

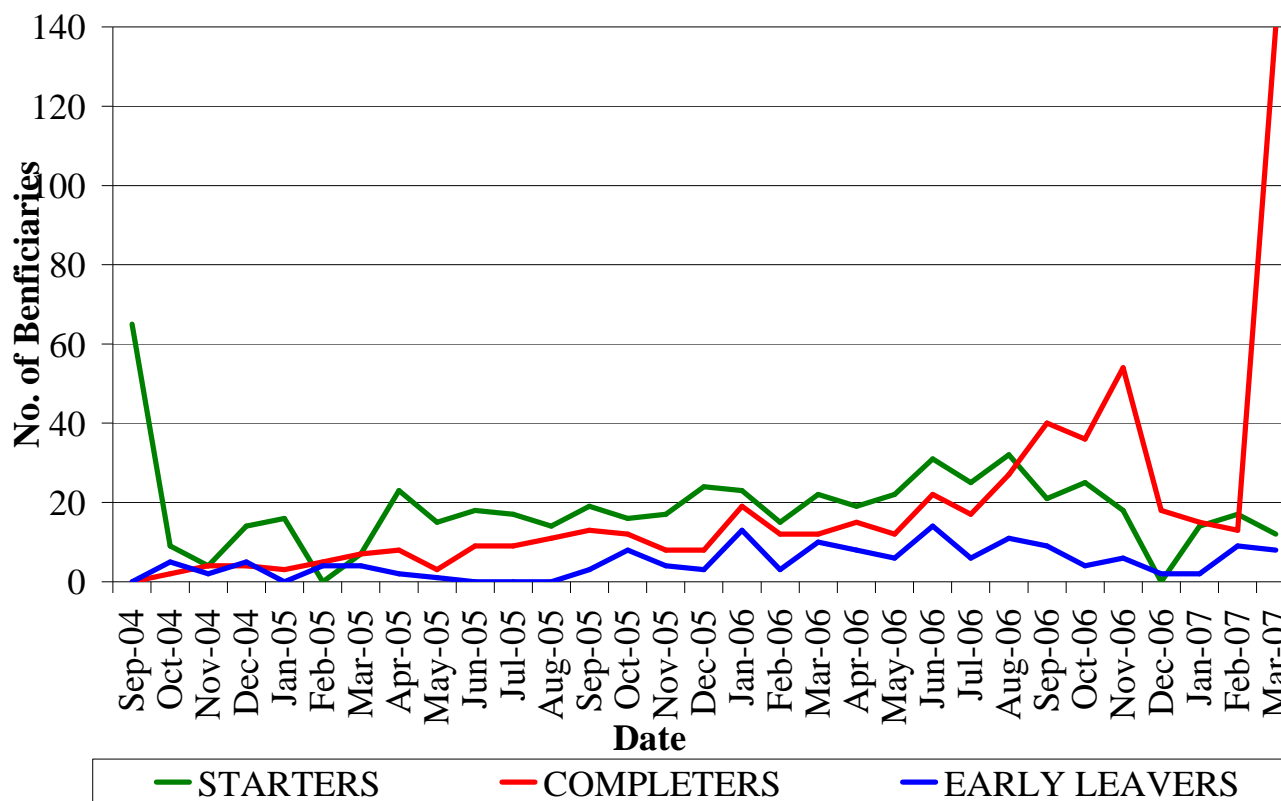

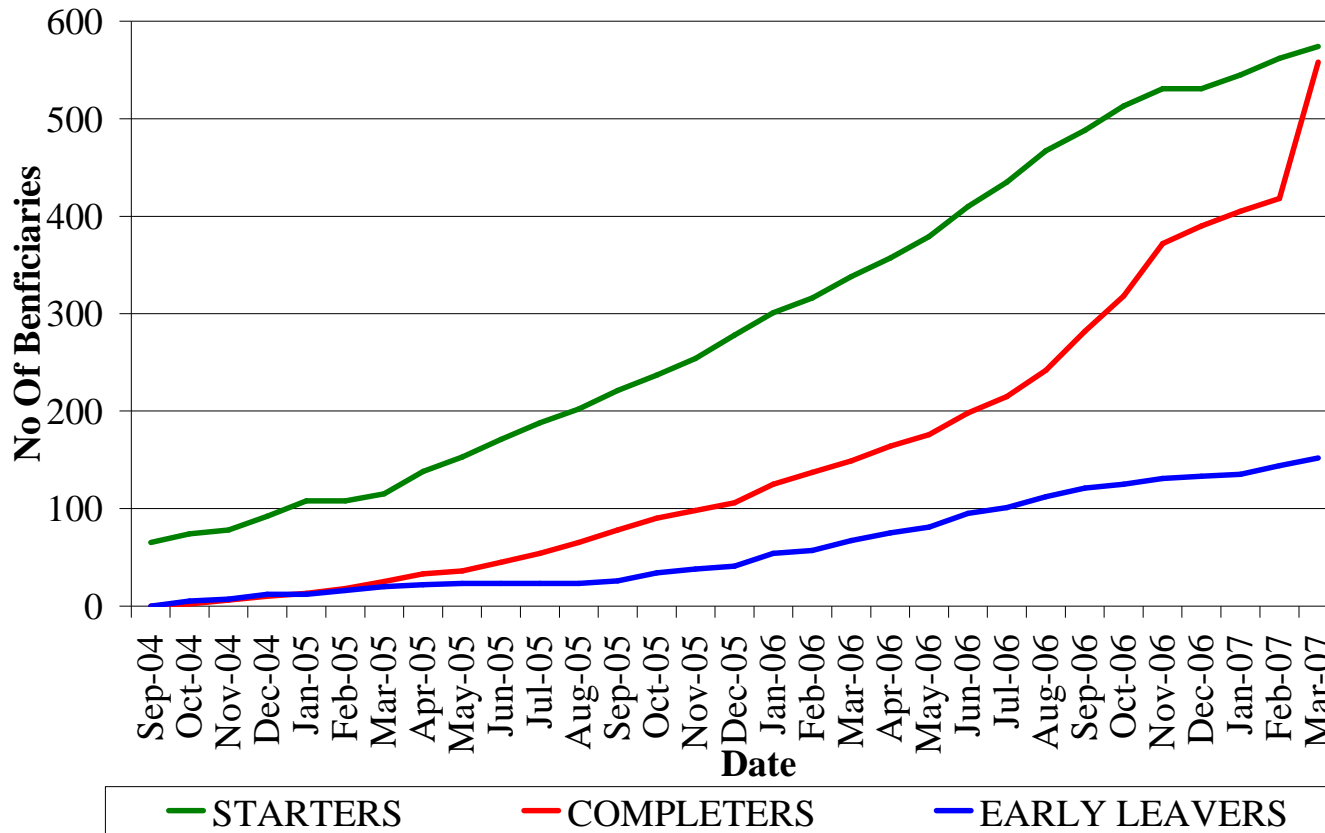

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



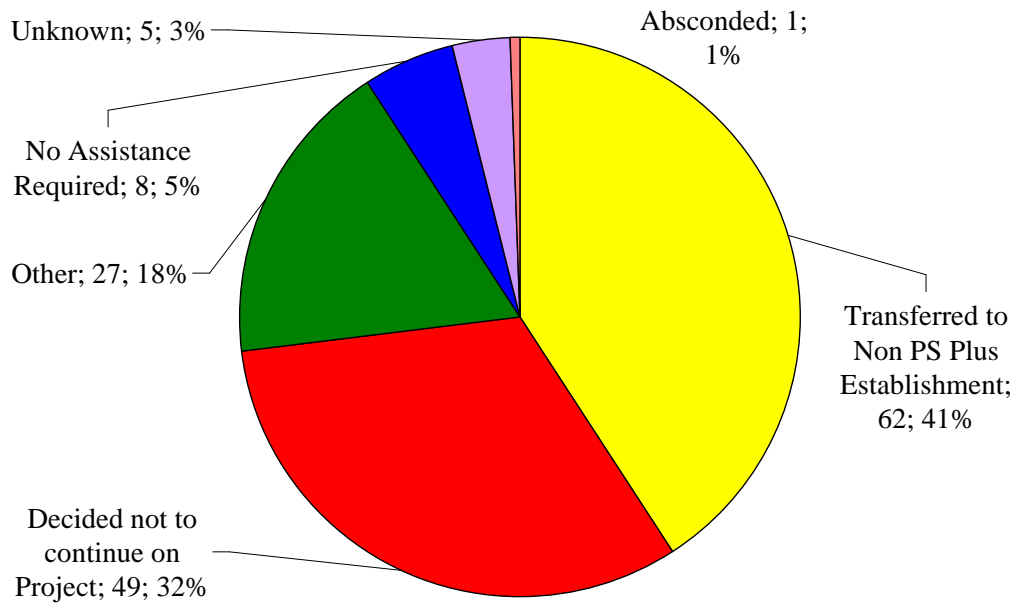
- Most months, Stocken started between 15 and 35 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- Up until the last 7 months of the project (project closure), no more than 27 beneficiaries were completing the PS Plus 2 project per month.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Nearly 580 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Stocken.
- 710 beneficiaries finished in Stocken – 558 completed the project and 152 left the project early.

