

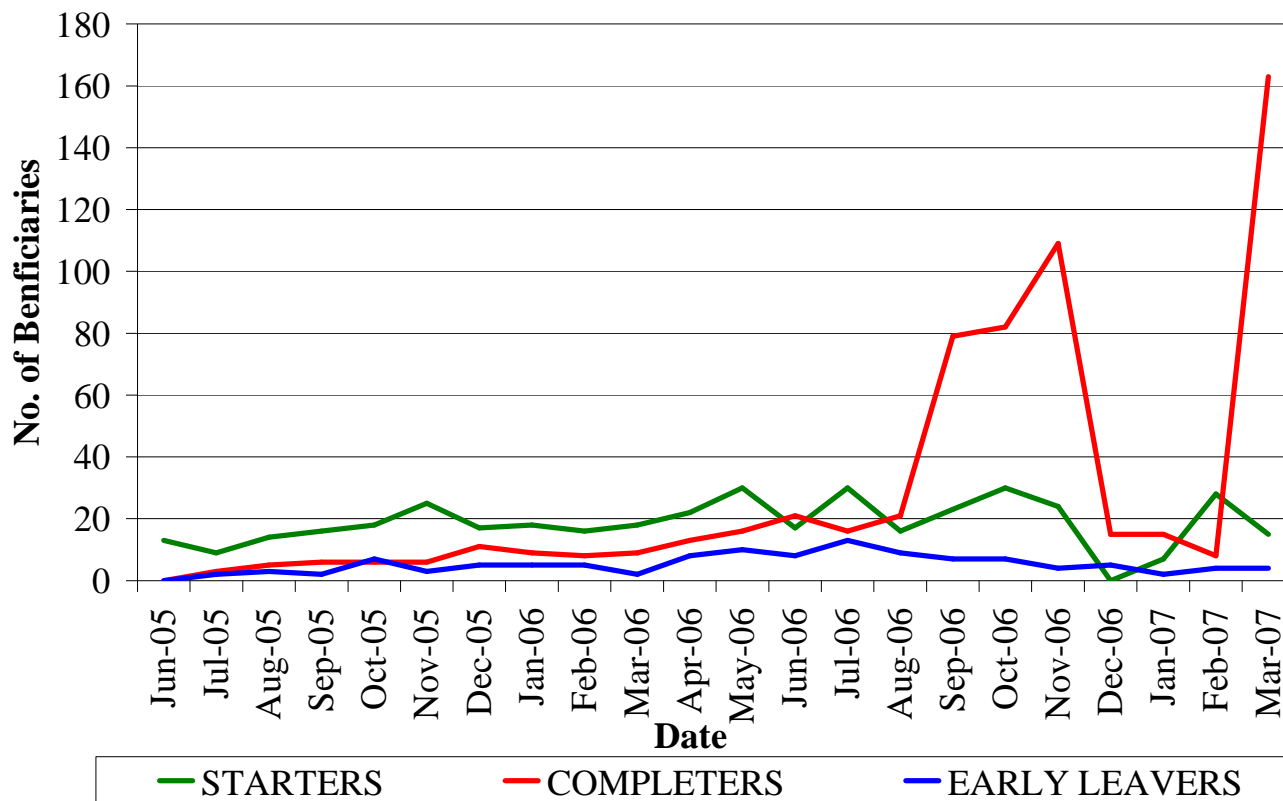

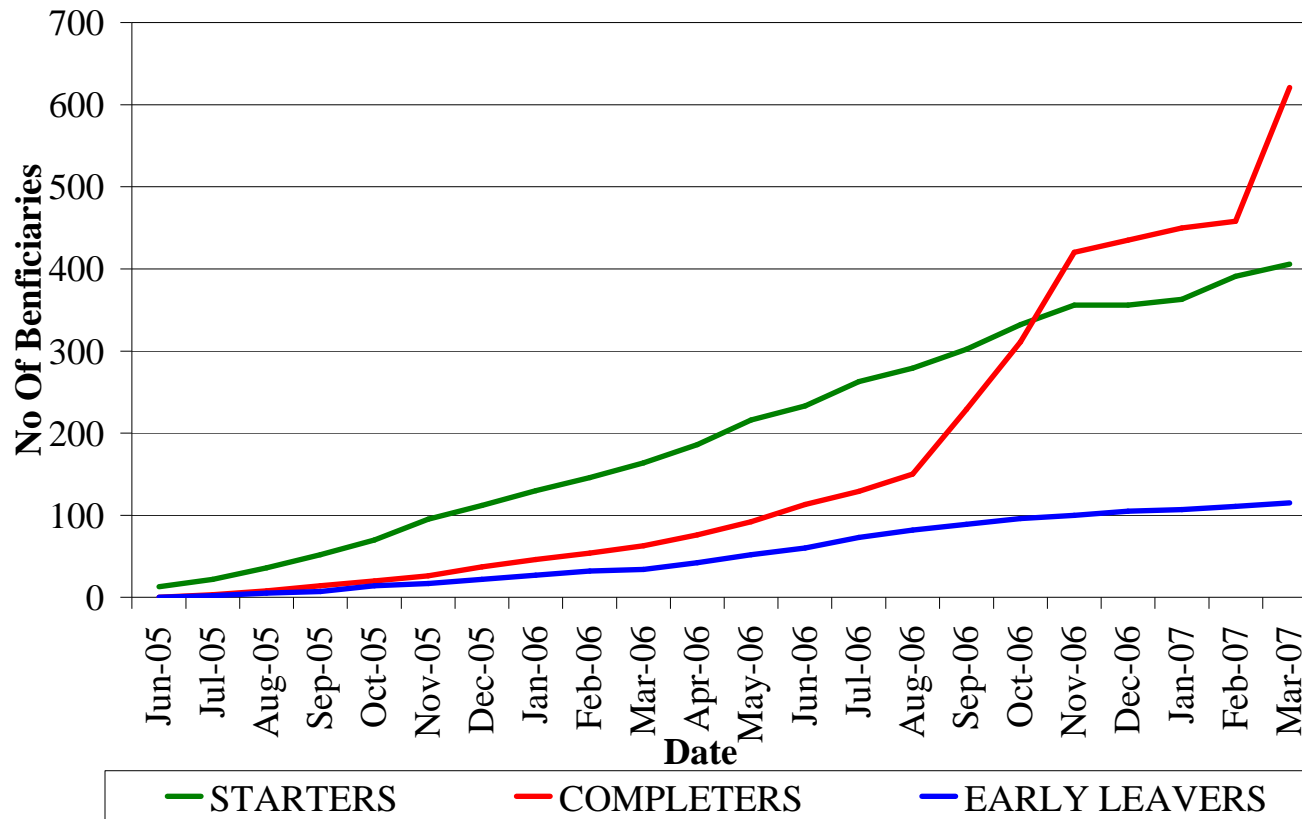

Starters, Completers and Early Leavers Per Month



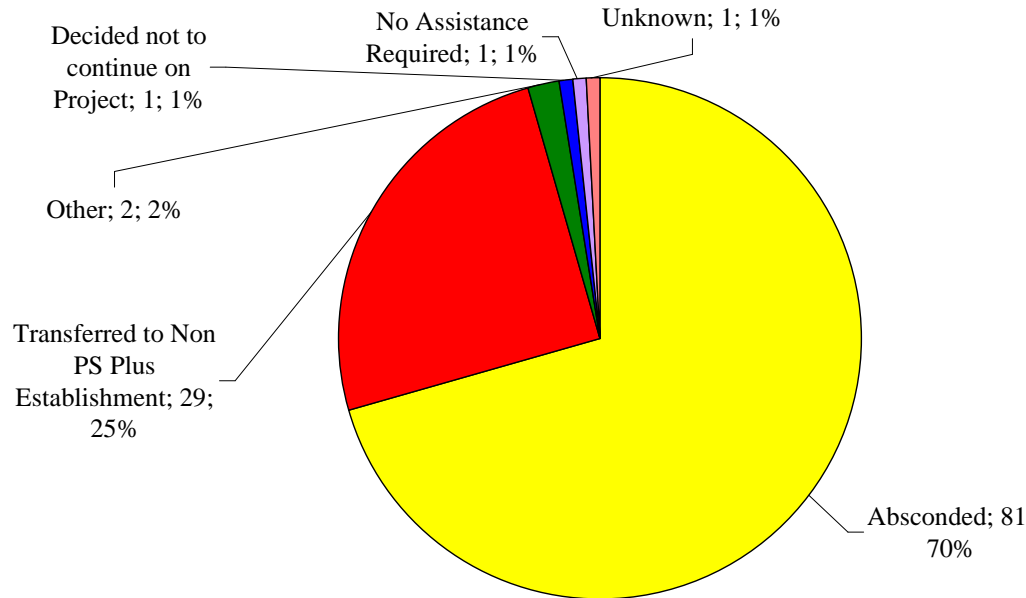
- Most months, Sudbury started between 10 and 30 beneficiaries on the PS Plus 2 project.
- Up until the last 7 months of the project (project closure), no more than 21 beneficiaries were completing the PS Plus 2 project per month.

Cumulative Starters, Completers and Early Leavers



- Over 400 beneficiaries were started on PS Plus 2 in Sudbury.
- Approximately 740 beneficiaries finished in Sudbury – 621 completed the project and 115 left the project early.

### Reasons for Early Leavers

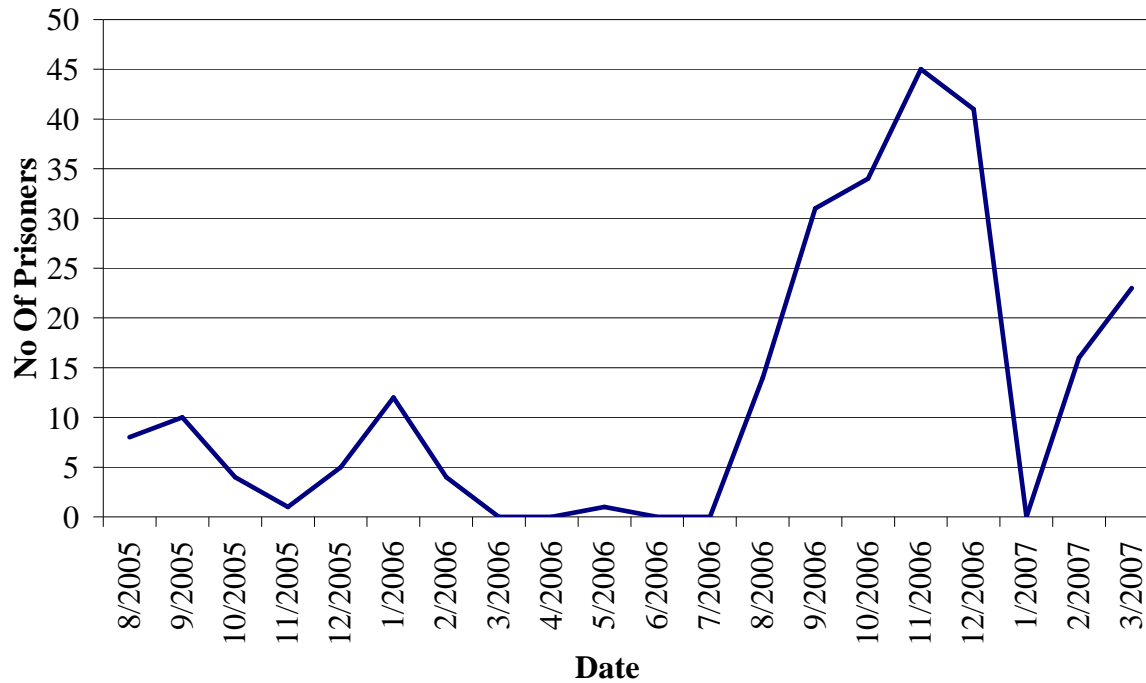


Other reasons given for beneficiaries leaving the project early:

