

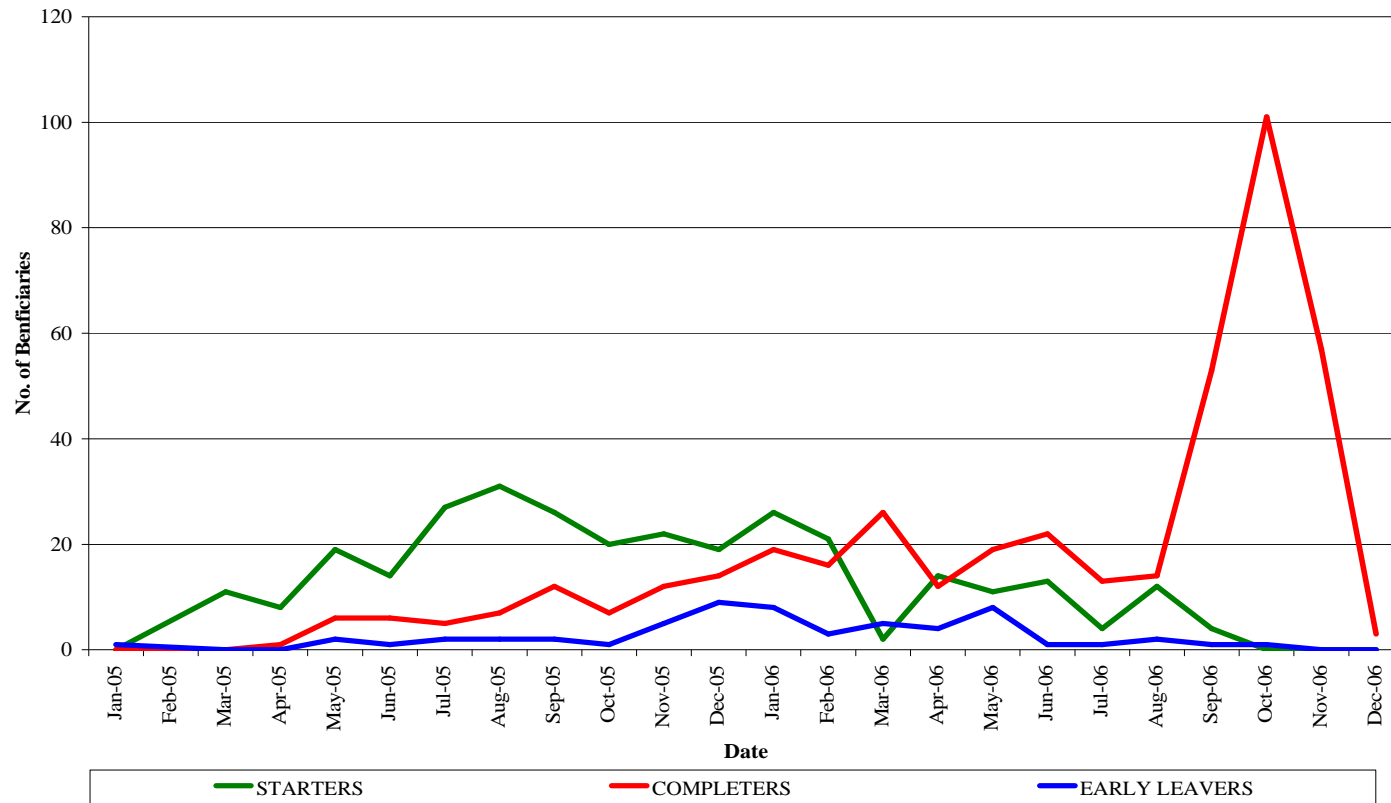

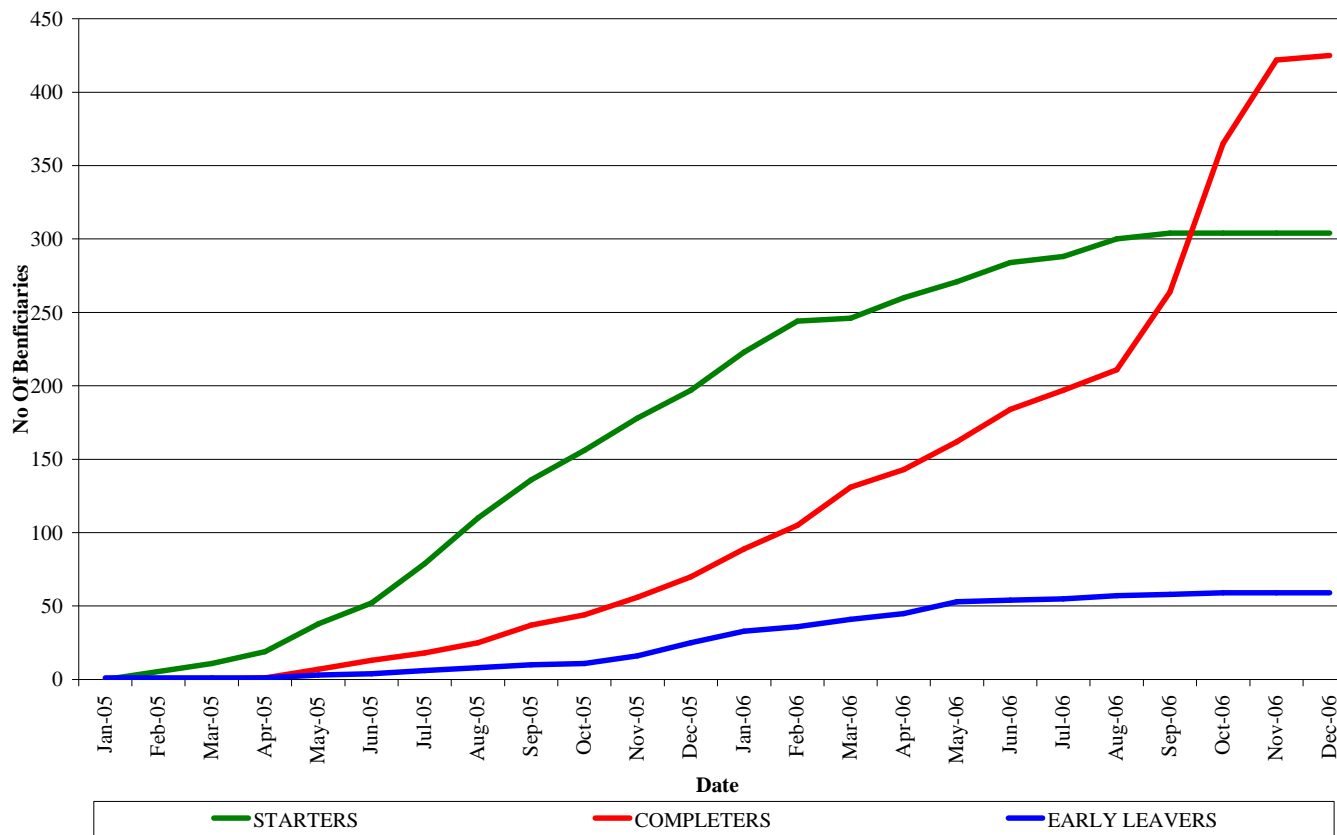

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



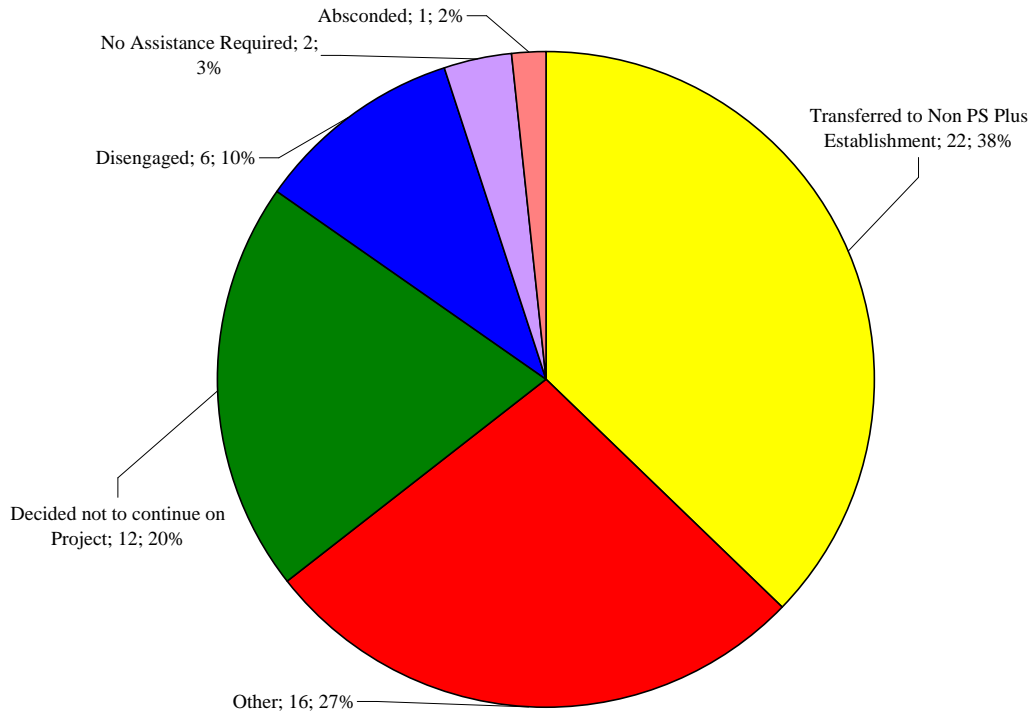
- Most months, Drake Hall started less than 30 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- Up until the last 4 months of the project, no more than 26 beneficiaries were completing the PS Plus 2 project per month. 214 beneficiaries were completed in the last 4 months due to project closure.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Over 300 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Drake Hall.
- 484 beneficiaries finished in Drake Hall – 425 completed the project and 59 left the project early.