Reasons for Early Leavers

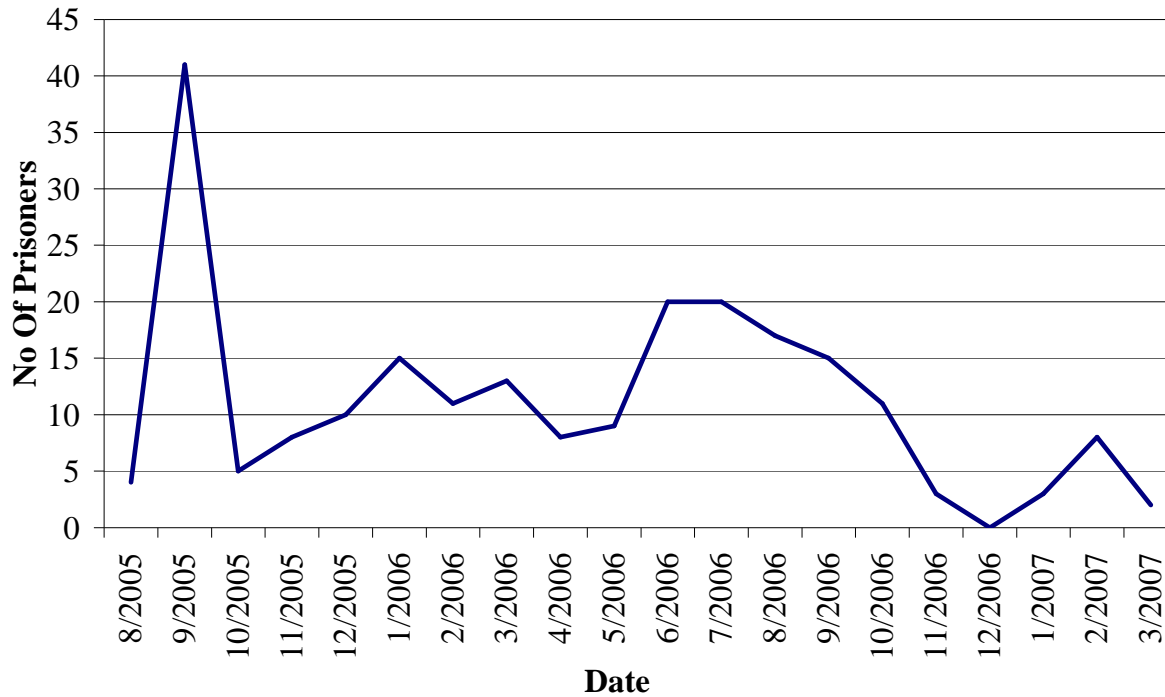

- Of the 152 beneficiaries who left the project early, 41% (62) transferred to a non-PS Plus establishment.
- 49 (32%) beneficiaries decided not to continue on the project.

Non-Starters Per Month

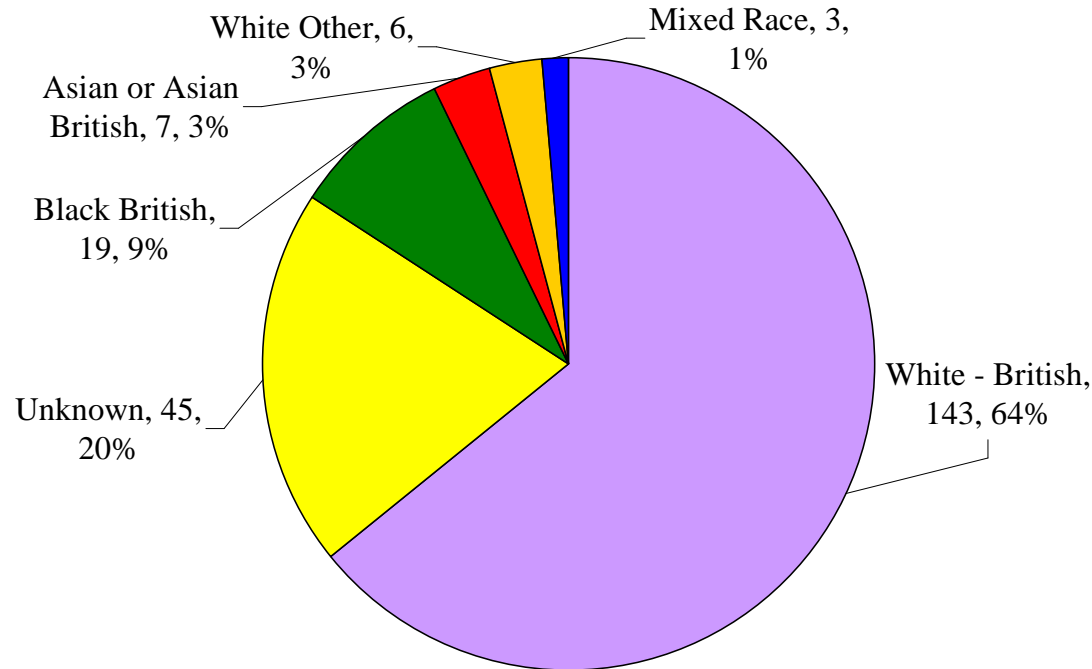


Reasons for prisoner not being started:

- Most months, no more than 20 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- In total, over 220 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Stocken.
- 43% (96) of prisoners not started at Stocken did not require PS Plus services.