- Of the 115 beneficiaries who left the project early, 70% (81) absconded.
- 25% (29) of the beneficiaries who left early transferred to a non PS Plus establishment.

Non-Starters Per Month

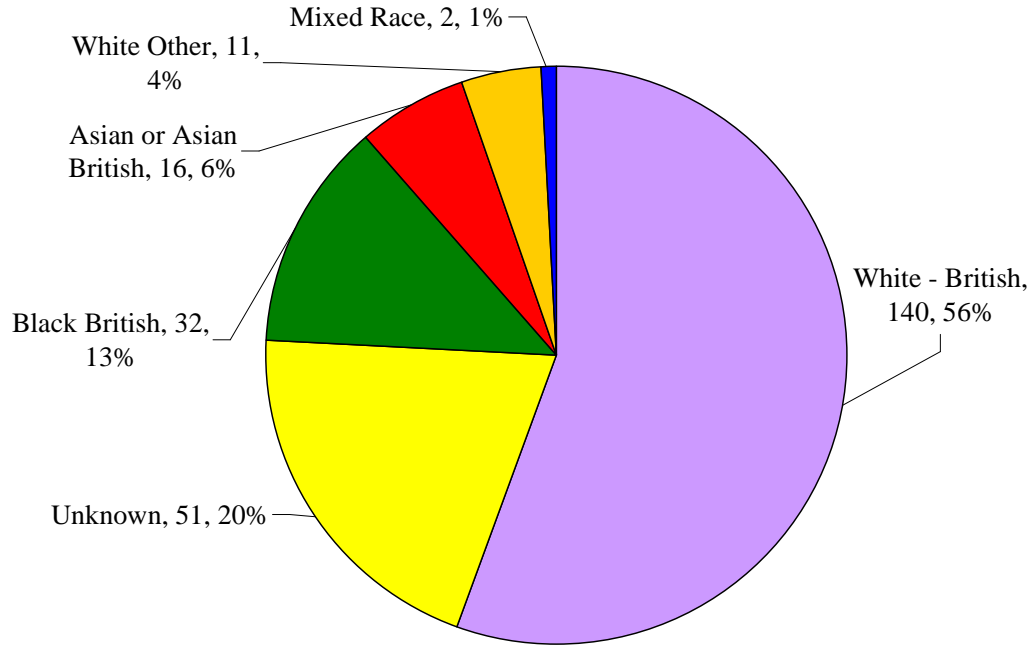


Reasons for prisoner not being started:

- Most months, less than 15 prisoners were seen and deemed unsuitable for the project. The number not started raised dramatically between August and December 2006.
- In total, over 252 prisoners were not started on the PS Plus 2 project in Sudbury.
- 105 of the prisoners not started in Sudbury did not require PS Plus Services and 43 prisoners transferred before being started on the project (3 transferred before the assessment entered and 40 to a non-PS Plus establishment).

