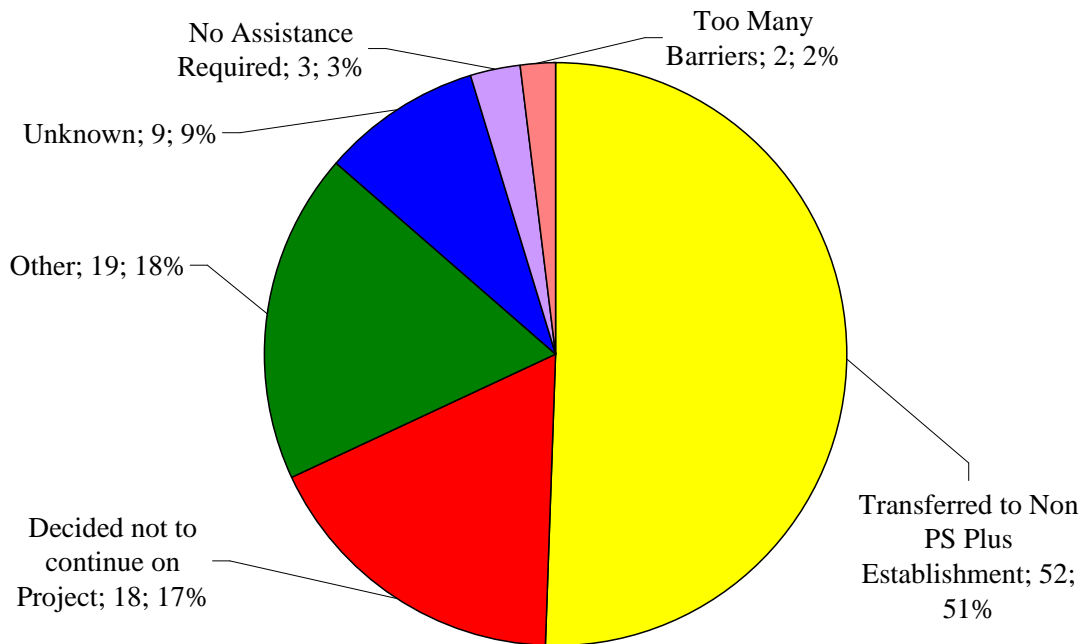
- Most months, Stafford started between 35 and 60 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- Up until the last 7 months of the project (project closure), no more than 50 beneficiaries were completing the PS Plus 2 project per month.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- 1046 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Stafford.
- Over 1000 beneficiaries finished in Stafford – 909 completed the project and 103 left the project early.

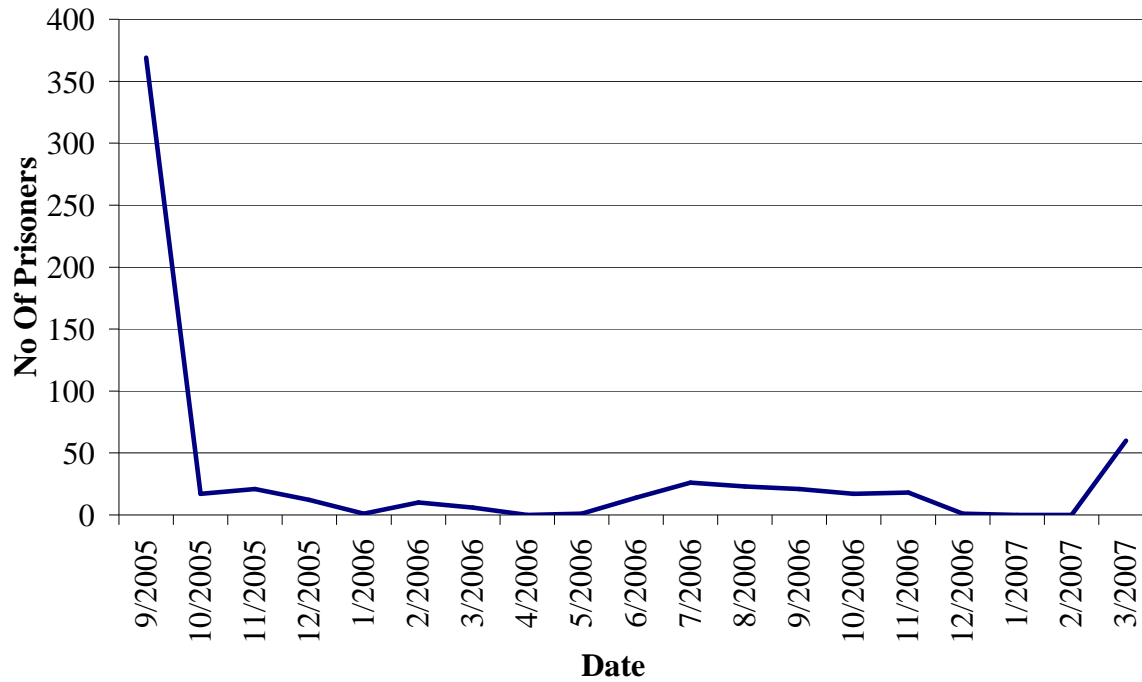

- Of the 103 beneficiaries who left the project early, 51% (52) of the beneficiaries transferred to a non-PS Plus establishment.
- 18 beneficiaries decided not to continue on the project.