Ethnic Breakdown of prisoners not started



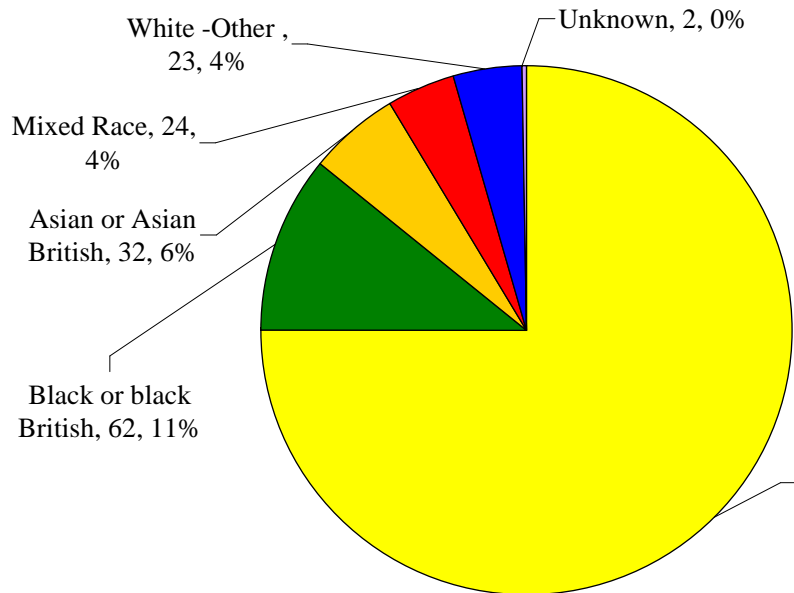

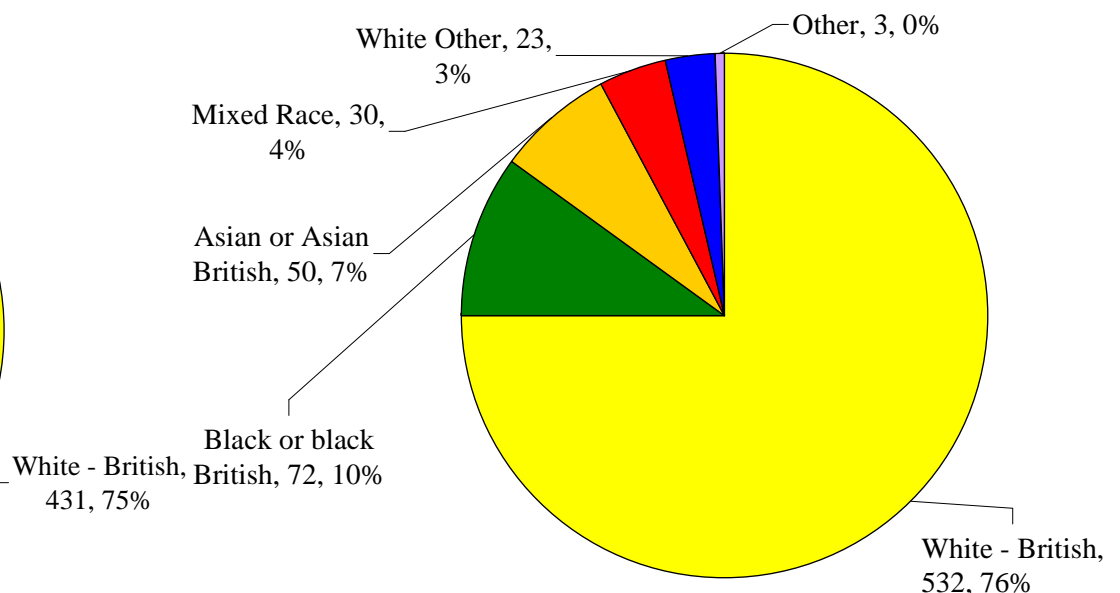
- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (64%) and from United Kingdom (80%)
- Ethnic minorities account for 16% (35) of the prisoners not started.
- The ethnic origin of 20% (45) of the prisoners not started at Stocken is unknown.

- 75% (431) of the beneficiaries who started and 76% (532) of the beneficiaries who finished in Stocken were White-British.
- 25% (141) of the beneficiaries who started and 24% (175) of the beneficiaries who finished in Stocken were from ethnic minorities.

- The Ethnic Origin of 2 beneficiaries who started (<1%) and 3 beneficiaries who finished (<1%) in Stocken, is Unknown.

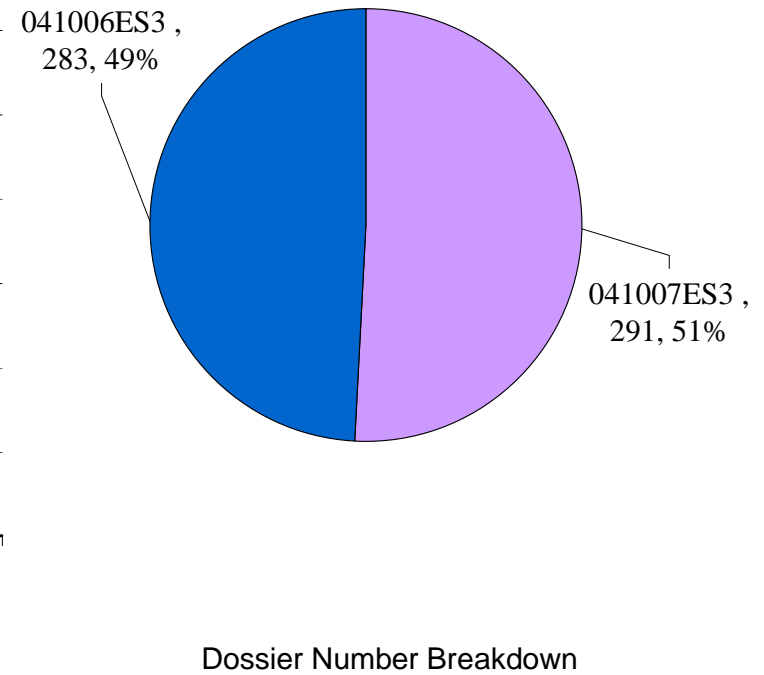
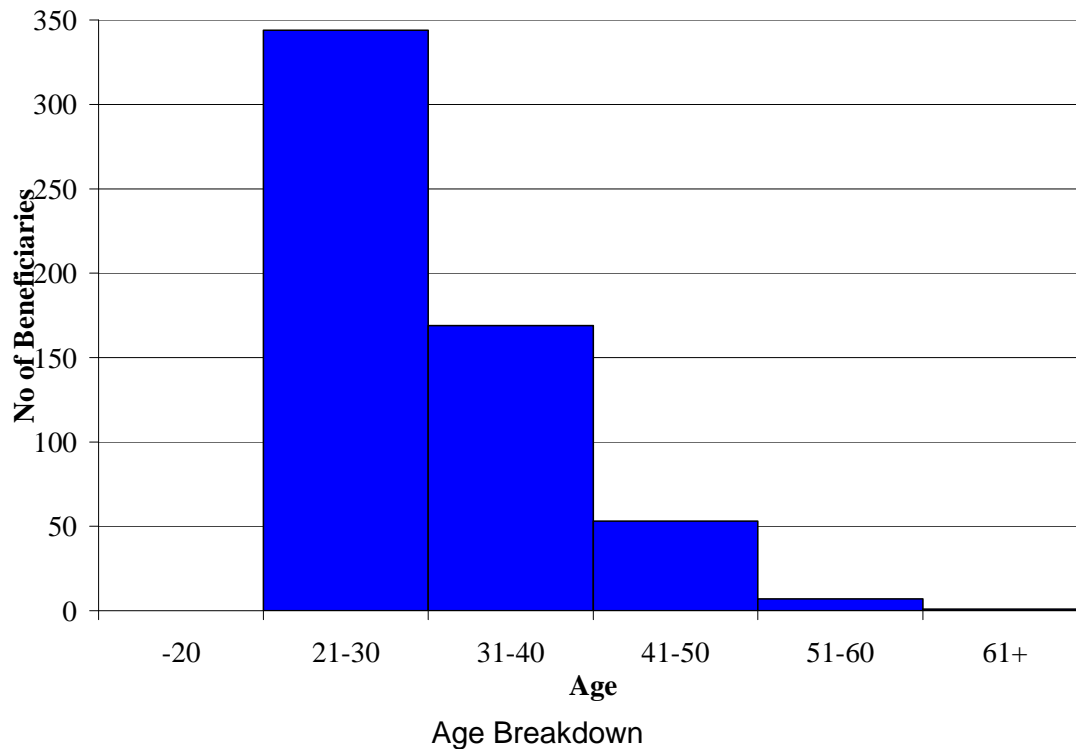

