



## PROJECT SUMMARY

# PS Plus 3 – HMP Haverigg

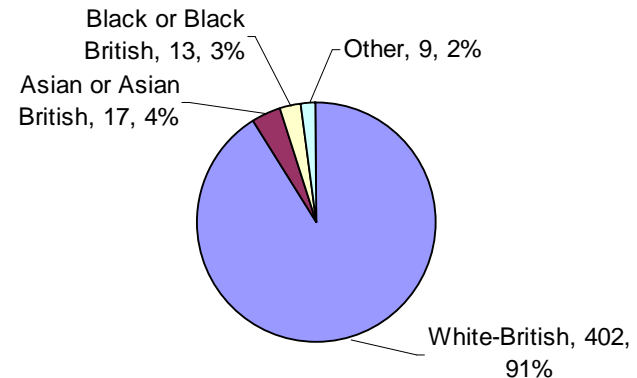
This report has been compiled to give information about the offenders (beneficiaries) worked with on the PS Plus 3 project in HMP Haverigg - a male closed category C prison in the North West. The project ran for 14 months between 1<sup>st</sup> April 2007 and 30<sup>th</sup> June 2008, in which time 441 beneficiaries were started on the project. At its peak, it is estimated that the project worked with approximately 27% of the prison population.

Of the 441 beneficiaries started, 21% (92) left the project early with 70% of these transferring to a non-PS Plus prison establishment.

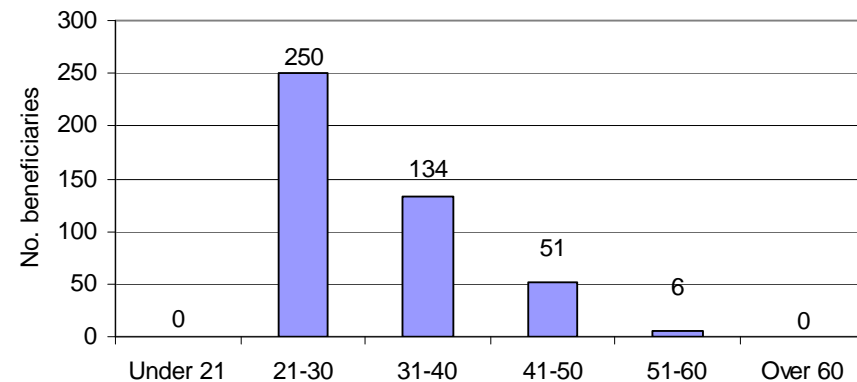
**Demographics**

- 91% (402) of the beneficiaries started in Haverigg were White-British. 9% (39) of the beneficiaries were from ethnic minority groups, and 4 beneficiaries were from outside the United Kingdom (where known).
- 57% (250) of beneficiaries started in Haverigg were aged between 21 and 30, with the average age on starting the project being 30 years 9 months.
- The most common offence type of beneficiaries started in Haverigg was theft, burglary or robbery (37%) followed by violent offences (31%).