Non-Starters Per Month

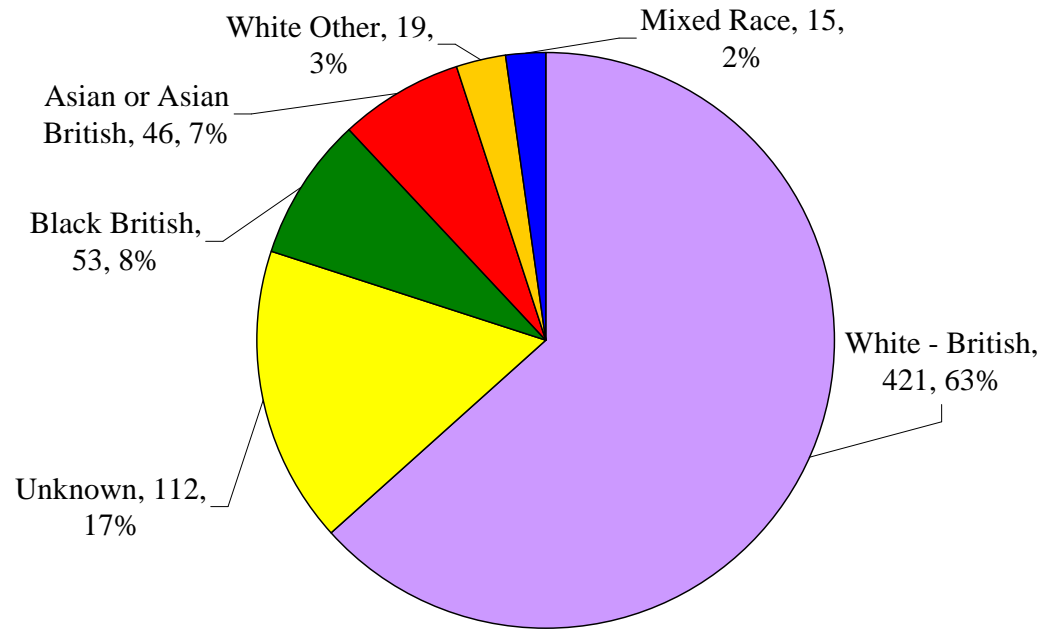

- Most months, less than 30 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- In total, over 660 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Stafford.
- 111 of the prisoners not started in Stafford did not require PS Plus Services and 83 prisoners transferred before being started on the project (13 transferred before the assessment entered and 70 to a non-PS Plus establishment).

Ethnic Breakdown of prisoners not started



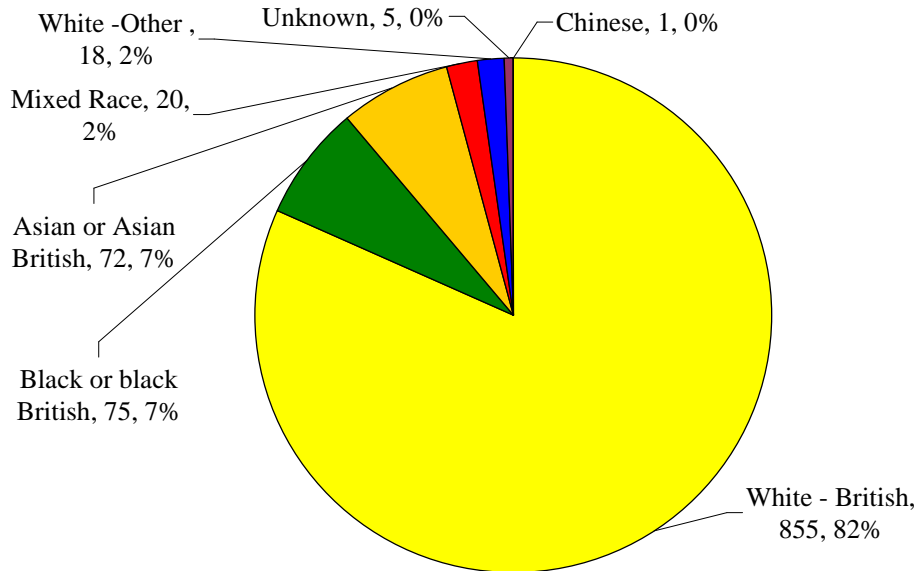

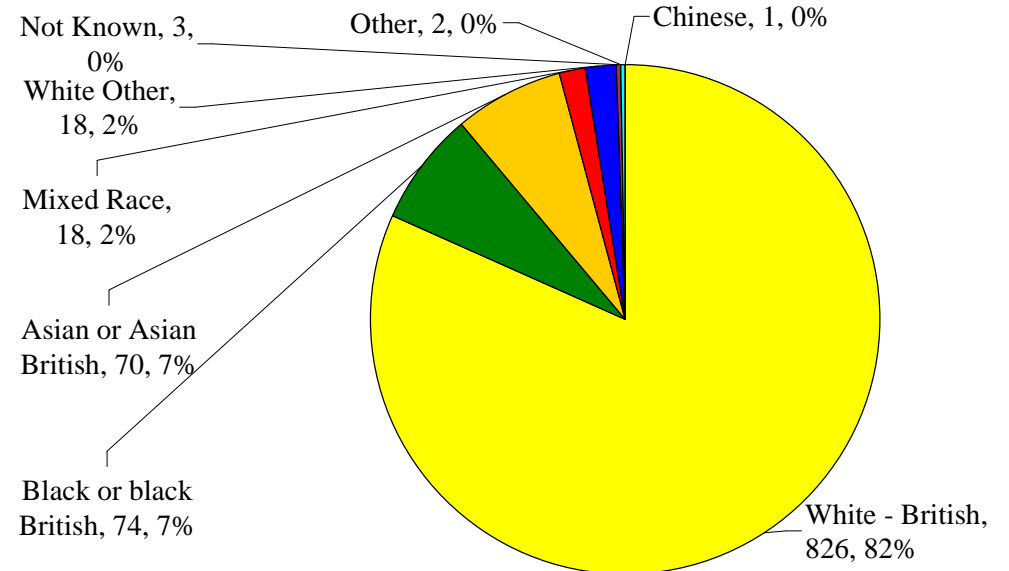
- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (63%) and from United Kingdom (79%).
- Ethnic minorities account for 20% (133 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.

- 82% (855) of the beneficiaries started and 82% (826) of the beneficiaries who finished in Stafford were White-British.
- 18% (186) of the beneficiaries started and 18% (181) of the beneficiaries who finished in Stafford were from ethnic minorities.