- 83% (478) of the beneficiaries who started in Stocken stated that their nationality is United Kingdom or British.
- 86% (610) of the beneficiaries who finished in Stocken stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- The nationalities of 89 of the beneficiaries who started in Stocken and 88 of the beneficiaries who finished in Stocken are unknown.

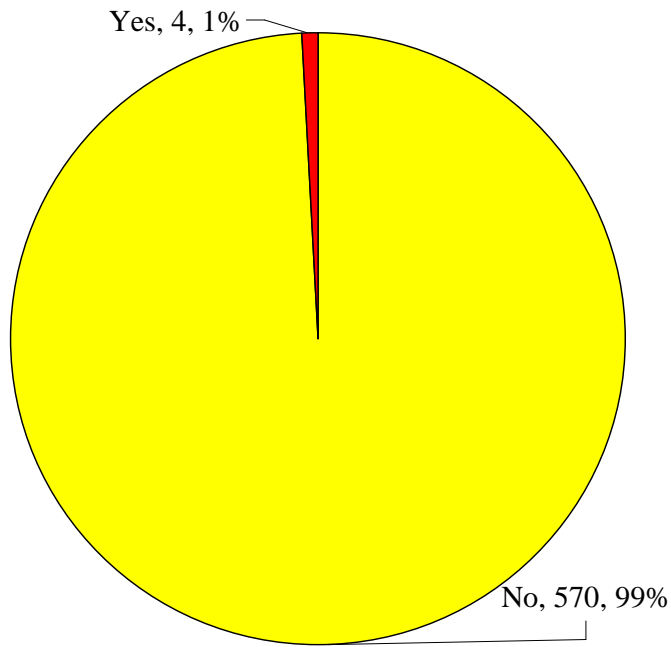


Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2

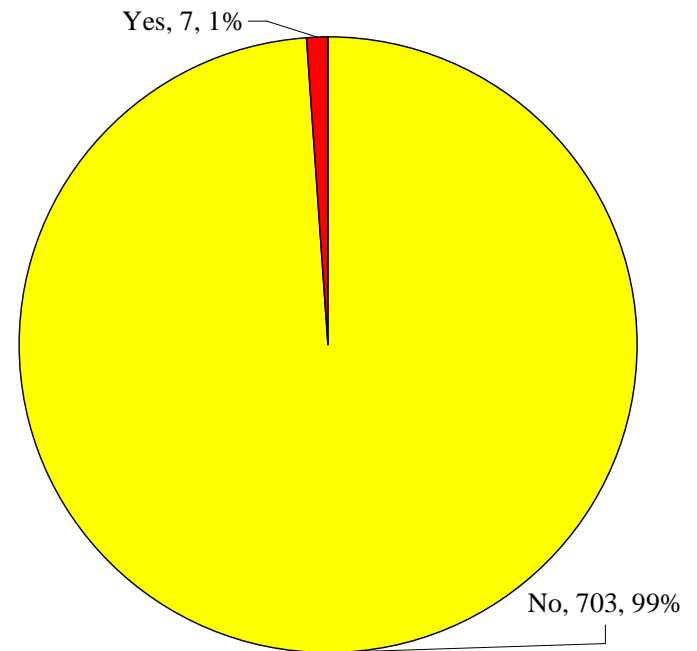


- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Stocken is 30 years. The average (mode) age group is 21 – 30 years old.
- 51% (291) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041007ES3 (male beneficiaries aged 28 and over).