Ethnic Breakdown of prisoners not started



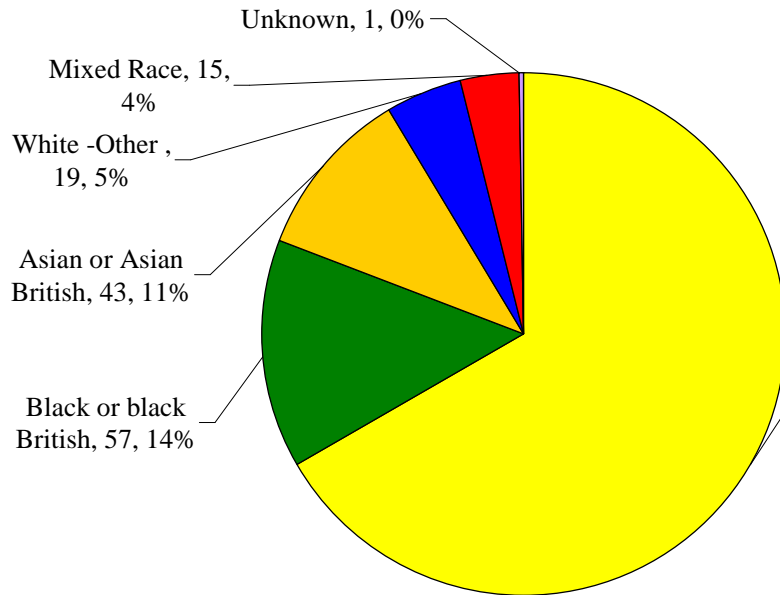

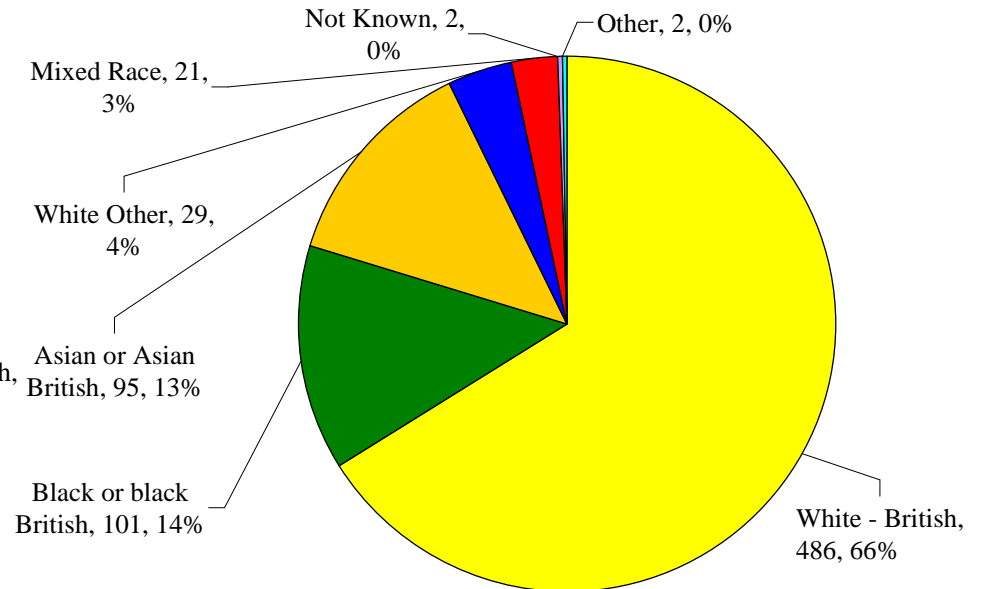
- The majority of the prisoners not started on the PS Plus project were White-British (56%) and from United Kingdom (88%).
- The ethnic origin for 1 in 5 and the nationality of 7% of the prisoners not started was unknown.
- Ethnic minorities account for 24% (61 prisoners) of the prisoners not started.

- 66% (271) of the beneficiaries who started and 66% (486) of the beneficiaries who finished in Sudbury were White-British.
- 34% (134) of the beneficiaries who started and 34% (246) of the beneficiaries who finished in Sudbury were from ethnic minorities.

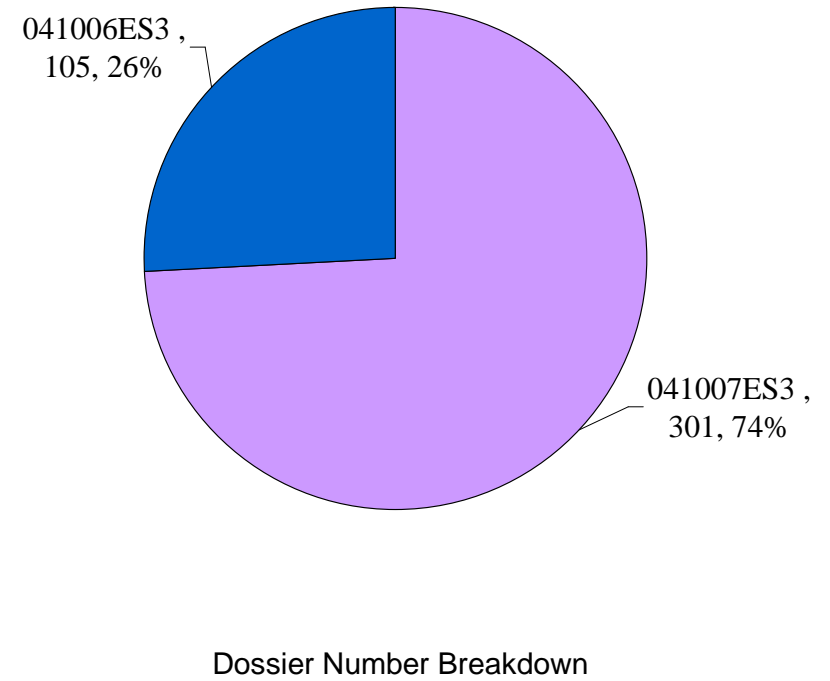
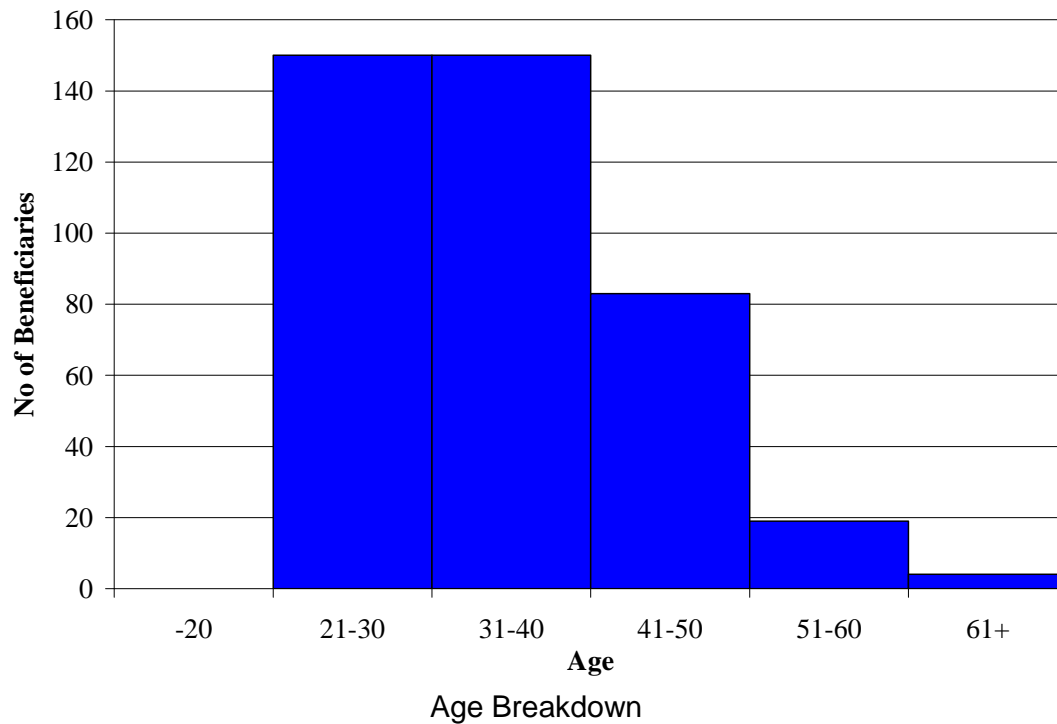