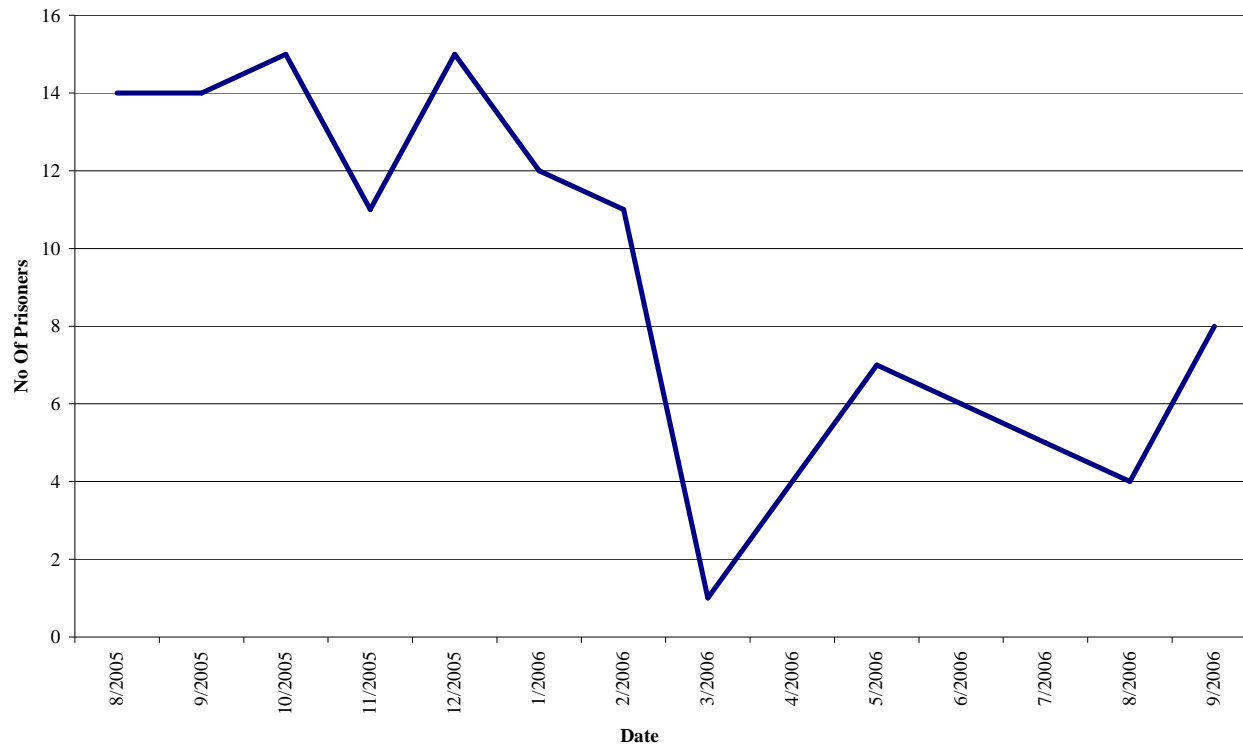

- Of the 59 early leavers, 38% (22) transferred to a Non-PS Plus establishment.
- 20% (12) of the early leavers decided not to continue on the project.
- 2 of the early leavers did not require any assistance from PS Plus.

Non-Starters Per Month

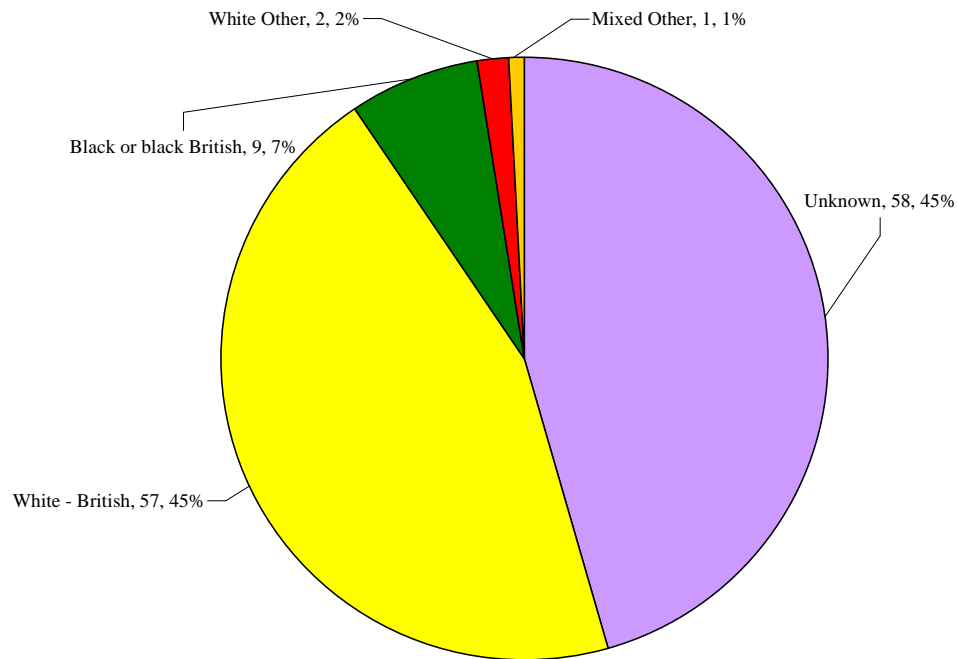


Reasons for prisoner not being started

- Every month, no more than 15 prisoners per month were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- In total, over 127 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Drake Hall.
- 55 prisoners transferred before being made starters – 50 to non-PS Plus and 5 to PS Plus establishments.