Disabled Beneficiaries



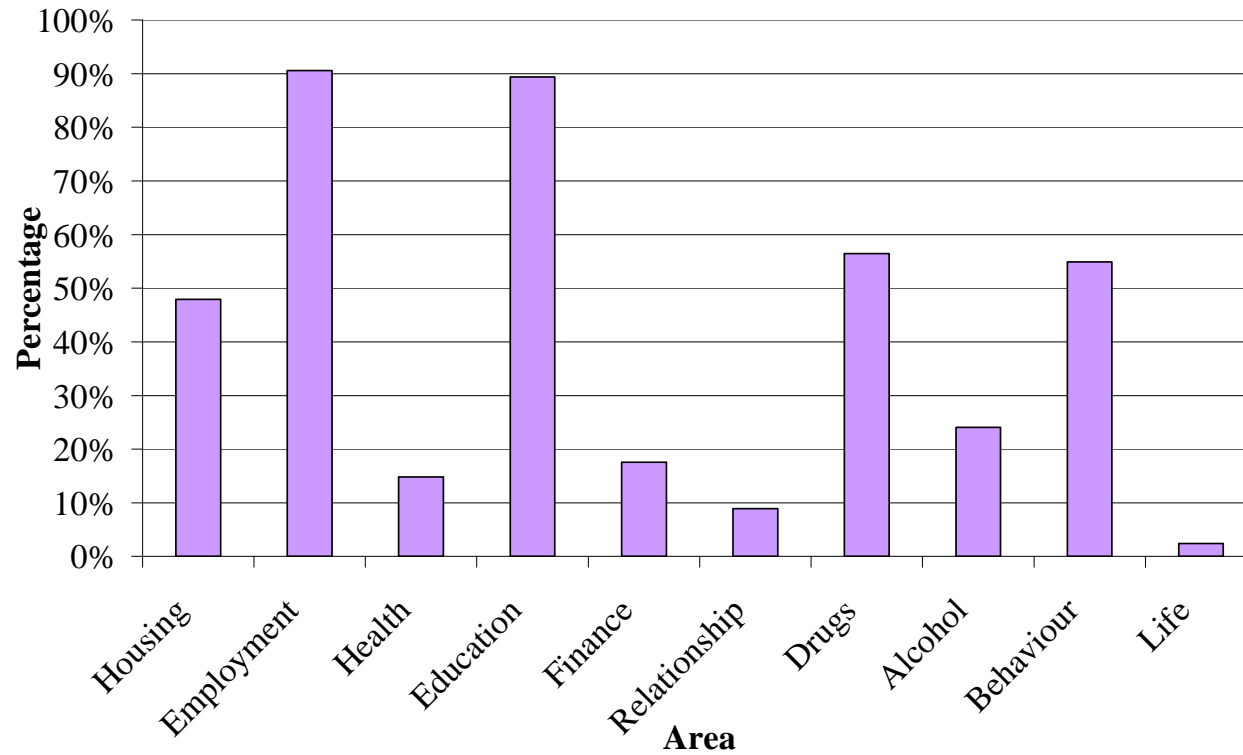
Beneficiaries Starting in Stocken



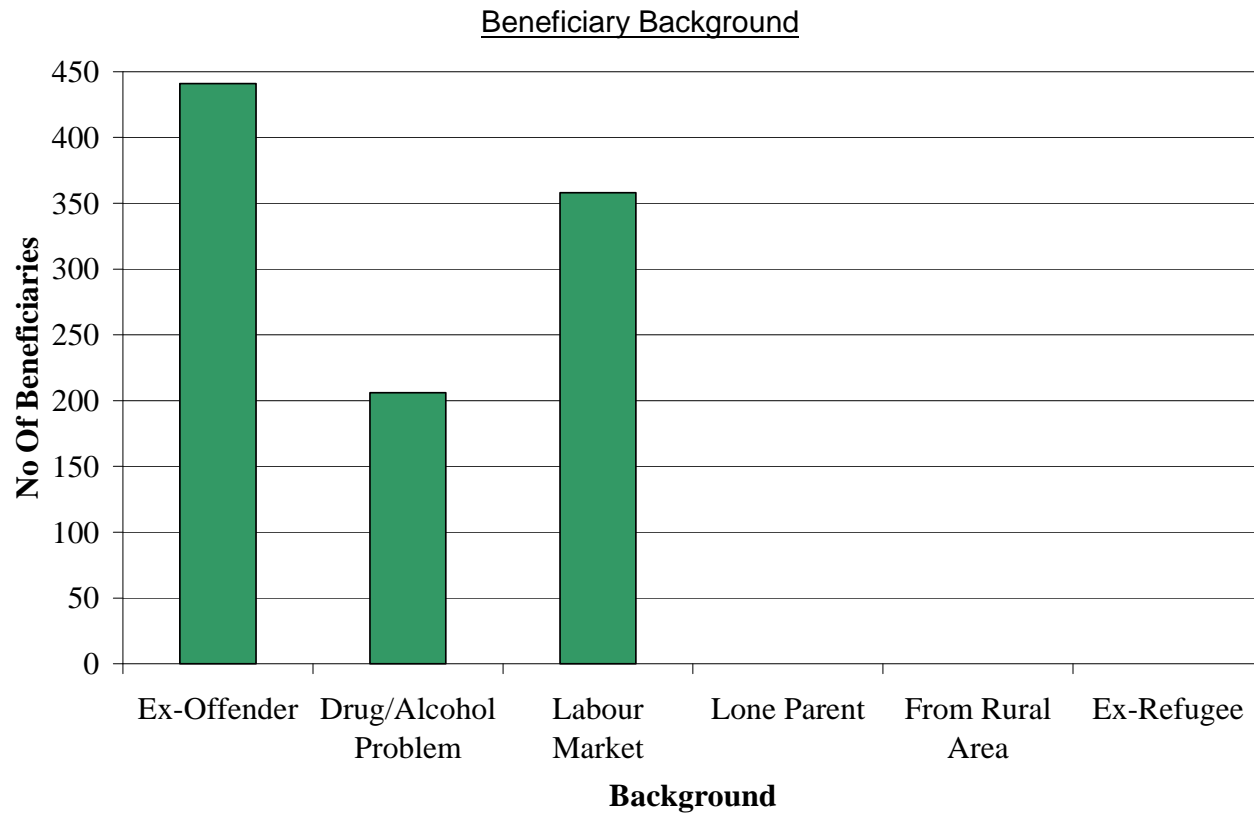
Beneficiaries Finishing in Stocken

- 4 of the beneficiaries who started in Stocken were classified as being disabled.
- 7 of the beneficiaries who finished in Stocken were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Stocken



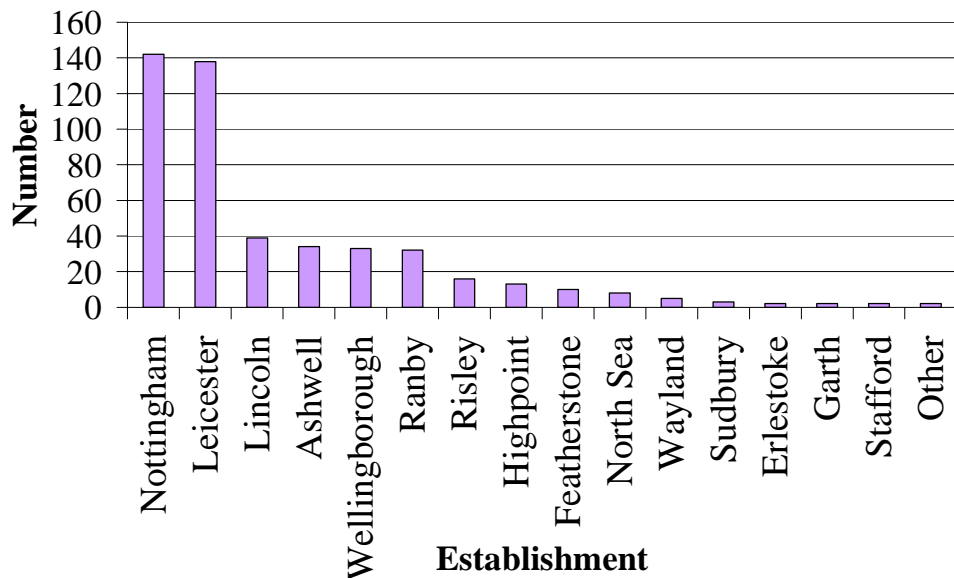
- Over 90% of the beneficiaries who started in Stocken needed help with employment.
- Almost 90% of the beneficiaries who started in Stocken needed help with education.
- Over 50% of the beneficiaries who started in Stocken need help with drugs issues.



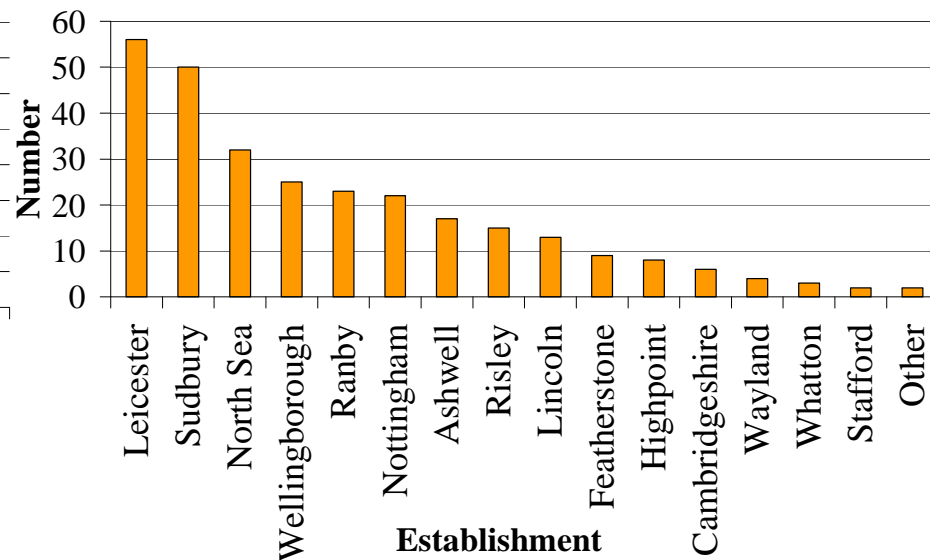
- Almost 450 of the beneficiaries who started in Stocken were ex-offenders.
- Over 350 of the beneficiaries who started in Stocken were on the labour market.
- Over 200 of the beneficiaries who started in Stocken had drug or alcohol related problems.