**Ethnic Origin**



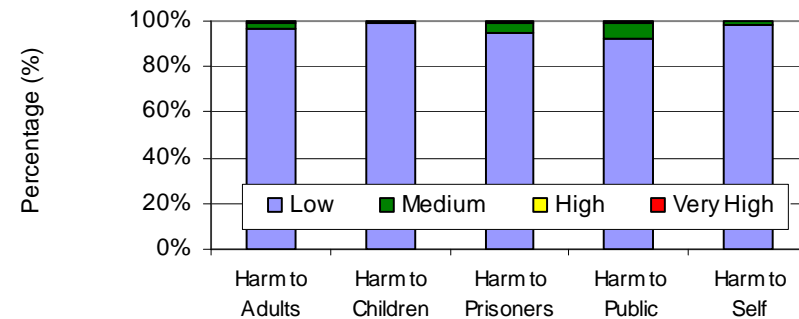
**Age Groups**



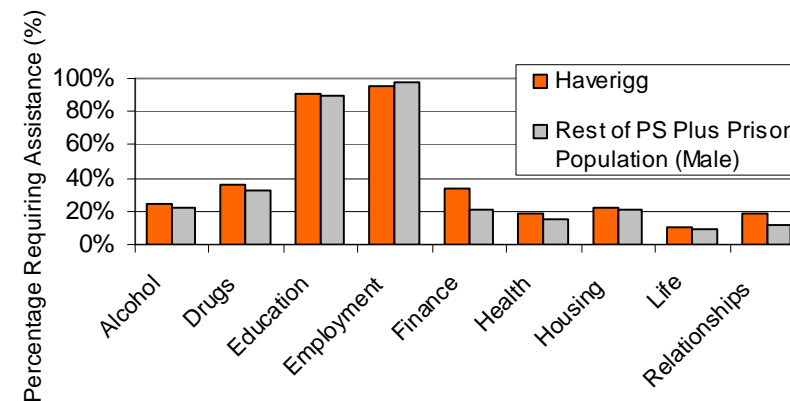
### Assessment

- For the majority of prisoners (where known), the level of risk posed towards adults, children, other prisoners, the public and themselves is low. Less than 1.5% were classed as high or very high risk in each category.
- Every beneficiary required help with either employment or education. 421 (96%) beneficiaries required help with employment, while 386 (88%) required help with both employment *and* education.
- 228 beneficiaries were identified as requiring assistance with substance abuse, with 25% and 37% of beneficiaries requiring help with alcohol and drugs issues respectively.
- Comparison to the rest of the beneficiaries worked with in male PS Plus prisons shows that beneficiaries started at Haverigg were significantly *more* likely to require assistance with finance, health and relationship issues. Analysis shows that beneficiaries started at Haverigg were significantly *less* likely to require assistance with employment issues.
- Comparison to beneficiaries worked with in other male PS Plus prisons shows that beneficiaries in Haverigg were significantly more motivated on starting the project.

### Soft Outcomes

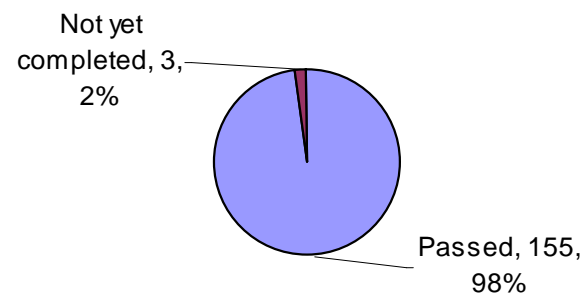
- 555 soft outcomes were achieved by Haverigg.
- 65% (295) of the beneficiaries worked with at Haverigg achieved at least one outcome while there.
- 242 beneficiaries received advice and guidance.
- 284 beneficiaries received assistance with employment issues.
- 271 beneficiaries received assistance with education or training issues.

### Qualifications

- 155 courses or qualifications were passed by beneficiaries on the PS Plus project at Haverigg.
- PS Plus beneficiaries completed courses in a wide range of subjects, from joinery to horticultural skills.
- 55 adult literacy and adult numeracy courses, and 7 manual handling courses were passed.

### Exam Results



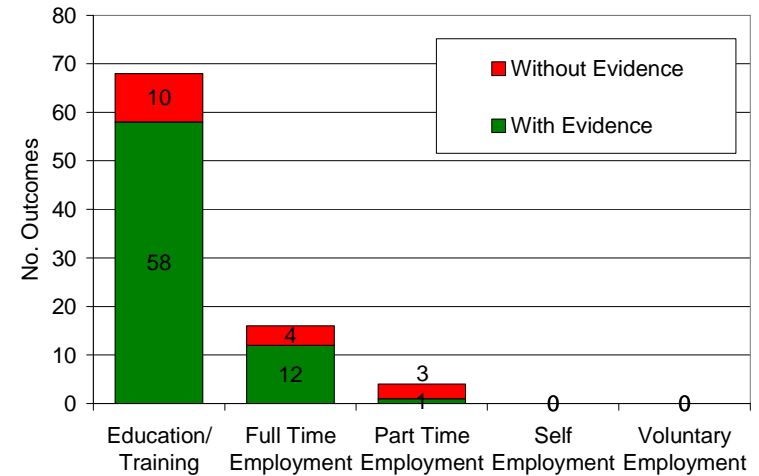
**Hard Outcomes**

- 88 hard outcomes were recorded by PS Plus staff.
- 71 hard outcomes had sufficient evidence for ESF auditing purposes.
- Beneficiaries successfully achieved 13 employment outcomes and 58 education/training outcomes while on PS Plus 3.
- Employment ranged from motor repairs to engineering, while education/training ranged from the Construction Skills Certification Scheme (CSCS) test to plastering.

**Summary**

- Overall, Haverigg started 441 beneficiaries, achieved 72 hard ETE outcomes and 555 soft outcomes on the PS Plus 3 project.