Ethnic Breakdown of prisoners not started



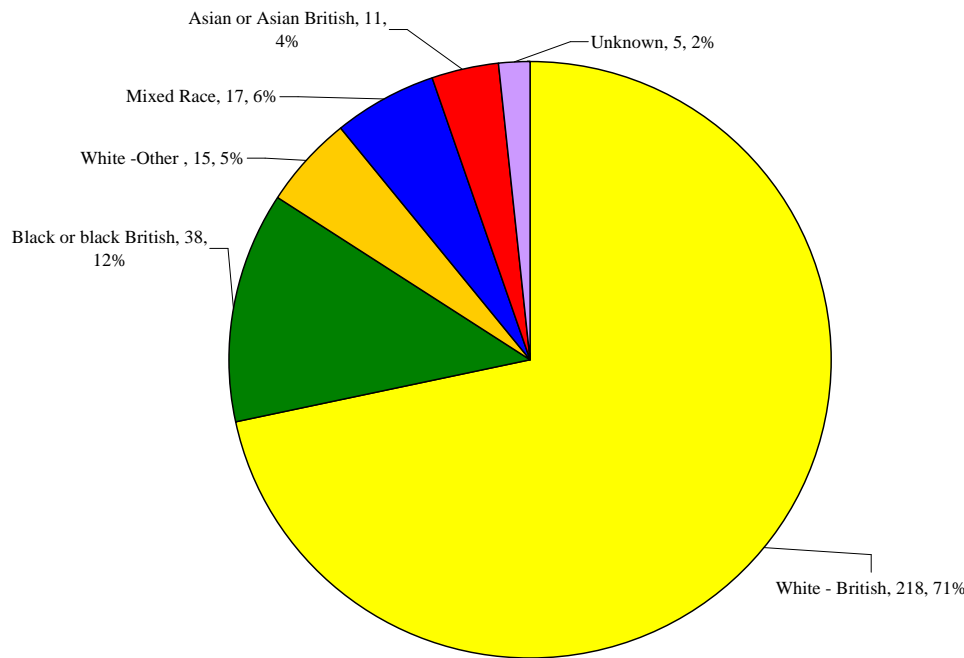

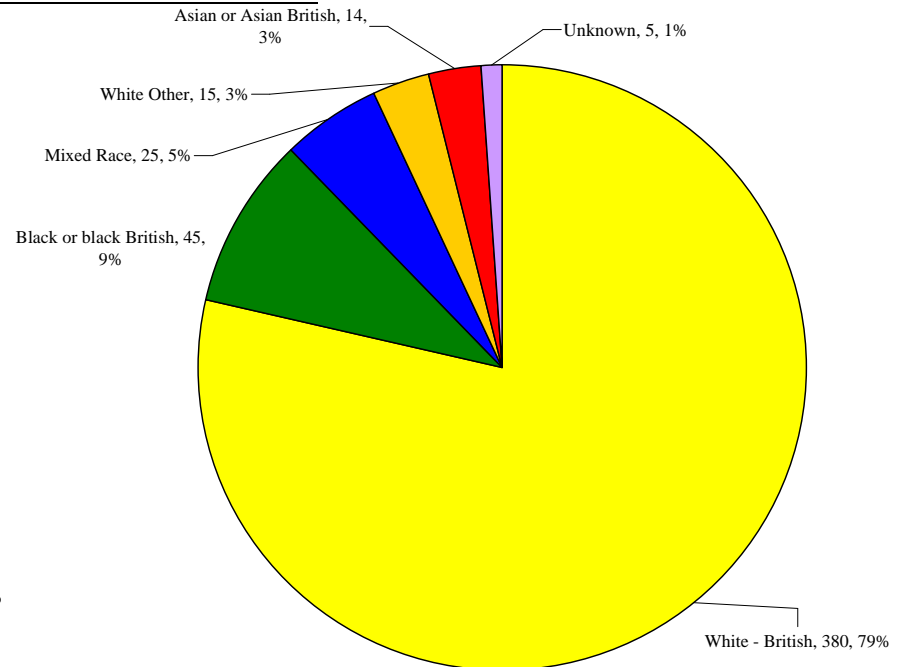
- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project (where the ethnic origin is known) were White-British (45%) and from United Kingdom (64%).
- The ethnic origin of 45% and the nationality of 31% of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- Ethnic minorities account for 10% (12 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.

- 71% (218) of the beneficiaries started and 79% (380) who finished in Drake Hall where White-British.
- 27% (81) of the beneficiaries who started and 20% (99) who finished in Drake Hall where from ethnic minorities.
- The ethnic origin of 5 beneficiaries who started (2%) and 5 beneficiaries who finished (1%) in Drake Hall is unknown.

