

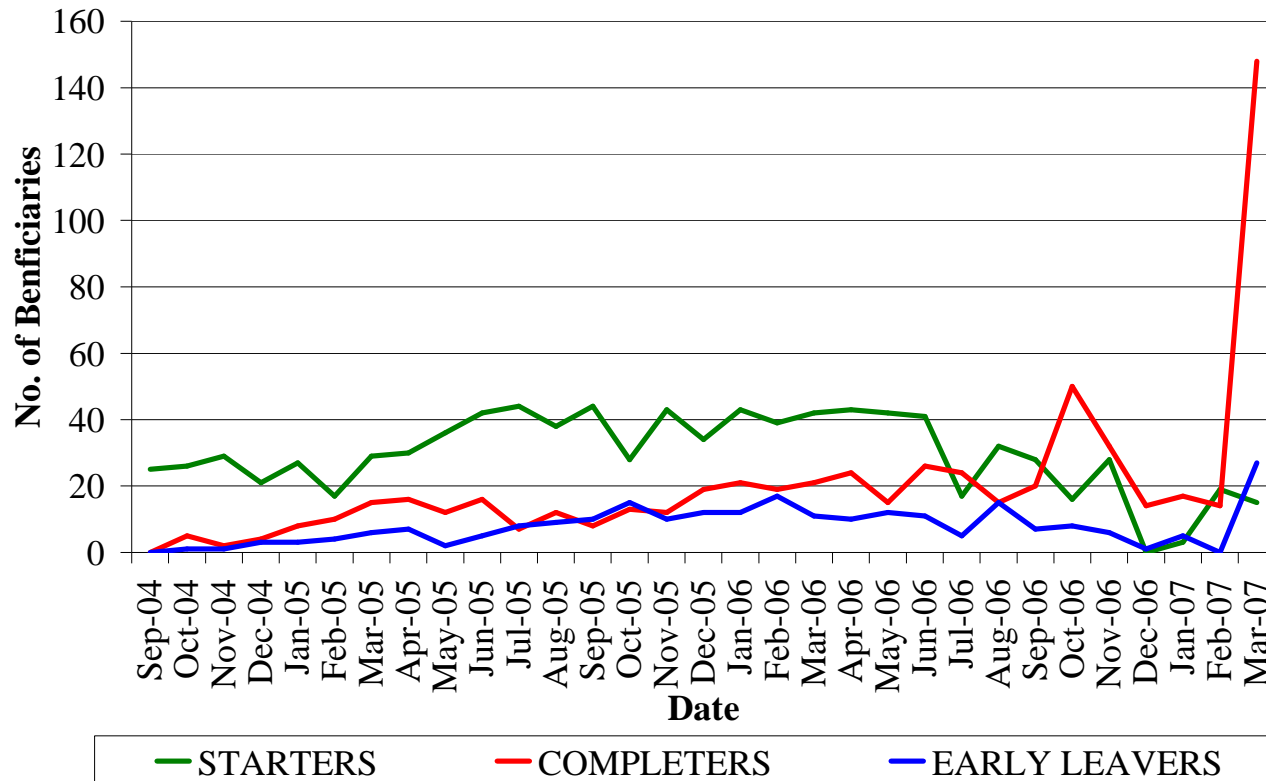

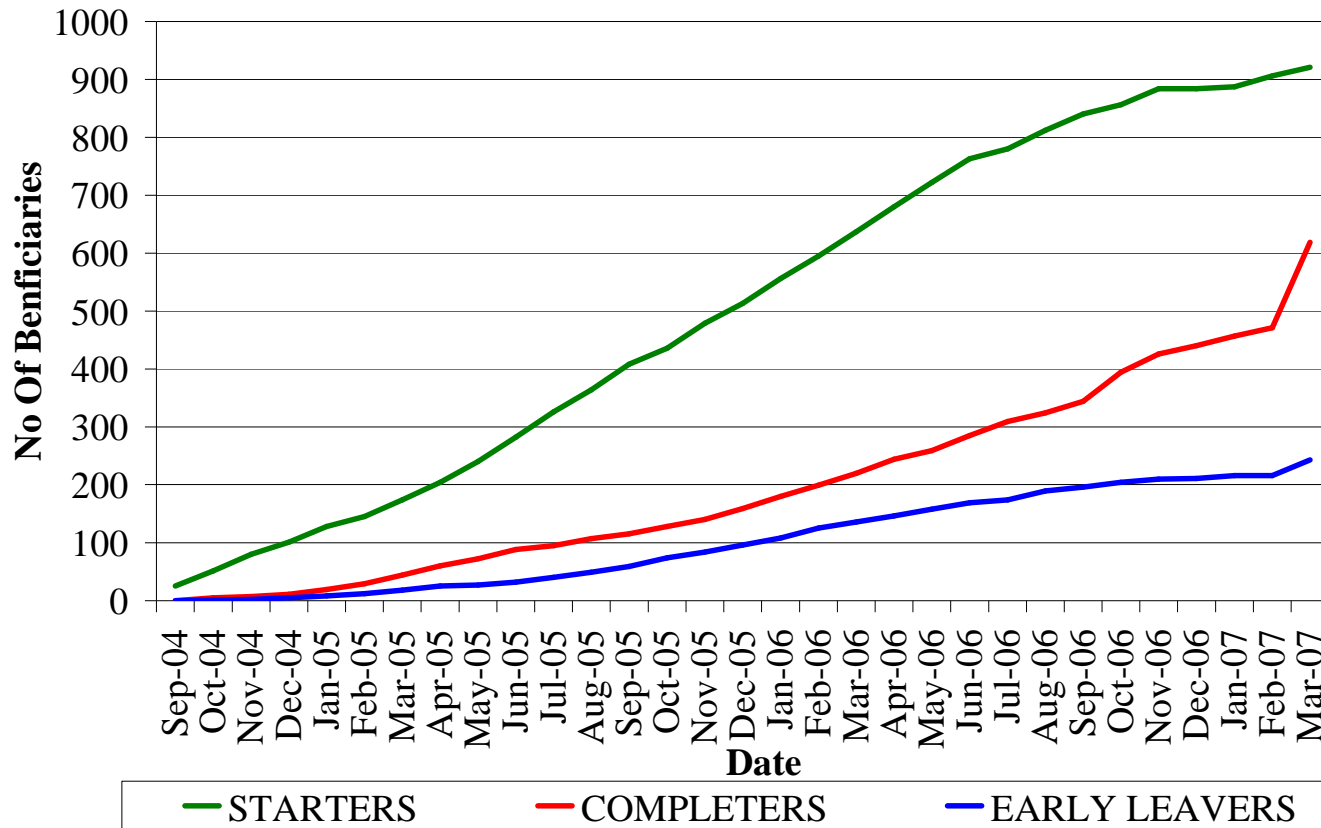

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



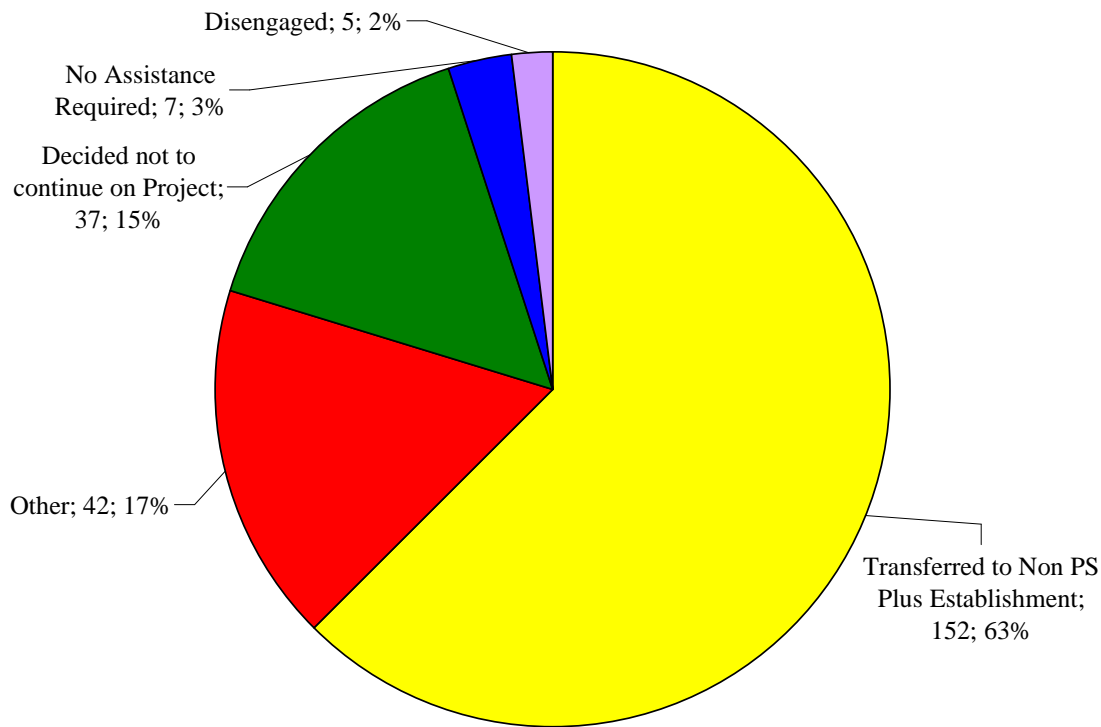
- Most months, Featherstone started between 20 and 45 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- Up until the last 6 months of the project (project closure), no more than 30 beneficiaries were completing the PS Plus 2 project per month.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Over 900 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Featherstone.
- Approximately 860 beneficiaries finished in Featherstone – 619 completed the project and 243 left the project early.

Reasons for Early Leavers