- 94% (383) of the beneficiaries who started in Sudbury stated that their nationality is United Kingdom or British.
- 95% (699) of the beneficiaries who finished in Sudbury stated that their nationality is United Kingdom, British or English.
- The nationality of four of the beneficiaries started in Sudbury and 14 of the beneficiaries that finished in Sudbury is unknown.

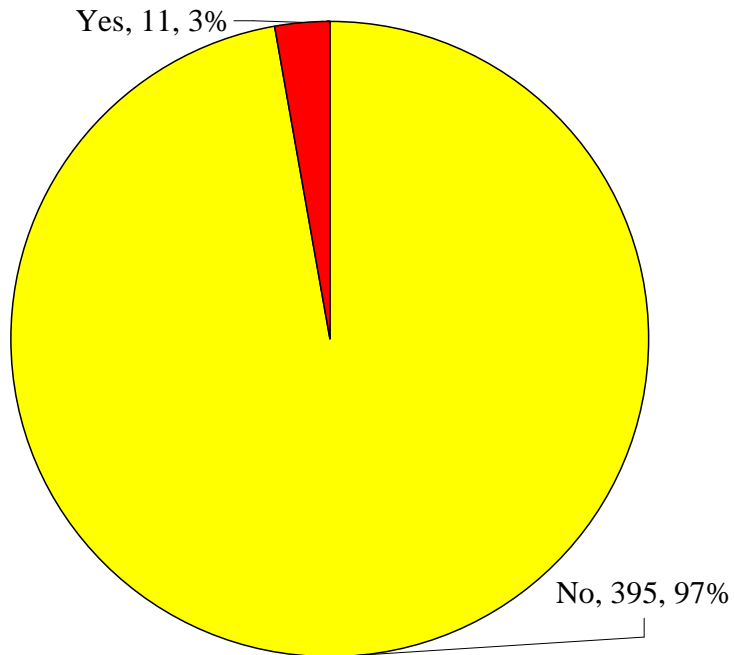


Age and Dossier Number of Beneficiaries on Starting PS Plus 2

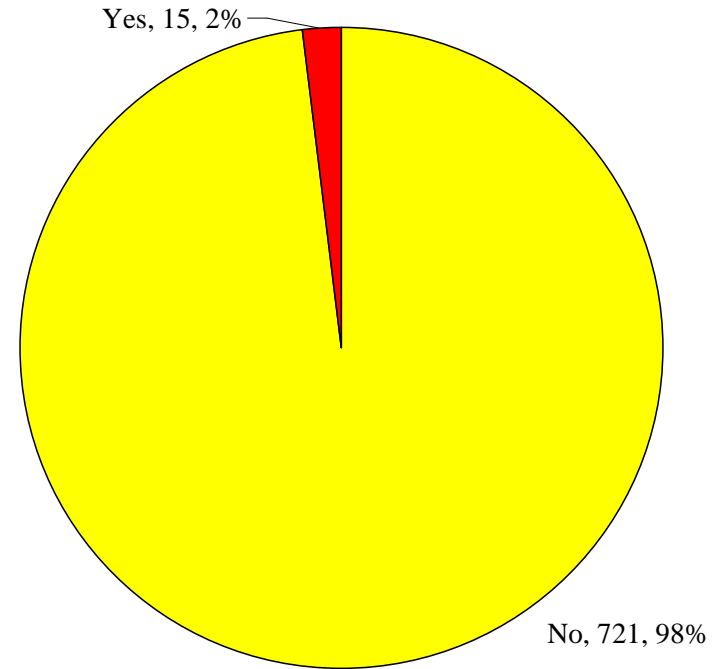


- The average (mean) age of the beneficiaries started in Sudbury is 35 years. The average (mode) age group is equally 21 – 30 years old and 31-40 years old.
- 74% (301) of the beneficiaries are in the ESF Group 041007ES3 (male beneficiaries aged 28 and over).

