

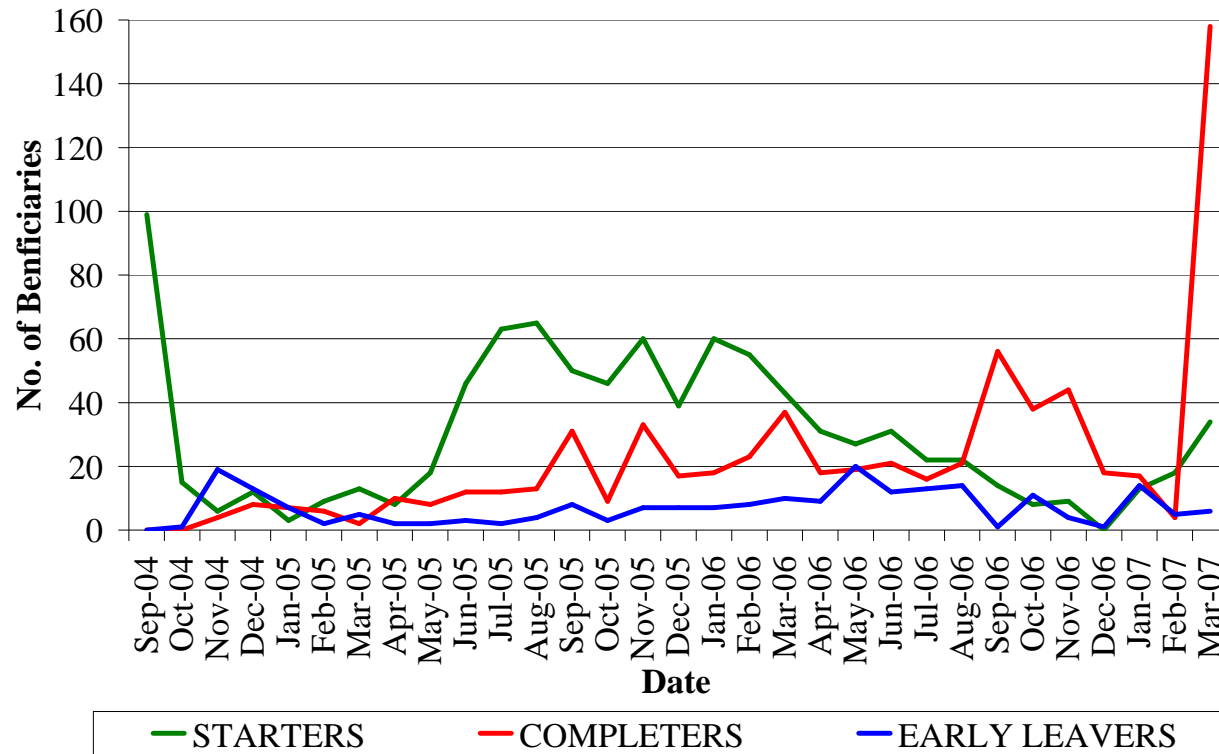

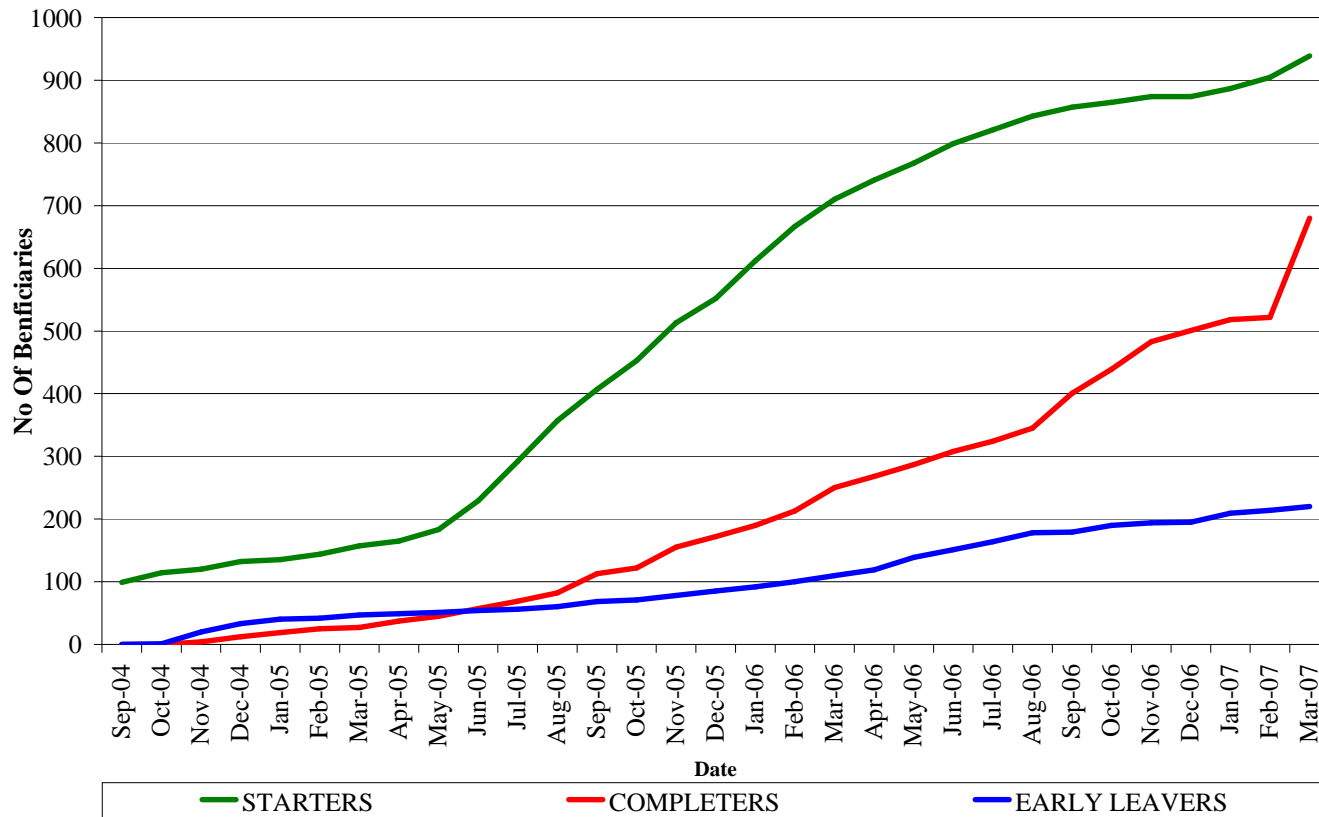

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



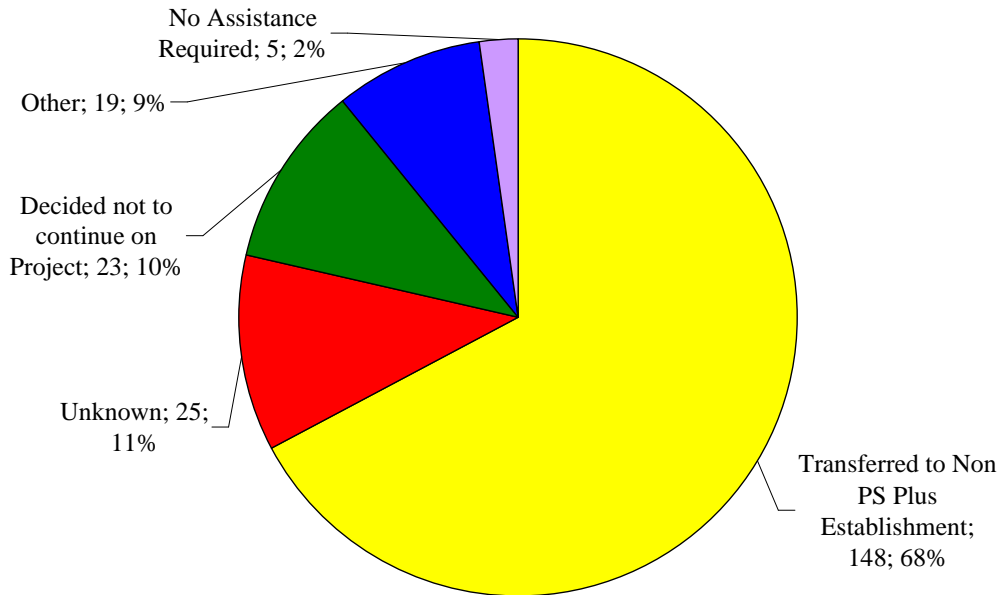
- With the exception of September 2004, for the first 9 months less than 20 beneficiaries were started per month in Wellingborough. This increased to over 40 beneficiaries per month and wound down in the last 8 months before project closure.
- Up until the last 7 months of the project (project closure), no more than 40 beneficiaries were completing the PS Plus 2 project per month.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Nearly 950 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Wellingborough.
- 900 beneficiaries finished in Wellingborough – 680 completed the project and 220 left the project early.