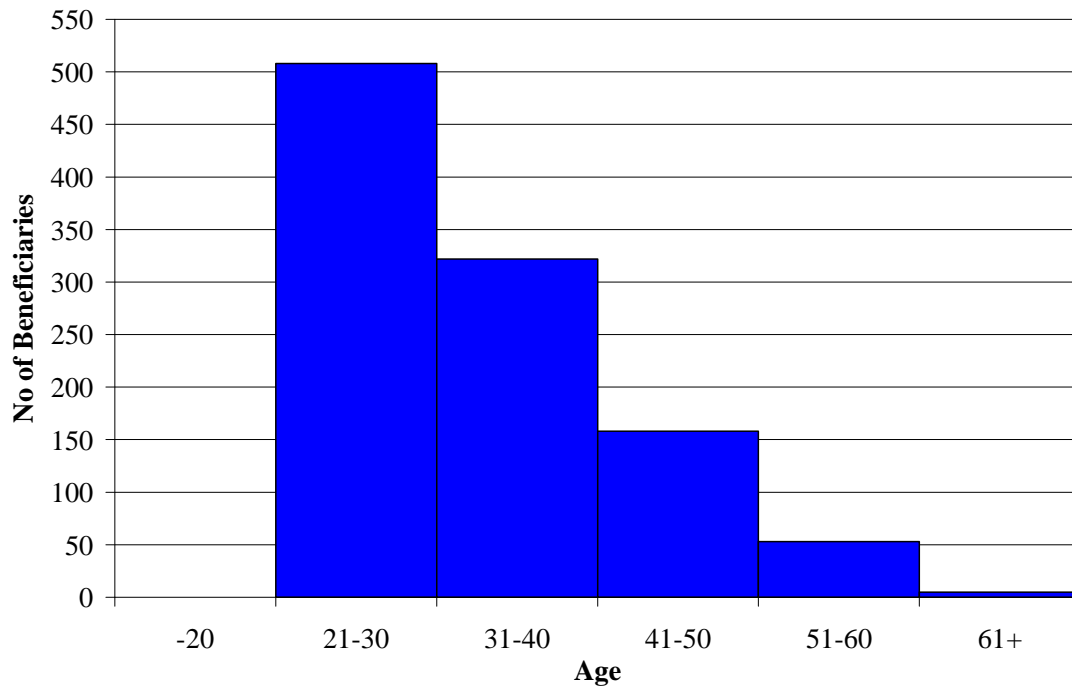

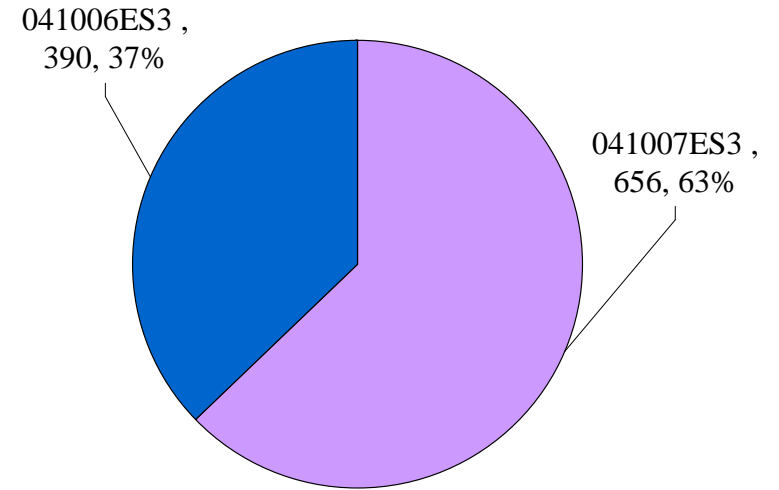

- 87% (908) of the beneficiaries who started in Stafford stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- 87% (876) of the beneficiaries who finished in Stafford stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- The nationalities of 119 of the beneficiaries who started in Stafford and 119 of the beneficiaries who finished in Stafford are unknown.

Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2



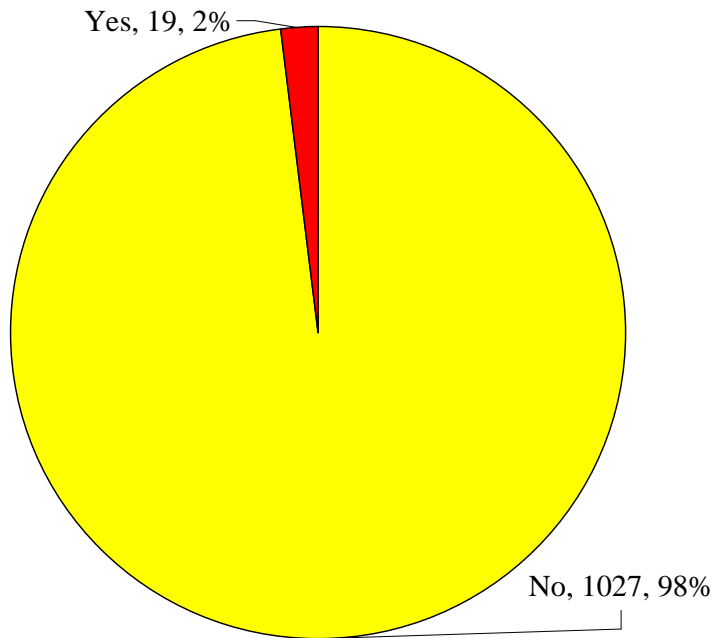
Age Breakdown

- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Stafford is 33 years and 1 month. The average (mode) age group is 21 – 30 years old.
- 63% (656) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041007ES3 (male beneficiaries aged 28 and over).