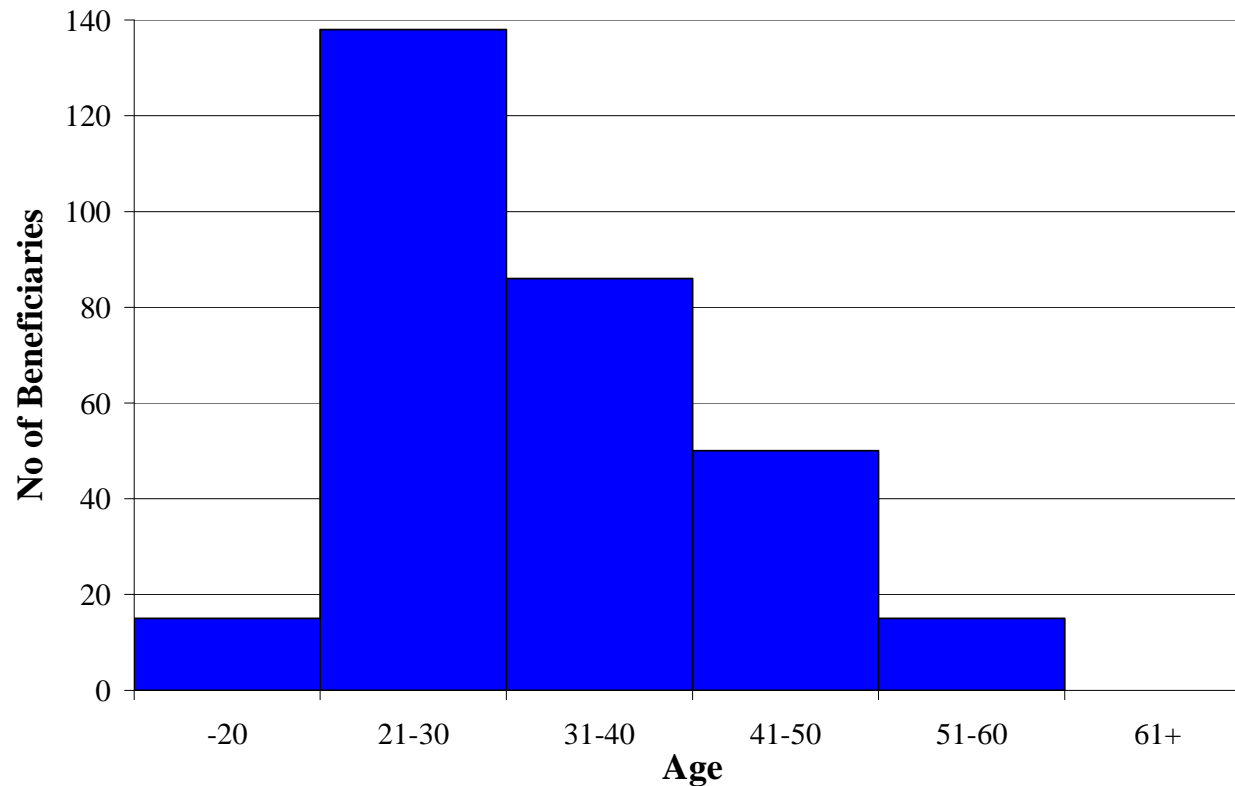

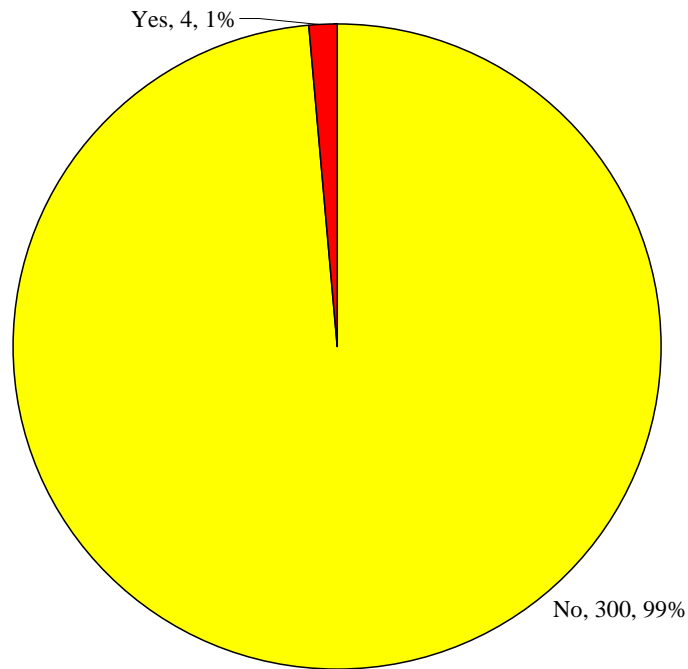
- 90% (273) of the beneficiaries who started in Drake Hall stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British, Welsh or English.
- 92% (447) of the beneficiaries who finished in Drake Hall stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British, Welsh or English.
- The nationalities of 22 of the beneficiaries who started in Drake Hall and 26 that finished in Drake Hall is unknown.

Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2

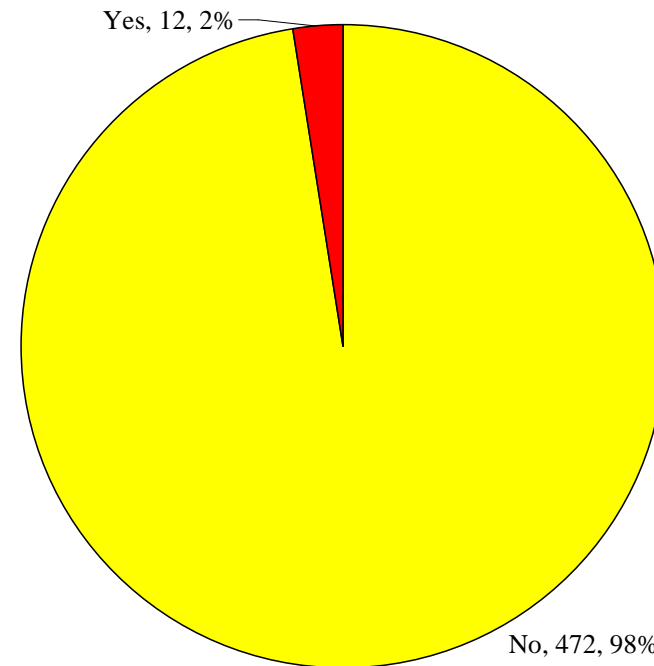


- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Drake Hall is 32 years and 5 months. The average (mode) age group is 21 – 30 years old.
- There are no beneficiaries in Drake Hall over the age of 61.