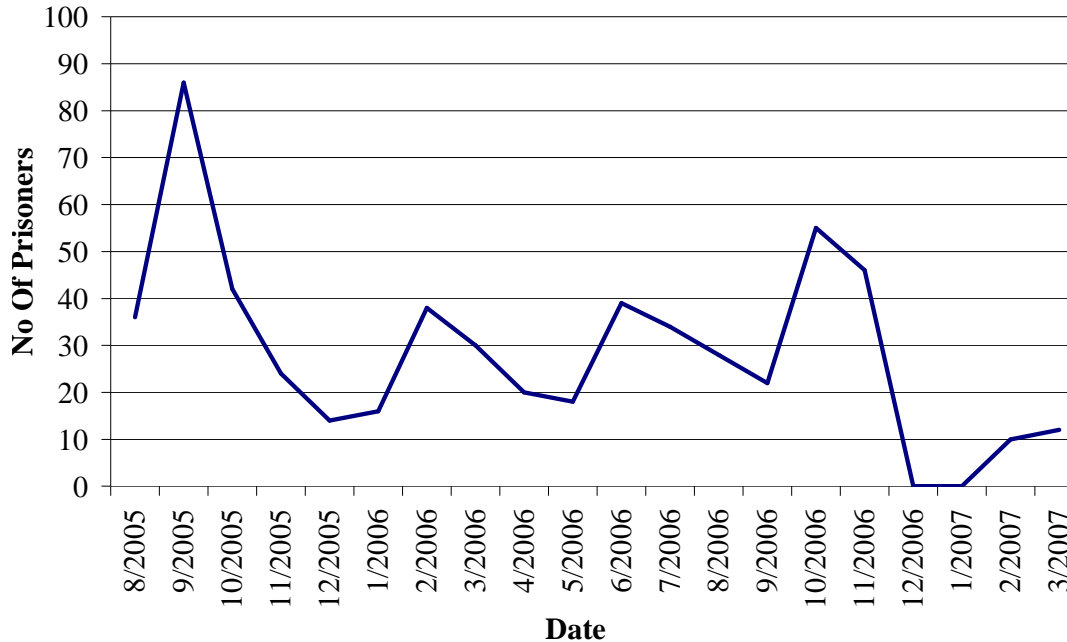

- Of the 220 beneficiaries who left the project early, 68% (148) transferred to a non-PS Plus establishment.
- 23 beneficiaries decided not to continue on the project, and 5 did not require any assistance.

Non-Starters Per Month



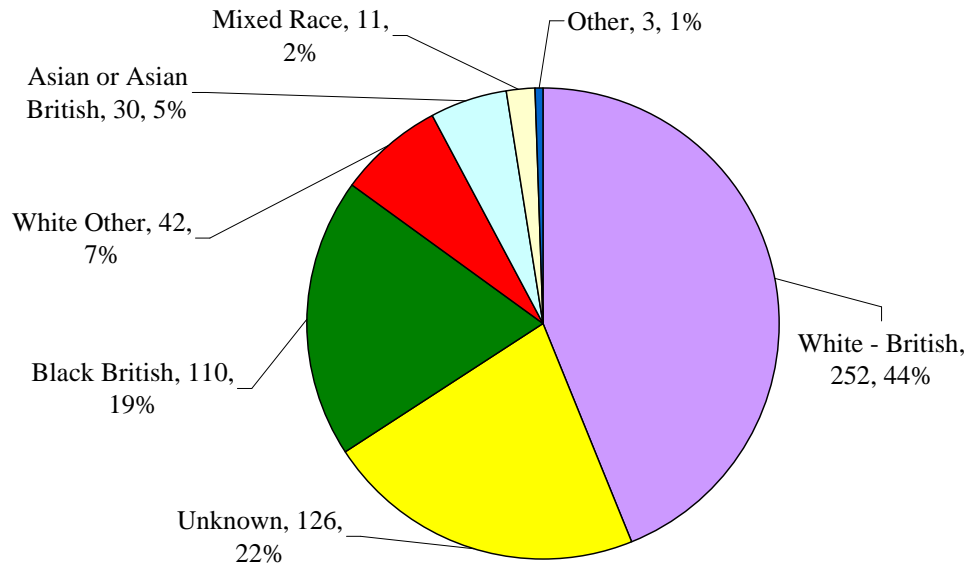

- Most months, over 20 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- In total, 574 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Wellingborough.
- 194 of the prisoners not started in Wellingborough did not require PS Plus Services and 79 prisoners transferred before being started on the project (6 transferred before the assessment entered and 73 to a non-PS Plus establishment).