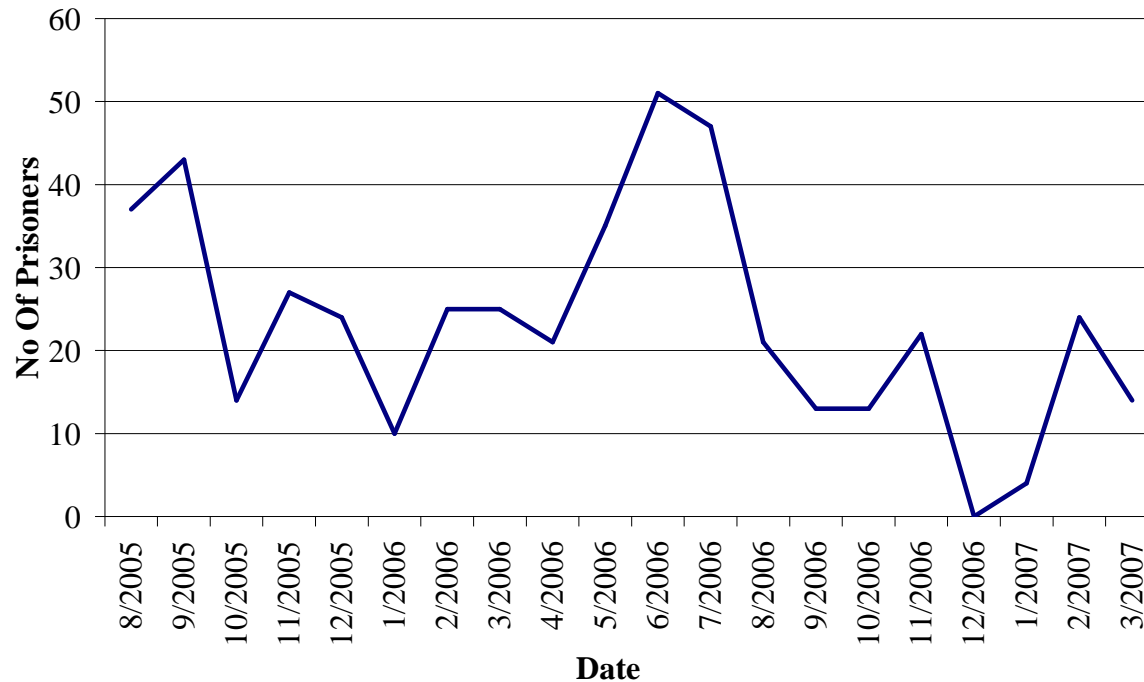

- Of the 243 beneficiaries who left the project early, 63% (152) transferred to a non-PS Plus establishment.
- 15% (37) of the early leavers decided not to continue on the project.

Non-Starters Per Month

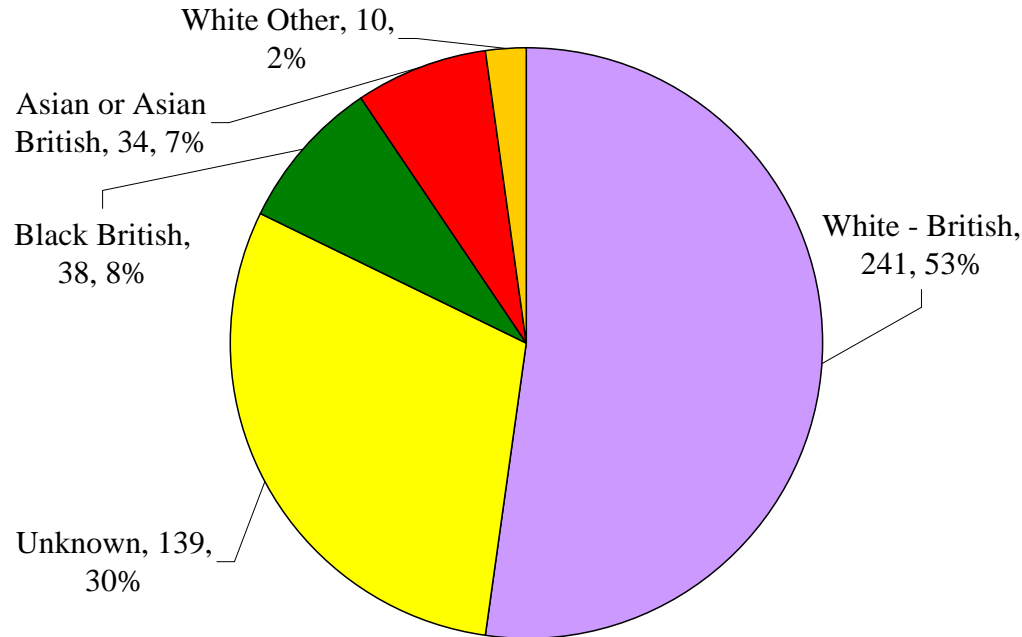

- Most months, between 10 and 30 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project.
- In total, 470 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Featherstone.
- 163 of the prisoners not started in Featherstone did not wish to be considered for the project and 111 prisoners transferred before being started on the project (15 transferred before the assessment entered and 96 to a non-PS Plus establishment).