Disabled Beneficiaries



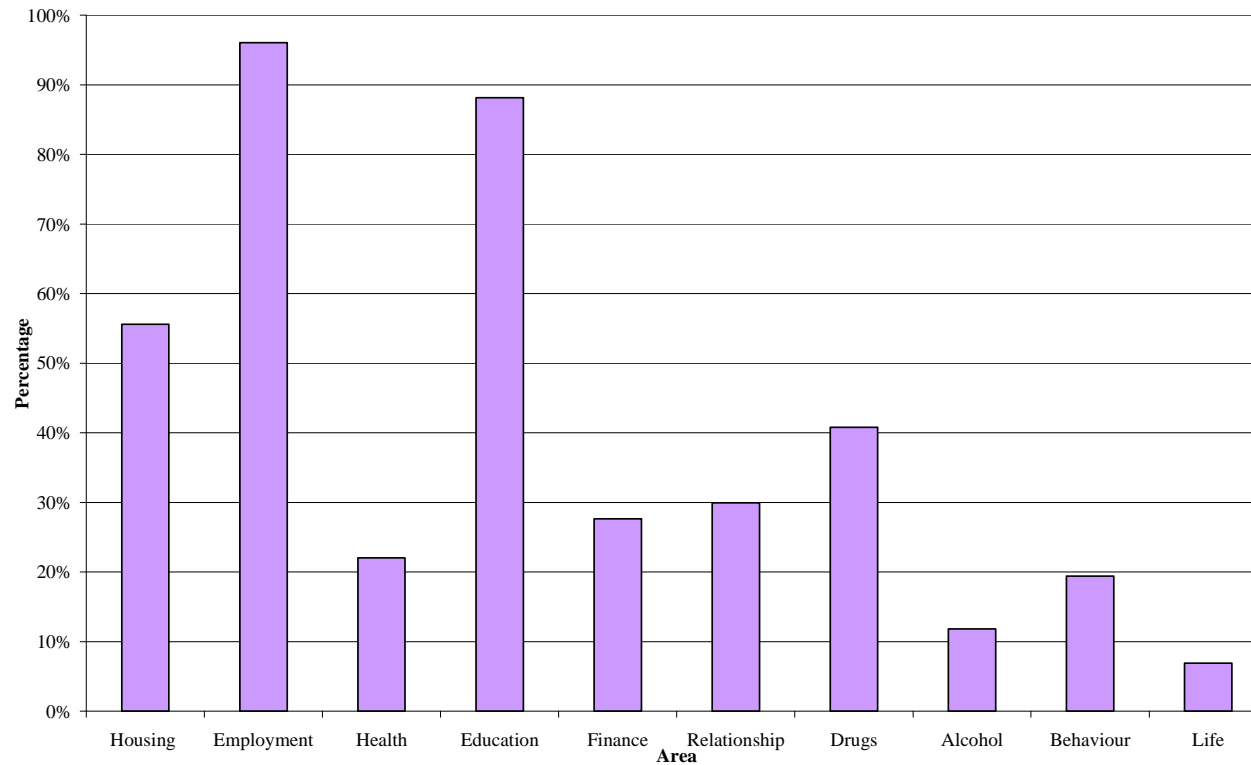
Beneficiaries Starting in Drake Hall



Beneficiaries Finishing in Drake Hall

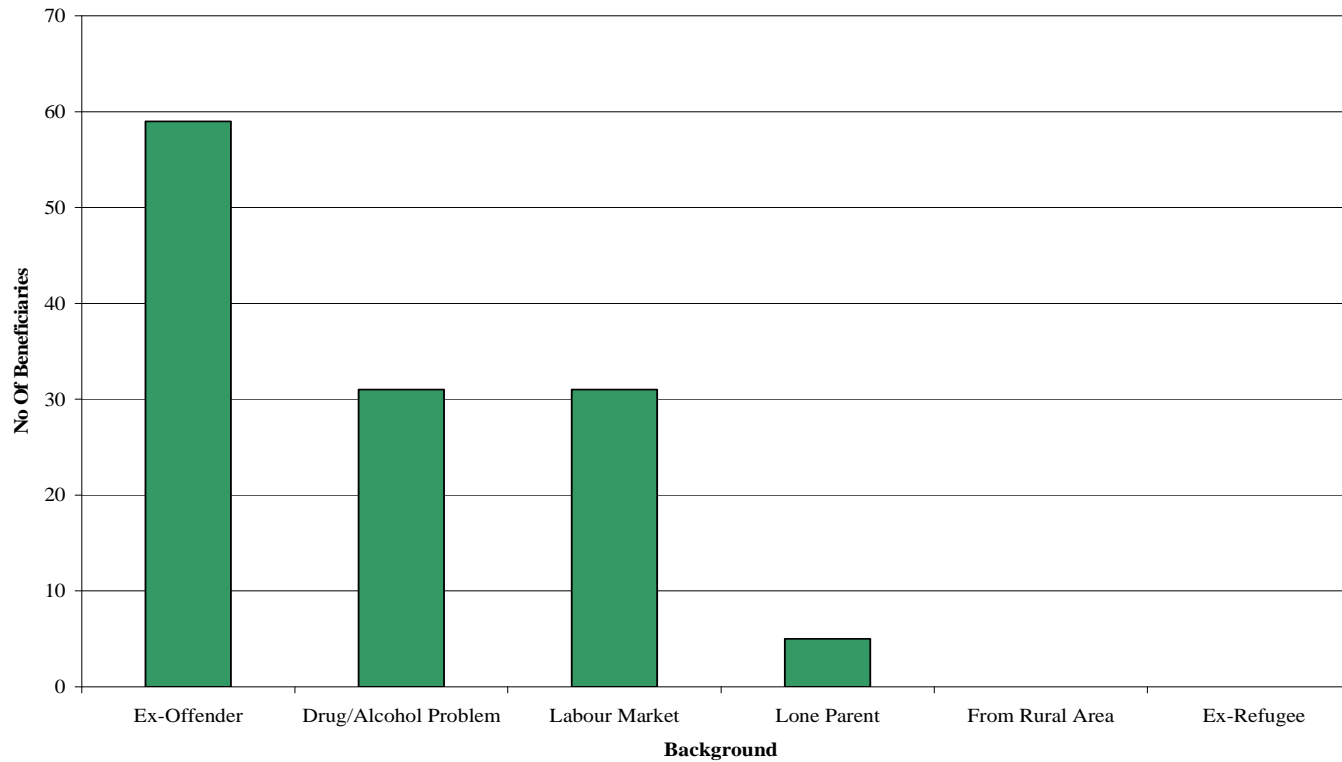
- 1% (4) of the beneficiaries who started in Drake Hall were classified as being disabled.
- 2% (12) of the beneficiaries who finished in Drake Hall were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Drake Hall



- Over 95% of the beneficiaries who started in Drake Hall needed help with employment and over 85% needed help with education.
- Over 40% of the beneficiaries who started in Drake Hall needed help with drug issues.
- Over 55% of the beneficiaries who started in Drake Hall needed help with housing issues.

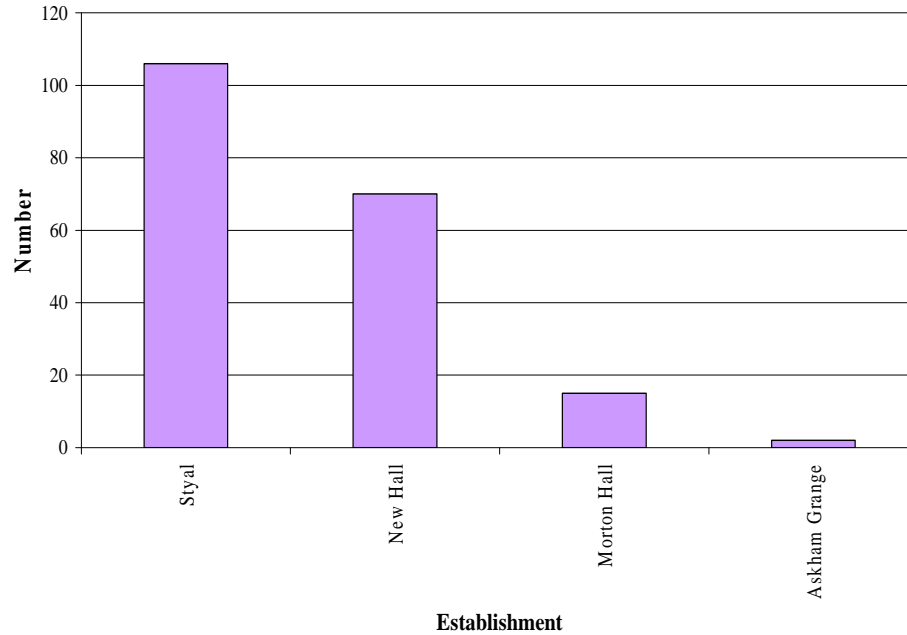
Beneficiary Background



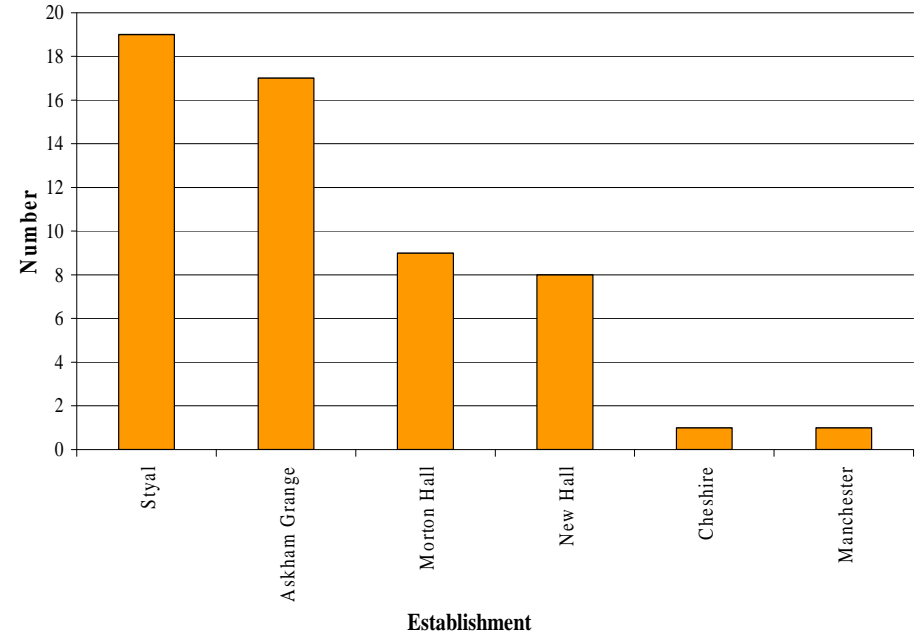
- 31 of the beneficiaries who started in Drake Hall are on the labour market.
- 31 of the beneficiaries who started in Drake Hall had a drug or alcohol problem.
- There were 5 lone parents in Drake Hall.