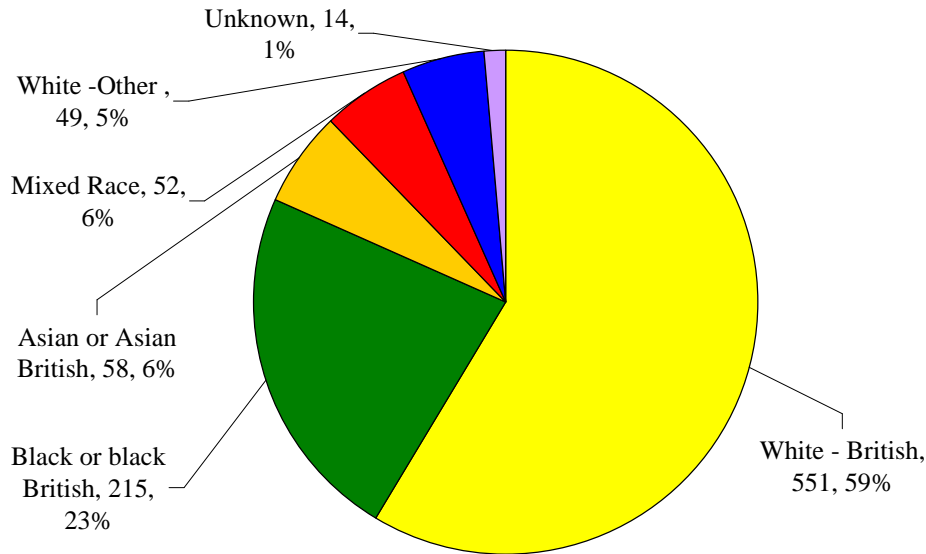

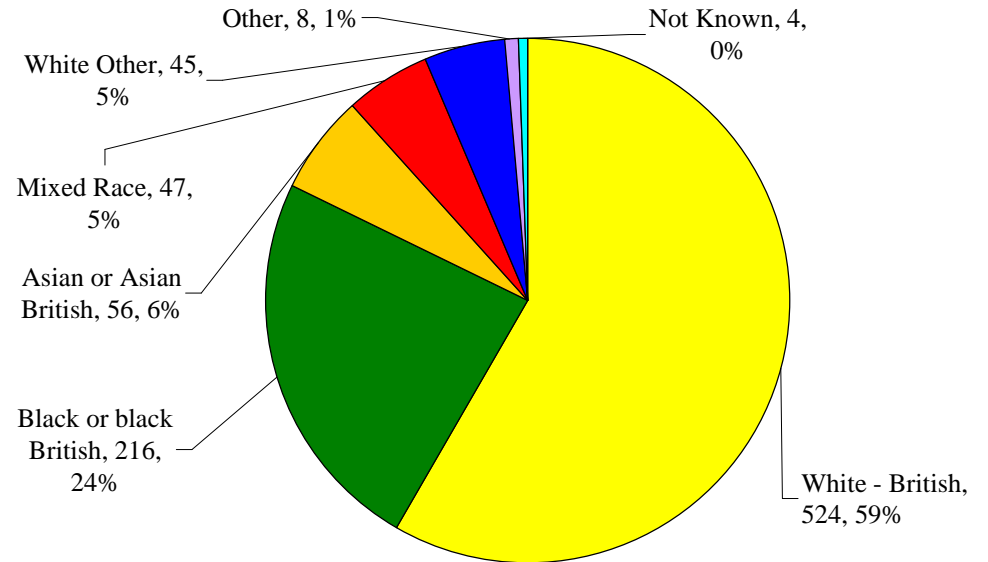
- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (44%) and from United Kingdom (59%).
- The ethnic origin for 1 in 5 and the nationality of 1 in 5 of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- Ethnic minorities account for 33% (193 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.

- 59% (551) of the beneficiaries who started and 59% (524) of the beneficiaries who finished in Wellingborough were White-British.
- 40% (374) of the beneficiaries who started and 40% (364) of the beneficiaries who finished in Wellingborough were from ethnic minorities.

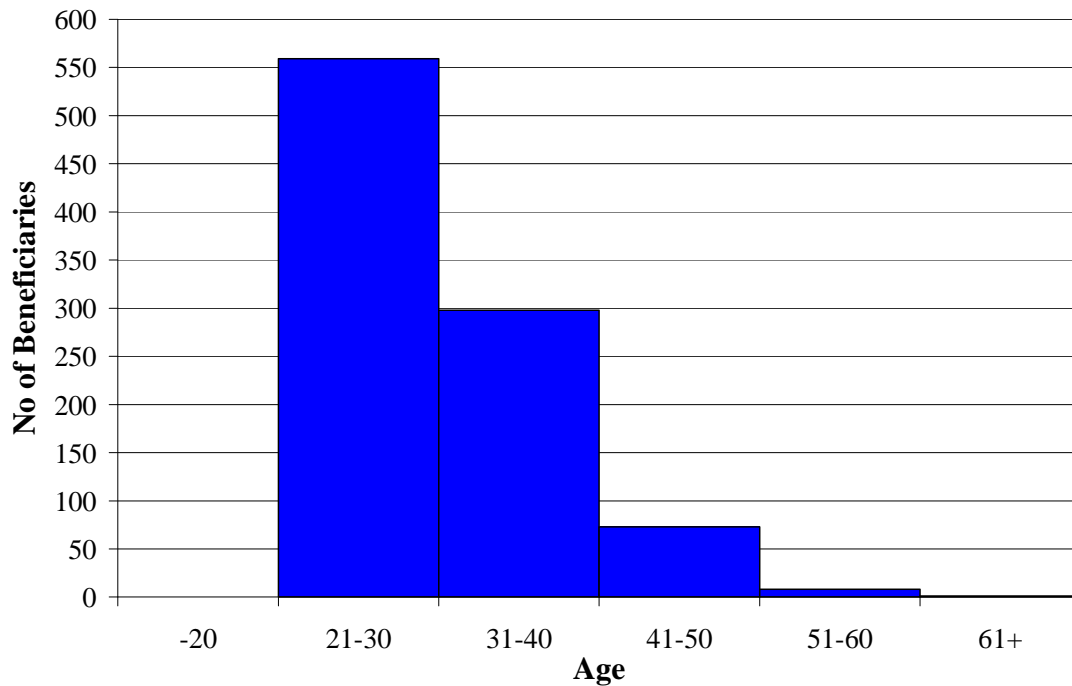

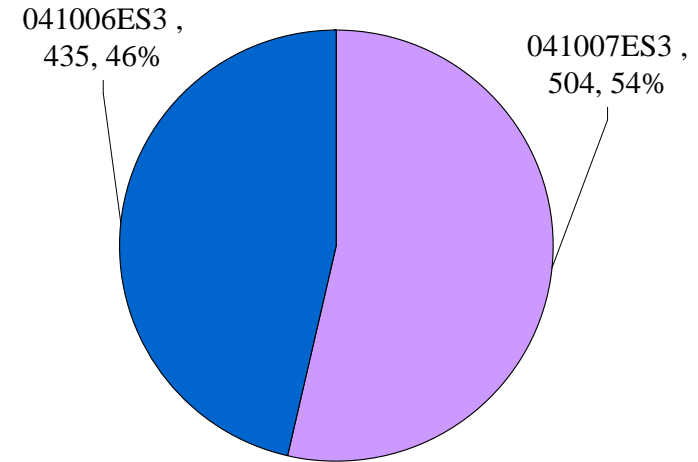

- 80% (755) of the beneficiaries who started in Wellingborough stated that their nationality is United Kingdom or British.
- 80% (720) of the beneficiaries who finished in Wellingborough stated that their Nationality is United Kingdom or British.
- The nationality of 139 of the beneficiaries who started in Wellingborough and 140 of the beneficiaries who finished in Wellingborough is unknown.

Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2



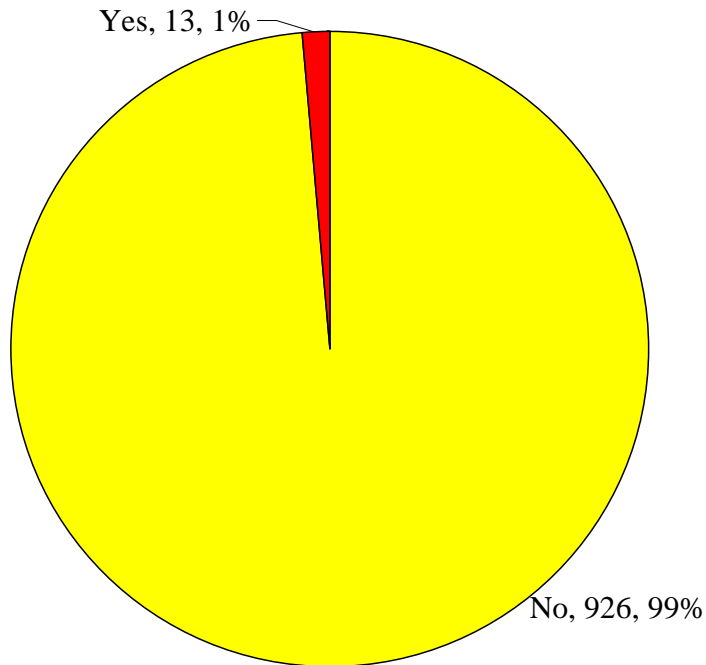
Age Breakdown



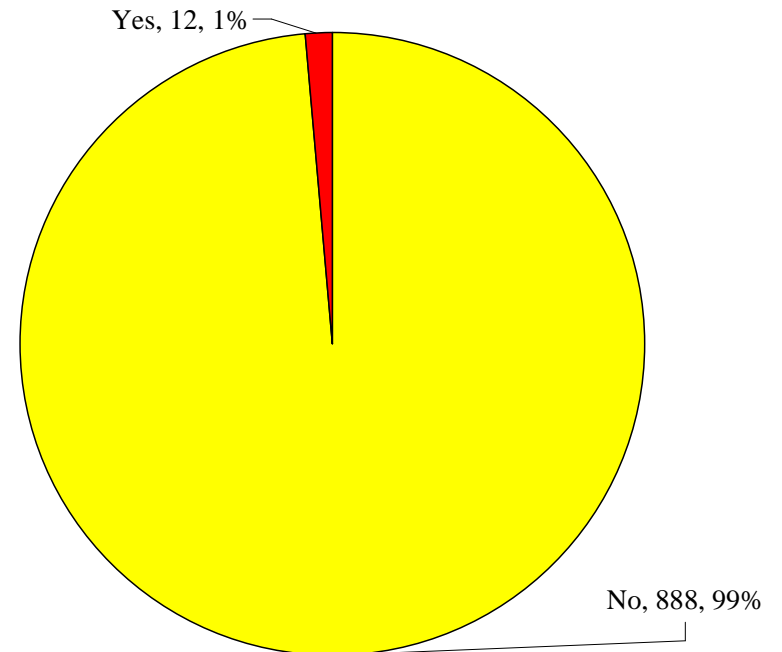
Dossier Number Breakdown

- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Wellingborough is 30 years and 2 months. The average (mode) age group is 21-30 years old.
- 54% (504) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041007ES3 (male beneficiaries aged 28 and over).