Disabled Beneficiaries



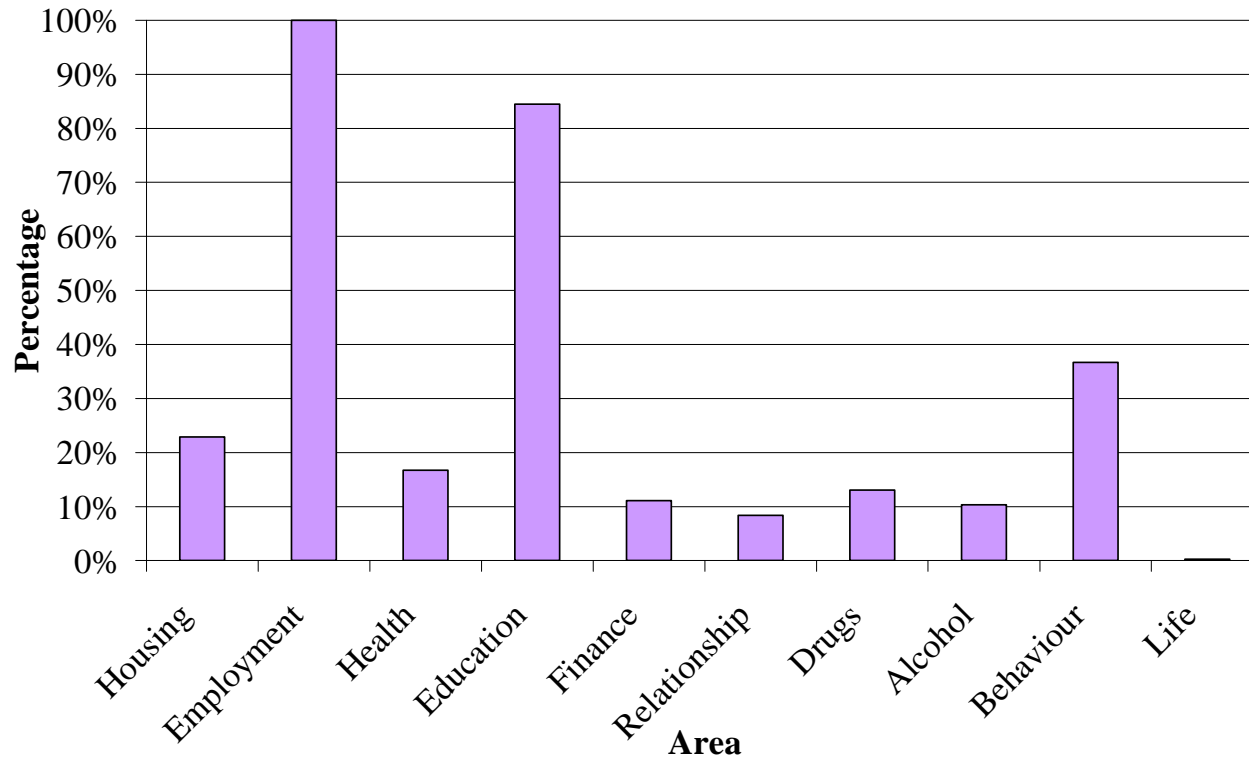

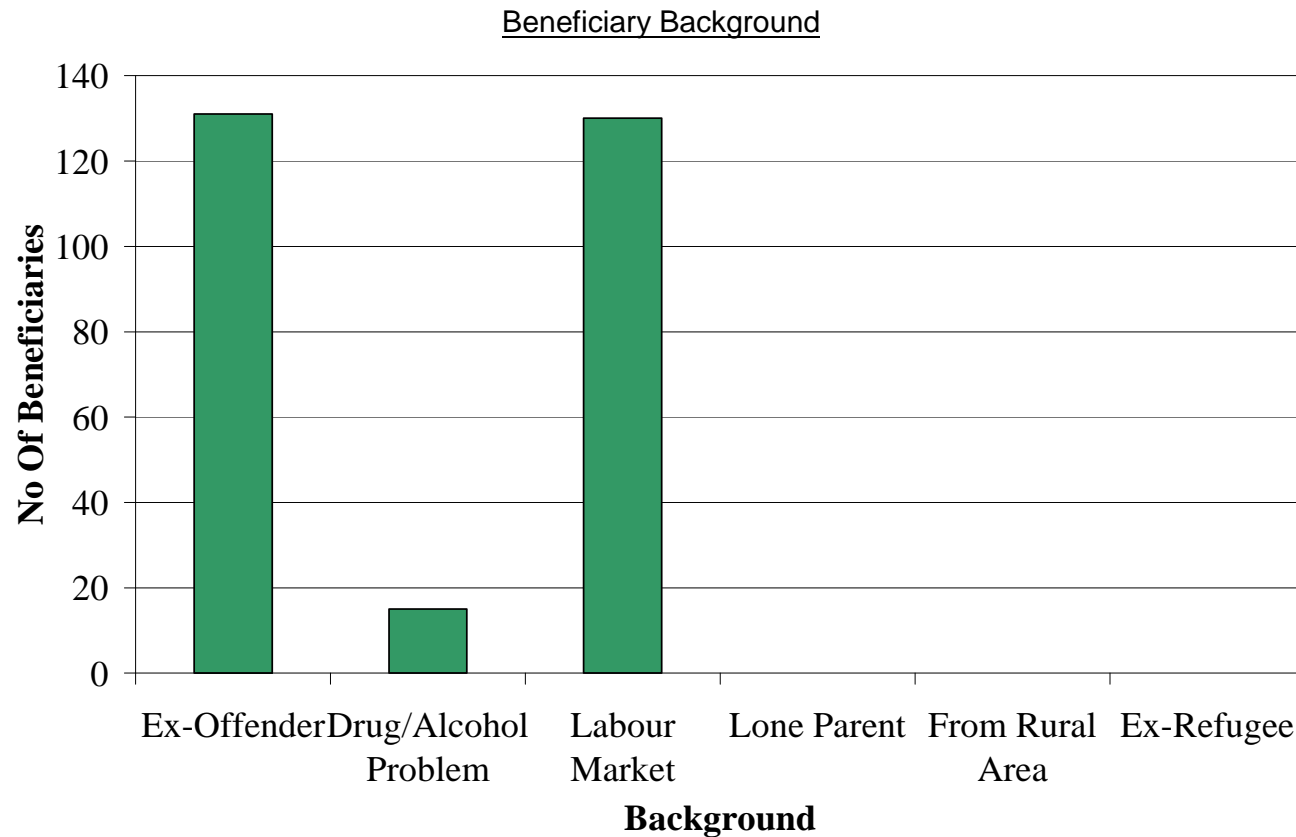
Beneficiaries Finishing in Sudbury

- 3% (11) of the beneficiaries who started in Sudbury were classified as being disabled.
- 2% (15) of the beneficiaries who finished in Sudbury were classified as being disabled.

Needs of the Beneficiaries Started in Sudbury



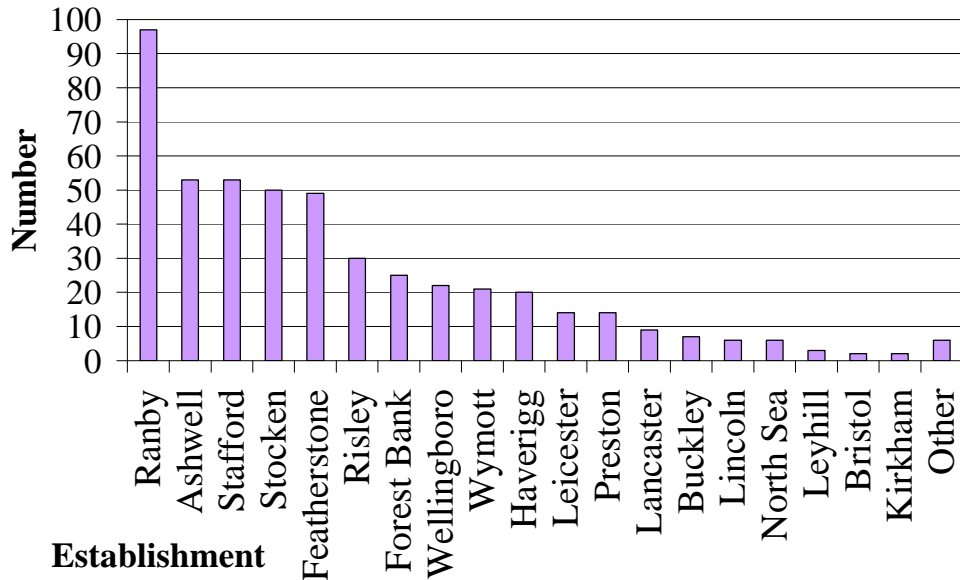
- All of the beneficiaries who started in Sudbury needed help with employment.
- Over 80% of the beneficiaries who started in Sudbury needed help with education.
- Over 30% of the beneficiaries who started in Sudbury needed help with behaviour issues.