Transfers into Drake Hall

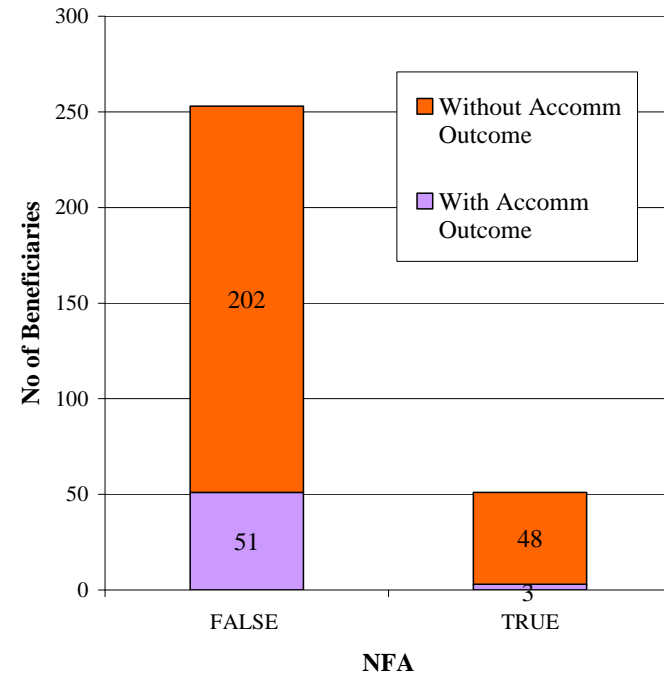
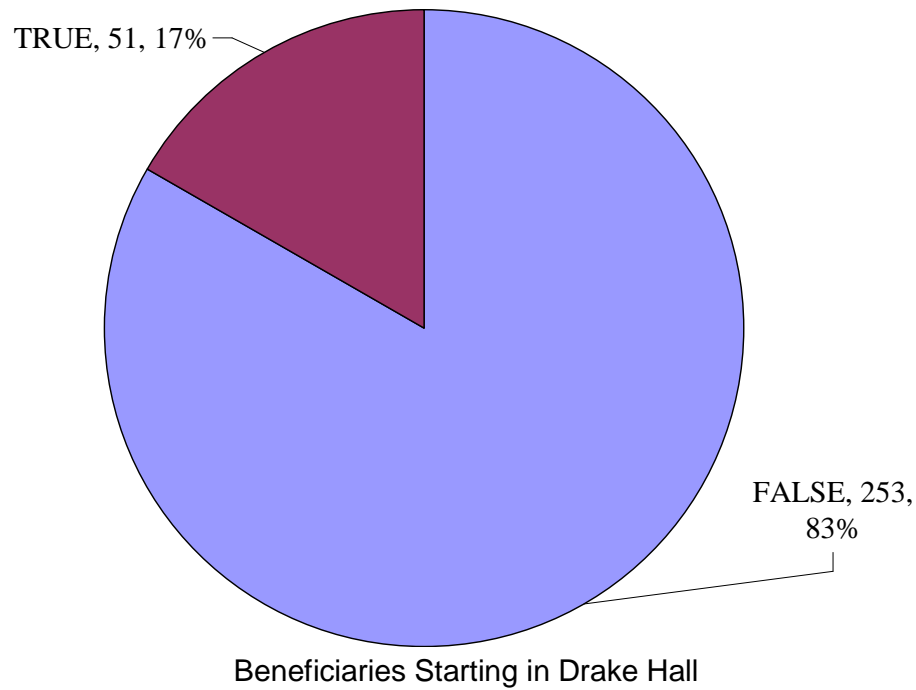


Transfers from Drake Hall

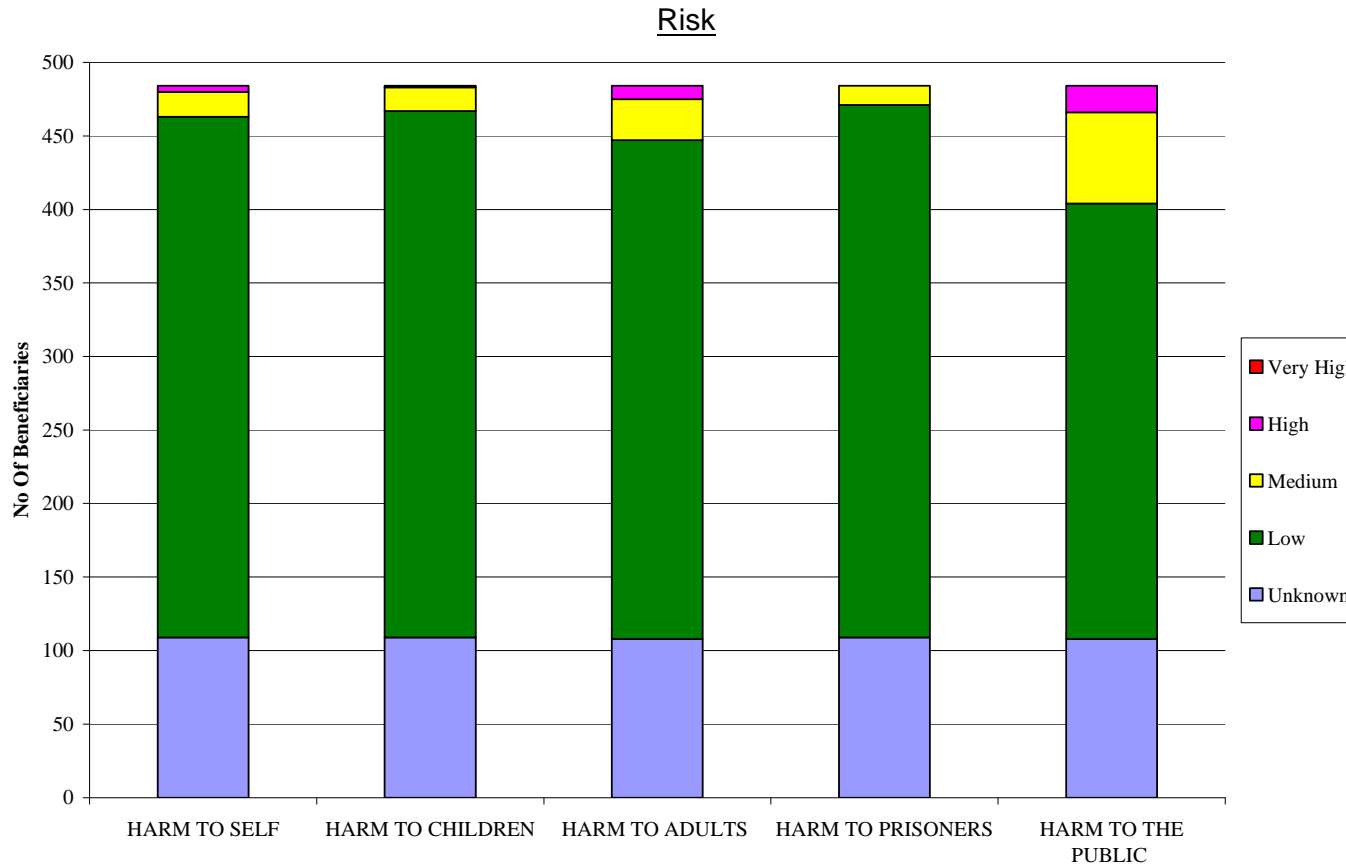


- 193 beneficiaries have transferred into Drake Hall – including 106 from Styal and 70 from New Hall.
- 55 beneficiaries have transferred from Drake Hall – including 19 to Styal and 17 to Askham Grange.
- One beneficiary has moved on to Cheshire probation and one to Manchester probation as part of the PS Plus “Through the Gate” procedure.

Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode



- 17% (51) of the beneficiaries started in Drake Hall were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 51 beneficiaries who were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 3 had an accommodation outcome secured.