Transfers into Stocken

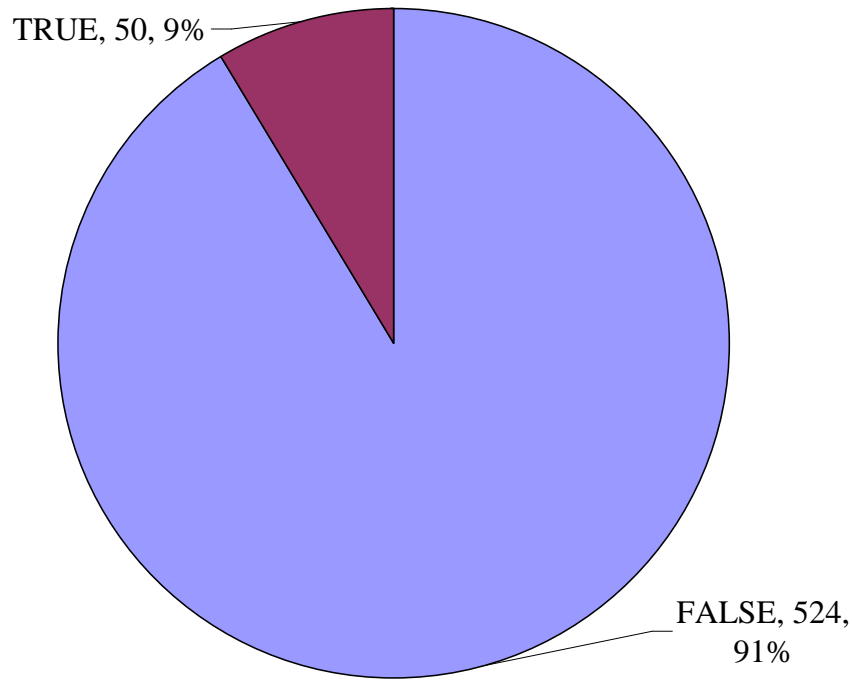


Transfers from Stocken

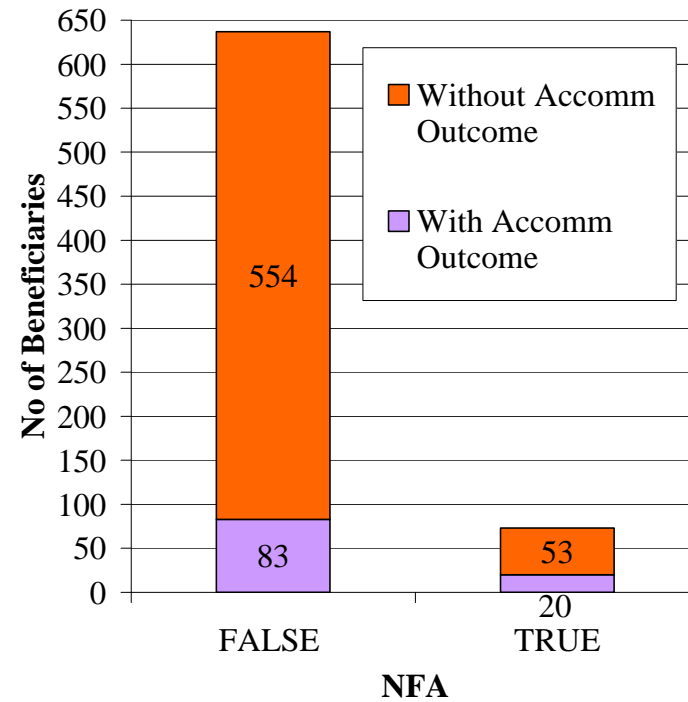


- 481 beneficiaries have transferred into Stocken – 58% transferred to Stocken from Nottingham and Leicester.
- 287 beneficiaries have transferred from Stocken – 37% transferred from Stocken to Leicester and Sudbury.

Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode

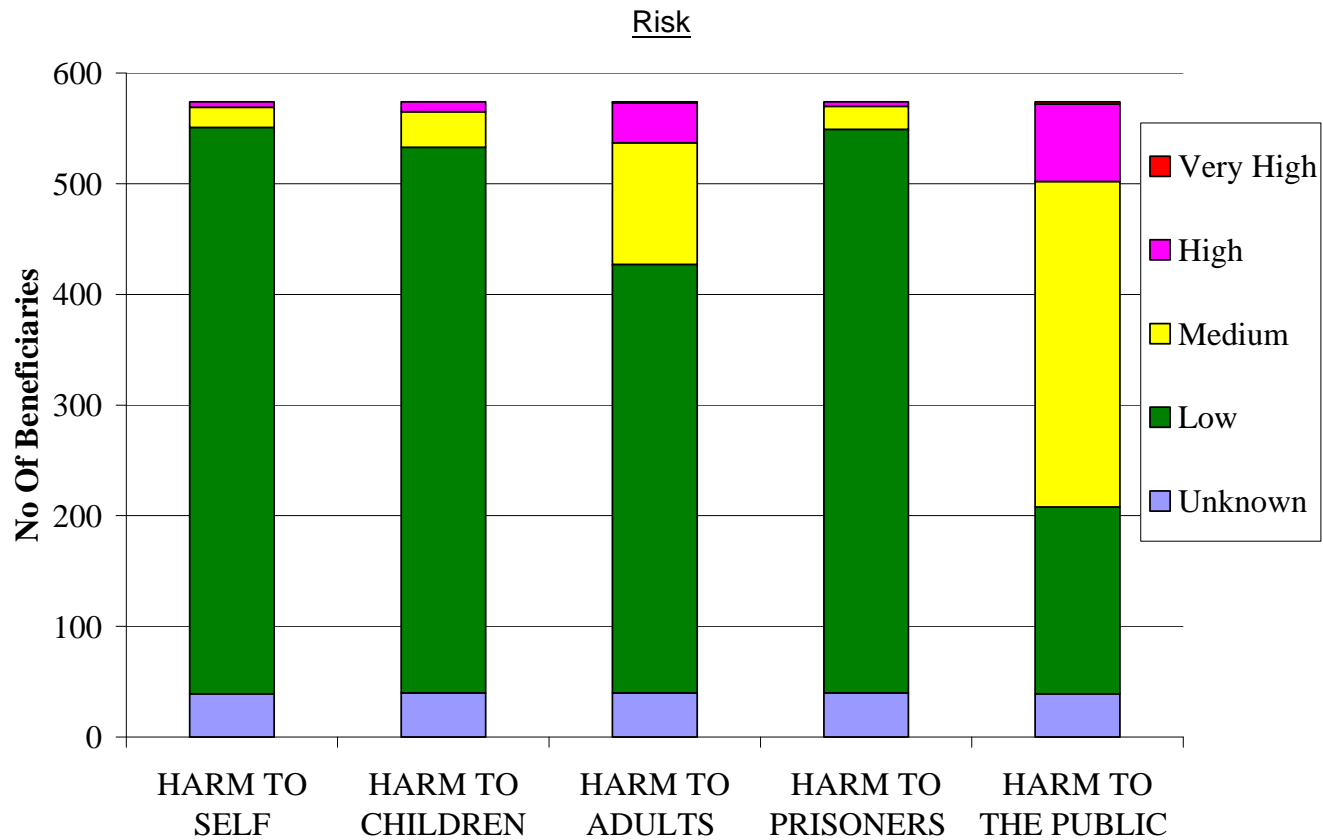


Beneficiaries Starting in Stafford

- 9% (50) of the beneficiaries started in Stocken were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 73 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 20 had an accommodation outcome secured.



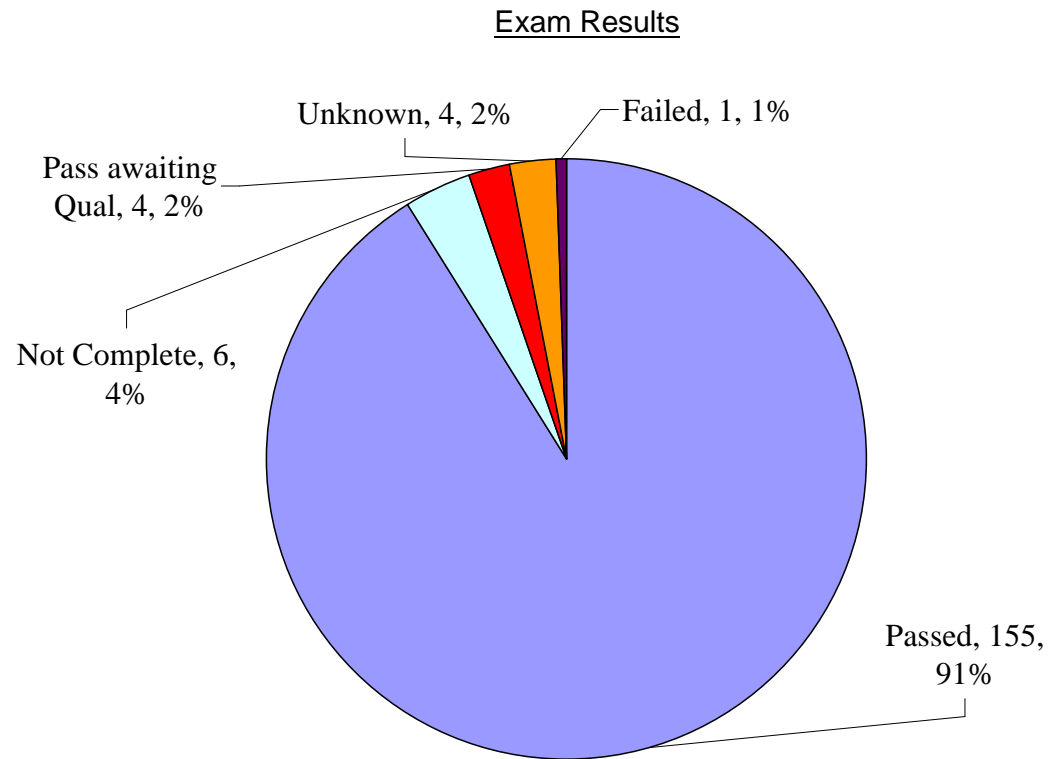
- For approximately 40 beneficiaries the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners towards themselves, children, adults, prisoners, and medium risk towards the public.

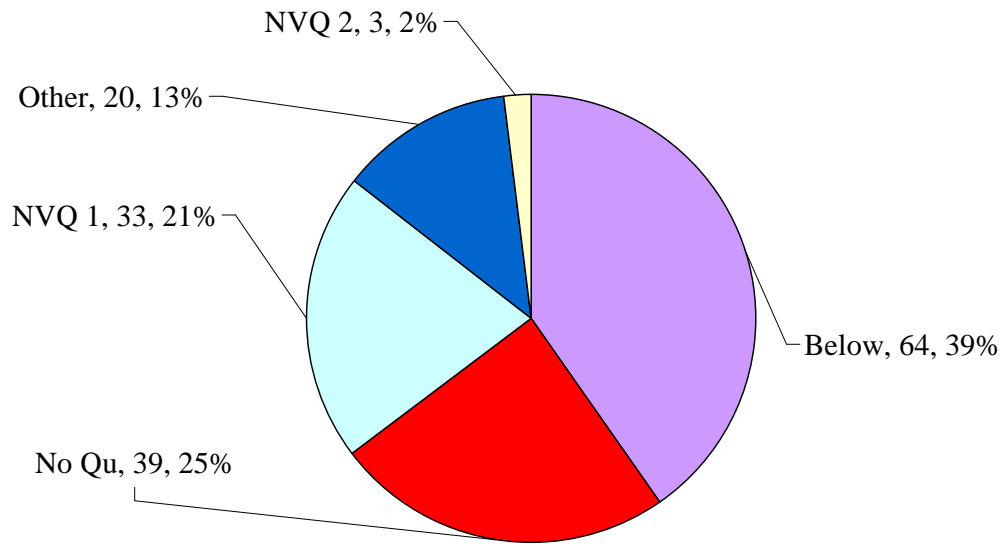
- 957 soft outcomes were gained by Stocken beneficiaries.
- 213 beneficiaries received IAG assistance.
- 117 beneficiaries attended ECDL.
- Beneficiaries in Stocken attended 89 interviews – Further Education, Job, Homeless, Progress to Work, Fresh Start and New Deal interviews.
- 100 beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiary Access Fund.