Disabled Beneficiaries



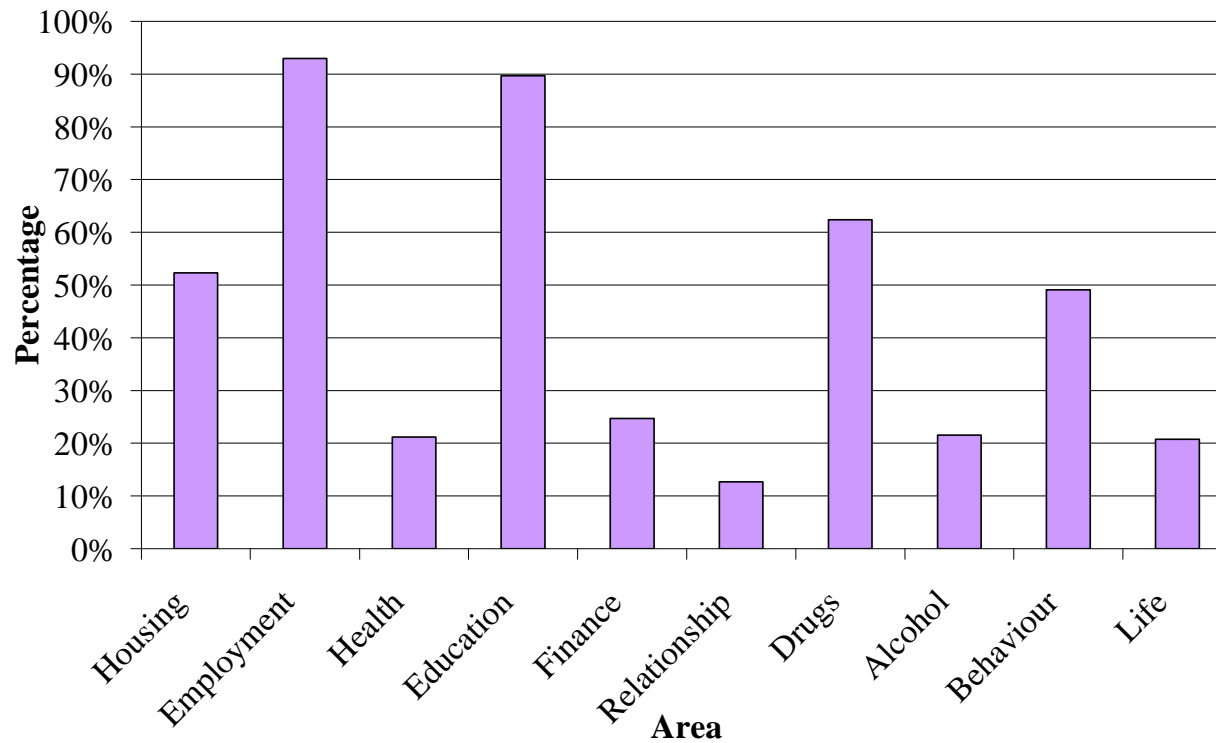

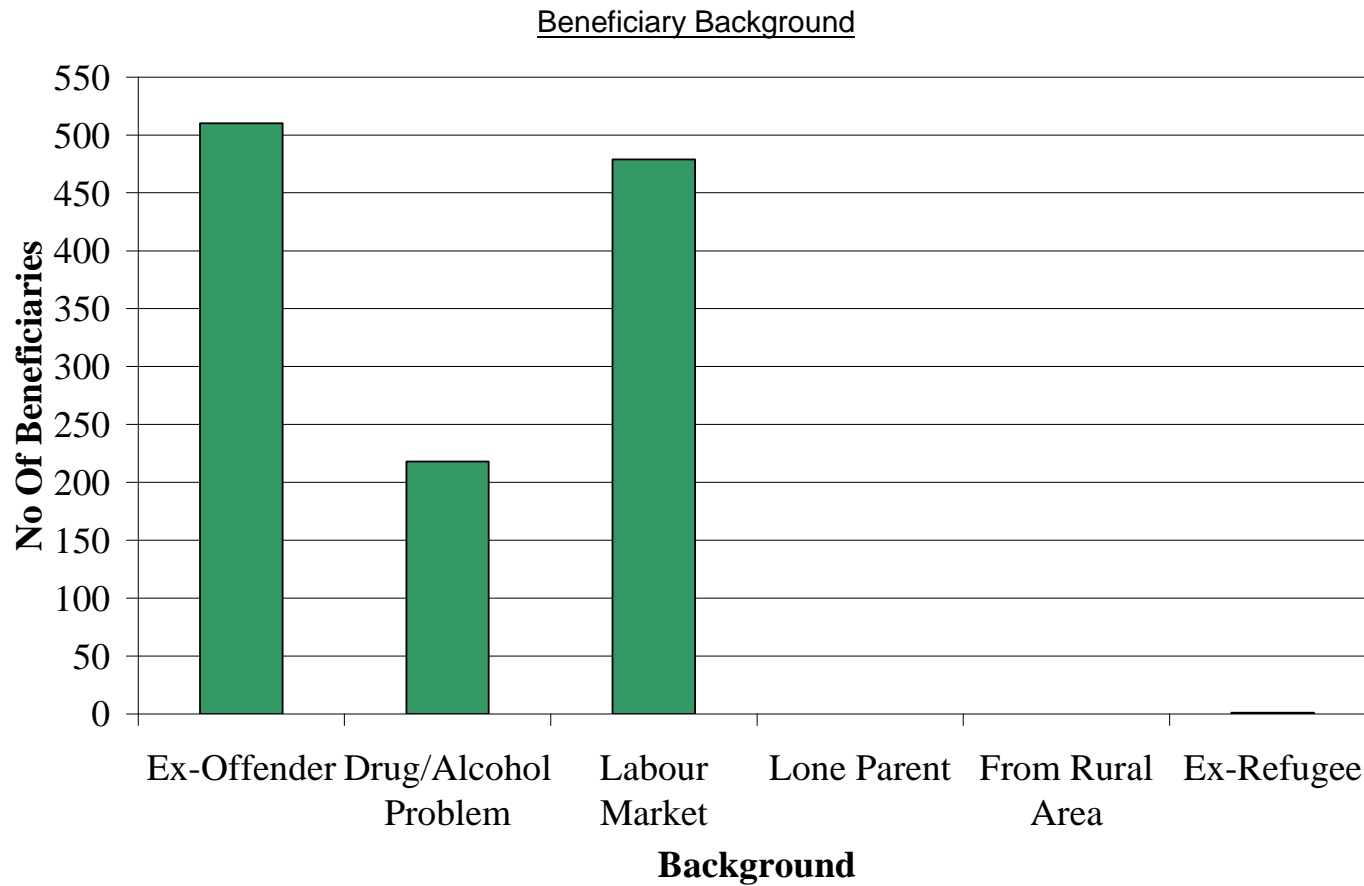
Beneficiaries Finishing in Wellingborough

- 13 of the beneficiaries who started in Wellingborough were classified as being disabled.
- 12 of the beneficiaries who finished in Wellingborough were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Wellingborough



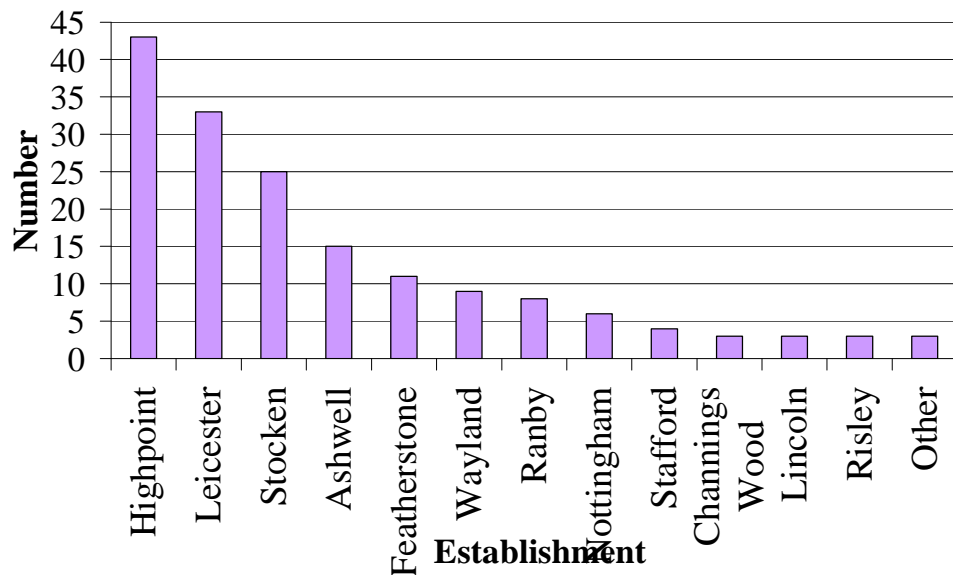
- Over 90% of the beneficiaries who started in Wellingborough needed help with employment.
- Almost 90% of the beneficiaries who started in Wellingborough needed help with education.
- Over 60% of the beneficiaries who started in Wellingborough needed help with drugs issues.



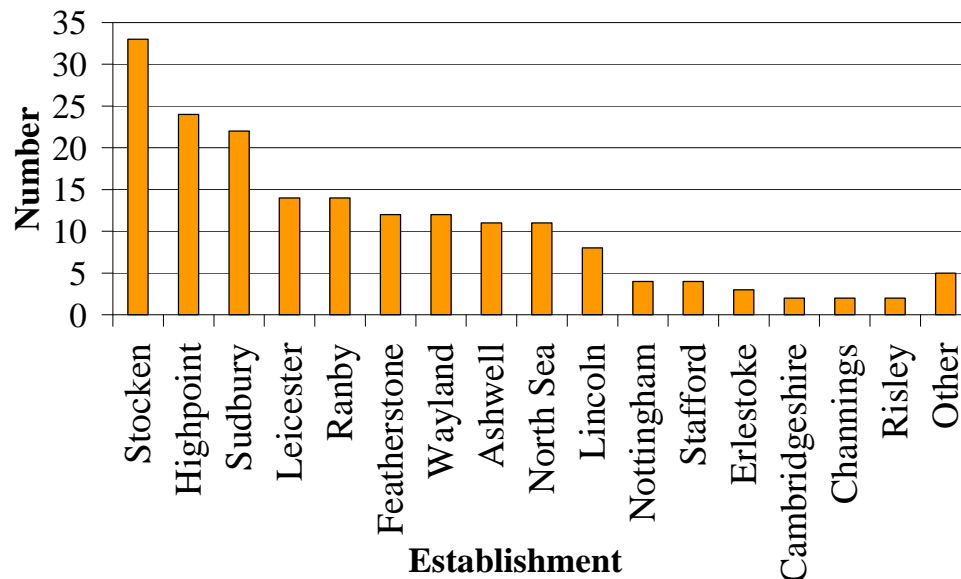
- Over 500 of the beneficiaries who started in Wellingborough were ex-offenders.
- Nearly 500 of the beneficiaries who started in Wellingborough are on the labour market.