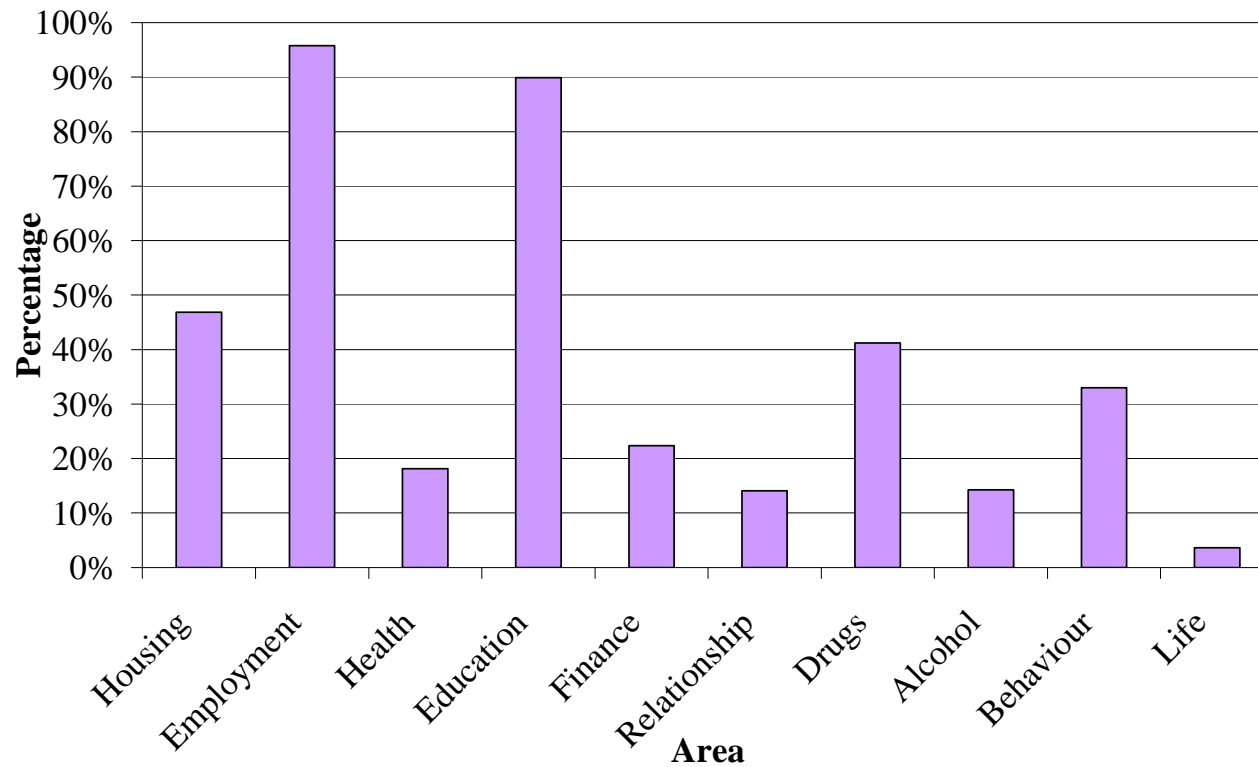
Beneficiaries Starting in Stafford



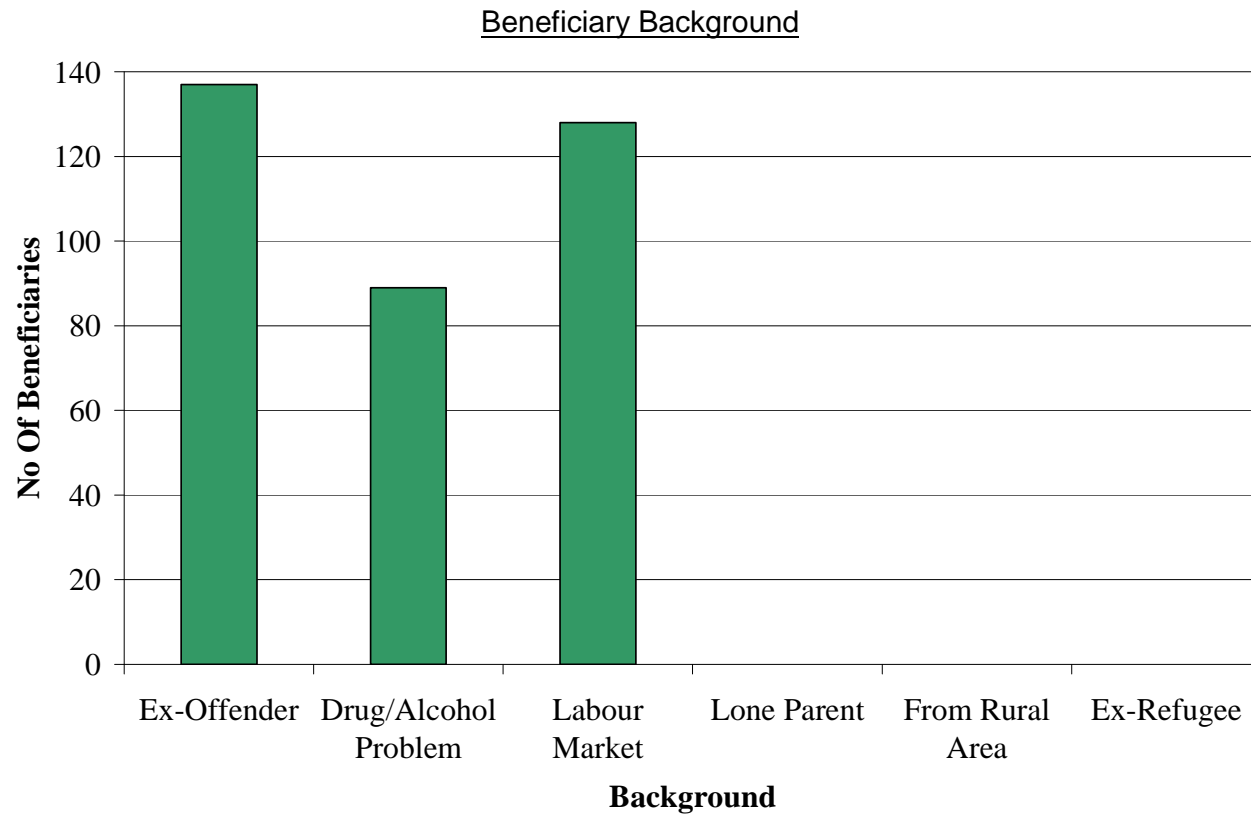
Beneficiaries Finishing in Stafford

- 2% (19) of the beneficiaries who started in Stafford were classified as being disabled.
- 2% (18) of the beneficiaries who finished in Stafford were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Stafford