Ethnic Breakdown of prisoners not started



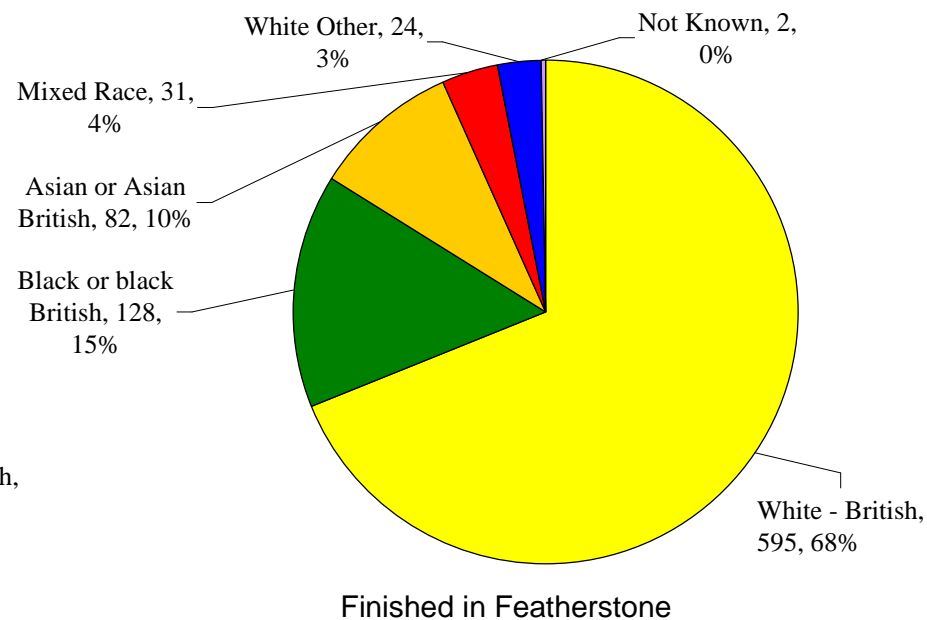
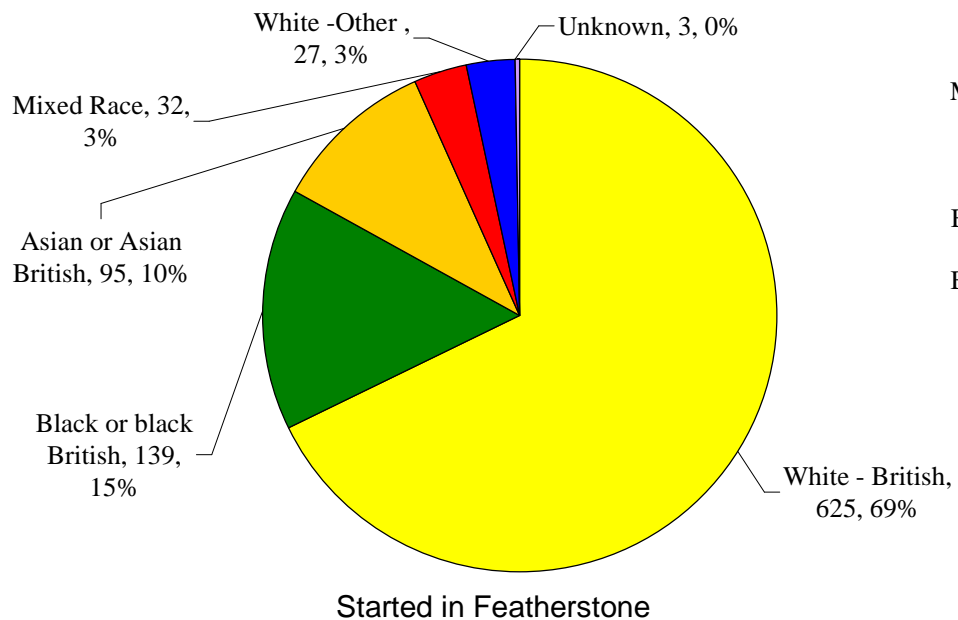

- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (53%) and from United Kingdom (73%).
- The ethnic origin of 30% and the nationality of 26% of the prisoners not started were unknown.
- Ethnic minorities account for 17% (82) of the prisoners not started.

Beneficiaries Started On PS Plus

Ethnic Breakdown of Beneficiaries in Featherstone



- 69% (625) of the beneficiaries who started and 68% (595) of the beneficiaries who finished in Featherstone were White-British.
- 31% (293) of the beneficiaries who started and 32% (265) of the beneficiaries who finished in Featherstone were from ethnic minorities.