Transfers into Wellingborough

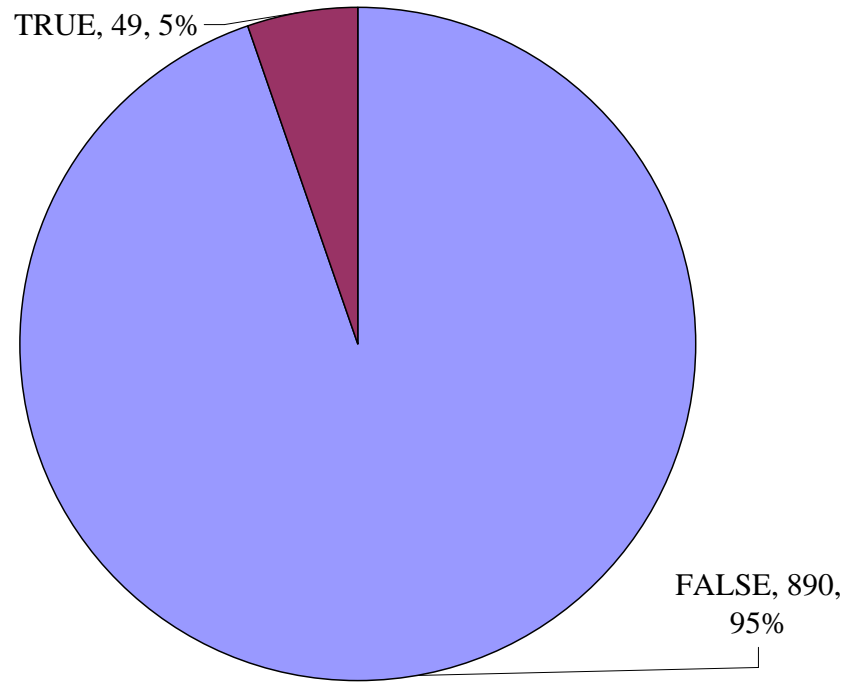


Transfers from Wellingborough

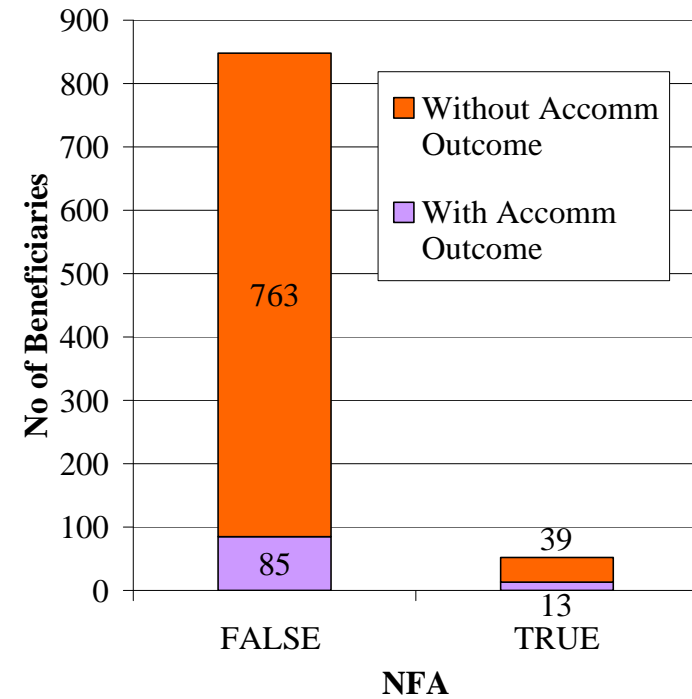


- 166 beneficiaries have transferred into Wellingborough – 61% transferred to Wellingborough from Highpoint, Leicester or Stocken.
- 183 beneficiaries have transferred from Wellingborough – 43% transferred from Wellingborough to Stocken, Highpoint or Sudbury.

Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode

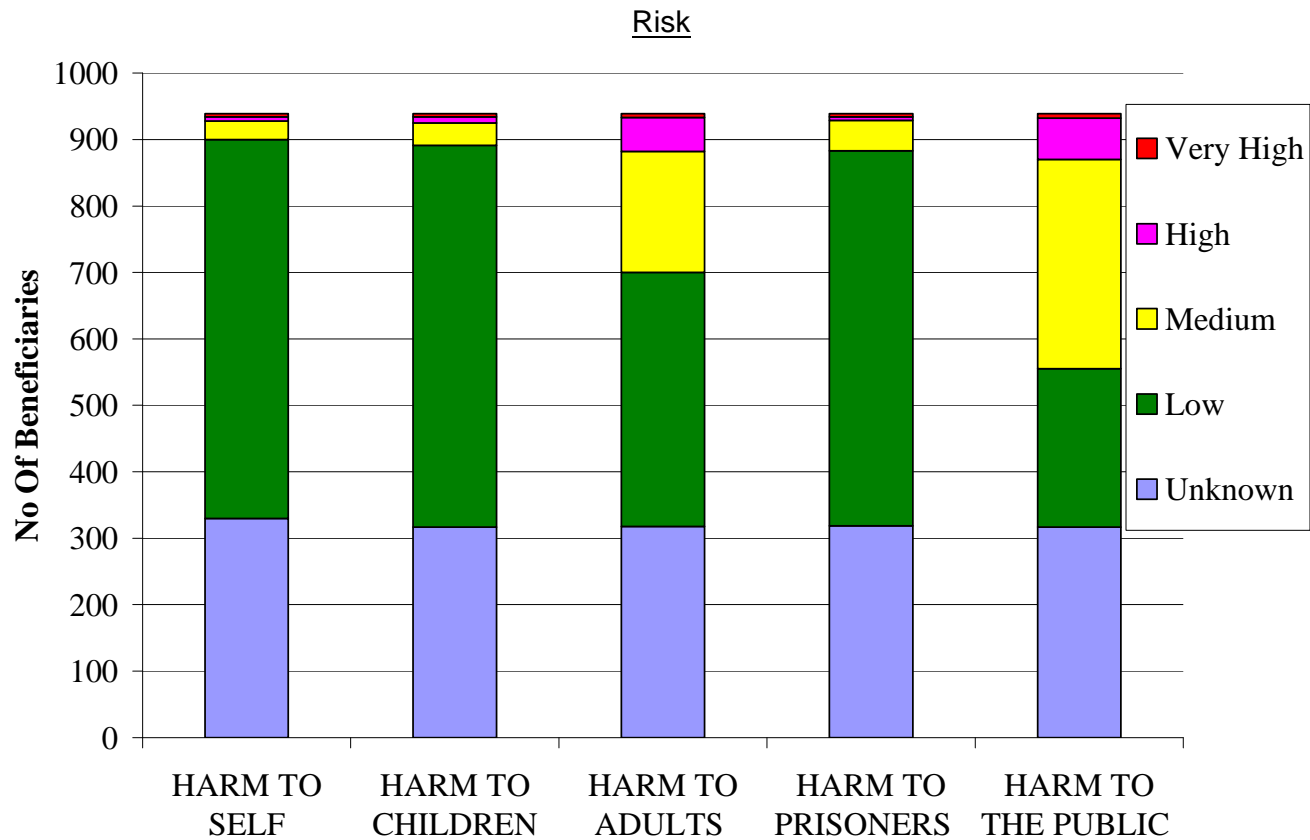


Beneficiaries Starting in Wellingborough



Beneficiaries Finishing in Wellingborough

- 5% (49) of the beneficiaries started in Wellingborough were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 52 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 13 had an accommodation outcome secured.



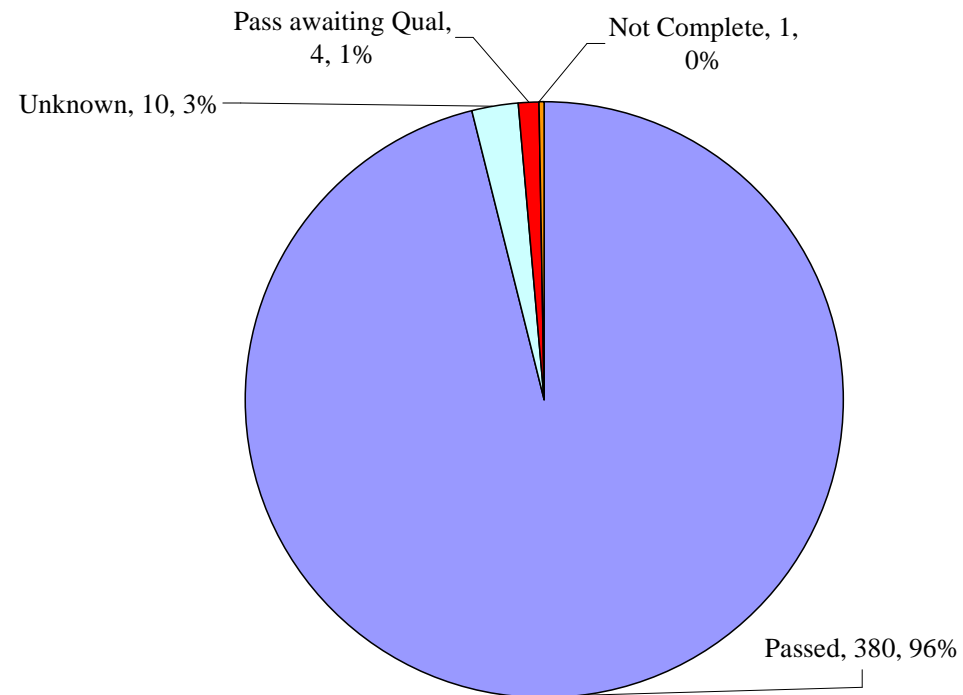
- For over 300 beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners towards themselves, children, adults, prisoners, and medium risk towards the public.

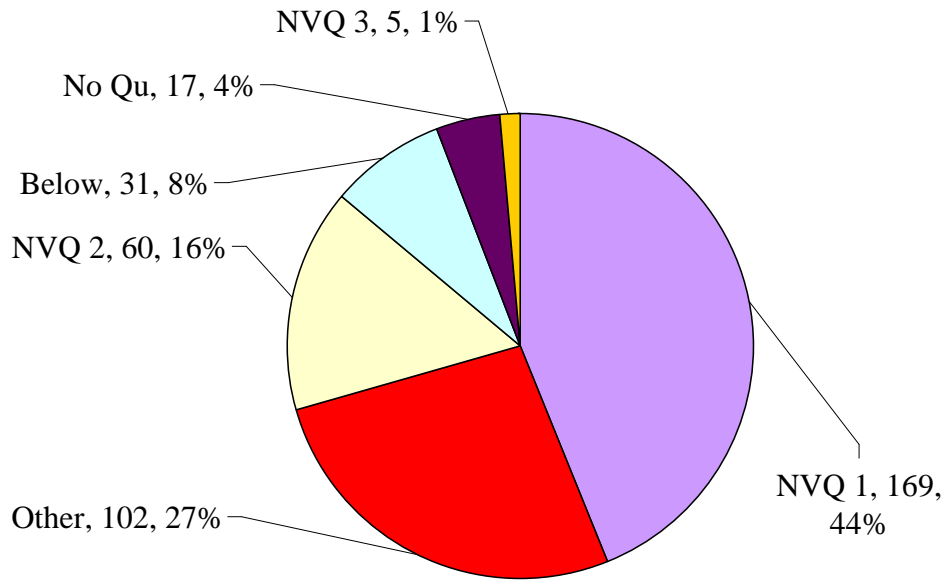
- 573 soft outcomes were gained by Wellingborough beneficiaries.
- 88 beneficiaries gained NVQs while in prison, while 86 gained non-NVQ qualifications.
- 74 beneficiaries were assisted in completing a CV.
- Beneficiaries in Wellingborough attended 71 interviews – Further Education, Job, New Deal and Progress to Work interviews.
- 22 beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiary Access Fund.