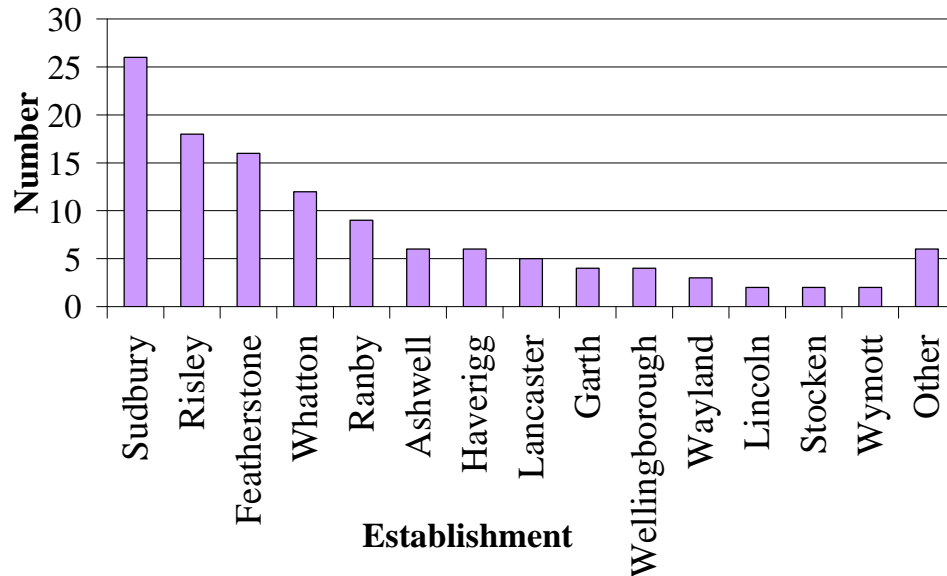
- Over 90% of the beneficiaries who started in Stafford needed help with employment.
- 90% of the beneficiaries who started in Stafford needed help with education.
- Over 40% of the beneficiaries who started in Stafford needed help with housing issues.



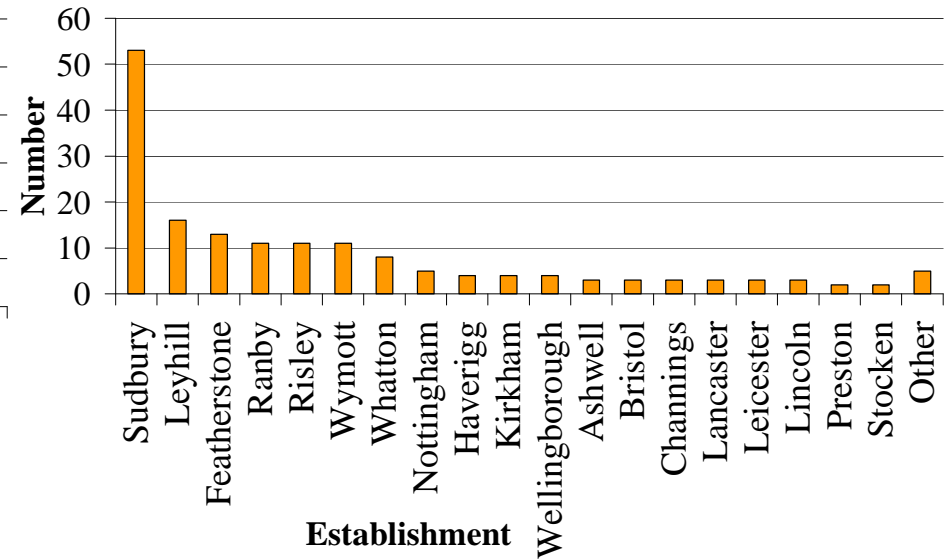
- Almost 140 of the beneficiaries who started in Stafford were ex-offenders.
- Over 120 of the beneficiaries who started in Stafford were on the labour market.
- Nearly 90 of the beneficiaries who started in Stafford had drug or alcohol related problems.

Transfers into Stafford

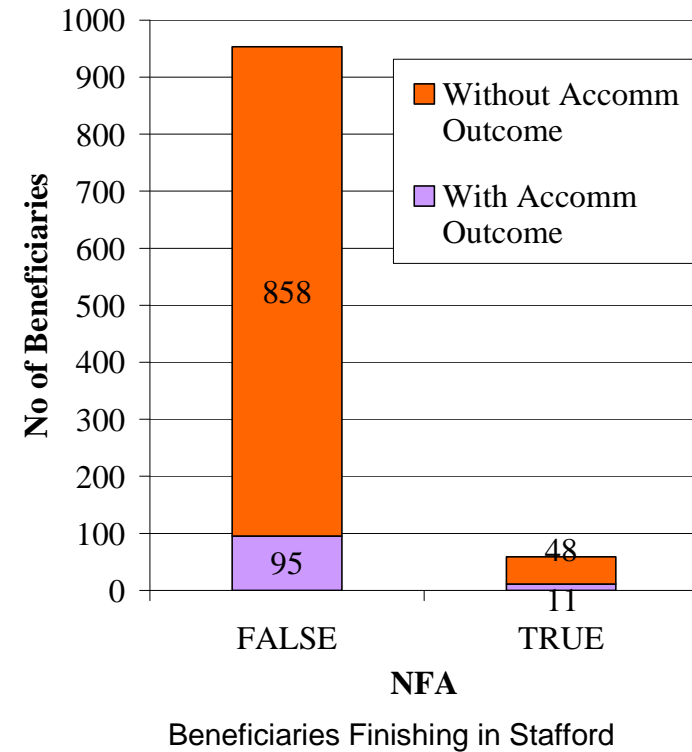
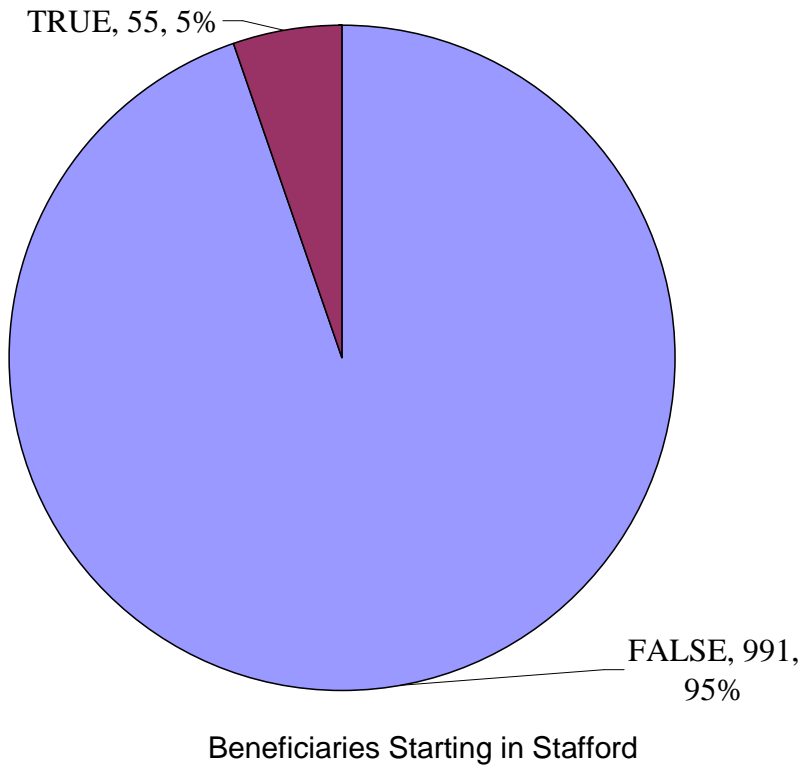