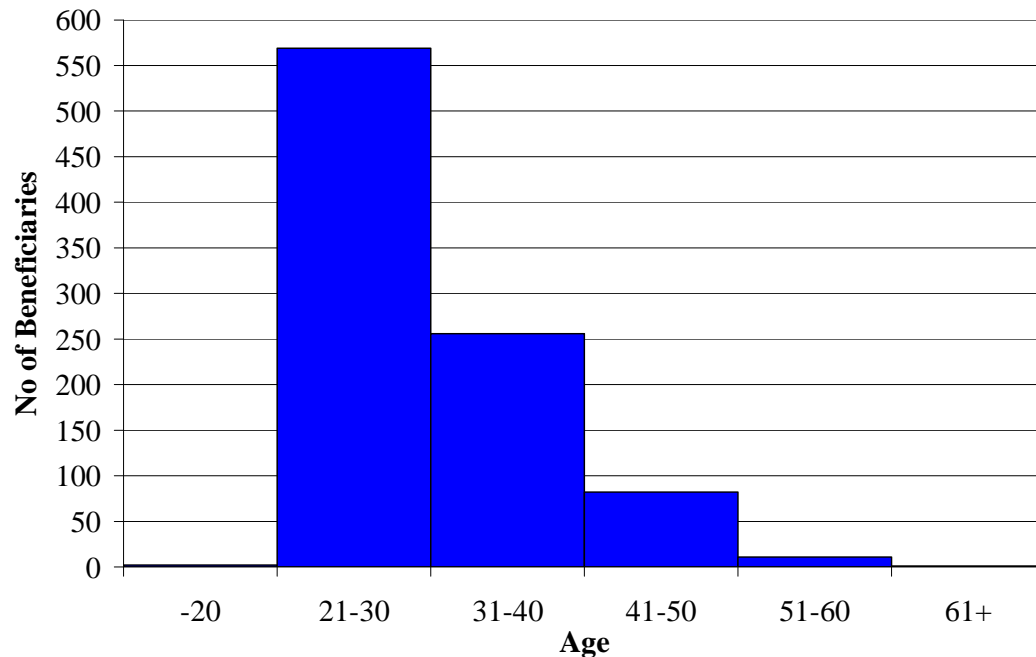

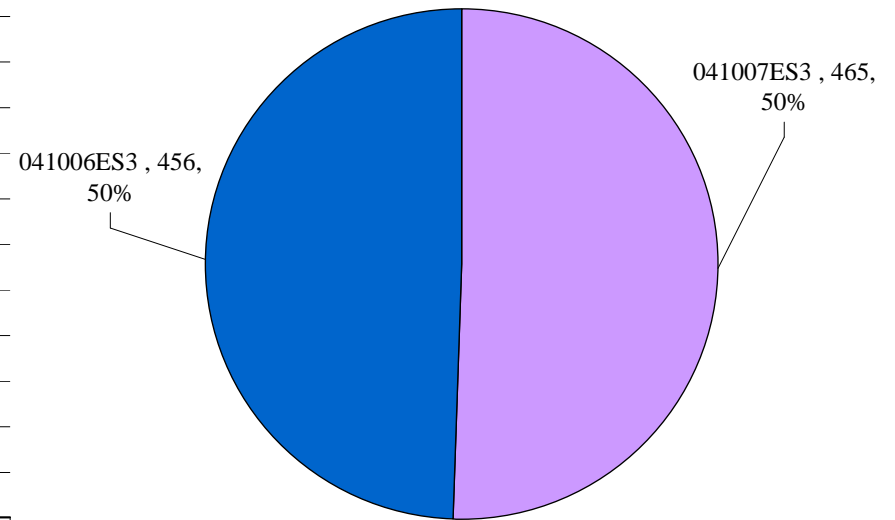

- 83% (765) of the beneficiaries started in Featherstone stated that their Nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- 82% (706) of the beneficiaries who finished in Featherstone stated that their Nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- The nationalities of 156 of the beneficiaries started in Featherstone and 154 of the beneficiaries that finished in Featherstone are unknown.

Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2



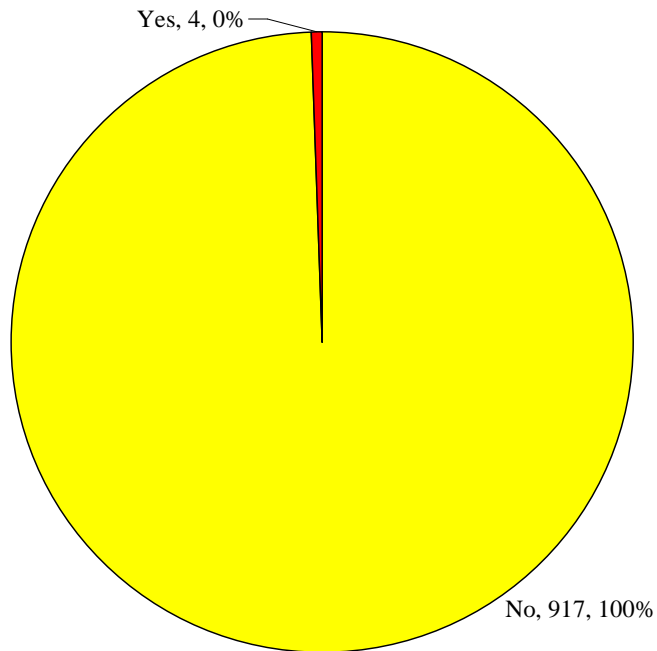
Age Breakdown



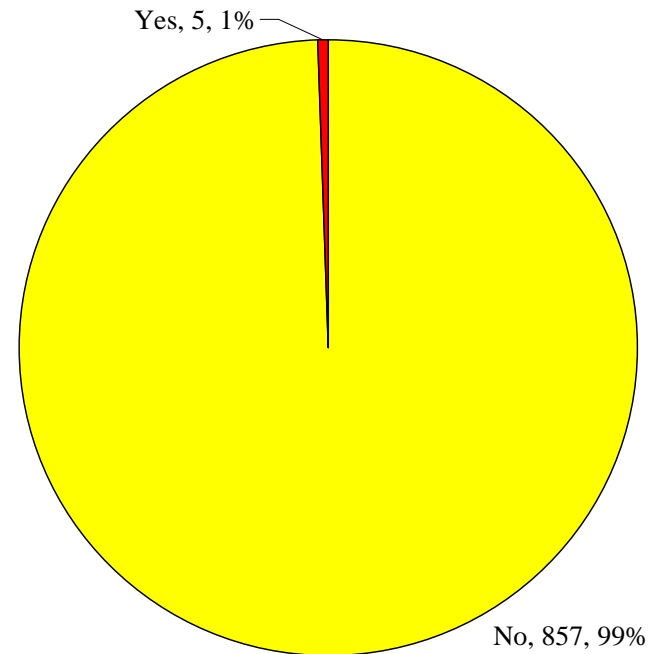
Dossier Number Breakdown

- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Featherstone is 30 years and 1 month. The average (mode) age group is 21 – 30 years old.
- 50% (465) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041007ES3 (male beneficiaries aged 28 and over).