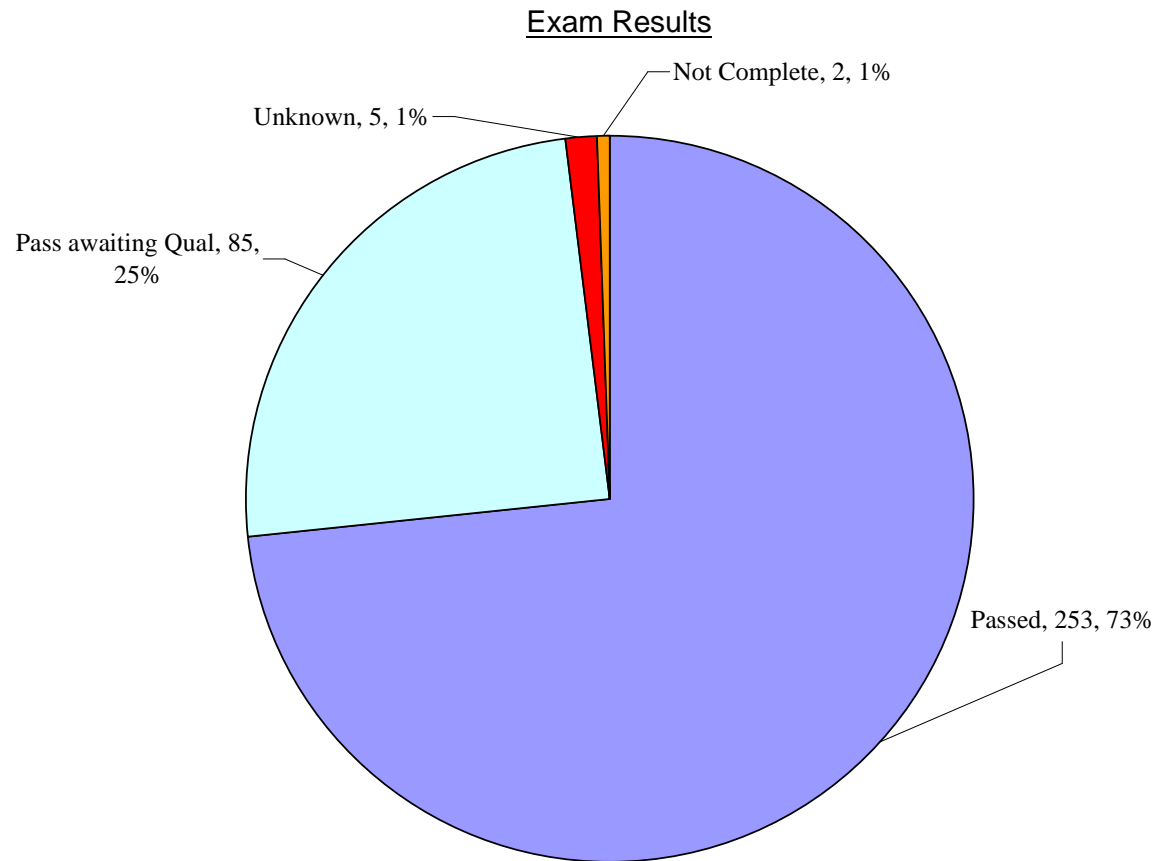


- For over 100 beneficiaries, level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners.

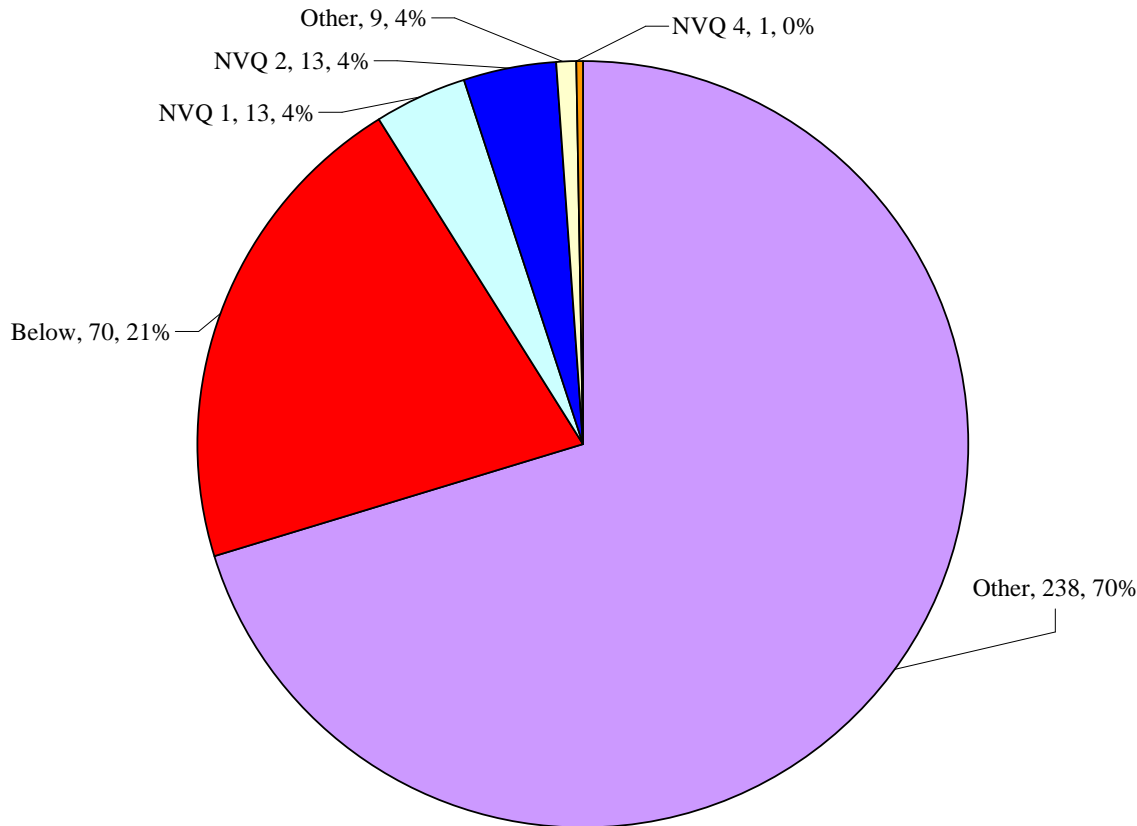

- 591 soft outcomes were gained by Drake Hall beneficiaries.
- 39 beneficiaries received IAG assistance.
- 177 beneficiaries had Advice on Disclosure.
- Beneficiaries in Drake Hall attended 48 interviews – Further Education, Fresh Start and Job interviews.
- 95 beneficiaries have written CVs, either independently or with assistance.