Transfers from Stafford

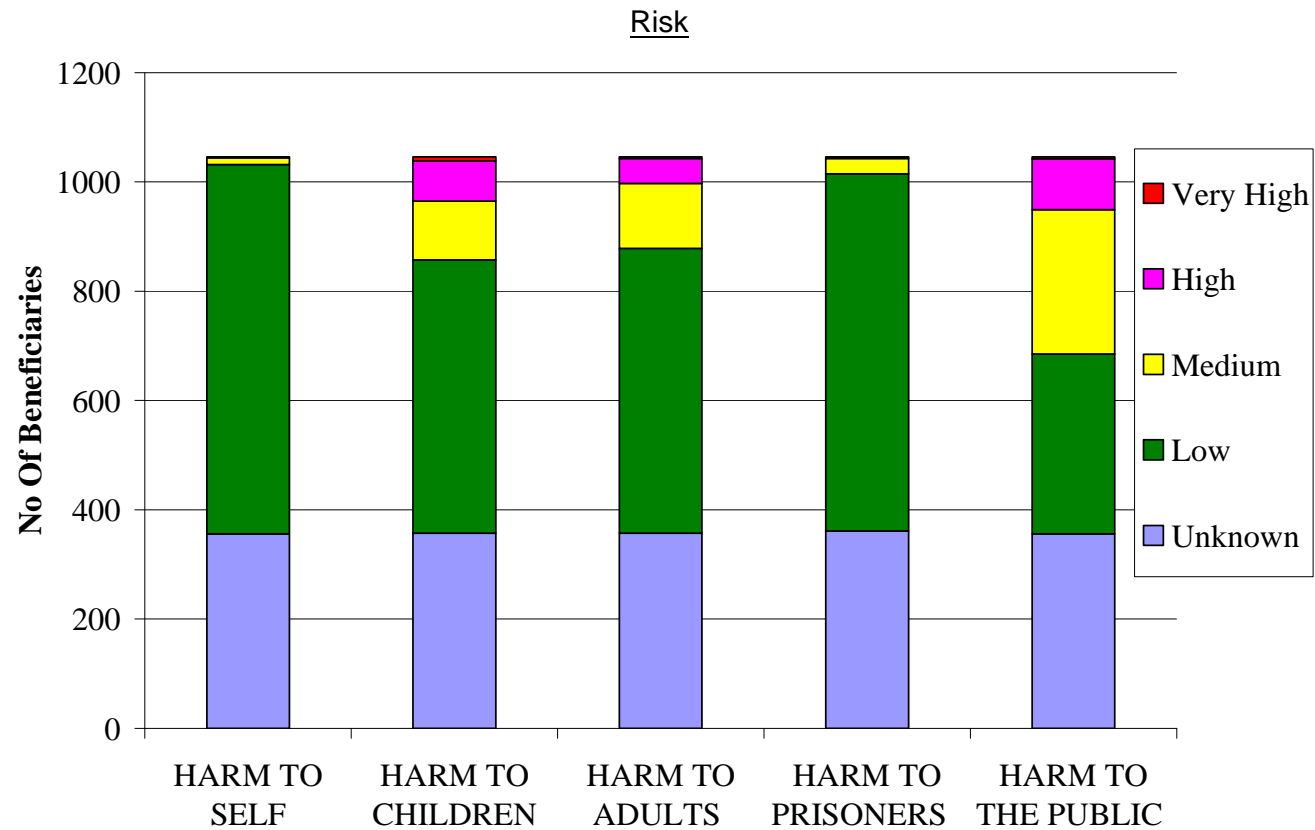


- 121 beneficiaries have transferred into Stafford – 60% transferred to Stafford from Sudbury, Risley, Featherstone and Whatton.
- 167 beneficiaries have transferred from Stafford – 69% transferred from Stafford to Sudbury, Leyhill, Featherstone, Ranby, Risley and Wymott.

Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode



- 5% (55) of the beneficiaries started in Stafford were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 59 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 11 had an accommodation outcome secured.