Disabled Beneficiaries



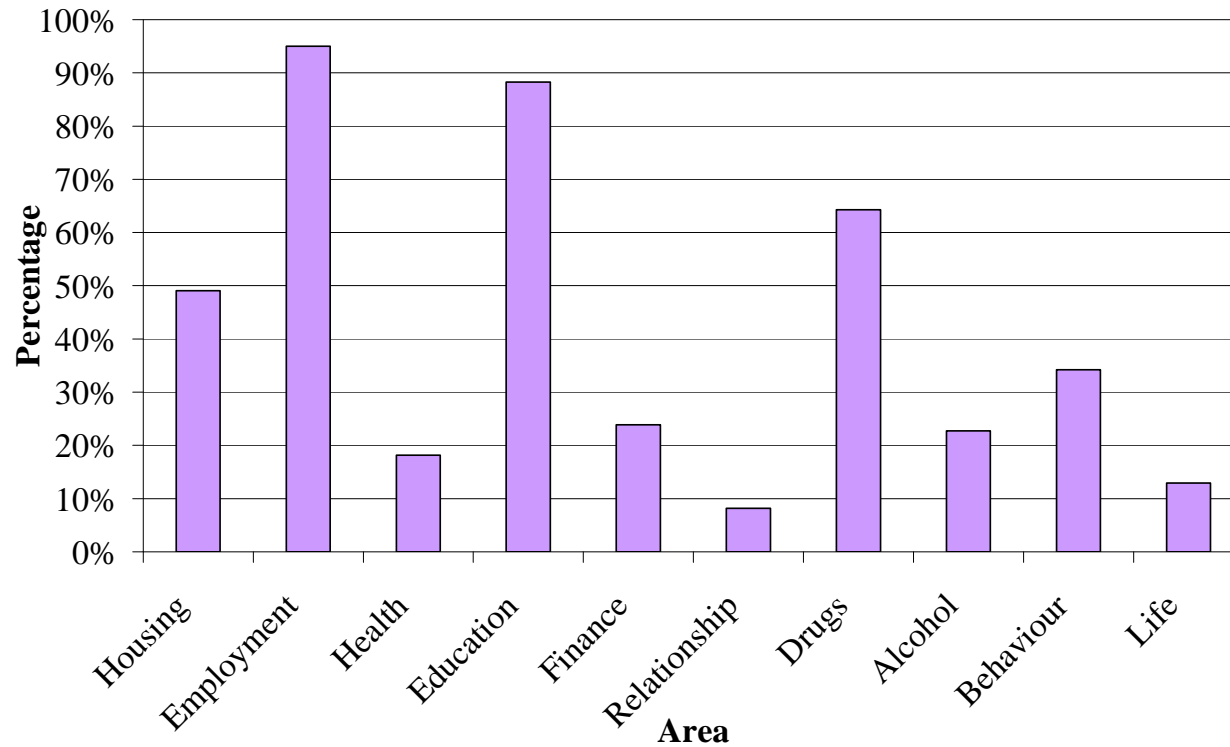
Beneficiaries Starting in Featherstone



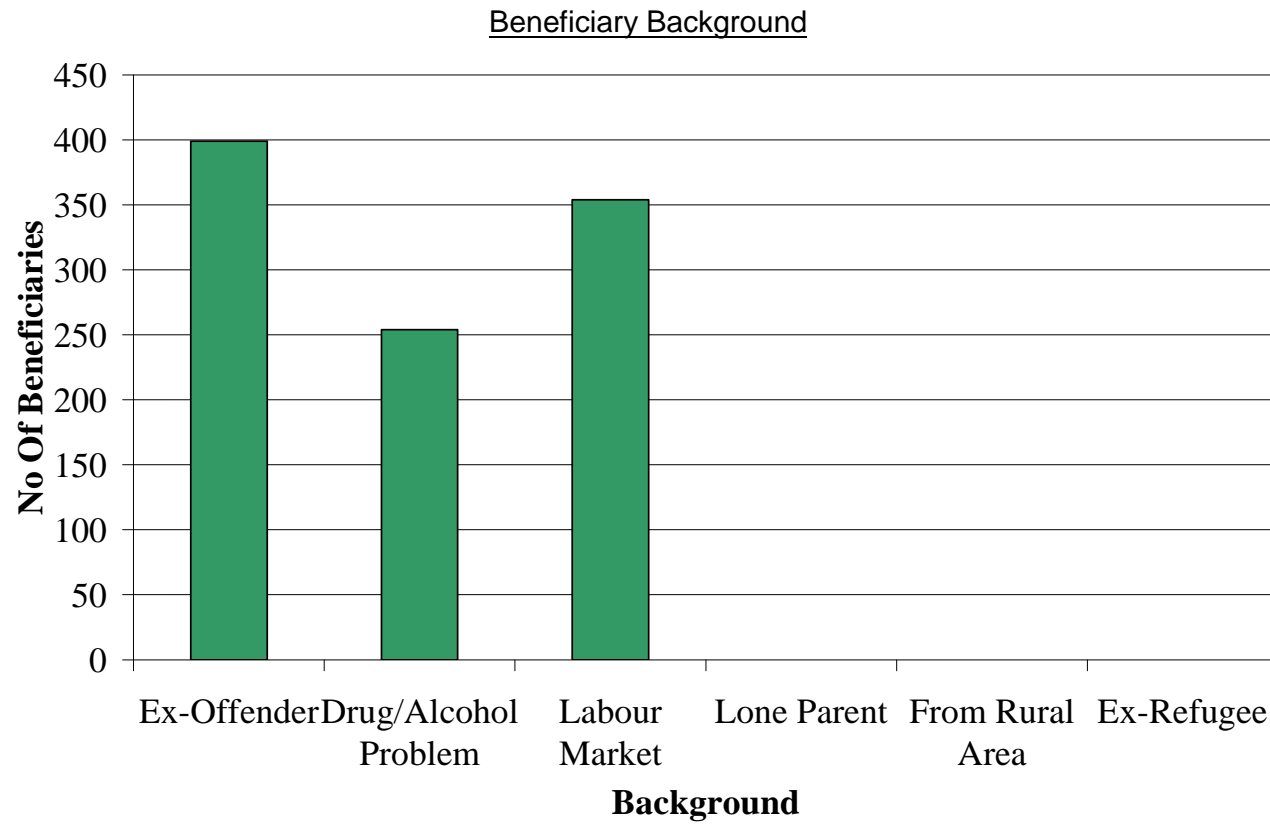
Beneficiaries Finishing in Featherstone

- <1% (4) of the beneficiaries who started in Featherstone were classified as being disabled.
- <1% (5) of the beneficiaries who finished in Featherstone were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Featherstone



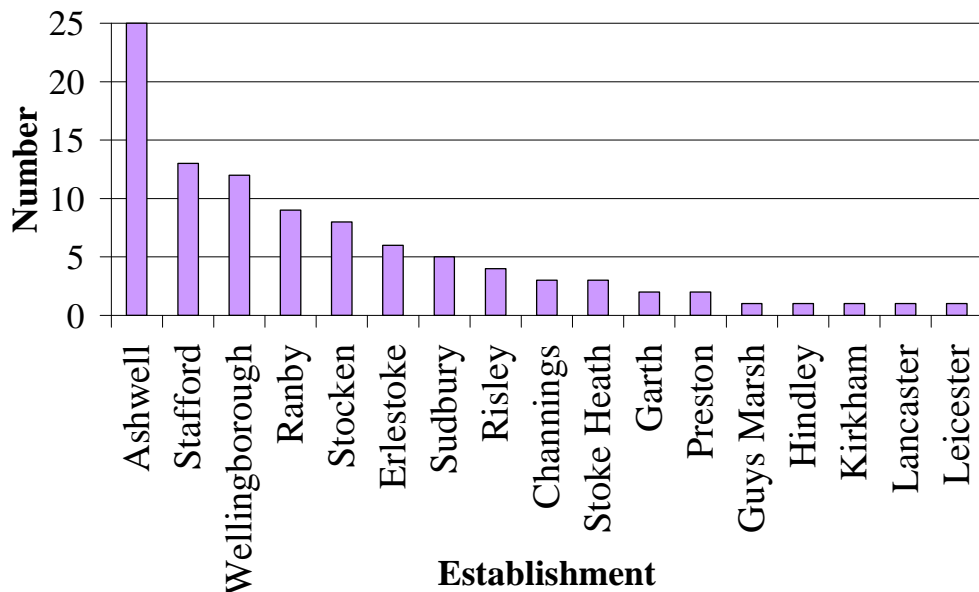
- Over 90% of the beneficiaries who started in Featherstone needed help with employment.
- Nearly 90% of the beneficiaries who started in Featherstone needed help with education issues.
- Over 60% of the beneficiaries who started in Featherstone needed help with drugs issues.