Exam Results



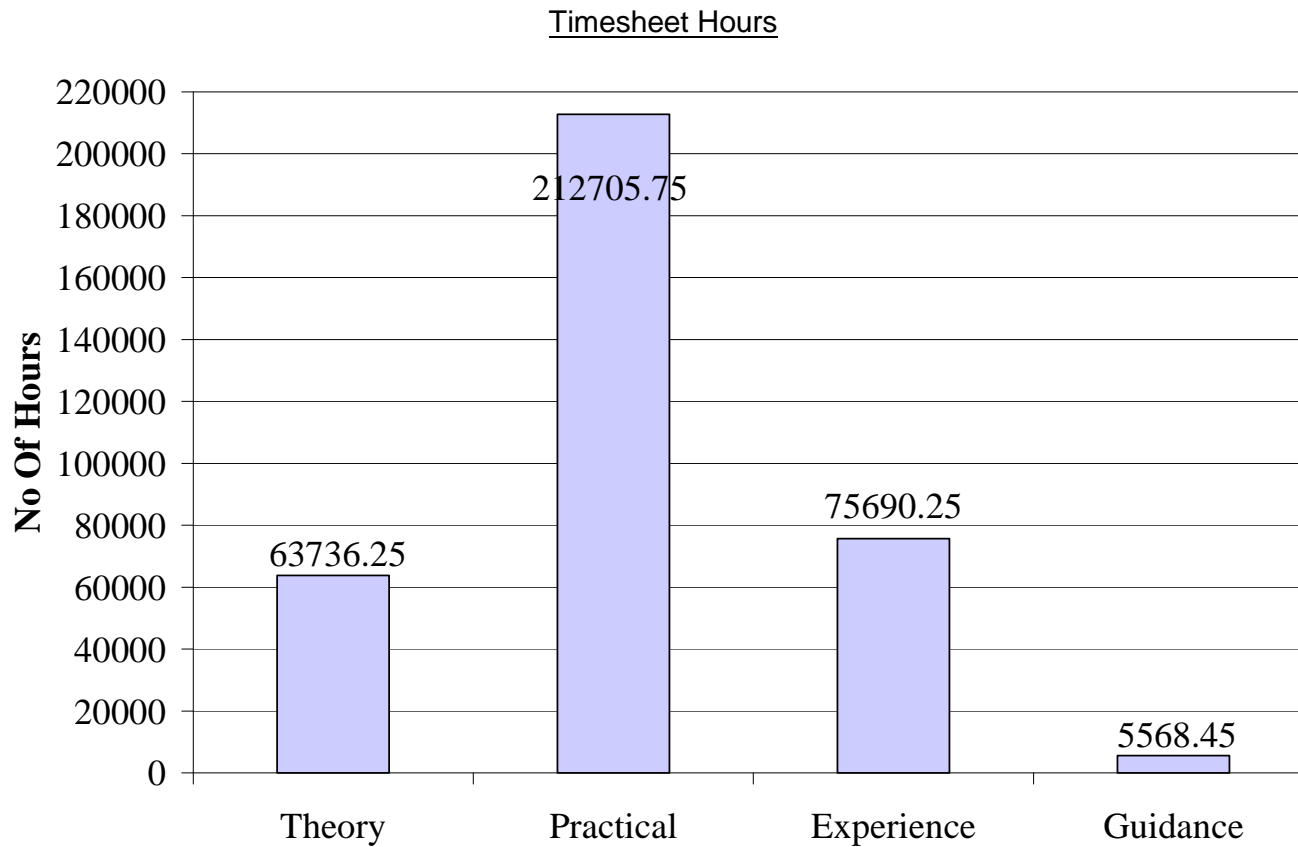
- 97% (384) of the exams taken were passed.
- No exams were failed, but for 10 exams (3%), the outcome is unknown.

NVQ Equivalence for Passed Subjects



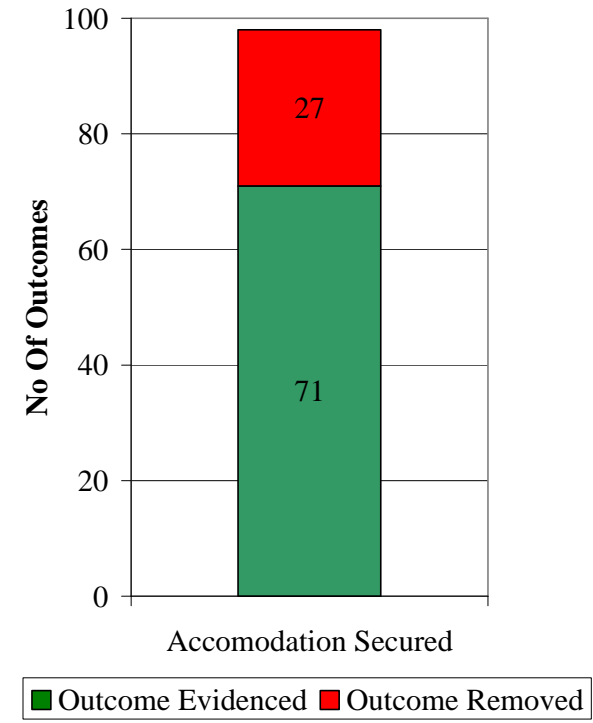
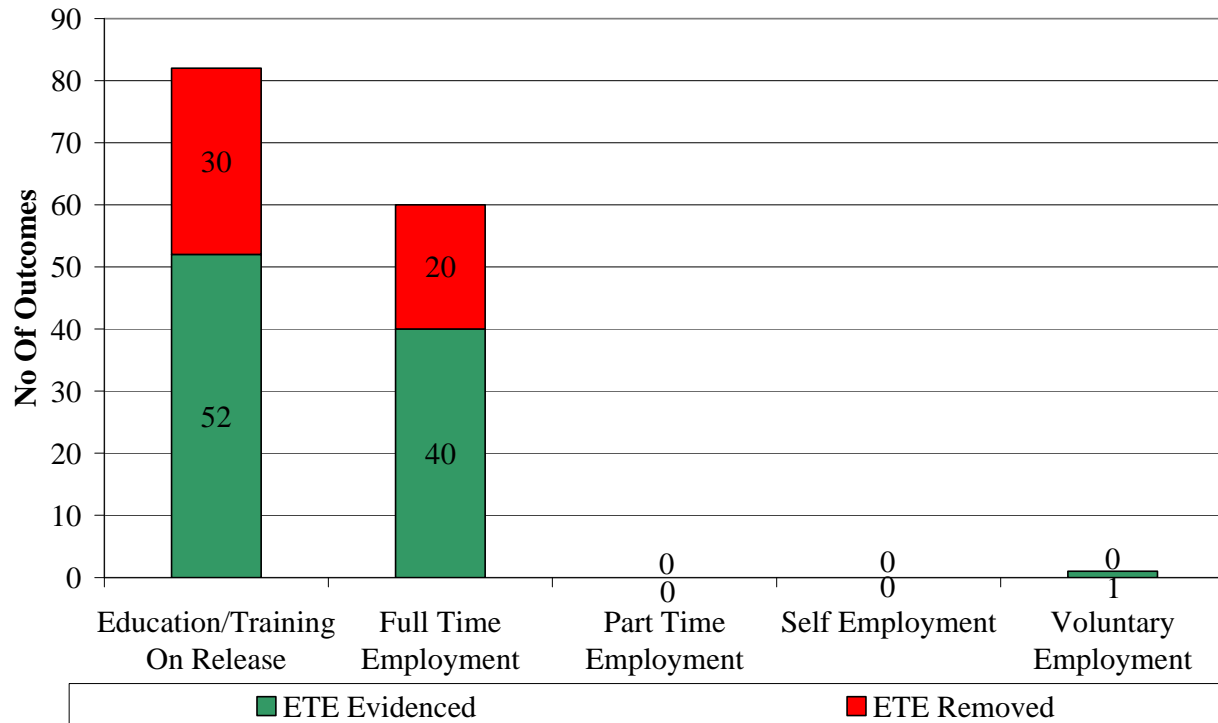

- 234 NVQ levels 1, 2 and 3 have been gained by beneficiaries in Wellingborough.
- 101 adult literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Wellingborough.



- 357,701 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 212,706 (59%) of the hours collected were for practical activities.

Hard Outcomes



- 143 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Wellingborough with evidence for 93 of these outcomes (65% evidence for outcome rate).
- 98 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 71 outcomes (72% evidence for outcome rate).