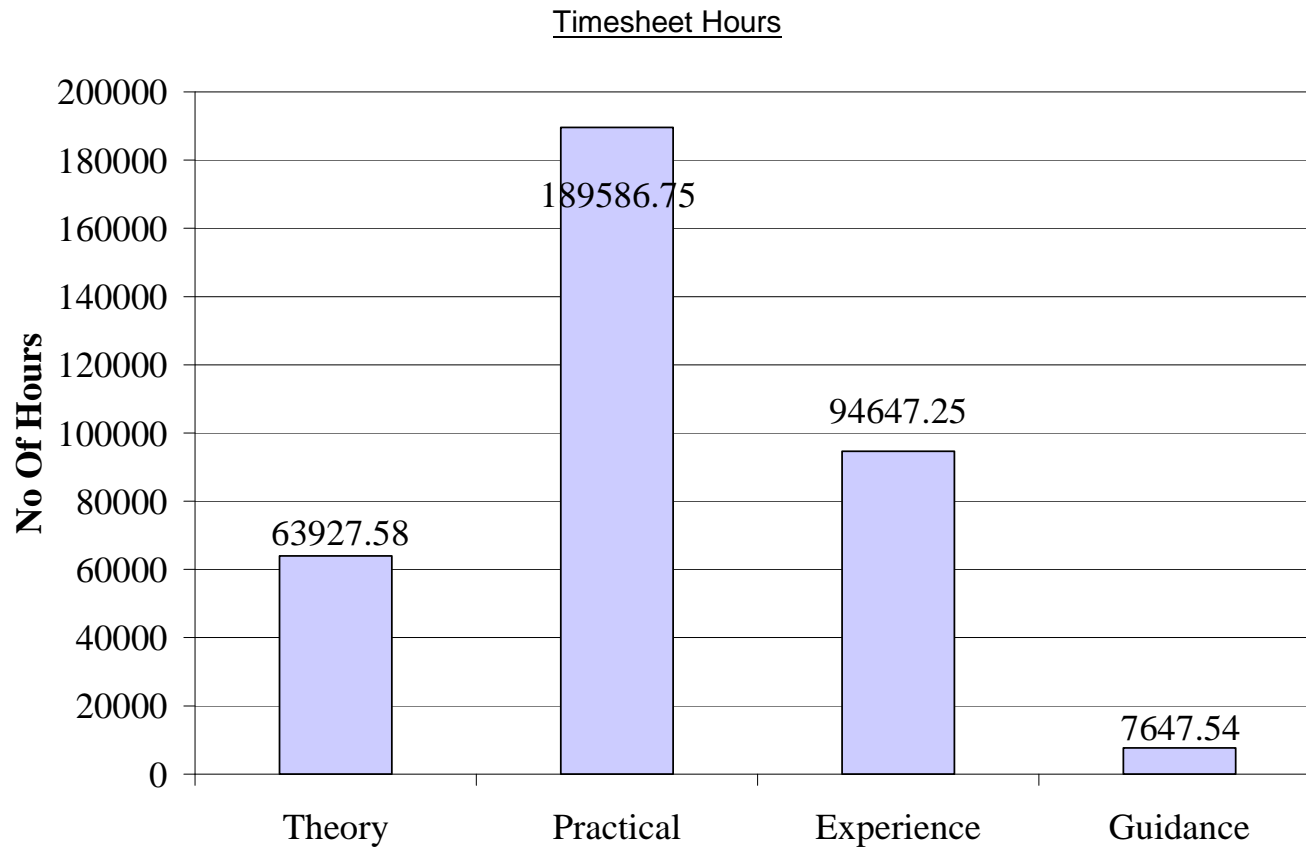
- 93% (159) of the exams taken were passed.
- Only one exam was failed.

NVQ Equivalence for Passed Subjects



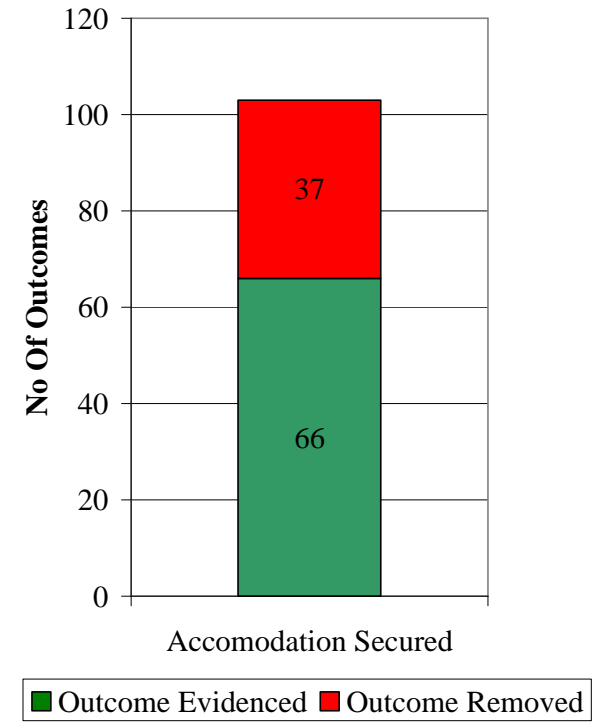
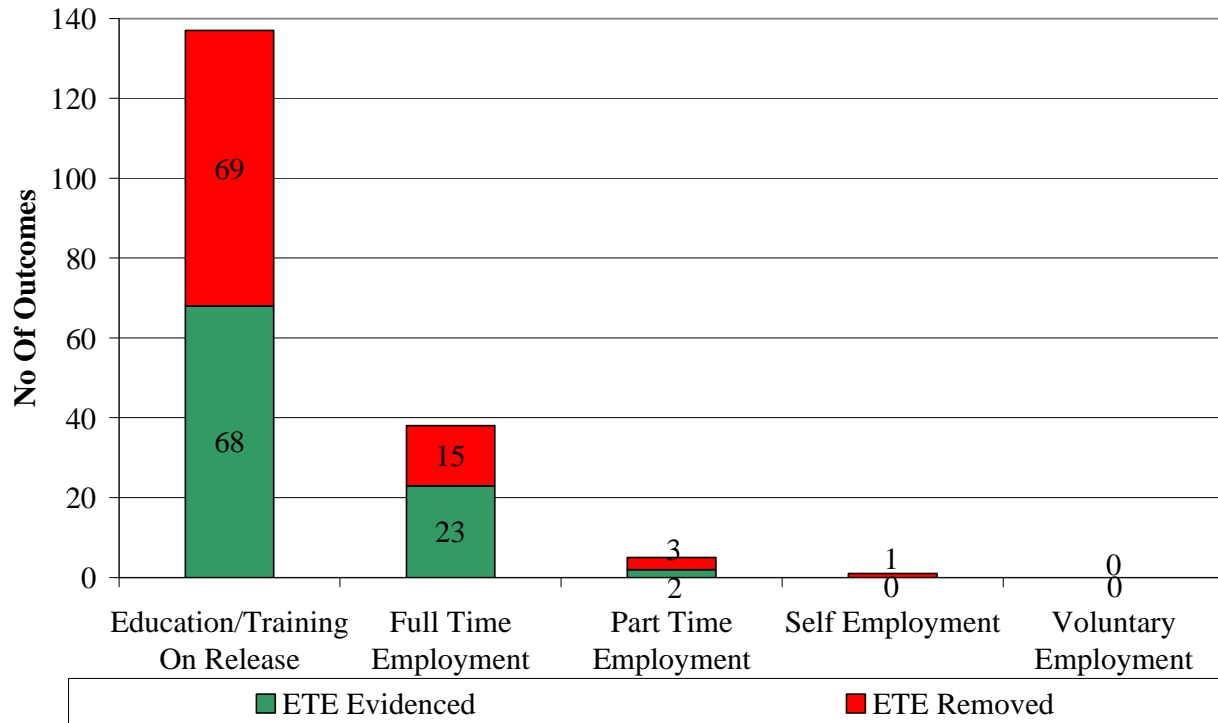

- 36 NVQ levels 1 and 2 have been gained by beneficiaries in Stocken.
- 21 adult literacy and numeracy courses have been completed.



- 355,809 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 189,587 (53%) of the hours collected were for practical activities.

Hard Outcomes



- o 181 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Stocken with evidence for 93 of these outcomes (51% evidence for outcome rate).
- o 103 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 66 outcomes (64% evidence for outcome rate).