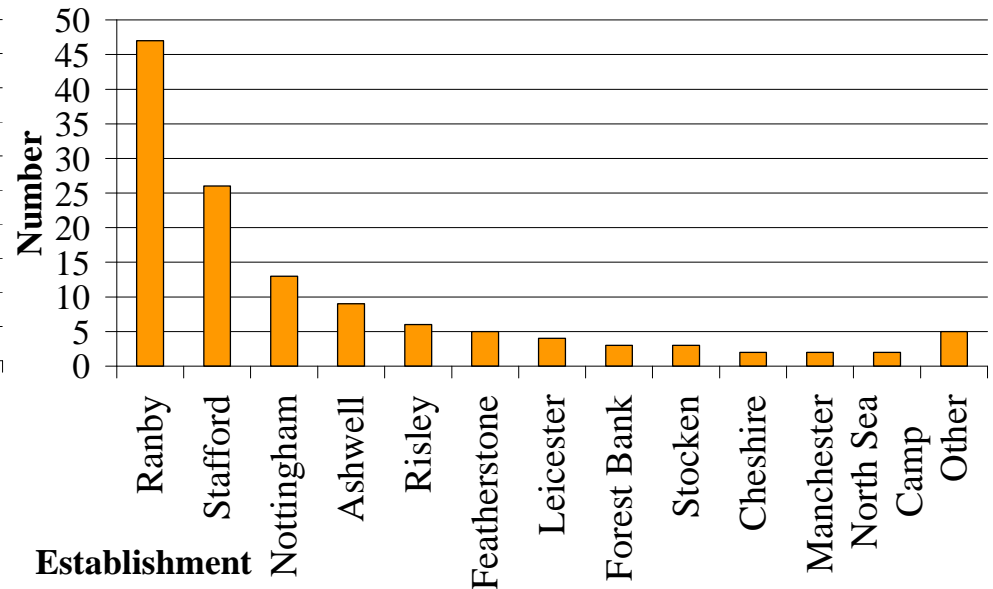
- Over 120 of the beneficiaries who started in Sudbury were ex-offenders and on the labour market.
- Less than 20 of the beneficiaries who started in Sudbury had a drug or alcohol problem.

Transfers into Sudbury

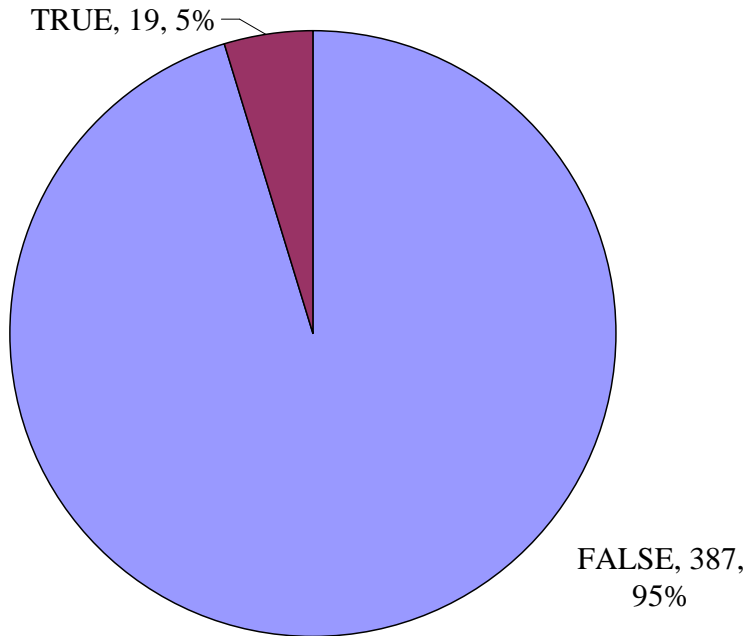


Transfers from Sudbury

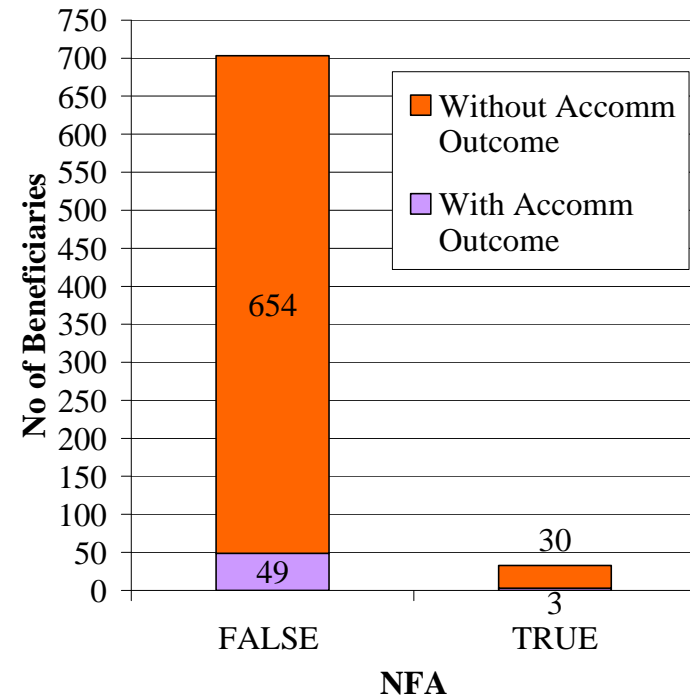


- 489 beneficiaries have transferred into Sudbury – 62% transferred to Sudbury from Ranby, Ashwell, Stafford, Stocken and Featherstone
- 127 beneficiaries have transferred from Sudbury – 68% transferred from Sudbury to Ranby, Stafford and Nottingham.