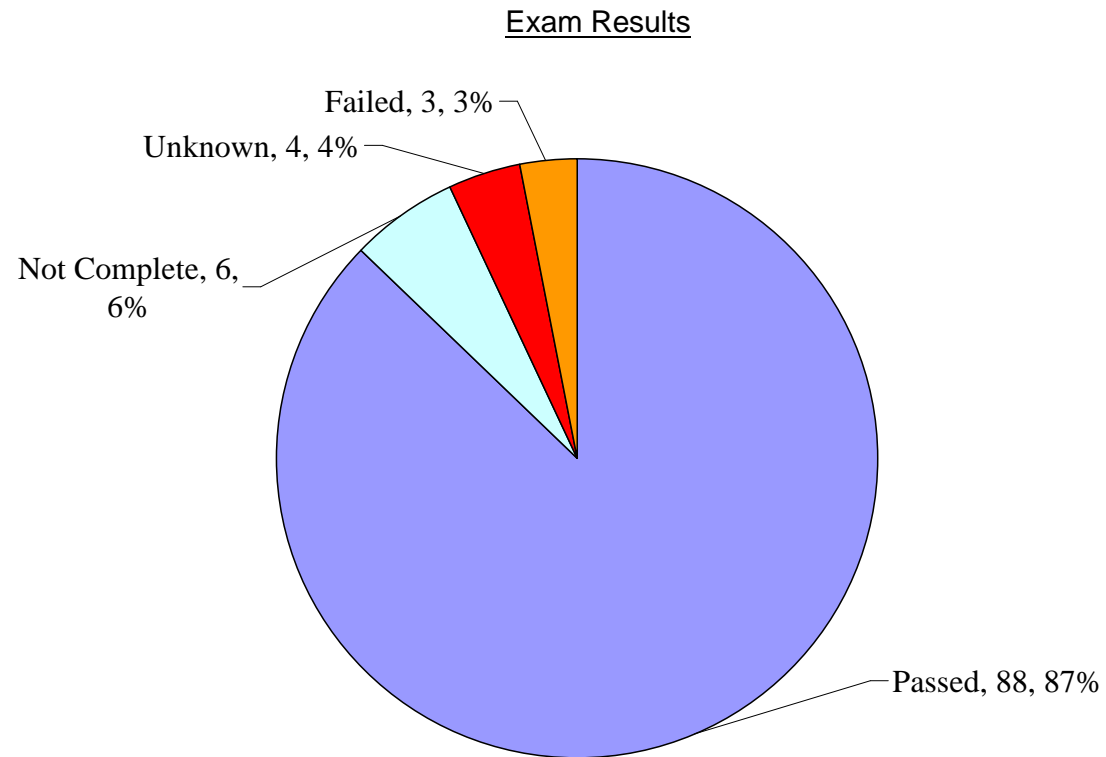


- For over 350 beneficiaries, , the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners.

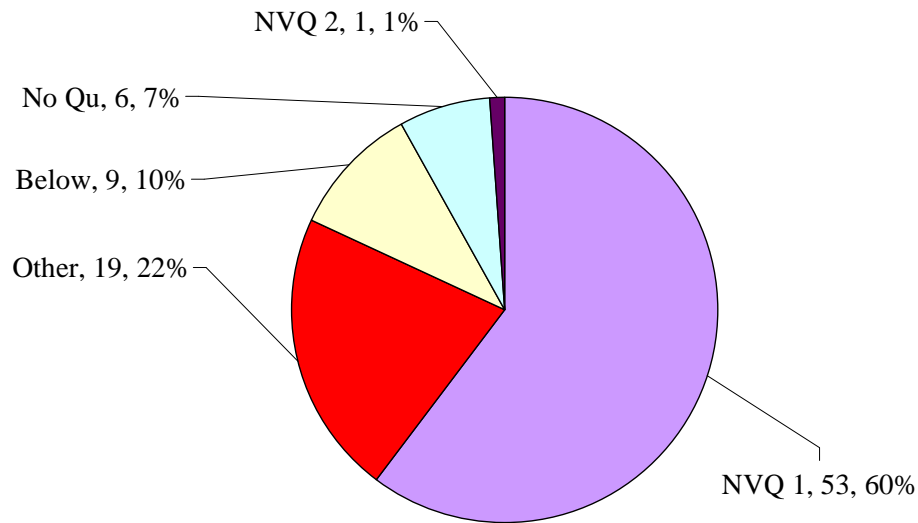

- 1183 soft outcomes were gained by Stafford beneficiaries.
- 540 beneficiaries gained advice on disclosure.
- 123 beneficiaries had assistance in writing a CV.
- Beneficiaries in Stafford attended 299 interviews – Fresh start, Further Education and Job interviews.
- 73 beneficiaries attended ECDL.



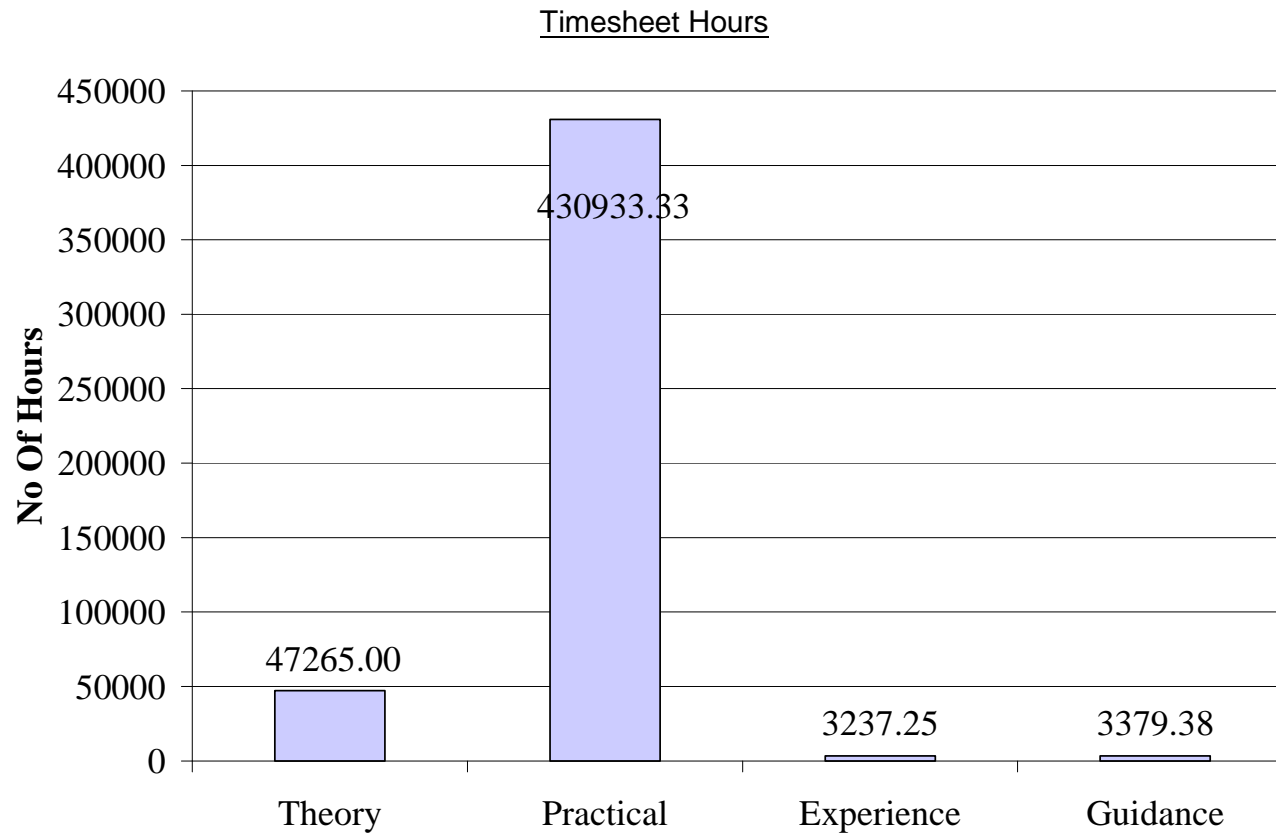
- 87% (88) of the exams taken were passed.
- Only 3 exams were failed.