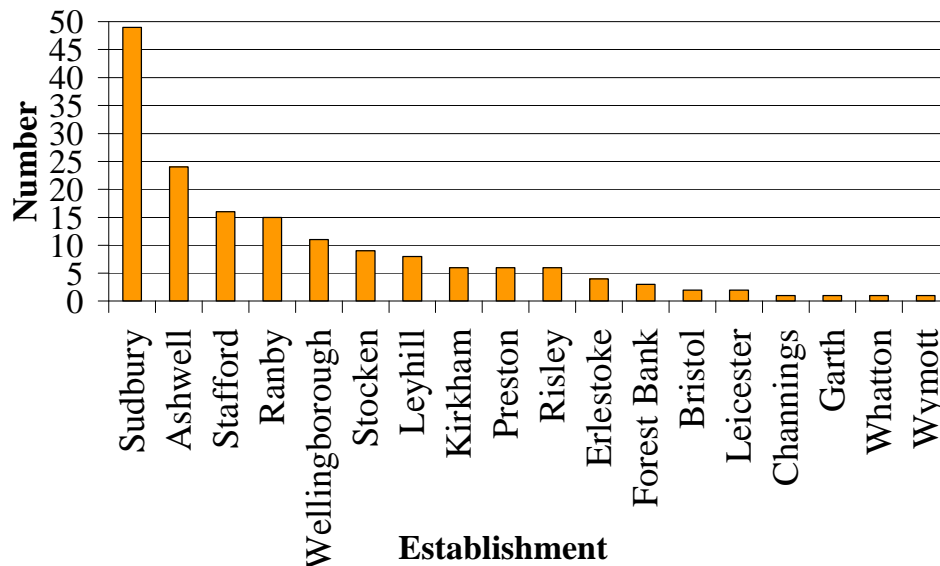
- Nearly 400 of the beneficiaries who started in Featherstone were ex-offenders.
- Over 250 of the beneficiaries who started in Featherstone had a drug or alcohol problem.

Transfers into Featherstone

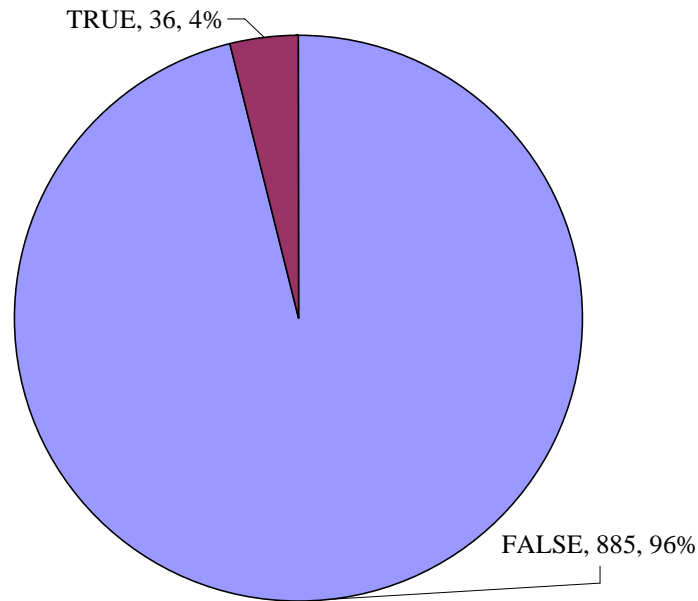


Transfers from Featherstone

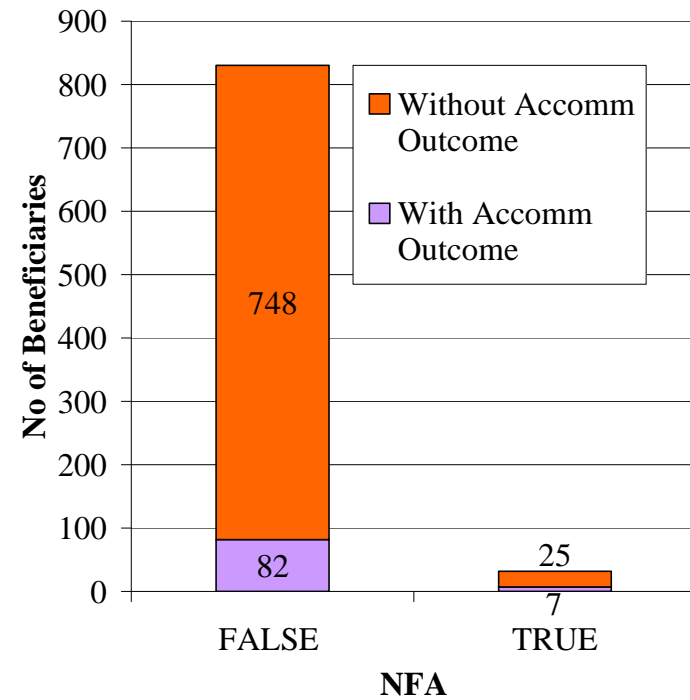


- 97 beneficiaries have transferred into Featherstone – 52% transferred to Featherstone from Ashwell, Stafford or Wellingborough.
- 165 beneficiaries have transferred from Featherstone – 63% transferred from Featherstone to Sudbury, Ashwell, Stafford or Ranby.

Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode

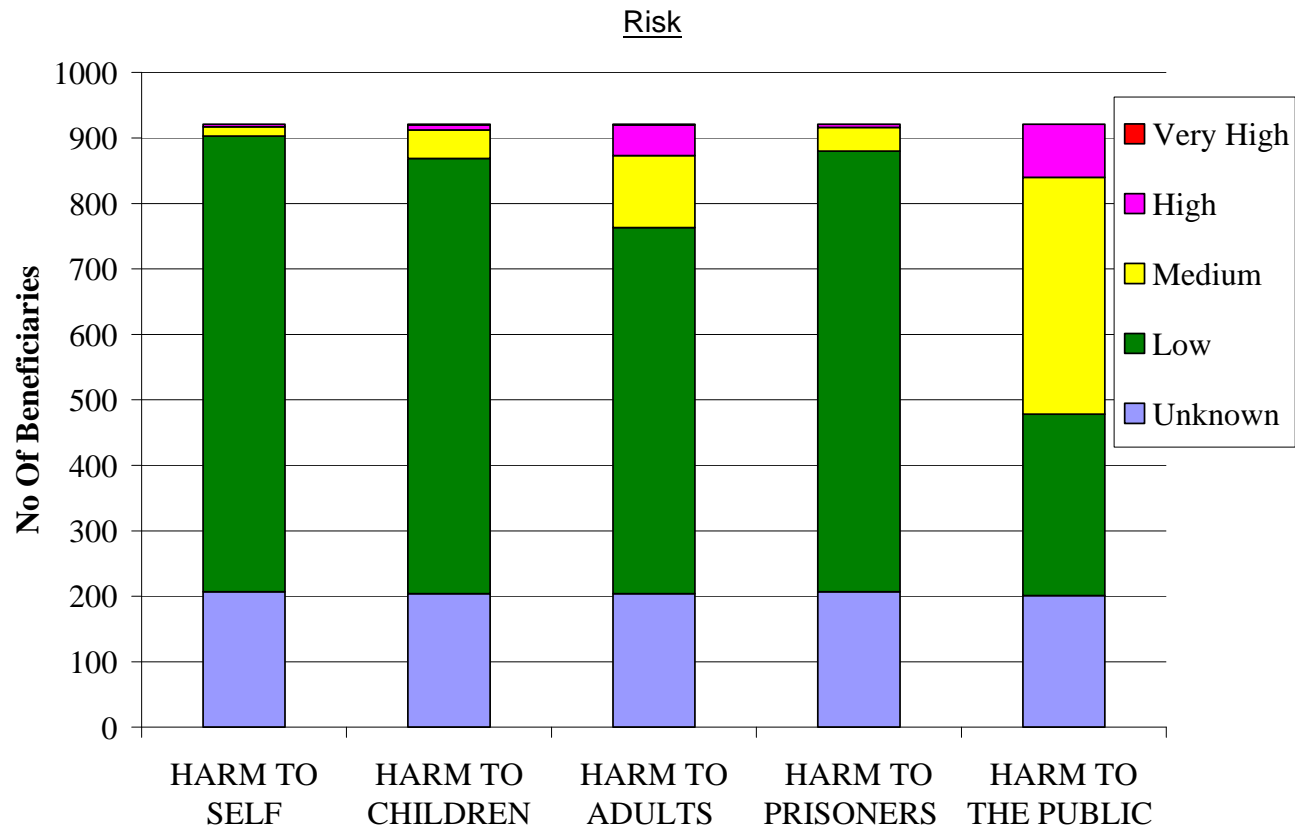


Beneficiaries Starting in Featherstone



Beneficiaries Finishing in Featherstone

- 4% (36) of the beneficiaries who started in Featherstone were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 32 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 7 had an accommodation outcome secured.



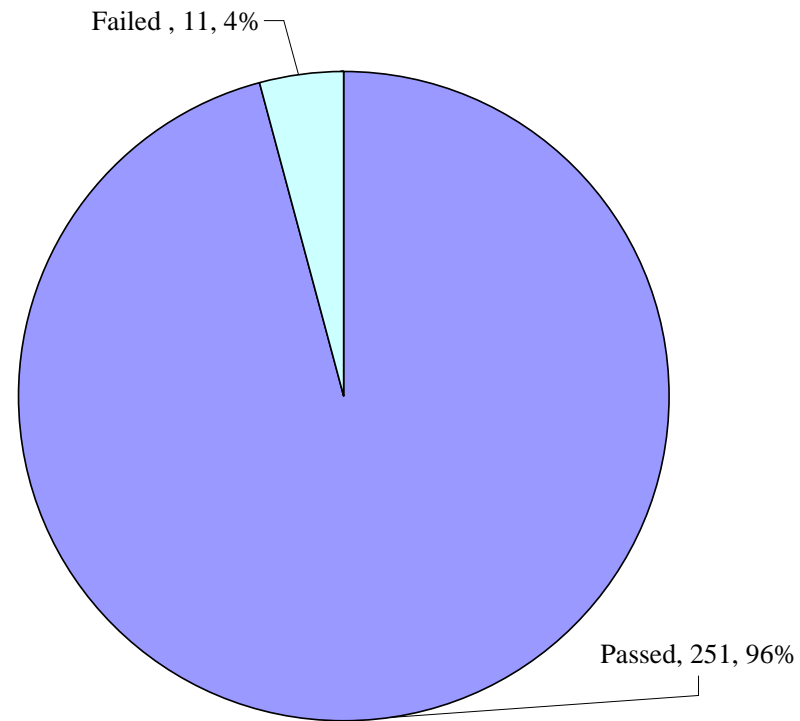
- For approximately 200 beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners towards themselves, children, adults, prisoners, and medium risk towards the public.

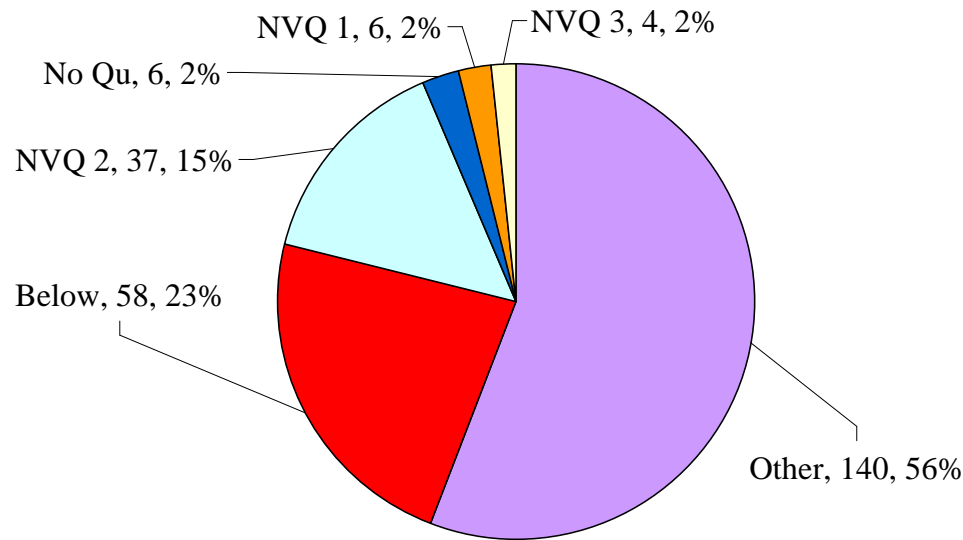
- 971 soft outcomes were gained by Featherstone beneficiaries.
- 258 beneficiaries received Advice on Disclosure.
- 156 beneficiaries gained assistance with writing a CV.
- Beneficiaries in Featherstone attended 259 interviews – Further Education, Fresh Start, Homeless, Job and New Deal interviews.
- 31 beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiary Access Fund.