Beneficiaries that have No Fixed Abode

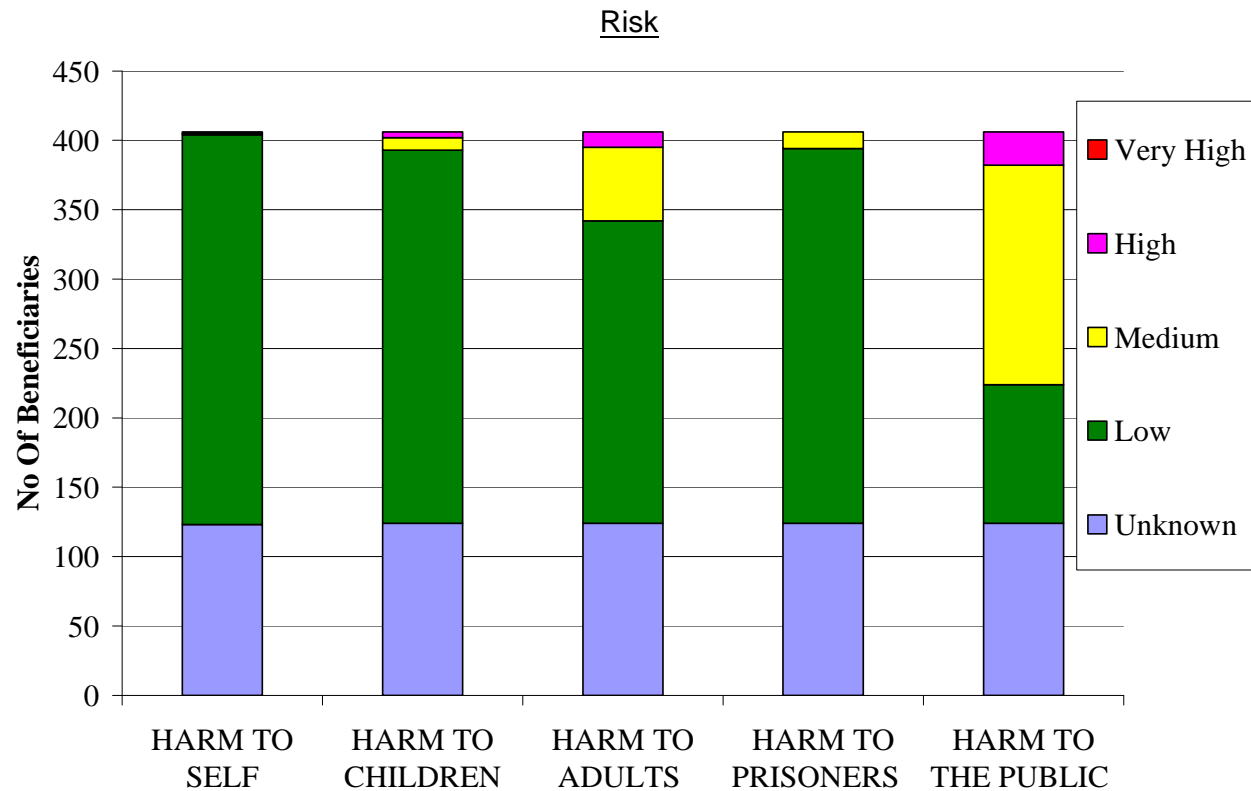


Beneficiaries Starting in Sudbury



Beneficiaries Finishing in Sudbury

- 5% (19) of the beneficiaries started in Sudbury were classed as having no fixed abode on starting the project.
- 33 beneficiaries were classed as having no fixed abode on finishing the project. Of these, 3 had an accommodation outcome secured.



- For over 120 beneficiaries, the level of risk of harm is unknown.
- Where risk is known, the majority of the beneficiaries are low risk prisoners towards themselves, children, adults, prisoners, and medium risk towards the public.

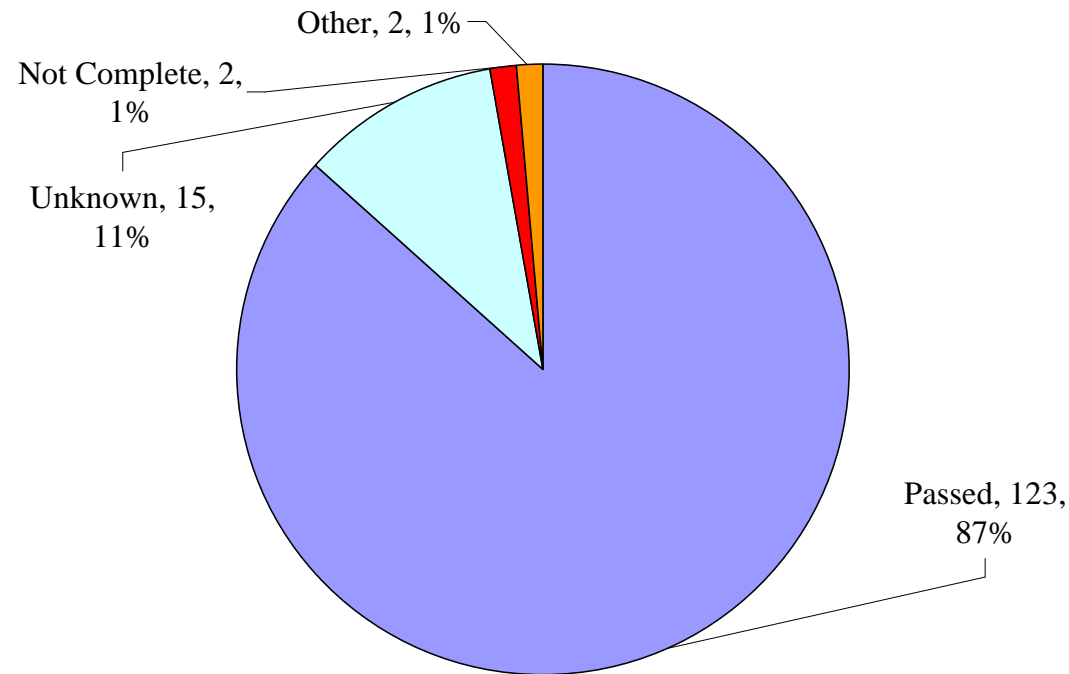

- 374 soft outcomes were gained by Sudbury beneficiaries.
- 125 beneficiaries gained assistance writing a CV.
- 58 beneficiaries utilised the Beneficiary Access Fund.
- Beneficiaries in Sudbury attended 14 interviews – Further Education, Fresh Start, Progress to Work, Job and New Deal interviews.