NVQ Equivalence for Passed Subjects



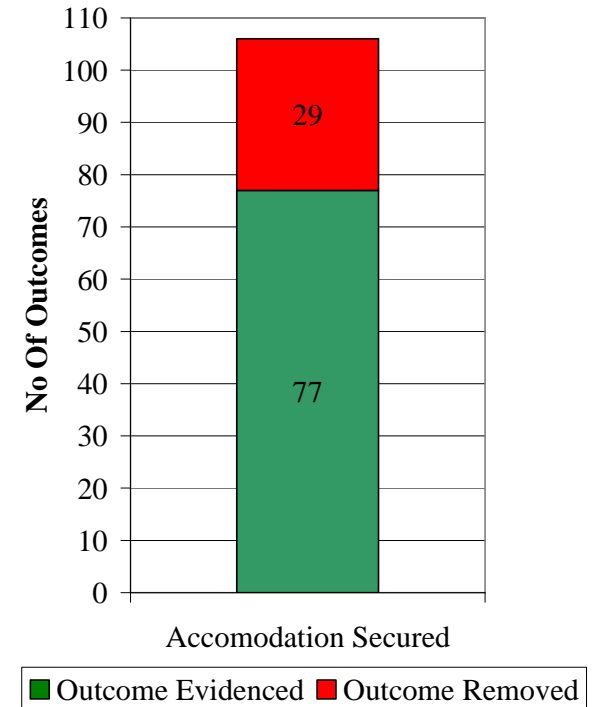
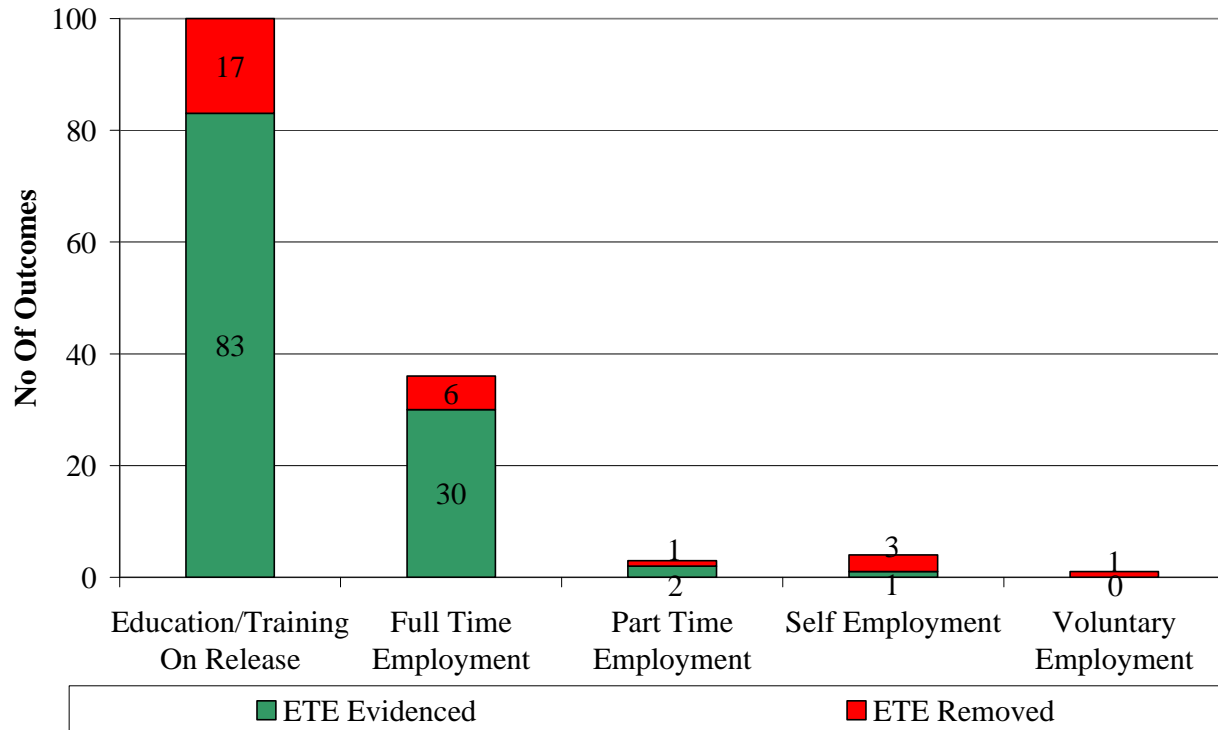

- o 54 NVQ levels 1 and 2 have been gained by beneficiaries in Stafford.
- o 19 adult literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Stafford.



- 484,815 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 430,933 (89%) of the hours collected were for practical activities.

Hard Outcomes



- o 144 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Stafford with evidence for 116 of these outcomes (81% evidence for outcome rate).
- o 106 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 77 outcomes (73% evidence for outcome rate).