Exam Results



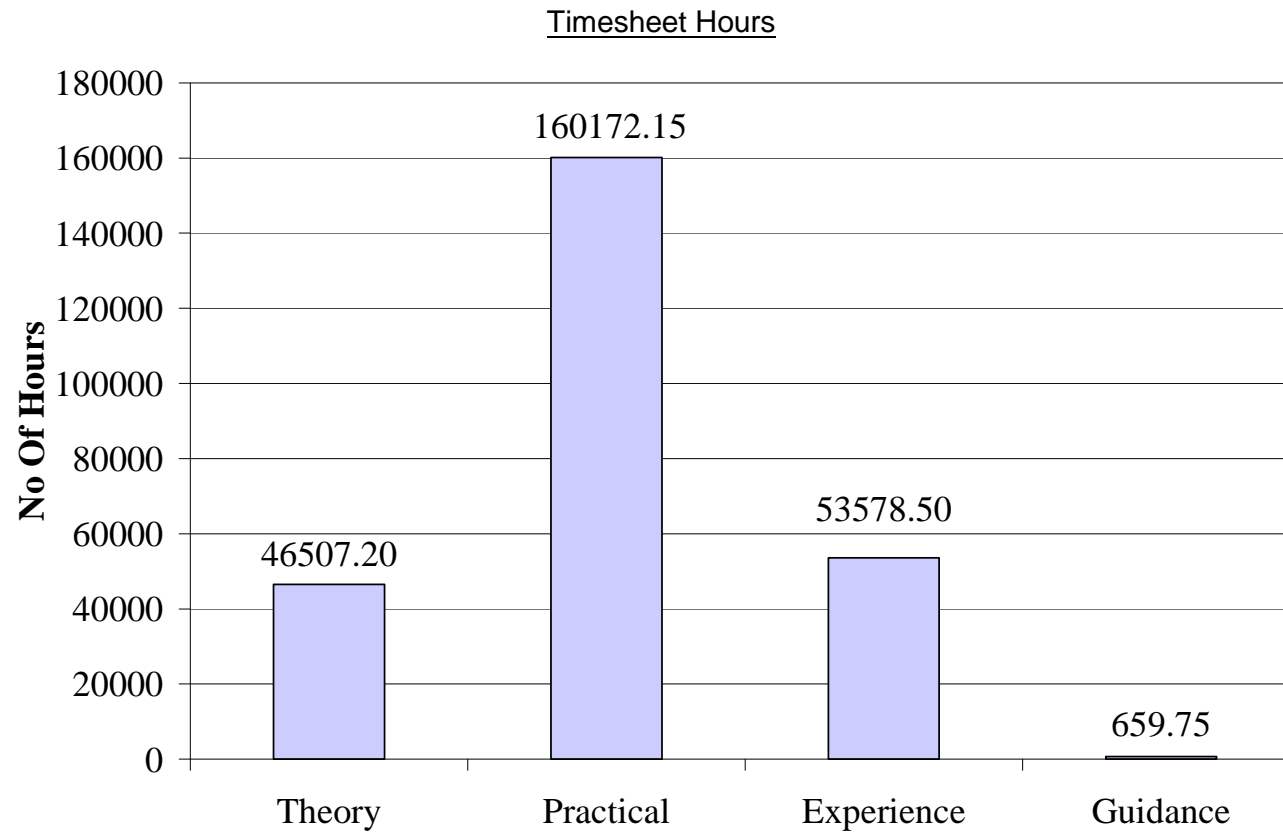
- 96% (251) of the exams taken were passed.
- Only 11 exams were failed.

NVQ Equivalence for Passed Subjects



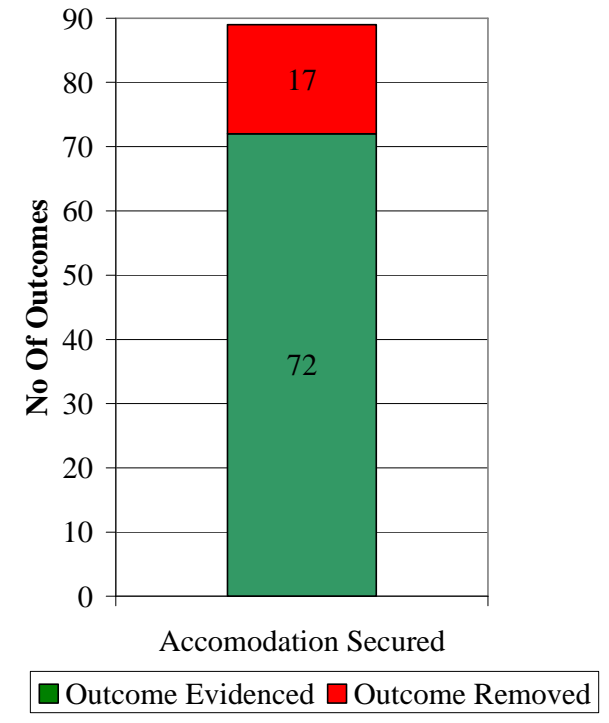
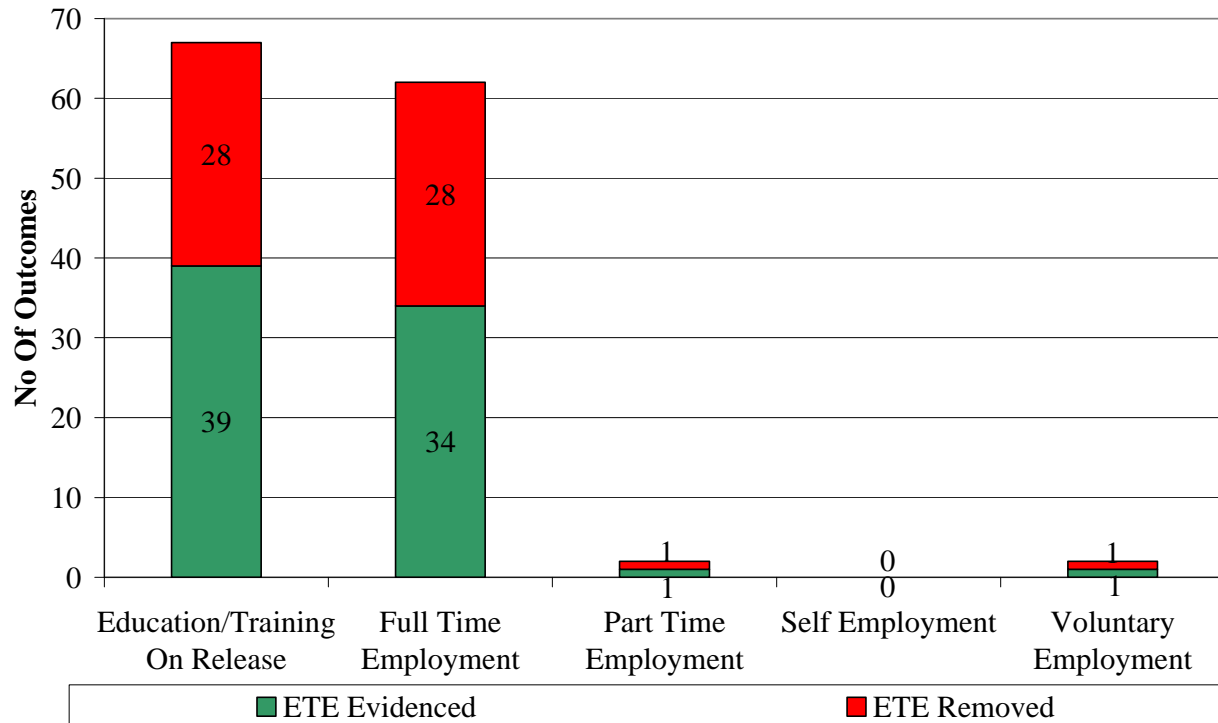

- 47 NVQ levels 1, 2 and 3 have been gained by beneficiaries in Featherstone.
- 63 adult literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Featherstone.



- 260,918 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 160,172 (61%) of the hours collected were for practical activities.

Hard Outcomes



- 133 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Featherstone with evidence for 75 of these outcomes (56% evidence for outcome rate).
- 89 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 72 outcomes (81% evidence for outcome rate).