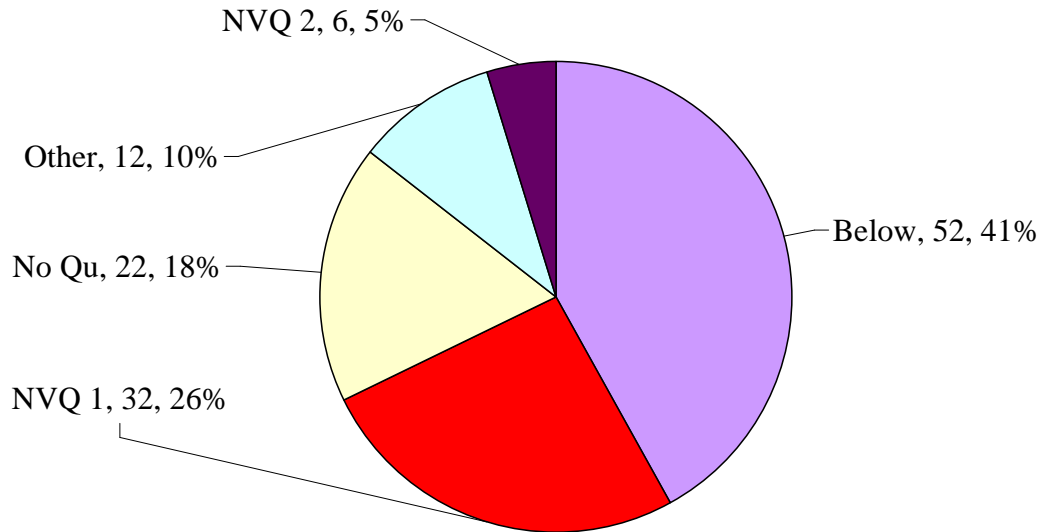


Exam Results



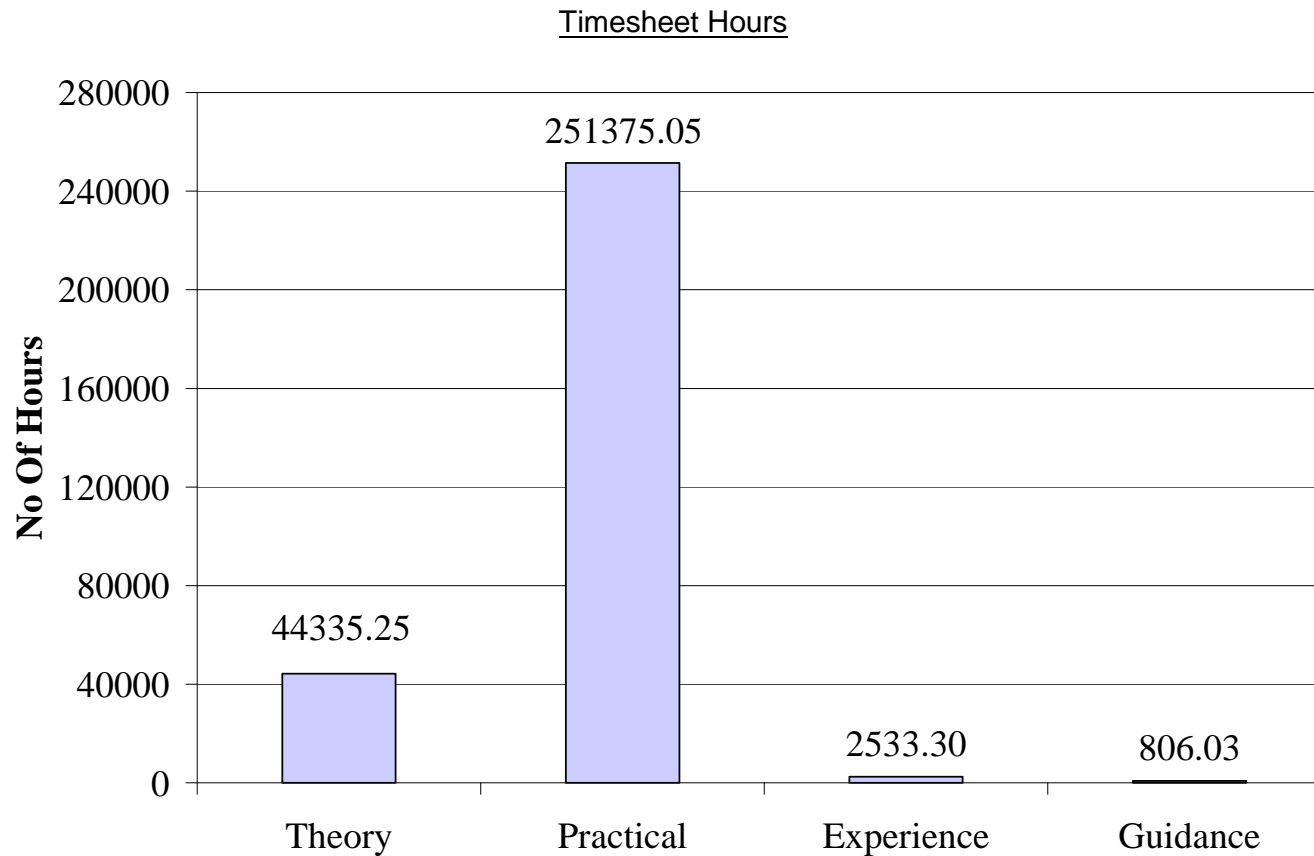
- 87% (123) of the exams taken were passed.
- No exams were failed and just two were incomplete on finishing the project.

NVQ Equivalence for Passed Subjects



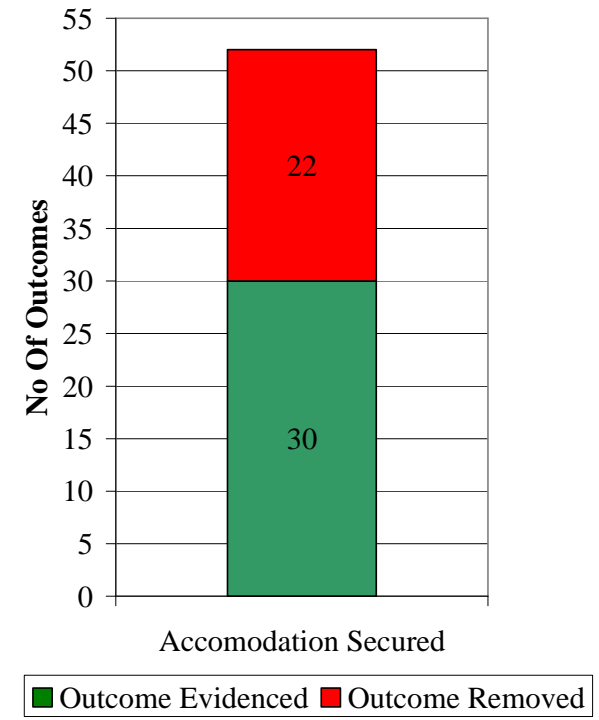
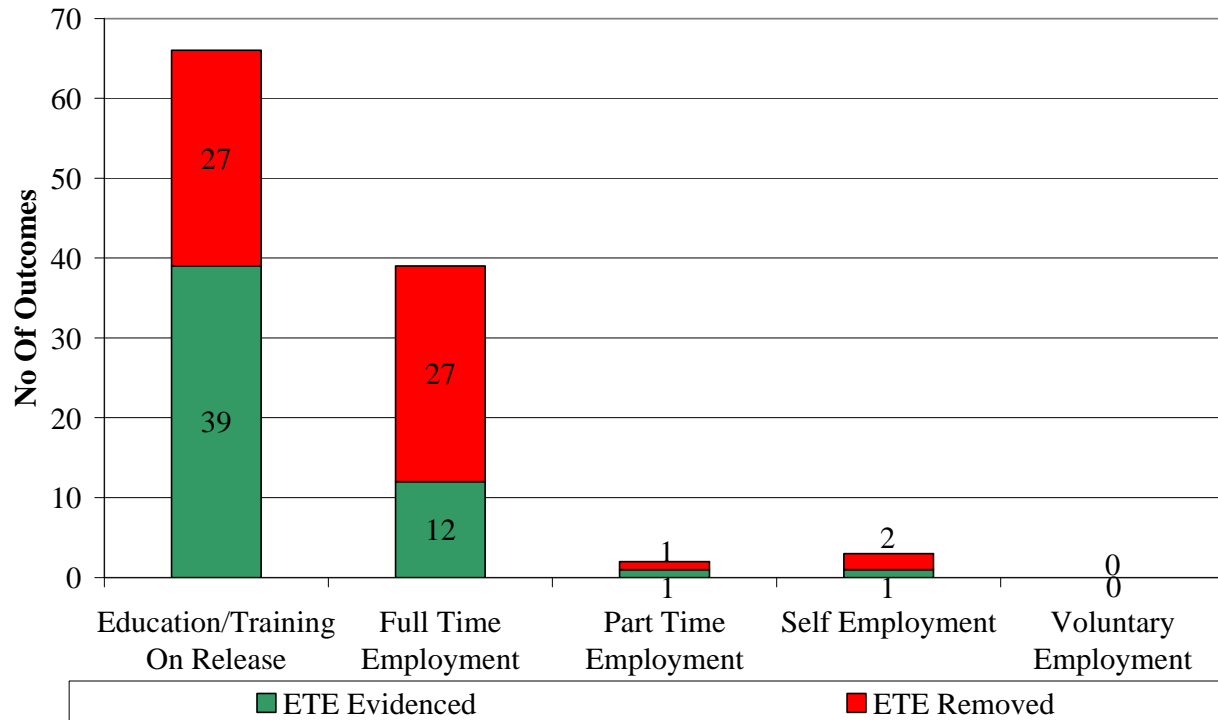

- 38 NVQ levels 1 and 2 have been gained by beneficiaries in Sudbury.
- 19 adult literacy and numeracy courses have been passed by beneficiaries in Sudbury.



- 299,050 hours were collected from PS Plus beneficiaries.
- 251,375 (84%) of the hours collected were for practical activities.

Hard Outcomes



- 110 hard education, training and employment (ETE) outcomes have been recorded at Sudbury with evidence for 53 of these outcomes (48% evidence for outcome rate).
- 52 hard accommodation outcomes have been recorded with evidence for 30 outcomes (58% evidence for outcome rate).