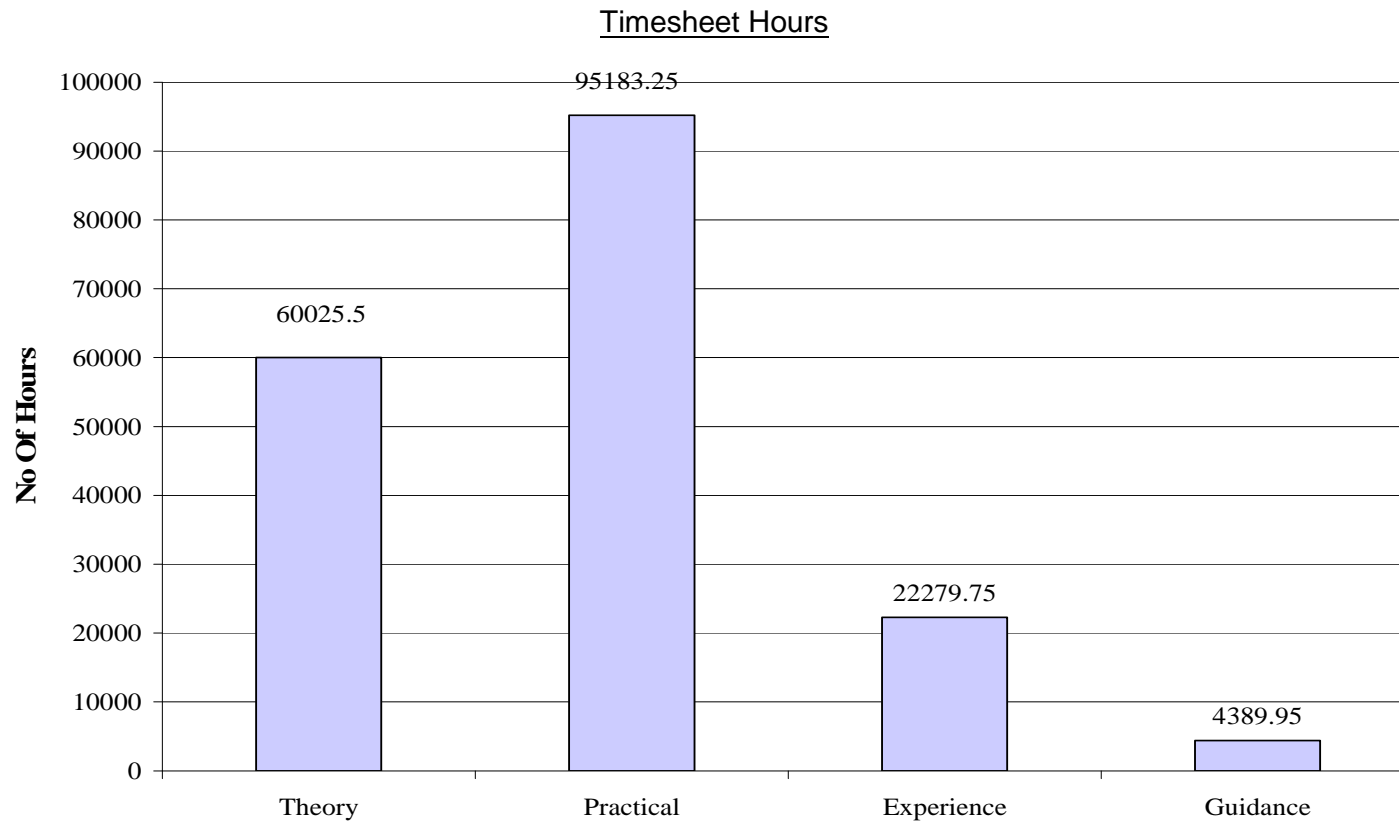
- 98% (338) of the exams taken were passed.

NVQ Equivalence for Passed Subjects



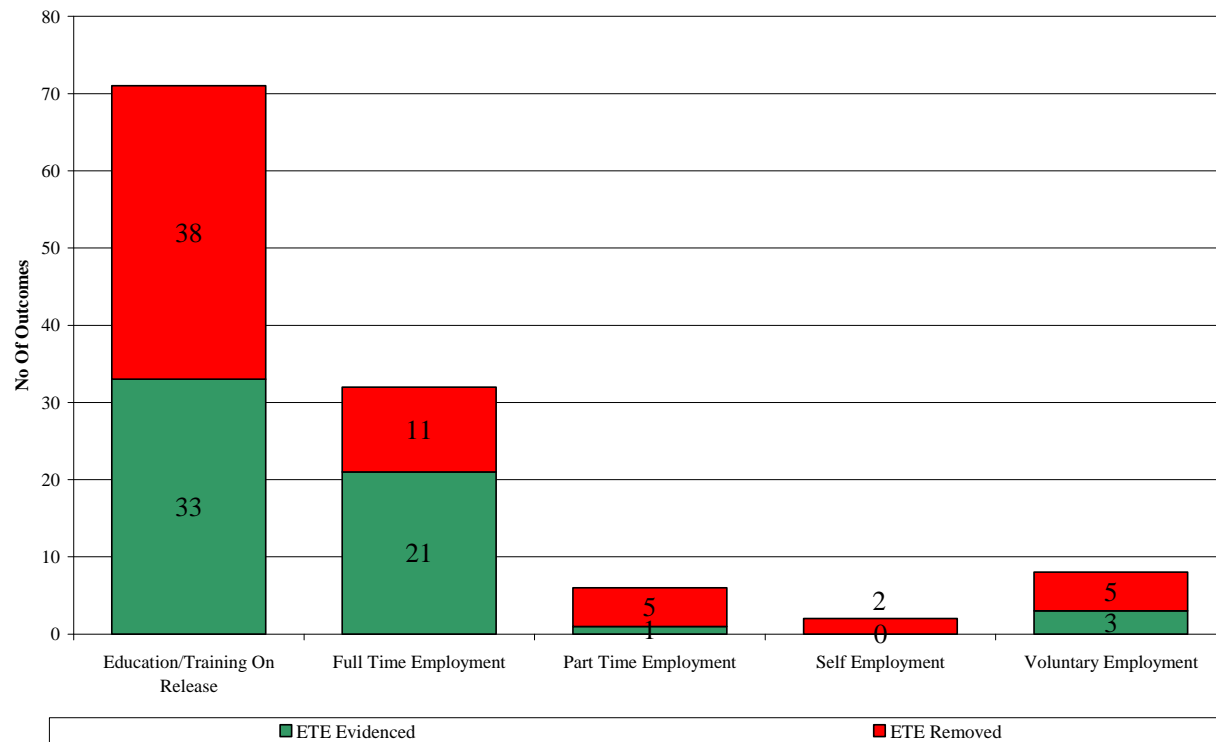

- 27 NVQ levels 1,2 and 4 have been gained by beneficiaries in Drake Hall.
- 63 adult Literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Drake Hall.

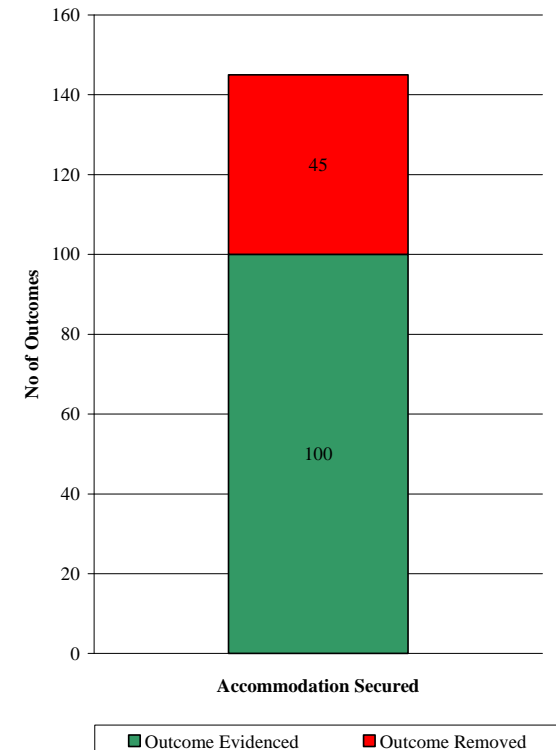


- 181,878 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 95,183 (52%) of the hours collected were for practical activities and 60,025 (33%) of the hours collected were for theory.

Accommodation Outcomes

- 119 hard education, training and employment (ETE) have been recorded at Drake Hall with evidence for 58 of these outcomes (49% evidence for outcome rate).
- 145 accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 100 outcomes (69% evidence for outcome rate).
